Ramblers roll past Blazers, Rams

Boyne City 67, Kalkaska 38

KALKASKA -- The Boyne City boys basketball team inched closer to another Lake Michigan Conference championship as they defeated the host Blazers, 67-38 on February 20.

The Ramblers jumped out to a 17-4 lead after the opening quarter and held a 33-15 advantage at the half. Boyne then outscored Kalkaska 16-9 in the third, taking a 49-24 lead into the final quarter.

"Great team effort," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "Nice to get a road win and get a lot of guys playing time."

Corey Redman paced the Ramblers with 15 points and five assists, while Zach Napont added 14 points and eight rebounds.

Mike Dohm added nine points and five boards, while Tanner Kruzal chipped in with seven points and five rebounds and Derek Willis had seven points.

"Corey (Redman) did a great job at point guard getting us into a nice flow offensively," coach Redman added. "Really happy with our focus and enthusiasm."

With the win, the Ramblers improve to 13-3 overall, 10-2 in the LMC.

Boyne City 53, Harbor Springs 20

BOYNE CITY -- The Ramblers came out applying full-court pressure against the Rams and executed it to near perfection as Boyne City took an early lead en route to a 53-20 Lake Michigan Conference win over the Rams on February 17.

Boyne jumped out to a 19-3 first quarter lead and moved to a 29-8 advantage at halftime and 48-14 after three quarters of play.

Corey Redman finished with 15 points and six boards to lead the Ramblers, while Zach Napont added 11 points and six rebounds.

Also for Boyne, Tanner Kruzal had eight points and five rebounds and the trio of Dalton Gardner, Alec Hoaglund and Mike Dohm all added five points apiece.

"Really happy with how hard we played," Rambler coach Nick Redman said. "Great team effort."

Boyne City improves to 12-3, 9-2 with the victory.

Regain shooting touch against Snowbirds

BOYNE FALLS -- The Boyne Falls boys basketball team took care of business as they clinched their fourth straight Northern Lakes Conference title with their 54th straight league win over Vanderbilt 63-10 on February 21.

The Loggers jumped out early to a 20-5 first quarter lead before pushing that to a 33-5 margin at halftime. BF then took a 57-7 advantage after three quarters of play.

Junior Marcus Matelski finished with 31 points, six rebounds and four assists to lead the Loggers.

Andrew Stevens added nine points and nine assists, while Andrew Campbell added seven points and 12 boards.

Boyne Falls improves to 16-0 overall, 12-0 conference.

Boyne Falls 75, Gaylord St. Mary 25

GAYLORD -- The Boyne Falls Loggers got things going early and often as they rolled to a 75-25 non-conference victory over Gaylord St. Mary on February 16.

When things were going good inside for Logger sensation Marcus Matelski, the St. Mary defense collapsed to the paint, hoping to contain him, only to see BF guard Andrew Stevens pull them back out as he connected on four consecutive triples.

Boyne Falls took a 22-7 advantage after one quarter of play and extended their lead to 42-9 at the break. The Loggers came out firing after halftime and increased their cushion to 66-14.

"We shot the ball very well over 60 percent in first half and ended up shooting 54 percent for the game," Boyne Falls coach Tim Smith said. "Marcus (Matelski) got us going with 15 points early and when they collapsed on him, (Andrew) Stevens went off hitting his first four threes."

Matelski would end up with a well-rounded game, netting 32 points, eight assists, seven steals and six rebounds, while Stevens added 25 points and seven assists, finishing 7-of-10 shooting from beyond the arc.

Also for BF, Andrew Campbell added nine points and five assists as the Loggers improved to 15-0 overall.

Ramblers clinch share of LMC title with convincing win over Rayders

Strong backcourt play from Gardner, Napont set the tone

Boyne City 68, Charlevoix 37

BOYNE CITY -- Whenever Boyne City and Charlevoix meet, you may as well toss out the records, sit down and buckle up, because the two rivals always put forth their best effort and play with passion and energy unlike any other game on the schedule.

