Boyne cruises to pair of conference victories

Ramblers cruise past Blazers 61-13, outlast Rams 74-65

Boyne City 61, Kalkaska 13

BOYNE CITY — The Ramblers jumped out to an early lead and were on a roll at the half, leading 41-6 behind the aggressive play of sophomore Ryan Carson, who tallied 15 points and nine rebounds in Boyne's 61-13 Lake Michigan Conference victory on January 27.

The Ramblers built the insurmountable lead as they went to the bench early and often as every player saw a good number of minutes, with everyone getting in the scoring column.

"Our team defense was outstanding," Rambler coach Nick Redman said. "Every player was ready to compete tonight."

Boyne City, which improved to 8-2 overall, 5-2 conference, also got eight points, six steals and five assists from Keegan LaBlance.

"I am proud of how unselfish we were," coach Redman noted, "We had guys that got to play a ton and every player scored, also our student section was great again tonight!"

Kalkaska fell to 0-10 overall, 0-7 conference.

Boyne City 74, Harbor Springs 65

HARBOR SPRINGS — The Ramblers exploded out of the gates in the third quarter and made their

lead hold up en route to a 74-65 Lake Michigan Conference win on January 21.

Boyne took a slim 39-38 halftime lead and expanded it to a 69-48 cushion headed into the final stanza.

"We got off to a good start and our first group played real well," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "Our bench play wasn't as good tonight as it has been; everyone has to be ready to compete."

Boyne City, 7-2 overall, 4-2 conference, got 26 points, four assists and four steals from Keegan LaBlance, Jay Redman added 22 points, four assists, two steals, and Ryan Carson finished with 16 points and five boards.

"Keegan and Jay played real good all-around games tonight," coach Redman noted. "Also, Ryan was aggressive tonight; he looked to attack the basket."

The Rams pulled to within nine in the final quarter but were unable to trim the deficit.

Neal Zoerhof led Harbor Springs with 21 points, 4-7 overall, 2-3 conference, Spencer Kloss had 19 points and Peter Lauer finished with 10 points.

some tasty trivia for "SUPER SUNDAY"

"Super Sunday" is ready to roll onto some 100 million televisions across the globe this coming February 5th. While AFC champs New England Patriots and NFC champions New York Giants are set to kick off around 6:30 pm this Sunday evening, the "big game" is often a daylong ride for football fans perched on recliners and couches before big screens on Super Bowl Sunday.

Whether viewers tune in for the excitement on the gridiron, or the anticipation of the big budget commercials that will be evaluated around the water cooler on Monday, the Super Bowl is consistently one of the most watched broadcasts of the year. Young or old, male or female, sports fan or not, "the" place to be this Sunday evening is either in the stands at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, or on a cushion within viewing range of a television capturing the play by play of the ultimate pro football match-up of the year.

Of course, what is "super" in concept can become less than engaging when the action on the field runs a bit slow. So it's always a good idea to have some Super Bowl conversation at the ready... just in case.

The Game;

- While Super Bowl XLVI (that's 46 for those no longer using Roman numerals) is being played at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Indiana, the Indianapolis Colts will not be playing in the game. The last time the Colts played in a Super Bowl was in 2010, though they lost to the New Orleans Saints, and that game was played at Miami Gardens in Florida. Actually, a home team has never played a Super Bowl in the host city, though in 1980 the Pittsburgh Steelers did face the Los Angeles Rams close to their home, at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena for Super Bowl XIV.

- This year's contest will feature the New England Patriots, who

have made six Super Bowl appearances and won three, and the New York Giants, who have made four Super Bowl appearances and won three as well. Among those appearances, these two teams actually faced each other once before, in Super Bowl XLII in 2008, and the New York Giants came out on top; 17 to 14.

- The winning team receives the sterling silver Vince Lombardi Trophy, named after the late coach of the Green Bay Packers, plus each of the players will receive the much-coveted Super Bowl ring (valued at approximately \$5,000 apiece).

- Originally known as the AFL-NFL World Championship, the name "Super Bowl" was purportedly inspired after Lamar Hunt, founder of the AFC, when he saw his daughter playing with a "Super Ball" toy.

- No team has been shutout (left the game without scoring a point) and although three games were tied during the last minute of play, no Super Bowl has gone into overtime.

