Rams use strong fourth quarter to hold off Rayders

Harbor Springs 53, Charlevoix 41

BOYNE CITY -- The Harbor Springs Rams and Charlevoix Rayders were locked in battle for over 24 minutes of evenly played girls basketball.

It was the final eight minutes that pushed one team towards the district championship, as the Rams put together a strong fourth quarter behind the play of Alexa Jensen-Philbrick to pull out a 53-41 victory and deliver Harbor their first district crown in four years.

Charlevoix jumped out to an early 6-1 lead, but the Rams buckled down and went on a 10-0 run to end the first.

The Rayders then went on a run of their own, eventually pulling even at 20-all and as when it looked as if the teams would head into the locker room all

knotted up, Harbor was able to come up with a layup as the horn sounded, giving the Rams a 22-20 lead.

The game remained close in the third quarter with Harbor outscoring Charlevoix 18-14, to lead 40-36 as the teams headed towards the final eight minutes of regulation.

"Harbor Springs did an exceptional job rebounding," Charlevoix coach Liz Shaw said. "We had some shots opportunities that didn't fall through and went dry in the end of the fourth quarter. Hats off to Harbor Springs and wishing them the best of luck."

Seniors, Alexis Tribfelner finished with 13 points, six rebounds, four steals and three assists, while Olivia Storm added 12 points, five rebounds, four steals and three for the Rayders and their efforts kept Charlevoix in the contest.

Also for the Rayders, Kourtney Putman added seven points and Hannah Zipp chipped in with five points and seven boards.

For the Rams, Perry Bower and Harmony Lang each had 10 points, while Jensen-Philbrick netted eight (seven in the final quarter).

Charlevoix closes out the season with an 11-11 record and will graduate; Tribfelner, Storm, Leah Davis, Ellie Way, Thea Ottesen, Samantha Meads, Kourtney Putman and Madeline Boss.

"The one thing I will miss the most about the season is my seniors," Shaw noted. "Ellie (Way), Kourtney (Putman) and Maddie

(Boss) (as sophomores), actually started the program with me when I took over in 2012-13. I will be forever be grateful for the time and energy they put into the program as well as all my seniors. They are a very special group and even better individual young women. I am blessed."

Rayders offense explodes in win over Ramblers

Charlevoix 56, Boyne City 29

BOYNE CITY -- A big second quarter by the Charlevoix girls basketball team was all it needed as the Rayders outscored the Ramblers 21-3 during that stretch to pull out a 56-29 Class C district semifinal win on March 4 in Boyne City.

The two teams played a pretty even first quarter, but the Rayders would pull ahead with a 14-9 lead headed into the second behind the playmaking of senior guard Alexis Tribfelner.

A full-court press by the Rayders in the second quarter would be too much for the Ramblers as they forced turnovers and errant passes from Boyne. Foul trouble and substitutions also contributed to Boyne searching for guards to handle the aggressive

pace the Rayder were forcing.

Charlevoix took a 35-12 advantage into halftime, and then the Rayders outscored the Ramblers 19-8 during the third quarter to take firm command of the contest.

"We played a nice defensive game with offense balance," Charlevoix coach Liz Shaw said. "We put a lot of pressure on Boyne City defensively and made it tough for them to get their offense going. I was real proud of the intensity the girls came out with."

The balanced Rayder attack was led by Tribfelner paced Charlevoix with 10 points, five steals and five assists, while Beth Veenstra added eight points and five boards, while Olivia Storm chipped in with eight points and three steals.

Also for the Rayders, which improve to 11-10 with the win; Rachel Nesburg added seven points and four steals, while Kourtney Putman and Ellie Way each had six points, with Way dishing out four assists.

For Boyne City, Celena Brzezinski finished with nine points, while Brooke Fouchia had four.

Keyrsten Girlinghouse, Sidney McLeod and Liv Looze each added three for the Ramblers, who finish the season at 3-18.

Rambler boys fall to Northmen in regular season finale

Petoskey 64, Boyne City 57

BOYNE CITY -- Another tough week of competition for the Ramblers as they prepare for the postseason.

