Loggers Marcus Matelski is regular season Player of the Year

Red Devils Bacchus is post-season Player of the Year

BOYNE FALLS — With a successful tournament run from both East Jordan and Boyne Falls, the Charlevoix County sports fans had their basketball season extended for a few weeks as both teams captured district crowns and the Red Devils also bringing home their first regional title in over 50 years.

This regular season saw Boyne City, Boyne Falls and East Jordan put together outstanding campaigns, with the Ramblers going 18-1 and the Loggers 17-1, with both squads posting undefeated records in the Lake Michigan and Northern Lakes Conferences, while the Red Devils finished their regular season 15-4 and a second place finish in the LMC.

With post season accolades pouring in for our area athletes, the Charlevoix County News is proud to announce the 2013-14 Boys Basketball All-Area "Dream Team."

This seasons "Dream
Team" has an array of talent,
varying from all-around athletes that can play all five positions, to lightning quick
guards that can get to the rim
with the slightest opening, to
high flyers and perimeter
threats that can knock down a
triple from the moment they
enter the gym.

After going over all the necessary statistical information and each student-athletes importance to their team and what those individuals faced every night on the court, the selection for regular season Player of the Year goes to Boyne Falls sophomore, Marcus Matelski, while postseason Player of the Year goes to none other than East Jordan's Noah Bacchus.

(#32) MARCUS MATELSKI

(#32) Marcus Matelski in his third season on the Logger varsity, averaged an area high, 26 points per game, while hauling in nine boards, dishing out three assists and making three steals per contest. Marcus also shot an amazing 63 percent from the field, while knocking down 86 percent of his free throws.

"He played more point guard for us this year which probably hurt his scoring a little but made us a better team," Boyne Falls coach Tim Smith said. "The thing that is amazing about Marcus is that he sees junk defense in almost every game and still puts up unbelievable numbers while only playing a little more than half the game in many instances. He does this because he really knows how to play the game without the ball. He is a tremendous rebounder and can score every

possible way a player can score, and he is a tremendous defensive player who has the versatility to defend all five

positions."
Matelski was recently selected to the AP Class D All-State team.

"Being selected to the allstate team as a sophomore is a great accomplishment," coach Smith noted. "But the neat thing about Marcus that he is the first to tell you that all of his accolades are really team awards. He understands that without team success he probably doesn't get the recognition he has earned."

(#10) Noah Bacchus enjoyed an outstanding regular season where he averaged 19 points per game, was plus 26 in the assist to turnover ratio (85 assist-59 turnovers), made 34 steals and led the team in rebounding with 105. The 5-9 guard also shot 42 percent from the floor and 83 percent from the free throw line. He finished with a game-high 38 points in a win over Kalkaska earlier in the year.

"In my opinion, the best guard in Northern Michigan," East Jordan coach Darrin Weber said.

And while that is one heck of a regular season, his



biggest team contributions would come during the Red Devils march to the Class C quarterfinals. It was during the tournament where "Mr. Big Shot" would take over and lead his team, averaging 20.2 points per game, including game winning/buzzer beating shots against Charlevoix and Beaverton, both coming in overtime. He had game-highs of 28 and 27 points in those contests.

"Noah carried us through the tournament," coach Weber added. "Throughout the course of the season, he learned to trust his teammates, but when the games on the line, we want the ball in his hands."

Joining Marcus and Noah on the 2014 All-Area "Dream Team" by alphabetical team order are; Brendan Matelski and Andrew Stevens of Boyne Falls; Cole Butler, Ryan Carson, Bradley Fouchia, Corey Redman and Maceo Vroman of Boyne City; Charlevoix is represented by Nate Moon, Justin Pearl and Austin Putman; Donny Cutler and Jordan Weber of East Jordan and Ellsworth Diamond McPherson and Nate Veldboom.

Boyne Falls

(#21) BRENDAN MATELSKI, SENIOR.

A four-year starter for the Loggers, averaged 12 points per game, while grabbing five rebounds, making three steals and handing out two assists per contest.

"Brendan's scoring was down this year, but his defense was outstanding," coach Smith said. "He guarded all five positions and was exceptional in doing so, he brought a toughness to our team and was our leader."

Brendan compiled a 75-12 record during his career, winning three conference titles and a district title. His toughness showed during the Loggers regional tournament run as he played with a broken wrist.

(#3) ANDREW STEVENS, JUNIOR.