This time around, the records did matter, and a shot at the Lake Michigan Conference championship was hanging in the balance.

Boyne City entered the contest with an overall record of 13-3 and 10-2 in league play, while the vis-

iting Rayders came in on a seven game winning streak, including 10 out of their last 11 games and an overall record of 10-6, 9-3 in the LMC.

On February 24, in front of a packed gymnasium, the two teams clashed and when all the dust settled it was the Ramblers still standing atop the LMC with a convincing 68-37 victory over Charlevoix.

Boyne City jumped out early in the first quarter, leading 20-6 headed into the second quarter as Rambler senior Zach Napont set the tone with eight points in the quarter.

The Ramblers kept pushing in the second quarter as Cole Butler hit a pair of triples, and Napont added another five points, and Dalton Gardner got to the free throw line and made good on four attempts.

Charlevoix was able to establish their inside game as Austin Putman scored on a pair of easy

baskets and knocked down three tosses from the charity stripe to help keep the Rayders in the game as Boyne led 42-17 at half-time.

"I thought we really did a great job defensively again tonight, which led us to a lot of transition baskets, and I thought we shared the ball really well and fought through our early foul trouble and every guy that got in the game, stepped up and did an outstanding job," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "Every single kid played their role tonight, big win."

Following intermission, Boyne City and Charlevoix both picked it up on the defensive end as the Ramblers outscored the Rayders 26-20 over the games final 16 minutes as play got chippy at times, with both teams not willing to bend or break against their rival.

"At halftime, we talked about them (Charlevoix) coming out strong and making a run," Red-

man noted. "I thought we did a good job of handling that and played pretty solid."

For the Ramblers, Napont finished with 14 points, while Gardner added 11 and Colton Sieradski and Cole Butler chipped in with nine and eight points, respectively.

Charlevoix was paced by Noah Jeakle with 11 points, while Austin Putman added nine and Kenen Borths had six.

With the victory, the Ramblers, (14-3, 11-2) clinched at least a share of the Lake Michigan Conference title, with one league game remaining when they travel to Traverse City St. Francis on Friday, February 27. Elk Rapids defeated East Jordan on February 24, to remain one game back in conference play.

Charlevoix slips to 10-7 overall, 9-4 conference with the loss. The Rayders host Kalkaska on Friday February 27.

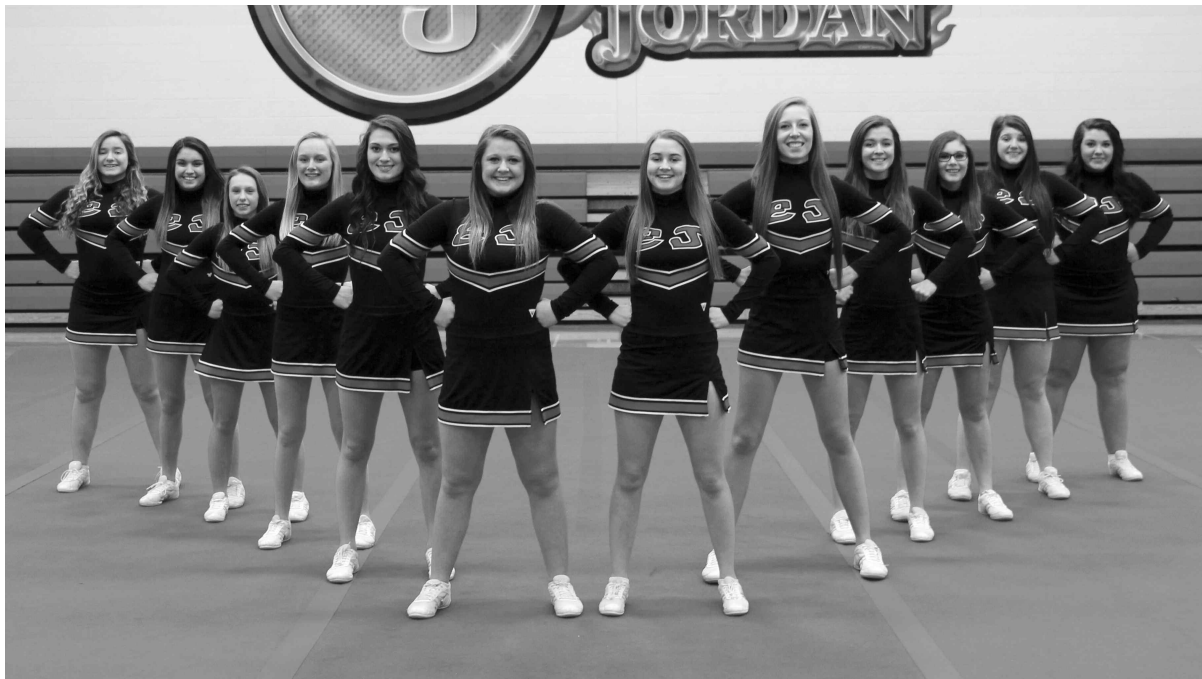
and advancing to the Regional Competition in Sparta, MI on February 28.