The Boyne City basketball team, prides themselves in finding tough non-conference opponents to close the season out and much like years prior, those teams gave the Ramblers all they could handle and more as the visiting Petoskey Northmen defeated Boyne, 64-57 in the regular season finale for both schools on March 5.

Rambler veteran coach Nick Redman was pleased with how his team performed during the week as they head into tournament play next week.

"It was good for us to play well against great competition this week," coach Redman noted. "Great atmosphere. Both teams played their butts off."

The two teams came out battling with some clean, hard, physical play as the Northmen took a 12-7 ad-

vantage behind the strong play of guard Aron Lee, who netted eight in the quarter.

In the second quarter, the Ramblers switched to a zone defense that shut down the Petoskey ability to get open looks from beyond the arc, but left Jason Bur able to work the baseline. Bur would manage 14 points in the quarter, including a putback with just under seven seconds remaining in the quarter to give the Northmen a 26-16 lead, only to see Boyne's Corey Redman go the length of the court and hit a pull-up jumper from the left elbow at the buzzer to pull the Ramblers within 26-18 at intermission.

Following the break, Boyne went on a 4-2 run to pull within 28-22 on a Tanner Kruzel floater with just under six minutes to play in the third, only to have the Northmen hit a Nick Mesnard triple seconds later to go back up 31-22.

A pair of Kruzel free throws and another Mesnard three pointer near the 5:00 minute mark, would show the Northmen ahead

34-24.

Boyne City would then go on a 13-7 run over the next four plus minutes to pull to within 41-37 on a Cole Butler triple from the right wing with under 20

seconds showing on the clock, only to have the Northmen get to the rim on their final attempt of the quarter for a 43-37 lead headed into the final eight minutes of regulation.

The Ramblers would look to make their move early in the fourth quarter as Redman hit a three out of the gate and on Boyne's next possession, work his way inside, drawing a foul and getting to the charity stripe for a pair of freebies.

On their next possession, Butler would come off a screen and toss up a deep triple that would be just a shade long, but ricochet off the glass as the banks were open for Cole on that particular possession, pulling the Ramblers to within one, 47-46 with 6:43 to go.

That would be as close as Boyne would get the rest of the game as Petoskey responded with quick Lee basket and then held the Ramblers at bay the rest of the way.

"Really happy with how we kept fighting," coach Redman said. "We had some bad possessions and they capitalized on it, great basketball game."

For the Ramblers, senior Corey Redman finished with 21 points, 10 rebounds and three assists, while senior Zach Napont added nine points and three blocks.

Also for the Ramblers, Kruzel added eight points, four rebounds and four steals and Butler chipped in with six points and four boards.

Petoskey was led by 29 points from Bur, while Lee added 18.

Both Boyne and Petoskey finish the regular season with 15-5 records.

Ramblers able to hold off surging Rayders

EAST JORDAN -- It's tough to beat a team three times in a year. Boyne City found that out first hand against rival Charlevoix, as the Ramblers took an early lead and held a 32-17 advantage at halftime, but had to survive a strong second half surge by the "never quit" Rayders, as Charlevoix clamped down on defense, holding Boyne to single basket in the third quarter, before the Ramblers were able to knock down 12-of-14 free throws during a key run late in the fourth quarter to pull out the Class C district opening victory over the Rayders in front of a packed East Jordan gymnasium on March 9.

The contest started with the two teams feeling each other out, as Charlevoix's Nate Moon stole the ball and went in for an uncontested layup, only to have the Ramblers respond with a Tanner Kruzel inside basket that would also draw some contact for a foul and the junior would drain the charity toss for a 3-2 Rambler lead, not a minute into the game.

Charlevoix would come rushing back as Justin Pearl and Wyatt Drost made back-to-back hoops for the Rayders to give them a 6-3 lead with just over six minutes to play.

That's when the Charlevoix shooting touch would cool off for a bit, as the Rayders went the next three minutes without a score, until Austin Putman connected on a triple from the left wing at the 3:10 mark, but the Ramblers had already reeled off eight points of their own from four different players.

Boyer would then close the quarter out on a 9-0 run and a 20-

9 lead after one quarter of play as the Rayders shots, both near and far, would just not drop.

