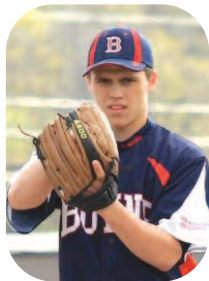

In the Ramblers first game

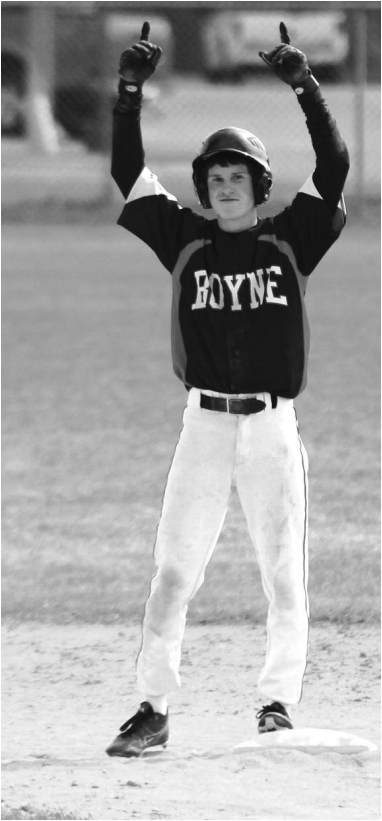

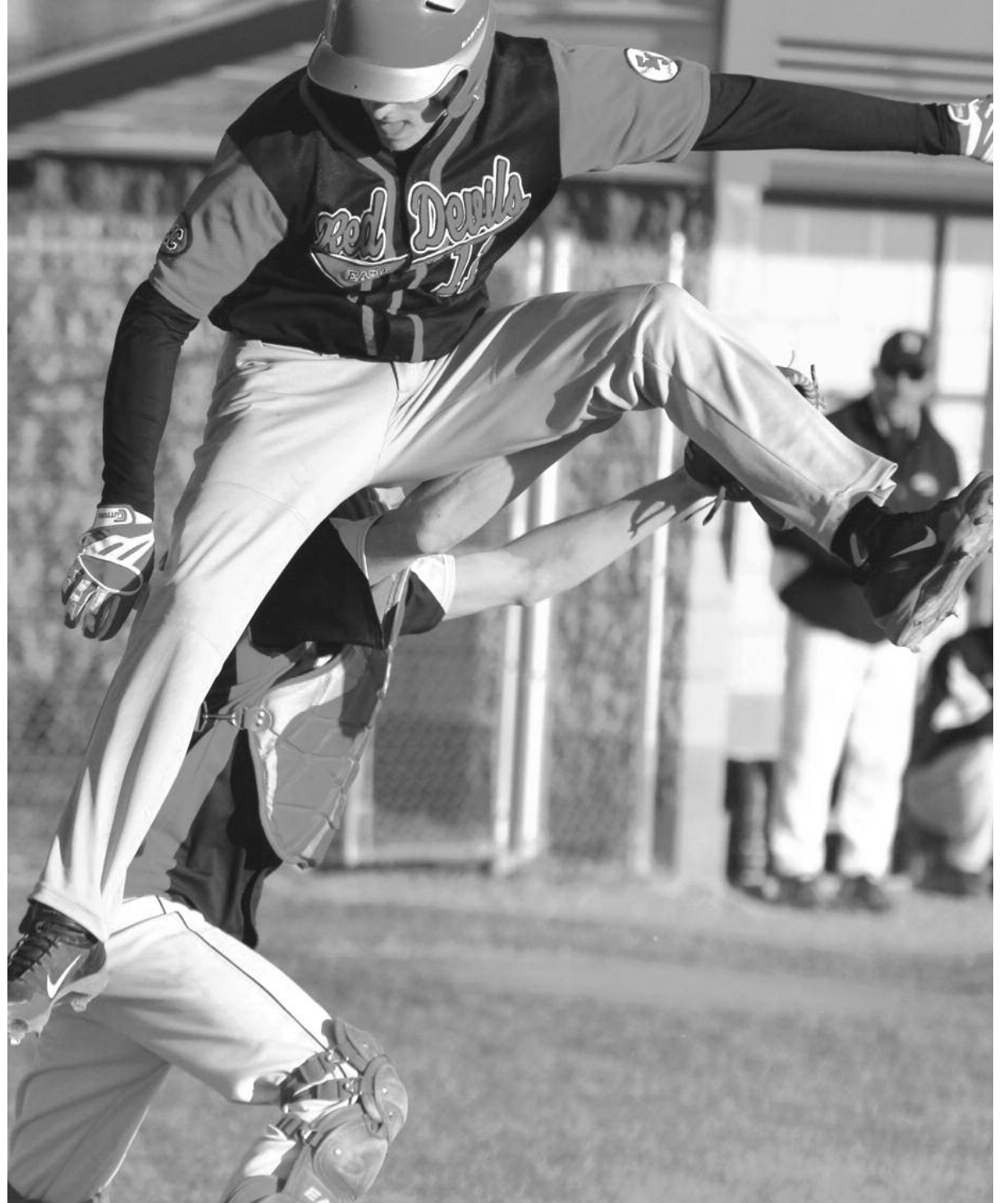
Keegan LaBlance, Austen Gardner and Tanner Roberts all singled for the Ramblers.
