In fact, nationwide, over 40% of lowincome adults have at least one untreated decayed tooth. In many areas of the country, people with low incomes who are enrolled in

Medicaid or have no health insurance cannot find a dentist to treat them. In a unique partnership with local health departments, thousands of residents across the tip of the mitt can get oral health care at Dental Clinics North, a system of public health dental clinics.

Dental Clinics North offers comprehensive oral care for children and adults with Medicaid, Healthy Kids Dental, MIChild, or Northern Dental Plan. For those without dental insurance, Northern Dental

Plan offers services at a reduced fee based on income eligibility.

"Dental Clinics North is a great program," Yaroch said. "If your teeth hurt, it's difficult to eat, talk, and sleep. Some oral health problems can affect the way you feel about yourself too. We have many success stories from clients who've gone back to school or found new jobs after their problem teeth were addressed. Getting teeth fixed can be a life-changing experience.'

Dental Clinics North caters to

patients with Medicaid, Delta Healthy Kids, Northern Dental Plan, and those with low income who are uninsured. Oral exams, cleaning, fluoride treatments, fillings, dentures, and other procedures are available at Dental Clinics North locations in Alpena, Cheboygan, East Jordan, Gaylord, Mancelona, Petoskey, Traverse City, and West Branch. National Infant Immunization Week April 22-28, 2012

National Infant Immunization Week is annual observance to highlight the importance of protecting infants from vaccine-preventable diseases. It's also a good reminder to check family immunization records to be sure everyone, especially babies, are up-to-date.

Each year, thousands of children become ill from diseases that could have been prevented by basic childhood immunizations. According to public health officials, there have been two disease outbreaks in recent years in the local health district: a major pertussis (Whooping Cough) outbreak that spread to four counties in 2010 and a varicella (chickenpox) outbreak in the fall of 2011.

"Giving babies the recommended immunizations by age two is the best way to protect them from serious childhood diseases, like whooping cough," said Pat Fralick, Director of Family & Community Health Services. "We're encouraging

parents and caregivers to check their babies' immunization records this week. Babies need several doses of vaccine before age two and it can be hard to keep track of which ones they need."

Before they are fully immunized, babies need extra protection from becoming infected with pertussis from the people who are in close contact with them. Parents, grandparents, and caregivers should receive pertussis vaccine too. Immunizing both adults and infants is the best way to protect babies from contracting this serious disease.

Immunization is important because it prevents deadly diseases. In the days before immunization, millions of people died from devastating infectious diseases like diphtheria, polio, and whooping cough.

"Most of us have never seen first-hand the discomfort, disability, and even death that these diseases—all preventable



through immunization—can cause, said Fralick. "They still exist today. In fact, we've seen local whooping cough and chickenpox outbreaks in recent years."

Health Department staff work very hard to maintain high immunization rates. Every time a child visits a health department office, his/her immunization record is reviewed for missing doses of vaccine, no matter what the reason for their appoint-

The Health Department of Northwest Michigan is mandated by the Michigan Public Health Code to promote wellness, prevent disease, provide quality healthcare, address health problems of vulnerable populations, and protect the environment for the residents and visitors of Antrim, Charlevoix, Emmet, and Otsego counties.

Immunizations can save your child's life.

Dear Editor,

You want to do what is best for your children. You know about the importance of car seats, baby gates and other ways to keep them safe. But, did you know that one of the best ways to protect your children is to make sure they have all of their vaccinations?

Immunizations can save your child's life. Because of advances in medical science, your child can be protected against more diseases than ever before. Some diseases that once injured or killed thousands of children, have been eliminated completely and others are close to extinction-primarily due to safe and effective vaccines. One example of the great impact that vaccines can have is the elimination of polio in the United States. Polio was once America's most-feared disease, causing death and paralysis across the country, but today, thanks to vaccination, there are no reports of polio in the United States.

Vaccination is very safe and effective. Vaccines are only given to children after a long and careful review by scientists, doctors, and healthcare professionals. Vaccines will involve some discomfort and may cause pain, redness, or tenderness at the site of injection but this is minimal compared to the pain, dis-

comfort, and trauma of the diseases these vac- against these diseases is a good investment cines prevent. Serious side effects following and usually covered by insurance. The Health vaccination, such as severe allergic reaction, are very rare. The disease-prevention benefits of getting vaccines are much greater than the possible side effects for almost all children.

Immunization protects others you care about. Children in the U.S. still get vaccinepreventable diseases. In fact, we have seen resurgences of measles and whooping cough (pertussis) over the past few years, including a pertussis outbreak here in northern Michigan. In 2010 the U.S. had over 21,000 cases of whooping cough reported and 26 deaths, most in children younger than 6 months. Because some babies are too young to be completely vaccinated, they need parents, grandparents, caregivers and others who are in close contact with them to receive the pertussis vaccine. Immunizing both adults and infants is the best way to protect babies from pertussis.

Immunizations can save your family time and money. A child with a vaccine-preventable disease can be denied attendance at schools or daycare facilities. Some vaccine-preventable diseases can result in prolonged disabilities and can take a financial toll because of lost time at work, medical bills or long-term disability care. In contrast, getting vaccinated

Department does not turn any child or adolescent away for inability to pay for immunizations required for school.

Immunization protects future generations. Vaccines have reduced and, in some cases, eliminated many diseases that killed or severely disabled people just a few generations ago. For example, smallpox vaccination eradicated that disease worldwide. Your children don't have to get smallpox shots anymore because the disease no longer exists. By vaccinating children against rubella (German measles), the risk that pregnant women will pass this virus on to their fetus or newborn has been dramatically decreased, and birth defects associated with that virus no longer are seen in the United States. If we continue vaccinating now, and vaccinating completely, parents in the future may be able to trust that some diseases of today will no longer be around to harm their children in the future.

Clear your countertops of everything except items you use nearly every day.

After you've de-cluttered, you can get to work cleaning. Cloud Conrad, vice president of marketing for cleaning company Maid Brigade, says

one tool you shouldn't overcrofiber cloth (about \$5). These aren't run-of-the-mill dusting rags. Microfiber is a densely woven synthetic fabric that picks up dirt and greasy deposits without chemicals thanks to its unique composition. You should be able to clean surfaces like countertops, sinks, and stoves with warm water, a microfiber cloth, and a bit of elbow grease, Conrad says.

Since you prepare your food in the kitchen, consider using

green commercial products for surfaces, or make your own vinegar/water spray. Conventional cleaners may remove dirt, but they can also harbor some nasty substances you don't want in your PB&J. Microfiber, vinegar, and baking soda will clean and disinfect almost every kitchen surface at a fraction of the price. Don't neglect once-ayear chores like vacuuming refrigerator coils (unplug your fridge first), and tossing out expired food from the back of the pantry.