The Entertainment;

- Rock diva (and 2002 American Idol winner) Kelly Clarkson will sing the National Anthem prior to opening kick-off this year, and the halftime show will feature Bay City Michigan's own "Material Girl" and Rock & Roll Hall of fame inductee; Madonna (who does have a last name, which is Ciccone).

- Most of the early Super Bowls featured marching bands during halftime. That began to change in the late 1980's as musical idols from virtually every genre took the stage. Among the staggering variety of entertainers featured during Super Bowl halftime shows over the years are; Tony Bennett, Prince, Michael Jackson, Janet Jackson (who had wardrobe difficulties), Ella Fitzgerald, The Who, The Rolling Stones, George Burns and Mickey Rooney, Chubby Checker, Clint Black, Shania Twain, Smokey Robinson, Diana Ross, Bruce Springsteen, Britney

Spears, Paul McCartney and Tom Petty. Yes, the Super Bowl audience is certainly wide ranging.

Commercials;

- Approximately 60 to 70 commercials will air during the Super Bowl. USA Today recently reported that the average cost for a 30-second spot for this year's Super Bowl was \$3.5 million, and that some ran as high as \$4 million...that's \$133,333.33 per second. The U.S. national debt increases at a rate of about \$34,000 per second. Too bad the U.S. Government isn't selling Super Bowl ads.

- Some memorable Super Bowl commercial debuts included NY Jets Quarterback Joe Namath shaving his legs for Noxzema (1973), sharpshooters firing at a variety of Master Locks during the 1970's, Pittsburgh Steelers lineman "Mean Joe" Greene tossing a Coca-Cola to a young fan (1980), a "1984" themed ad (in 1984) showing a woman hurling a hammer at a "Big Brother" type face on a screen to promote the rise of Apple's Macintosh computers, the many "Bud Bowls" of the 1990's, and Michael Jordan and Larry Bird playing HORSE to promote McDonald's Big Macs (1993). Last year, a Snicker's commercial with Betty White and Abe Vigoda was the top choice on many Monday morning ad quarterback's lists.

Food;

- Snacks are a major part of Super Bowl Sunday. The Snack Food Association states the average American will double their snack consumption this Sunday, and the Calorie Control Council observes that snack consumption averages around 1,200 calories (not including meals). That represents nearly 33 million pounds of "goodies" gobbled nationwide during Super Sunday. About that gobbling - American's actually eat more food on one other national holiday; Thanksgiving.

- An estimated 28 million pounds of pretzels,

popcorn, potato and tortilla chips will be consumed during the day, an amount that laid end to end would stretch nearly 293,000 miles. The Calorie Control Council found that potato chip binging during Super Sunday represents about 1.8 billion fat grams nationwide, which translates to 4 million pounds of fat or the equivalent of 13,000 NFL linemen at 300 pounds each. Michigan leads the nation in the production of potatoes used in making potato chips.

To qualify The expanded refinancing program is available only to those with mortgages backed by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac, but the two entities back more than half of all mortgages.

Eligible homeowners can have missed only one payment in the

past year and must still bring in enough monthly income to afford their lower payment.

Some borrowers will be required to show proof they have the income to pay the lower mortgage payments, but the guidelines aren't clear on who will be required to do this.

HUD Secretary Shaun Donovan told The Arizona Republic in October that part of the goal of expanding the refinancing program is to reward homeowners who have continued to pay their mortgages despite huge drops in their home's values and potentially prevent more homeowners from

walking away. Estimates show nearly half of Arizona's mortgage holders are underwater.

The previous HARP plan, which allowed homeowners to refinance if their loan-to-value ratio was 125 percent or lower, had the same intent. But it helped few metro Phoenix homeowners because home values in the region have plummeted 60 percent during the crash.

While the program will be expanded, some borrowers aren't eligible.

Kim Baker has been in her Phoenix home for more than five years and owes at least 40 percent

more on her mortgage than what her house is worth. She can't refinance to reduce her 6.5 percent interest rate because her loan isn't backed by Fannie or Freddie. She wants the federal government to give lenders an incentive to help homeowners like her, too.

"Otherwise, we're stuck," she said. "Can't sell, can't re-fi, can't lower our payment, can't move to a cheaper house down the street. We didn't want to walk away or foreclose. So we keep paying every month hoping the economy turns around and maybe in several years we'll break even."
