BOYNE CITY – Much like the girls basketball season that came to an end almost two weeks ago, the boy's tournament capped its season this past weekend in East Lansing at the Breslin Center, crowing its respective Class champions.

So with the season closing its doors on the 2011-12 season, the Charlevoix County News is proud to announce the Boys All-Area Basketball "Dream Team".

It was a difficult decision that came right down to the wire, but after it was all said and done, Boyne Falls big man and Lawrence Tech signee, Josh Puroll has been selected as the Player of the Year for the second consecutive season.

that spends most of his time in the trenches, banging and battling for position night in and night out, is the Boyne Falls all-time leading scorer with more than 1750 points, and his rebound total is well over the 900 mark for his career. He repeatedly drew the attention of multiple defenders, and if a team was brave enough to try and play the fourth year Logger center one-onone, he made them pay for it by posting huge numbers against them.

This season, "JP" averaged 21.4 points and 11.6 rebounds per game, shooting a remarkable 74 percent from the floor and 63 percent from the charity stripe. His ability to draw multiple defenders opened up the outside for his teammates, and his unselfish play made him a much

When asked to reflect on this season, Puroll responded, "Well we wish we would have went further in the state tournament, and it was definitely a new challenge with all the new guys coming in at the begging of the year." "Overall, I think we came together as the season progressed and I know I am going to miss all of the open gyms and not being around the area, but I will definitely look for an opportunity to visit and see these guys continue to get better."

As far as Josh getting ready for the next step at Lawrence Tech, he said, "I'm working hard running, working out and doing drills to get where I need to be, coach Smith has been a positive influence on myself gym whenever we need him there and he pushes us past our limits and makes us better than we thought possible, I also like the fact that if your doing something incorrect, he stops you and lets you know and we work on fining it."



Keegan averaged 14.5 points per contest for the balanced Ramblers, while dishing out three assists, grabbing 2.5 boards and two steals

Boyne City's Ryan Carson edges Pellston's Chris Hass for BCAM Free Throw title

EAST LANSING - And then there were two.

After outlasting the top twenty of the state's best free throw shooters, it all came down to a pair of Northern Michigan boys, and when the dust settled, Boyne City's Ryan Carson stood alone as the BCAM (Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan) Free throw champion.

Carson, a sophomore, made all 10 of his finals free throw attempts, while Pellston senior, Christopher Hass made his first nine and saw his 10th rim off.

"We were all excited for Ryan," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "It was great that Ryan and Chris made the final, also it was nice to see a Boyne uniform on the Breslin floor."

The BCAM competition was made up of the top 20 free throw shooters in the state. Each player was nominated by their respective coaches.

The competition consisted of three rounds, Carson finished round one 21-of-25, while his Northern Michigan counterpart nailed 23-of-25. Round two saw Carson make 23-of-25 and Hass finished 22-of-25.

Those totals were good enough to move on to the finals at the Breslin Center, home of the Michigan State Spartans.

Having made the highest number of free throws in the second round, Carson got to choose whether he go first or last in the final round. He chose first, figuring to put the pressure on the Pellston senior.

In the final, each competitor matched shot for shot, until the final shot, that's when Hass's attempt rimmed off and Carson was the champion, going a per-







The hard-working Charlevoix Rayders; Andrew Plude, Andrew Potter, Tanner Catt and Charlie Hamilton bring their talents, offensive execution and defensive prowess to the table.

Andrew Plude, one of the best shooters in the Lake Michigan Conference averaged 17 points per game for the Rayders. Plude shot over 40 percent from down town on the season, and many times set the tone for the game for Charlevoix with his aggressive offensive style of play. Coach Wood noted that Plude is tremendous person and great student.

Charlevoix senior Andrew Potter averaged 15 points and six assists per game for the Rayders. Andrew was the floor leader for the Rayders this season and many times took the

team upon his shoulder and carried them through to victories. Coach Adam Wood said "Andrew is one of the toughest players I have ever been around in any sport and left all he had on the floor every single night, a great student and even better person!"

Junior Tanner Catt brought toughness and grittiness to the team each time he took the court and Coach Wood acknowledged that statistics do not describe what Tanner did for the team this season.

Catt was the top Rayder defender and one of the top rebounders on the team, despite only standing at 5'9".

The "sweet shooting" of junior Charlie Hamilton made him an easy selection as whenever he took the floor, he was like lightning in a bottle. If a defender played him too close, he would blow by them for a layup, and if they gave him the slightest bit of daylight, he would drain long range threes over the outstretched arms of defenders like it was nobody's business.

Charlie averaged 11 points per game, but had many nights as the leading scorer for Charlevoix while coming off the bench. If you underestimated him, he would make you pay as he played much larger than his 5'8" frame. Coach Wood described him as a much needed "spark" for the team this season.

East Jordan's John Richards led the Red Devils with a 10 point per game average, but found his mark down the stretch, notching games of 31, 27 and 23 points.

Sophomore Noah Bacchus was the motor that ran the East Jordan offense and led the team with a near four assist per game average while dropping six points per night for the Red Devils. His consistent play helped keep East Jordan in each contest this past

the squad, Seaney was a bright spot for the Lancers this season. His all around play and unselfishness helped lead the Lancers. He averaged a near double-double this year, but finished the season with a quadruple-double, and a pair of triple doubles.

Coach of the Year, Tim Smith led his Boyne Falls team to a 20-2 record, sweeping the Northern Lakes Conference with a perfect 12-0 record in the process. Both Logger losses came at the hands of the Bellaire Eagles, the first in the season's second game and in the district finals.

After starting the season 1-1, Smith and the Loggers peeled off 19 straight wins, where as Boyne Falls averaged 69 points per game, while allowing only 39 per contest. On the season the Loggers averaged 66 points and allowed 40 per game.

"When we took over the program two years ago, we set goals of winning our league and advancing in the state tournament." Smith said. "I think that within that time frame, we have closed the gap on the elite teams in the state, one of which is in our district in the form of Bellaire."

While talking with the coach, it was notice- Ellsworth able that he wasn't relaxing at home or on the beach somewhere vacationing, you could hear the clanking of weights and encouragement of teammates pushing each other in the

weight room. "We have six guys in the weight room right now," Smith noted. "As a smaller school, we are going to have to outwork everyone and it starts in the offseason, and these guys have

bought into that and believe it." While Boyne Falls will say goodbye to the graduating Puroll and Jenkins, Smith will return a young, but very capable cast to give Boyne Falls a chance to defend its Northern Lakes Conference title as well as the Loggers

will look to unseat Bellaire in district play. "Also, while we are losing some great leadership in our seniors, and those guys have set the bar for future teams to reach for, we are excited for next season, where our middle school and junior varsity programs are doing well and we are developing the missing pieces. I think we will have a little more depth, be more versatile and may play more up-tempo, but all that hinges on how we develop in the off season, we do have the chance to be real good though."