Stevens, in his second year on the varsity, ran the point for the Loggers and averaged seven points, five assists and three rebounds from his guard position. He connected on 40 percent of his three point shots, while knocking down 72 percent of his free throws.

"Andrew is like a coach on the floor," coach Smith noted. "He is as intelligent as any player I have ever coached. He finished with a 3 to 1 assist to turnover ratio and turned himself into a good three point shooter."

"He is a championship player who make great decisions and never falters in the big moments as he proved in district final when he made four straight three point shots in third quarter."

Boyne City

(#21) COLE BUTLER, JUNIOR.

The sharpshooting wingman, seemed to get the Rambler offense kickstarted many times in games during the season, whether it be taking it too the hoop for an easy two or knocking down a triple.

Cole averaged 10 points per game and was Boyne's best spot up shooter according to coach Nick Redman.

(#10) RYAN CARSON, SENIOR.

Whether it was a triple from downtown or a high-flying slam dunk, Ryan often times got the Rambler crowd jumping out of their seats with his athletic play.

Carson led Boyne City with 13.5 points per game and 6.5 rebounds, while shooting 59 percent from the floor and 72 percent from the charity stripe. He poured in a season-high 30 points in an overtime victory over TC St. Francis in late January.

He will take his skills to the next level in the fall as a member of the Lake Superior State men;s basketball team.

(#3) BRADLEY FOUCHIA, SENIOR.

Bradley ran the point for the Ramblers and used his quickness and ball handling skills to shake defenders for a quick layup or he would roam around the perimeter and take the open three when the opportunity presented itself.

Bradley finished the season averaging 9.5 points and 2.5 steals per game.

(#2) COREY REDMAN, JUNIOR.

The five tool player, often times found himself matched up with the opponents best offensive threat and more times than not, shut him down.

Corey averaged 12.5 points, six rebounds and three assists per game for Boyne, while shooting 59 percent from the floor and 45 percent

from beyond the arch. He put together a huge game against Joburg in the district semifinals, scoring 27 points on seven shots and shooting 12-of-12 from the charity stripe, while, grabbing nine boards and dishing out four assists.

(#54) MACEO VROMAN, JUNIOR.

The 5-9 guard was the Ramblers best on ball defender and was in charge of disrupting the opponents ability to get into their offensive

He averaged eight points per game for Boyne, picking up a career high of 19 against Class D ranked Cedarville in the Ramblers regular season finale.

"Each member of our team sacrificed their own individual stats this year for team success," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "It wasn't easy, but once they saw how well balanced scoring was working, we think they got the idea."

(#11) NATE MOON. JUNIOR.

The six foot guard, finished second on the Rayders in scoring with a 9.5 per game average, while also hauling in four rebounds.

Nate would often times be matched up against the opponents most versatile player.

(#43) AUSTIN PUTMAN, SOPHOMORE.

Austin filled some big shoes this season, as he stepped in for the injured Zach Hankins and did not disappoint.

Putman led Charlevoix with 11.7 points and eight rebounds per game. His physical style of play would make things difficult for opponents.

(#12) JUSTIN PEARL, SENIOR.

Justin was in charge of running the show for the Rayders this season. He averaged 4.5 points and six assists per game from his point guard position.

East Jordan

(#12) DONNY CUTLER, SOPHOMORE.

The cat-like quickness of Cutler, created nightmares for opponents on both sides of the ball. Donny would often times get to the rim without hesitation, while creating havoc for the opponents best ball handler.

Donny seemed to pick up his play as the tournament went along, handling pressure sit uations as if they was nothing on the line at all. He finished the season averaging eight points per game, he led the Red Devils with 43 steals and was second on team with 60 assists.

"Donny was the best defender on the team," Red Devils coach Darrin Weber said. "He really improved as the year went on."

(#32) JORDAN WEBER, SOPHOMORE.

Jordan finished second on the Red Devils in scoring this season with a 15 per game average. while shooting 80 percent from the free throw

Jordan had a game-high of 36 against St. Ignace late in the season, connecting on eight triples in the contest.

"He is a great perimeter shooter, making 54 threes this season," coach Weber added.

Ellsworth

DIAMOND MCPHERSON, SENIOR.

Diamond finished second on the Lancers in scoring this season with a 7.6 average, while also hauling in 3.8 rebounds and dishing out 2.2 assists from his guard position.