The second quarter would see a more even pace of ball as Boyne's Kruzel kept his inside presence known as he tallied another six points, while on the Rayder side, Moon picked up the slack, scoring five of his own over the eight minute stretch.

With the game 32-17 at the half, many thought that the Ramblers had this one in hand, but the third quarter would see the Boyne City basket look as if it had a lid on it, as the Ramblers were not able to throw the ball in the ocean, much due to the aggressive defensive play of the Rayders. The lone Rambler basket would come with 1:32 remaining in the quarter on a Cole Butler running shot from about five feet out.

Charlevoix would outscore Boyne 9-2 in the quarter to creep to within 34-26, behind seven

points from Putman, setting the two teams up for a frantic finish.

Putman wasn't finished as he would reel off four of his 12 fourth quarter points in the first three and a half minutes to pull the Rayders to within four, 38-34, with 4:46 remaining in the game, but that's as close as Charlevoix would get as the Ramblers cashed in from the foul line.

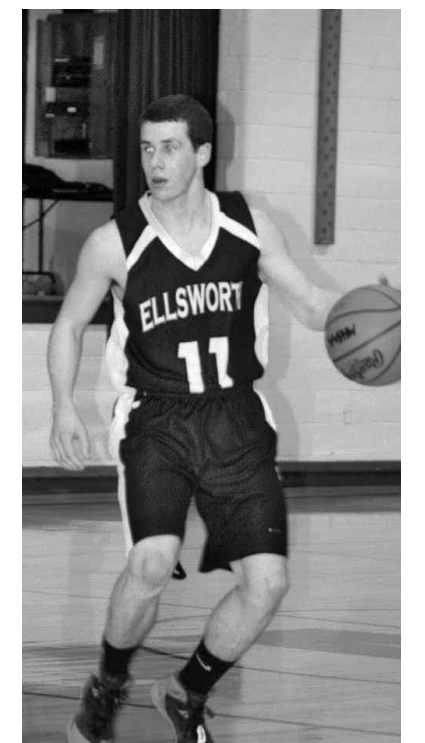
For the Ramblers, Kruzel finished with 20 points, while Zach Napont added 10, Butler chipped in with nine and Dalton Gardner added eight.

Charlevoix was led by Putman's 22 points, while Moon had seven and Kevin Pearl added six.

Red Devils handle Hurons to advance

EAST JORDAN -- The East Jordan boys basketball team jumped out to an early 6-0 lead and never looked back as the Red Devils took the first step in defending their Class C district crown with a 63-41 victory over Rogers City on March 9.

Colin Petrie used his elusiveness to get to the rim for the first four East Jordan points before teammate Thomas Brandell scored from close range to put the Red Devils up 6-0, and then the EJ defensive pressure took over, forcing the Hurons into panic plays and turnovers.

"I'm not sure how much of that type of pressure defense they have seen this year, but the way we executed it, it gave us a chance to get out and run a little bit," East Jordan coach Darrin Weber said. "We were used to playing like that, especially in our league (LMC)."

The Red Devils used that pressure to their advantage as they extended their lead to 15-4 after one quarter of play and were in cruise control the remainder of the night.

"Rogers City did adjust to the pressure in the third, so we went man," Weber added.

For EJ, Petrie finished with a double-double, netting 14 points, 13 rebounds, six assists and five steals, from his point guard position, while Jordan Weber added 24 points, grabbed eight rebounds and dished out five assists.

"We didn't shoot the ball really well from the outside, just didn't seem to get into any rhythm, and that may be do to us subbing a lot and trying to keep guys fresh, but we were pretty effective in getting to the basket off the drive," coach Weber noted. "That being said, we did get a lot of contributions from others."

Also for EJ, 16-5, Brandell ended the night with 11 points and Tucker Alward netted eight.

The Hurons were led by 14 points from Josh Belusar.

"Inland Lakes presents a different challenge, they are more talented and have a big post player, so we have to keep them off the glass," Weber noted. "They also

GAYLORD -- The Ellsworth Lancer boys basketball team pulled off the first surprise of the tournament for our local teams, beating Central Lake 47-42 on March 9 in the Gaylord St. Mary gymnasium.

