

# Rayder boys claim Lake Michigan Conference title

#### Steady play of seniors Putman, Ackerman led Charlevoix to a 16-6 Season Record

CHARLEVOIX - The 2010-11 Charlevoix Rayders came out of the gates firing on all cylinders, as they won their first three contests and nine of their first ten games. The only loss during that time was to the 2009-10 Class C runner-up Suttons Bay led by eventual Mr. Basketball winner Dwaun Anderson.

A key league victory would take place in game number three when Traverse City St. Francis and former longtime Rayder coach Keith Haske paid a visit.

In front of a packed house, the Rayders welcomed the former coach, and the end result of the basketball contest was even better for Charlevoix.


The Rayders jumped out

to an early lead and never trailed as they came away with a hard-fought 66-58 Lake Michigan Conference victory. Leading the charge was senior center Brennan Ackerman, with 18 points. eight rebounds and five blocks, while senior Dylan Putman chipped in with 16 points and six boards.

Charlevoix led at the quarter breaks 16-13, 32-26, and 41-34 before holding off a fourth quarter Gladiator charge, as TCSF cut the Rayder lead to 50-48 early in the quarter, but Charlevoix responded with a run of their own to go up 58-52 with just over two minutes

After the loss to Suttons Bay, Charlevoix reeled off six straight league wins to

# **Lady Rayders battle** through season of streaks

## Injuries to guards take toll throughout season

CHARLEVOIX -The 2010-11 Ladv Rayders season was that of streaks, to begin the year the team got off to a rough start, dropping six of their first seven games, including losses to a very tough Travers City St. Francis team as well as eventual Class C State Champion St. Ignace, a team that included Miss Basketball runner-up and Wisconsin-bound Nicole Elmbald.

Injuries to guards Jenna Way at the start of the season and a mid-season injury to Sydney Carlson did not help as the lineup had to constantly be adjust-

The Rayders then won four of their next five starts, including convincing Lake Michigan Conference victories over Boyne City, 61-20: Elk Rapids. 67-47; East Jordan, 43-31: and Harbor Springs, 47-39; the only loss during that time was to powerhouse Kalkaska.

Charlevoix would then fall in seven of their next eight contests to tough opponents; Class A

58-19 before falling in close games to Grayling, Elk Rapids, and East Jordan.

The Rayders would

Petoskey, TCSF, Kalkaska, the Rayders then clicked on all cylinders as they beat Boyne City

then win their last regular season game over Grayling 50-40, as they got 22 points from Lynzie Gotschall and 14 points from Dani Barron, while Kelly Greyerbiehl dished out eight assists.

In district action. Charlevoix would draw East Jordan and after splitting the season series, the two teams knew it would come down to a few points as the Rayders pulled out a hardfought 52-44 win.

The contest, which was nip and tuck the entire night, including a tie of 20-20 at halftime. Charlevoix then used a 32-24 second half scoring advantage to slowly pull away.

Jenna Way paced Charlevoix with 20 points, and Dani Barron finished with 14, while Kelly Greverbiehl and Megan Peters each grabbed seven rebounds.

Advancing to the district final, Charlevoix would play another familiar opponent, and another that it had split with during the season in the form of Harbor Springs.

The Rayders battled

hard throughout the game, and only trailed by one, 29-28, midway through the third quarter but found themselves down by 11 early in the fourth and again by nine with less than two minutes to go in regulation.

The Rayders, playing with a pair of injured guards (Jenna Way and Dani Barron), then went to a all out press and forced the Rams into six turnovers in the final minutes to pull within 48-46 with just over 18 seconds remaining in the game.

After the Rams were fouled, they sank both free throws, Charlevoix was then unable to find the bottom of the net again and Harbor Springs came away with a 50-46 Class C district championship victory.

Lynzie Gotshall finished with a gamehigh 21 points and 11 boards to lead Charlevoixwhile Barron added 11 points, and Way finished with eight.

The Rayders had handled the Ramblers without




Leading the way in the semifinal loss was the always steady Dylan Putman with 23 points.