Diamond also shot 37 percent from the floor and 74 percent from the charity stripe. He had a season-high 23 points against Alba late in the season.

NATE VELDBOOM, SENIOR.

Nate led Ellsworth with 13.3 points per game this year, while grabbing 7.8 rebounds and making 2.4 steals per contest.

Nate also shot 59 percent from the floor and had a season-high 20 points against both Alba and Alanson during the season.

Coach of the Year - Regular season

Coach of the Year honors go to Boyne City's Nick Redman. Coach Redman helped lead the Ramblers to a 20-2 record, including an 18-1 regular season which saw Boyne go 14-0 in the Lake Michigan Conference, winning their first conference title in 16 years.

"Proud of how the guys handled being ranked in the top 5 in the state all year," coach Redman said. "To play a tough schedule and get everybody's best shot every night and still win 20 games and go undefeated in our confer-

ence is something everyone should be proud "Really happy with how our program has developed over the past three years, winning 48 games, a district and conference champi-

onship," he added. "Thanks to all the players for being focused and working hard, all the coaches from our youth programs on up and all the support from our community and ad-

McLaren Northern Michigan

To complete our series on the Health of Northern Michigan Hospitals we spoke with McLaren Northern Michigan in Petoskey to find out what challenges and successes they have met with in light of recent government mandated health care changes.

McLaren Northern Michigan covers the eastern Upper Peninsula and a large portion of northern Michigan. The hospital offers acute **Emergency Department services** and has specialists available for this care around the clock which differs from various other local hospitals and makes it necessary for McLaren to serve 10 different counties when it comes to emergent

The hospital is the largest facility in the area which houses 202 beds total. The hospital also focuses on outreach specialty care and provides patient clinics in 20 communities in the region. Due to its size and the amount of people McLaren cares for, the hospital has faced challenges in light of the Affordable Care Act.

We spoke with Patricia Sewarch, the Director of Strategic Sale and Business Development for McLaren Northern Michigan who shared

with us the problems and triumphs that the hospital has faced. She explained that the hospital has dealt with continual changes in government regulations and the reduced reimbursements from insurers recently. In addition they have struggled with bad debt and increased

"To meet these challenges, McLaren Northern Michigan must carefully reduce and control costs while focusing on providing awardwinning care," said Sewarch.

In fact, part of the recent decision to partner with McLaren Health Care in 2012 was actually due to the impending changes that the hospital saw coming in the future. The hope is to be part of a larger system that may help offset high costs while maintaining a strong hospital for the northern Michigan area.

"Our decision to become an affiliate of McLaren Health Care in 2012 was based on our understanding of looming market changes...this affiliation has enabled us to continue to build our specialty strengths in northern Michigan while reducing operational costs," explained Sewarch.

This partnership has indeed made it possible for McLaren to focus on its specialty services,

which is proved by the recent national recognition given to the hospital for its transcatheter aortic valve replacement program by the Michigan Heart and Vascular Specialists in 2013. The success rates for the program are higher than the national average, and thoracic surgeons have earned Three-Star recognition in both 2012 and 2013. This recognition places those surgeons in the top 10-15% of thoracic surgeons nationwide and is the highest level of recognition by the Society of Thoracic Surgeons for bypass surgery.

The hospital hopes that by focusing their attention on extraordinary specialty patient care the challenges created by the Affordable Care Act will be weathered gracefully, and that although recent challenges have led to cutbacks in staff, they will do their utmost to keep the medical care top quality in future years.

Throughout our series we have focused on how our area hospitals are doing in light of the issues created by the Affordable Care Act, overall each hospital has faced their share of struggles but is doing their utmost to maintain impeccable care and reduce costs to focus on patients and not finances.

KNOCK DOWN CANCER TODAY

Cancer rates around the world will skyrocket 57 percent in the next 20 years, says a sobering new report from the World Health Organization. What you may not know: In North America, despite amazing advances in treating cancers, the number of cases will increase dramatically -- up 52 percent in Mexico, 55 percent in the U.S., and 66 percent in Canada! But this doesn't have to happen.

One-third of common cancers can be prevented by adopting an improved nutrition and weight-loss plan, getting regular physical activity, managing stress and avoiding tobacco -- everything we outline in "YOU: On a Diet.' If everyone followed those recommendations it would eliminate 374,000 new cases of cancer annually, including 38 percent of breast cancers, 11 percent of prostate cancers, 50 percent of colon cancers, 36 percent of lung cancers and 24 percent of kidney cancers. And, according to researchers from the University of Michigan and the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle, each of these healthy steps can reduce your risk of dying from cancer by 10 percent; do them all, and your risk plummets 61 percent.

