Earn pair of LMC wins with outstanding team play

BOYNE CITY — The Boyne City boys basketball team has reeled off six straight wins and playing at a high level after opening the season 0-2, as they controlled the contest from the opening tipoff in downing Kalkaska 76-33 in Lake Michigan Conference action on January 23.

"Really happy with how the team is working hard and improving," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "Especially on defense. Another great team effort and great opportunity to get a lot of guys playing time."

The Ramblers improved to 6-2 overall, 4-1 conference with the win as Boyne raced out to an early lead and carried a 21-9 cushion into the second quarter. That margin would increase to a 39-16 advantage at halftime before they would put away the Blazers with strong third and fourth quarters, outscoring Kalkaska 37-17 after intermission.

Boyne City had 14 players score in the contest, led by seniors, Corey Redman and Zach Napont as Redman finished with 16 points, six assists and four rebounds, while Napont added 10 points to go with four rebounds and four


Hannah Hoth would add nine points for Boyne, all coming from three 3-pointers, while Jordan Weiss scored four points.


The Lady Glads led at the quarter breaks 18-4, 36-10 and 46-24.



Sunday, February 1st is "Big Game" day. Super Bowl XLIX (or 49 in less numerically dramatic fashion) rolls into the University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Arizona for a 6:30 pm kickoff this coming Sunday evening, February 1st. This year's event pits the New England Patriots against the Seattle Seahawks, and while not over-inflating the pregame hype: this year's contest promises to put a little extra pressure on Patriot quarterback Tom Brady as he faces off against Seahawks QB Russell Wilson who has a 10-0 career record when squaring off with Super Bowl winning quarterbacks.

- Seattle's defense is rated the best in the league including first in points per game, first in rushing yards per game and first in passing yards per game (now that's a defense on the offence).

 New England QB Tom Brady has thrown three or more touchdown passes during seven postseason games, the second most in NFL postseason history.

- Sunday will mark the eighth New England Super Bowl appearance (3-4) and Seattle's third (1-1) – the Seahawks won the Super Bowl last year for those who may have missed it.

Whether gathering with family or a few friends, or taking part in a huge Super Bowl Sunday celebration, it can be fun to have a few crumbs of game day trivia handy to share as the gridiron battle unfolds.

When the AFL and NFL merged in 1970, the contest between the American Football Conference (AFC) and National Football Conference (NFC) was renamed "Super Bowl" as proposed by Lamar Hunt, founder of the AFC. The name was purportedly inspired after Mr. Hunt saw his daughter playing with a "Super Ball" toy

- Most of the early Super Bowls featured marching bands during halftime. That began to change in the late 1980's as musical idols from virtually every genre took the stage. Among the staggering variety of entertainers featured during Super Bowl halftime shows over the years are; Tony Bennett,
Prince, Michael Jackson,
Carol Channing and Ella
Fitzgerald, The Who, The
Rolling Stones, George Burns
and Mickey Rooney, Chubby
Checker, Clint Black, Beyonce', Shania Twain, Smokey
Robinson, Diana Ross, Bruce
Springsteen, Britney Spears,
Paul McCartney, U2 and Tom
Petty. It's obviously a difficult target audience to define.

Commercials;

- The cost of a 30-second commercial during the Super Bowl this year is reported to be around \$4.4 million. Carl's Jr, Anheuser-Busch, BMW, Mercedes, Victoria's Secret, McDonald's, Doritos, Go-Daddy, and the new Jurassic World film are among the advertisers getting ready to sling memorable spots to the delight of viewers during this year's game.

- Some notable Super Bowl ads over the years include NY Jets Quarterback Joe Namath shaving his legs for Noxzema (1973), sharpshooters firing at a variety of Master Locks during the 1970's, Pittsburgh Steelers lineman "Mean Joe" Greene tossing a Coca-Cola to a young fan (1980), a "1984" themed ad (in 1984) showing a woman hurling a hammer at a "Big Brother" type face on a screen to promote the rise of Apple's Macintosh computers, the "Bud Bowls" of the 1990's, and Michael Jordan and Larry Bird playing HORSE to promote McDonald's Big Macs (1993).

Food;

- Snacks are a major part of Super Bowl Sunday. The Calorie Control Council and Snack Food Association observe that snack consumption averages around 1,200 calories (not including meals), representing nearly 50 grams of fat ingested per Super Bowl armchair quarterback.

- An estimated 28 million pounds of pretzels, popcorn, potato and tortilla chips will be consumed during the day, an amount with laid end to end would stretch nearly 293,000 miles. Michigan leads the nation in the production of potatoes used in making potato chips.

- It takes about 223,000 football fields of farmland to grow the amount of corn, potatoes and avocados needed to make the snacks fueling Super Bowl Sunday munchies.

- Americans will quaff approximately 325 million gallons of beer on Super Bowl Sunday. Designated drivers are a must; the Insurance Information Institute reports more drivers are involved in alcohol-related accidents on Super Bowl Sunday than any other day of the year, with the exception of St. Patrick's

- Super Bowl Sunday is the biggest winter grilling day of the year

- Antacid sales spike by 20 percent during the Monday after the Super Bowl, and 6 percent (or about 7 million) of Americans call in sick to work on that same Monday.

Super Bowl XLVII kick-off is at 6:30 pm EST on Sunday, February 1st on NBC stations. Enjoy the game.

Skiing was invented for travel, not recreation

Today, skiing appears in many different styles all over the world. Perhaps the two most recognized forms of this popular pastime are Alpine (downhill) and Nordic (cross-country) Skiing. Skiing was not invented for the thrill of rushing down a mountain with the wind whipping at your face, the sound of your skis gliding on the soft white powder beneath you. The invention of the ski dates back to the ice age as a mode of survival and a way to

cross snowy terrain. There are cave drawings of skis that date back to the Paleolithic period, or the Old Stone Age, as well as artifacts from the Mesolithic period, or the Middle Stone Age. Fragments of ski-like objects were found in the 1960s by archeologist Grigoriy Burov that date back to 6000 BC in Northern Russia.

In history, man needed a way to hunt and travel in the winter when everything was snow covered and froze over. Skis and snowshoes were invented to serve that purpose. The word "ski" is a Norwegian word that comes from the Old Norse word "skid," a split length of wood.
Skis were more popular in Central Asia and Europe, while snowshoes were used in the New World. Skiing was also a popular aspect of military training in Norway circa 1760. The Norwegian Army held skill competitions that were precursors to the Olympic sports that involve skiing such as skiing across a snowy field while shooting. The first race on record was in Norway in 1842.

Norway was also starting to see civilians join in on the skiing

craze, both Alpine and Nordic. There was a shift in the 1880's from cross-country skiing to downhill skiing. The first appearance of cross-country skiing in the Olympic Games was in 1924 at the Chamonix Games for men only. Women were included in 1952 at the Oslo Games. Since the introduction of cross-country skiing to the Olympics, it has been on the program ever since and now (2002-2014) has 12 events (6 men's and 6 women's).

While cross-country skiing is still popular, especially with the Winter Games, downhill skiing has grown in popularity as well. There are many ski resorts in Northern Michigan including some popular ones around the area such as Treetops, Boyne Mountain, Otsego Club, Nubs Nob, Boyne Highlands and more. While man may not need skis to traverse treacherous, snow covered terrain to kill a caribou for the family's dinner, skis continue to be used all around the world. If you haven't tried skiing (or snow-boarding) there couldn't be a better time to learn.