While records don't mean anything come this time of year, the Lancers did boast a 10 win team,

while the Trojans entered the contest with only four, it looked as if Central Lake would take this game as they raced out to a quick 18-6 first quarter lead.

Things didn't look much better for Ellsworth in the second as the Trojans once again held the advantage, 12-9 in the quarter for a 30-15 cushion at halftime.

But Lancer coach Kirk Ikens, made the necessary adjustments at intermission and rallied the troops as Ellsworth came storming back with a strong third quarter, as they outscored Central Lake 10-6 in the quarter and an even stronger fourth, where they poured it to the Trojans, 22-6, to pull off the monster come from behind win and advance to the semifinal against the defending champion Boyne Falls Loggers on Wednesday, March 11.

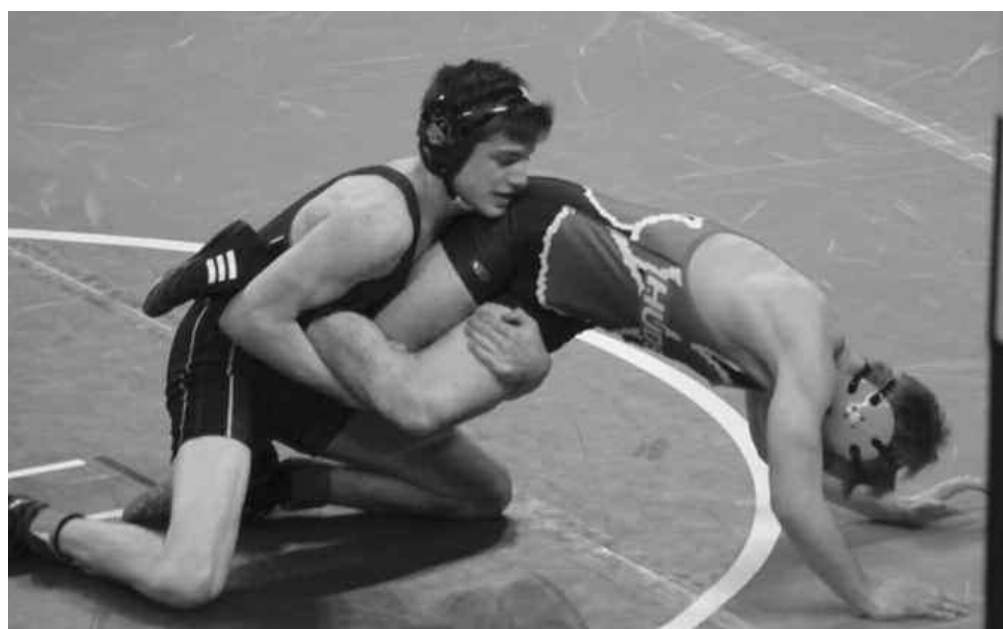

AUBURN HILLS -- Four Charlevoix wrestling team members made the trip to the Palace of Auburn Hills to compete in the MHSAA Individual State Championship Tournament from March 4-7.

The first round occurred on Thursday where sophomore Cam Alden (125 lbs.) lost to Robert Rogers of Burton 3-4, Senior Sam Hovie (160 lbs.) defeated Eric Birchmeier of New Lothrop 5-3, junior Mick Hinkle (189 lbs.) lost to Cole Southworth of Decatur by fall in 1:27, and senior Spencer Bruce (215 lbs.) fell to Kevin Kourig of Laingsburg in 1:59.

Both Hovie and Alden earn "All-State" honors for finishing in the top eight.

Hovie finished the year with a season record of 41-8, Alden finished the year with a season record of 45-15.

Coach Hinkle commented he was proud of all four wrestlers.

"It is a very difficult task just to make it to the state tournament. In fact, that was Cam Alden's season goal this year. To place in the top eight was frosting on the cake," coach Hinkle said. "Senior Sam Hovie had an uphill battle this season, fighting back from a devastating football injury and major operation late last fall to eventually take fifth in the state."

Coach Hinkle also noted that during the tournament he had to defeat Chris Gillis of Elk Rapids, an opponent he had lost to on four occasions earlier in the season.