In many corners of the world folks can't get the screening tests for colon, prostate or breast cancer that catch precancerous growths and cancers in their earliest, most treatable stages. But here, in North America, these screens are more readily available. And you're getting them regularly, right? We bet you're also smart enough to follow these powerful cancer-dodging steps:

Stop smoking. Tobacco is the world's leading cause of cancer deaths. So if you've tried to quit before, try again. Smokers try, on average, eight to 10 times before they quit for good. (Go to sharecare.com for help.)

Move, move, move. Get 30 minutes of activity minimum daily. We suggest walking. Build up to 10,000 steps a day and add in 30 minutes of weights two to three times a week. Then ease into cardio. You'll reduce your cancer risk by boosting immunity and stopping your body's overproduction of cancer-fueling compounds like insulin, prostaglandins and some hormones.

Load up on produce; and choose 100 percent whole grains. Fruit, veggies and grain are loaded with fiber that boosts immunity and helps keep your gut bacteria in a cancer-fighting mood. Plus, they deliver phytochemicals that cool inflammation and protect your DNA. Eat nine servings of produce, and three to four of whole grains daily, and you'll get cancer-fighters like indoles from broccoli and cabbage, lutein in tomatoes (cooked tomatoes are best), anthocyanins in blueberries and raspberries, and lignans and phenolics in grains.

Go easy on red meat, eliminate processed meat and moderate your alcohol consumption. A red-meat-heavy diet raises colon cancer risk 28 percent and your risk for many other cancers almost as much. Processed meats may be even unhealthier. If you drink alcohol, stick with one drink or less per day for women, two or less for men; excess alcohol can raise risk for cancers of the colon, liver, breast and mouth.

Give these food felons the heave-ho. Added sugars and syrups and refined flours increase inflammation and cancer-feeding glucose levels, and they push cancer-fighters like fresh fruit, veggies and whole grains off your

Whittle your middle. Carrying extra pounds, especially at your waist, increases odds for cancers of the breast, colon, kidneys, esophagus, pancreas and gallbladder. Hormones released from fat cells encourage development of tumors and stimulate their growth, while bodywide inflammation fuels cancer development. The best belly-busting foods? Nonfried fish rich in omega-3 and omega-7 fatty acids, fiber-rich 100 percent whole grains and veggies, and walnuts, almonds and avocados.

Ask your doc about lowdose aspirin. Meta-studies show that daily low-dose aspirin cuts risk for colon, lung, pancreatic, ovarian and eight other cancers by 20 percent to 40 percent. Aspirin also cuts the risk that a cancer will spread by 35 percent. Ask your doc if aspirin is right for you (it can be a risk for digestive bleeding). We take 80 milligrams twice a day, with a half-glass of warm water before and after to reduce negative side effects.

New healthcare plan in Michigan

There has been a lot of talk lately about Obamacare and all of the controversies surrounding this topic, but something you may not have heard about is the new Healthy Michigan Plan. This is a plan that has health care benefits available to individuals at a low

Even if you have heard about this new plan that became available April 1st, you may want to know a little more about it before you decide if it's right for you.

A basic question when it comes to a health care plan is whether or not you qualify for it. For the Healthy Michigan Plan you have to be between the ages of 19 and 64, have income at or below 133% of the federal poverty level (16,000 for a single person or 33,000 for a family of 4), don't qualify for or are not enrolled in Medicare or Medicaid, are not pregnant at the time of application, and are a resident of Michigan.

Another common question is what the plan actually covers. The Healthy Michigan Plan covers the federal healthcare law essential



benefits as well as other services and benefits. Some of these benefits include emergency services, hospitalization, prescription drugs, preventive and wellness services, and pediatric services for 19 and 20 vear olds. Other medically necessary services as appropriate are also covered. For a full list of what is covered under this plan, visit www.michigan.gov/healthymiplan and check out the Healthy Michigan Plan Handbook.

The actual monthly fee that you pay for this healthcare plan is evaluated and determined based on the services that you receive in the first six months that you have the plan. The individuals that have an annual income between 100% and 133% of the federal poverty level are required to contribute 2% of their annual income for cost sharing purposes. A list of co-pays associated with the plan is also available in the Healthy Michigan

Plan Handbook.

