## Rayders hold off Red Devils

### Charlevoix 58, East Jordan 56

EAST JORDAN – Sydney Carlson nailed six triple, including four in the second half en route to a game high/career high 22 points, in leading Charlevoix to a 58-56 victory in the opener of the Class C girls district at East Jordan High School on February 27.

With the win, Charlevoix, 8-13 overall, played Harbor Springs, 9-11 in semifinal action on Wednesday, February 29, after the paper went to press. District final is scheduled for March 2 at 7pm.

After a well played first half by the Rayders, Charlevoix found themselves up 28-15 at intermission, behind 18 first half points by senior Jenna Way. The Rayders extended that cushion to 34-17 early in the third quarter on a pair of Carlson three's, before the Red Devils halftime adjustments took hold and their offense got untracked as East Jordan climbed all the way back to take the lead at the midway point of the fourth quarter.

"We played an excellent first half," Charlevoix coach Leslie Hoffman said. "We felt good coming out to the second half and ready to maintain our intensity on defense and continue to look for good shots against their zone."

"We got off to a rough start in

the first half and were down 13 at halftime," East Jordan coach Steve Hines said. "We struggled with their press and we didn't shoot very well." "The second half was a different story as we scored 41 points in the half with 26 in the fourth quarter."

"I could not be prouder of the way we handled the ups and downs during this game," Hoffman said. "We never let up or felt defeated even after their big run."

The two teams exchanged leaded five times during the last four minutes of play, with the Rayders taking the lead for good 53-51 with just over a minute to go in the contest.

Charlevoix nailed 5-of-8 free throws down the stretch to seal the victory.

"Charlevoix's three point shooting did us in, Sydney Carlson was on fire," Hines noted. "I was very pleased with our effort in the second half, to go from 17 down to take the lead was an awesome comeback. This group has done this a few times this year; they seem to play best when their backs are against the wall...a sign of true character."

Jenna Way finished with 21 for Charlevoix and Carlson added nine rebounds.

East Jordan, which finished 13-8, was led by Jordyn Bacchus with 17, while Grace Howes added 11 and Val Peters had eight. Howes and Emily Crick were the leading rebounders.

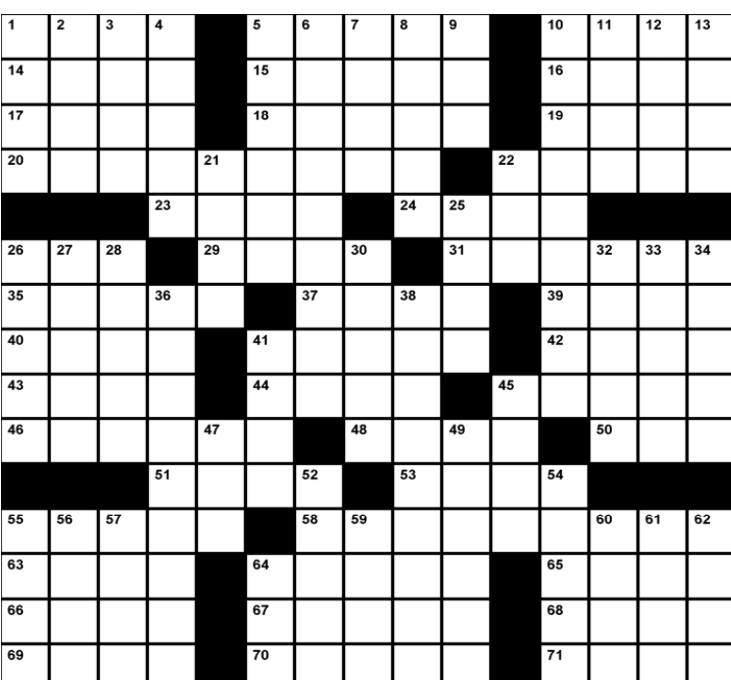

**CITY OF EAST JORDAN - ORDINANCE #224**

An Ordinance to Amend Section 46-77 Water Bills of the City of East Jordan Code of Ordinances

**The City of East Jordan hereby ordains:**

**Sec. 46-77. Water bills.**

(a) *Responsible person.* If more than one family takes water through a single tap the owner of the premises on which the tap is located shall in all cases be responsible for the water rent. The same applies to more than one family using water taken from a single service pipe. If individuals taking water from a single service pipe desire to meter their water separately they may do so by making application to the city administrator, paying for a separate meter and its installation. Upon doing so the separate meter shall belong to the party so paying, except that the city reserves the right to at all times inspect it and order its owner to repair it if it is in need of repair.