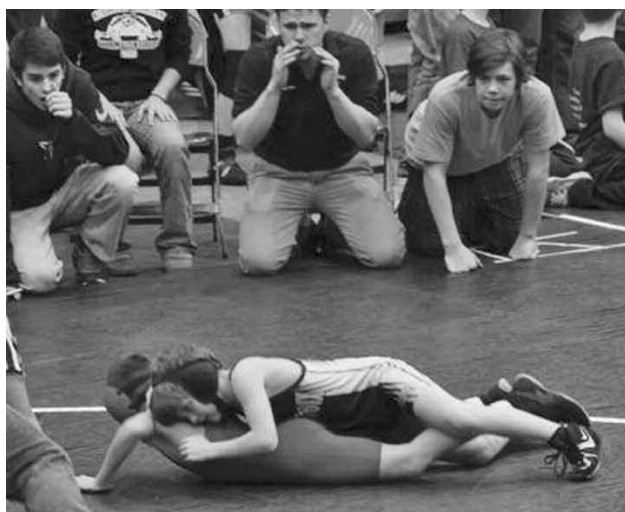

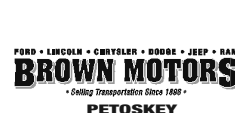

Tips to help in your search

Armed with your down payment and your pre-approval letter for a mortgage loan, the next step is finding the house that will best meet your family's needs. With realistic expectations, patience and plenty of research, you'll be well on your way.

Once you narrow the search to neighborhoods you like, you'll want to determine the maximum

house price you can afford. Even though you're pre-approved for a set loan amount, it doesn't mean you can afford it. You'll want to factor in other expenses, including retirement and college savings, vacations, and home maintenance and repairs, when you calculate how much you can afford for a monthly payment. And don't forget to budget for homeowners insurance and property taxes. There's also homeowner's association fees, especially in newer developments.

Next, differentiate your needs versus your wants. You need three bedrooms, but a fourth room would be nice for a play room or guest room. You need a two-car garage, but a larger one would be nice for storage. You need a functional kitchen but want hardwood floors. You need two bathrooms but want a luxurious master suite. You get the picture.

As you begin your house-hunting venture, prepare a checklist. Break it down between exterior and interior characteristics. Make notes on each

feature and make notes. Some people give each a 1 to 10 score, which is fine, but the first few houses you see will score differently than the last few because you have many more to compare against. Also, after viewing many homes, the numbers begin to lose meaning.

Some of the exterior features to rate might include size of yard, quality of fence, paint condition, roof condition, window conditions, garage, and backyard. When it comes to interior, think about square footage; the floor plan; condition of walls; the size, quality, and functionality of the various rooms and closet and storage space.

Your checklist should also include any other factors you deem important—the amount of traffic, the appearance of the neighborhood, safety in the area, the reputation of local schools, etc.

Here are some other suggestions from industry experts:

Take a camera with you to capture an image of each house you look at that makes it to the "maybe"

Stay on top of newly listed houses by reading the paper every week or keeping in touch with your agent.

Remain in close contact with your agent. This is extremely important if you're in a strong seller's market and/or in which homes that are priced right go fast. You want a good agent who will alert you of new listings and who will show you the houses as soon as they're listed.

Be prepared to look at the potential of a house rather than what you see in front of you. Set your priorities and decide what can be sacrificed. It's more important that the layout of the house and the number of bedrooms you need fit your needs and that all major systems are functional versus your dislike for the avocado green carpet or the lack of landscaping. Those types of cosmetic shortcomings can be easily remedied once you buy the house.

If you find a house you like, offer a competitive bid. Keep in mind you'll likely be competing against other offers—especially if interest rates are low and the spring buying season is in full bloom.

And don't forget—once you make an offer, make it contingent upon the findings of a professional home inspection. If any major defects surface, you'll want to have the leverage to renegotiate or back out of the deal completely.

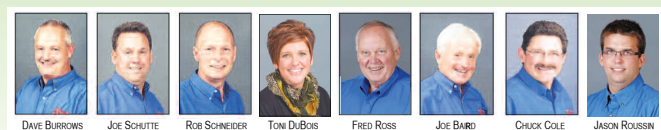
