Boyne then made a late run at EJ, outscoring the Red Devils 14-10 over the final eight minutes, but could not knock down the necessary shots to take the lead, having multiple opportunities late in the contest.

The Red Devils were led by Colin Petrie's 18 points, including 12 in the first quarter. Donny Cutler added nine, while Jordan Weber and Collin Bajko added five and four points, respectfully.

For the Ramblers, Derek Willis

finished with 10 points, while Tanner Kruzel and Luke Sage each added seven and Mason Gardner chipped in with five points.

"Really proud of how hard we played," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "Our defense gave us chance to win we just need to keep improving our skill so we can make free throws and layups. We shot 1-14 from three as well. We have good athletes we just need to improve skill to put ball in basket and cut down our turnovers."

Both teams went 7-for-18 from the charity stripe.

Annual White Pine Stampede cross-country ski race takes place February 6

It's Michigan's longest-running point-to-point cross-country ski race, and continuing a tradition that began in 1977, the 40th Annual White Pine Stampede takes place this coming Saturday, February 6, starting at Mancelona High School and ending at Schuss Village and the Summit at Shanty Creek. Participants can choose between a 50k or 20k race, or a 10k timed tour. So there is something for every level of skier to enjoy. A portion of each participants entry fee is donated to the Children's Hospital of Michigan, so this is not only a fun outing to take part in, it also helps support a very worthy cause.

Race Director Jack McKaig, emphasized that this is an event that nearly anyone familiar with cross-country skiing can join in on. "We make an effort for this to be open to everyone. We do have competitive skiers and groups who have been skiing for a long time, and they typically chose the 20K or 50K events. For the 10k race, we have high school teams show up from schools such as Petoskey and Traverse City, and

ational tour for them, and there are no prizes, but they do receive a t-shirt, medal and their official race time"

The White Pine Stampede was founded based on the dream of Gus Knopnicki, who wanted to create a marathon cross-country ski race traversing four northern Lower Michigan counties. He presented the idea to the Mancelona Chamber of Commerce in 1976, and two of the four proposed counties decided to participate, so the course was set through acres of White Pines in Crawford and Antrim counties, which inspired the event's name.

The original race was 50 kilometers, and took place on a cold, windy day. McKaig recalled, "We had 91 people skiing from Frederic to Mancelona in the worst

weather we have had to date that year, with a high around 9 degrees and 20 mile an hour strong wind. Only 41 finished. I was the race director and went to bed that night relieved that we had pulled it off."

By 1981, the race was held solely in Antrim County, and upon completion of the new Mancelona High School in 1985, the start was moved to its present location. That was the same year White Pine Stampede organizers began donating a portion of entry fees to Children's Hospital of Michigan, and to date those donations have exceeded \$100,000.

Entry Fee is \$85 for the 50K and 20K races while the 10K tour costs \$40. A portion of each skier's registration is donated to the Children's Hospital of Michi-

gan.

Spearing Serpents

Without question the **Great Lakes** State's "most extreme" fish is the lake sturgeon. The ancestors of

these ancient creatures date back to the Upper Cretaceous period when dinosaurs were at the height of their existence. They are the Mitten State's largest fish and can live to be 150 years old!

There's no group more invested in the preservation of lake sturgeon than the well established Sturgeon for Tomorrow organization. Toward this end, they work tirelessly to fund raise, volunteer, and collaborate with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and MSU sturgeon researchers. They play a key role in the MSU sturgeon tagging program that has safely captured, aged, and tagged hundreds of the fish on the Black River during their amazing spawning run.

One of Sturgeon for Tomorrow's biggest events is coming up this Friday, February 5 and Saturday, February 6 as they sponsor the fun and fascinating Black Lake Sturgeon Shivaree. At the Shivaree you can be witness to a modern-day Moby Dick tale as up to seven fortunate fishermen just might spear one of these freshwater behemoths. Last year's winning fish, skewered by James Bodinger, weighed 87 pounds and was a whisker under 6 feet long! The spears

they use would make Poseidon happy as they are gigantic. You can imagine the battle that ensues when a sturgeon is speared and brought up into the shanty. Stories – some folklore, some true - abound of the giant fish essentially turning the walls of the shanty into kindling!

The fundraiser includes a beverage tent with terrific live music, kid's fun shanty, a poker run, raffles and auctions, and, of course, an opportunity to see a truly rare creature. Specifics about the timing of these events

Friday is for fishing registration and live music while Saturday is when most of the events occur including the fishing contest that concludes at 7:15 pm. The Shivaree is located at 1701 Winifred St., Cheboygan, MI in front of the former Black Lake Hotel.

DNR reminds public of ice-safety measures

and rainy weather patterns seen in recent weeks in many parts of the state, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources urges ice anglers and snowmobilers to remember that no ice is safe ice.

"When temperatures reach into the 40s, as they

have recently in many areas, thawing will occur and that will definitely weaken ice," said Sgt. Steve Orange, DNR Law Enforcement Division's recreational safety, education and enforcement supervisor. "It's very important to know and follow guidelines to determine how ice looks and feels so that your day of ice fishing or snowmobiling is enjoyable and safe. Ignoring warning

The DNR does not recommend the standard "inch-thickness" guide used by many anglers and snowmobilers to determine ice safety, because ice seldom forms at a uniform rate.

signs of weakened ice can result in a

life-threatening incident.'

Orange said a warm spell may take several days to weaken the ice; however, when temperatures vary widely, causing the ice to thaw during the day and refreeze at night, the result is a weak, "spongy" or honeycombed ice that is unsafe.

Ice strength can't be determined by its look, thickness, the temperature or whether or not it's covered with snow, Orange said.

When venturing onto ice, remem-

Clear ice that has a bluish tint is the strongest. Ice formed by melted and refrozen snow appears milky, and is very porous and weak.

Ice covered by snow always should be presumed unsafe. Snow acts like an insulating blanket and slows the freezing process. Ice under the snow will be thinner and weaker. A snowfall also can warm up and melt existing ice.

If there is slush on the ice, stay off.

> Slush ice is only about half as strong as clear ice and indicates the ice is no longer freezing from the bottom.

"Although it's a personal decision, the DNR does not recommend ice anglers take a car or truck onto the ice," Orange said.

Anyone venturing onto the ice is urged to wear a life jacket, wear bright colors, bring a cell phone and bring along a set of ice picks or ice claws, which can be found in most sporting goods stores.

If ice does break, Orange offered the following tips:

Try to remain calm.

Don't remove winter clothing. Heavy clothes won't drag you down, but instead can trap air to provide warmth and flotation. This is especially true with a snowmobile suit.

Turn in the water toward the direction you came from; that is probably the strongest ice.

If you have them, dig the points of the picks into the ice and, while vigorously kicking your feet, pull yourself onto the surface by sliding forward on the ice.

Roll away from the area of weak ice. Rolling on the ice will distribute your weight to help avoid breaking through again.

Get to shelter, heat, warm dry clothing and warm, nonalcoholic and noncaffeinated drinks.

Call 911 and seek medical attention if you feel disoriented, have uncontrollable shivering or have any other ill effects that may be symptoms of hypothermia (the life-threatening drop in the body's core temperature).

How to scout out the best place to call home