CHARLEVOIX -- The Charlevoix boys basketball team took the next step in the process in the quest for a piece of the Lake Michigan Conference title with a convincing 62-50 victory over Traverse City St. Francis on February 20.

Noah Jeakle then caught fire, knocking down consecutive triples around a St. Francis basket for a 32-30 advantage with 22 seconds to go, before Drost stole the ball on the next Gladiator possession and took it to the rack

as the horn sounded for a 34-30 Rayder lead at intermission.

A strong defensive effort in the final eight minutes would be enough for Charlevoix to pull out the victory and set up their chance against league leading Boyne City.

Drost and Putman finished with 15 points apiece to lead the Rayders, while Jeakle added eleven.

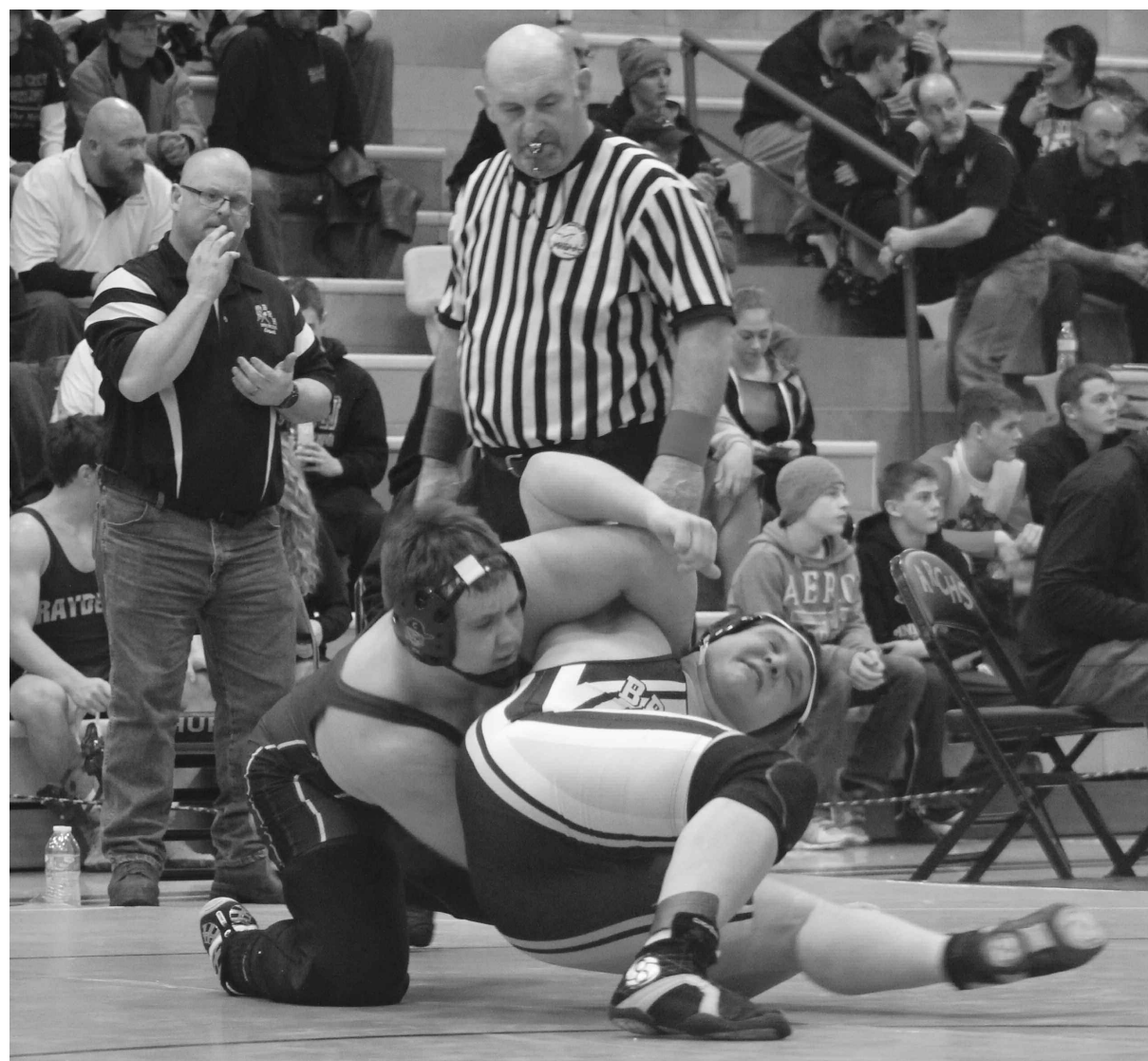

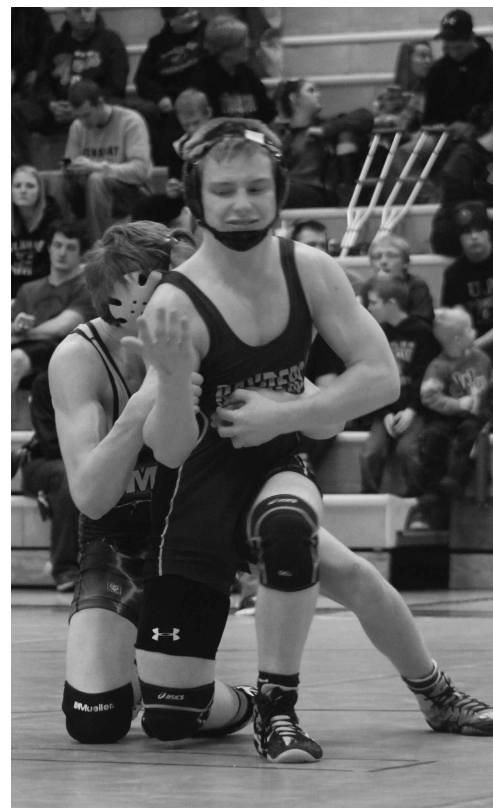

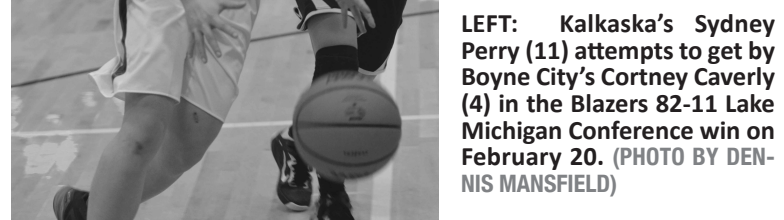
