Year Book, State Normal,

This office has received the 1906 Year Book of the Central State Normal School of Mt. Pleasant, Michigan. This is a pamphlet of 120 pages and gives much interesting information concerning this rapidly growing institution. It shows a faculty of forty and an enrollment of about 900 students for the fiscal year, July 1. 1905 to July 1, 1906. Among the Roster of Students we find the following from East Jordan: Graded School Course, Miss Mabel Malpass; Summer School Students, Misses Vesta Hughson, Jessie Lewis, Ruzena Stewart.

The courses of study are designed to prepare teachers for all lines of public school work from the kindergarten to the high school. Graduates from the ife certificate course are admitted to particulars. the literary department of the University of Michigan with two years advanced standing, thus enabling them o take the B. A. degree from that intution in two years. Students who graduate from the Central Normal are practically sure of good positions as he call for teachers from this school

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