(b) *When due.* Water bills are due within 30 days of billing. Overdue charges are assessed a penalty as established by city commission resolution. Service shall be disconnected to customers who are at least 15 days past due and an additional amount prescribed by resolution of the city commission as an off-charge shall be levied. Members of the department of public works shall, without notice to the user or property owner, turn the water off until the bill has been paid in full, plus an additional charge in an amount prescribed by resolution of the city commission for turning on the water. The exception to this will be when the property owner requests the water to be turned on for a period of eight hours and back off for the purpose of a pre-purchase inspection. The fee for turning the water on and back off shall be paid in full prior to the service being turned on. The city shall incur no liability for any damages that may occur from having the water service turned on. During the winter months the property owner shall be required to have the snow removed from the meter pit and shall have the snow replaced after the service has been turned back off. The city will not be responsible for the meter freezing and the property owner shall be responsible to reimburse the city for all costs incurred as a result of a meter freezing.

(c) *Liens.* The charges for water service make a lien on all premises served thereby. When ever such charge against any piece of property shall be delinquent for six months such lien may be enforced following these procedures. Each year the city clerk will make a list of all unpaid water rentals in which shall be incorporated a description of the property, the name of the owner, the name of the user and the amount delinquent. The city clerk shall present such report to the city commission. At such meeting the commission shall fix a time and place for hearing objections to the placing of such delinquent water rents and charges on the city tax roll for collection. Such time of hearing shall not be less than 20 days nor more than 40 days from the time of fixing the same, and notice of such hearing shall be served by registered mail addressed to the last known address of the recipient. Each notice shall inform the owner of the time and place of hearing, the amount of water rentals and charges that are delinquent, and the intentions of the city to place such charges on the tax roll for collection unless legitimate reasons for not doing so are presented at such hearing. The city commission shall meet at the time and place of hearing and all persons interested shall be heard. The commission shall then determine by resolution all water rents and charges which shall constitute a lien upon any premises and shall in such resolution direct the city clerk to certify the same to the city assessor with instructions to enter the same upon the tax roll of the city for such year in an appropriate column for collection. Such determination shall state the last known owner of the premises, a description of the premises and the amount of water rent and charges. To the amount reported on the books of

the treasurer shall be added a charge of ten percent collection fee. Such water rents and charges shall thereupon be collected, receipted and returned in the same manner as other taxes.

(d) *Quarterly charges.* For the purpose of charging for water used, the year shall be divided into four quarters of three months each. Meters will be read at the close of each quarter. All users will be charged based on the amount of water used and at a rate established by commission resolution. Irrespective of and in addition to the amount of water used, each meter for each user will receive a minimum flat bill amount representing readiness-to-serve charges for the system. The minimum flat rate shall be determined by city commission resolution. In all cases where the water is turned off at the request of the owner or tenant or for non-payment of water bills or violation of this article an additional charge to be determined by resolution of the city commission will be made and it shall be paid to the city before the water is turned on. No reduction in rate, discount or rebate shall be allowed to any user unless it is determined that the water meter has not registered properly through no fault or neglect of the user.

(Code 1998, § 26-66; Ord. of 12-5-1995; Ord. No. 191, 3-16-2004)  
 Secs. 46-78—46-97. Reserved.

**Add the following sections:**

(e) *Rental/Lease Properties.* Each property owner is solely responsible for the water consumed and solely responsible for the payment of all water bills, fees and costs consumed at his/her premises and for timely payment. All water bills shall be put in the property owner's name and mailed to the property owner's address of record with the city. It is the property owner's sole responsibility to notify the city of a correct mailing address and any changes in mailing address. Further, the above lien detailed in Sub-Section C above shall not apply if a lease has been legally executed, containing a provision that the lessor shall not be liable for payment of water or sewage system bills accruing subsequent to the filing of the affidavit provided for under state law MCL 123.65. An affidavit with respect to the execution of a lease containing this provision shall be filed with the city and 20 days' notice shall be given by the lessor of any cancellation, change in, or termination of the lease. In the event that a lease and affidavit are appropriately filed, a lien shall not attach against the premises as provided in state statute, but the property owner shall remain responsible to the city for the payment of the water bill, which the city may enforce through any remedy available under the laws of the State of Michigan.

(f) *Tax Sale/Foreclosed Properties.* In the event a property is foreclosed under the General Property Tax Act (MCL 211.1 et seq), the city may seek to recover appropriate charges by including the delinquent water/sewer charges into the cost of the property at the time it is offered for sale under the General Property Tax Act and/or by instituting other lawful action against the former owner.