If this healthcare plan is something that you want to apply for, you can do so online (www.michigan.gov/mibridges), over the phone (855-789-5610), or in person at a Department of Human Services

After you have enrolled in the Healthy Michigan Plan, you need to do two things: complete the Healthy Michigan Plan Health Risk Assessment which can be mailed to you or found at michigan.gov/healthymiplan under the "After Enrollment" tab, and schedule a check-up with your doctor. You will want to take the assessment form with you to this doctor's visit because your doctor will sign the form for you. If you need help completing the form, you can call the Beneficiary Help Line at 1-800-642-3195.

This plan could be good news for people who want healthcare but can't afford anything else. If you want to look into the Healthy Michigan Plan for yourself and see if it is right for you, visit michigan.gov/healthymiplan and take a look at all of the details.

ORDINANCE NO. 232 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE II. PARK REGULATIONS, SECTION 30.20 "HAWKING, PEDDLING, SELLING" and **SECTION 30.34 "NONPROFIT-SPONSORED ACTIVITIES"**

THE CITY OF EAST JORDAN HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amendment of Section 30.20 "Hawking, Peddling, Selling." Section 30.20 is hereby deleted in its entirety and shall be amended to read as

OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF EAST JORDAN

follows:

30.20. Hawking, Peddling or Selling in Parks

(a) The City may permit public, private, for-profit or nonprofit street vendors, roadside stands and transient merchants to operate within the City's parks, excluding the Campground within the Tourist Park, Community Park, Murphy Field baseball and softball fields, and the Harbor Docks and the Boat Launch.

(b) Said operations shall be subject to the approval of an annual license or permit by the City Administrator, or his/her designee, on forms and with requirements and conditions as determined by the City Administrator in consultation with the City Parks Director. License or permit conditions may include, but are not necessarily limited to such

> Designated locations within parks where vending would be permitted or prohibited (lawns, sidewalks, parking lots, internal streets, drives, etc.)

> Requirements for obtaining a license or permit (permit fee, liability insurance, health department permits, etc.) Requirements for operating in a park (trash removal, no use of electric-

> ity or water, times of operation, noise limits, signage, etc.) Whether allowed during special events in the parks as permitted by the City Administrator (including, but not limited to such events as the Freedom Festival, Portside Arts Fair, South Arm Classics, Farmers Market, etc.)

> Whether there are similar operations already permitted in a park area, or if there is sufficient room to accommodate any further operations without creating crowding, vehicle or pedestrian traffic and safety issues.

(c) Nonprofit, civic service or association sponsored fundraising activities (food & snack sales, etc.) may be permitted during the an organization's scheduled and pre-approved events at the baseball, softball, Little League and soccer fields located at Community Park and Murphy Field. Organizations desiring to conduct such activities and sales shall submit such requests as a part of an annual application process for use of the facilities for leagues, tournaments and special events. The application process shall be approved in advance of the use by the City Administrator, or his/her designee, on forms and with requirements and conditions as determined by the City Administrator in consultation with the City Parks Director. License or permit conditions may include, but are not necessarily limited to the items listed in Section 30.20(b) of this Article, as well as any additional conditions placed on the use of existing vending facilities, snack booths, refreshment buildings, or similar City-owned structures. The City Commission may establish a fee for the use of said structures to offset the public costs of utilities (water, sewer, electric), maintenance and depreciation. (d) Nothing in this Section shall preclude the City, or its designee, from offering

for sale or resale in any city park staples and basic supplies for camping, boating and general enjoyment of a park, including by example, but not limited to such items as ice, firewood, non-alcoholic beverages, camping or boating supplies, gasoline/fuel, wireless Internet access, television service, etc.

Section 2. Amendment of Section 30.34. Nonprofit-Sponsored Activities Section 30.34 is hereby deleted in its entirety and shall be amended to read a follows:

Sec. 30-34. – Nonprofit-sponsored activities.

Events sponsored by nonprofit organizations that restrict an individual's right to use and enjoy the public parks for their intended purposes must be approved by the City Administrator. The City Commission may require user fees to offset the public costs involved with the activity or may choose to waive any and all user fees. Such waivers shall be based on criteria as established by the City Commission.

Section 3. **Effective Date.**

This ordinance shall take effect seven (7) days following its enactment and publication as provided by the City Charter.
