Rayders dominant in win over Suttons Bay

McLean, Boss, Williams combine for big game to lead ground attack

Charlevoix 45, Suttons Bay 0

SUTTONS BAY -- Talk about being ready for battle. The Charlevoix Rayder football team, used the knowledge they gained in their two early season non-conference losses to Boyne City and Grayling and applied

that to their opening contest in the Northern Michigan Football League I against Suttons Bay, as they rolled to a 45-0 victory over the Norsemen.

"Overall, very pleased with our effort," Charlevoix coach Ron Bindi said. "The kids played well. We're also starting to click in a couple of areas."

The Rayders picked up a few yards on the ground as the team combined for 336 yards rushing to set the tone for the game.

Leading the way was Jared McLean, Malcolm Williams and

Ben Boss, as the trio combined for 303 yards on 30 carries, with McLean rolling up 161 yards, Williams chipping in with 72 and Boss adding 70.

McLean and Boss accounted for four Rayder touchdowns on runs of 10, 65, 17 and 29 yards, respectfully.

Brad Klinger added a pair of touchdowns; both five yard scores, with one coming on the ground and the other through the air.

Quarterback, Forrest Noirot tossed two touchdowns en route

to a 52-yard passing night.

"Everyone had a good night," coach Bindi added. "If we stay healthy, maybe we can make a little noise. The offensive line is starting to gel, setting up some of our big plays. We matched up really well, sizewise against them too."

Williams put on a defensive clinic, leading Charlevoix with 16 stops and a fumble recovery, while Cam Alden also recovered a fumble.

Klinger added to his outstanding defense in the secondary,

picking off another pass, while McLean also added an interception.

"We still need to work on some of the little things," Bindi noted. "But, I feel we got after it a lot better tonight and we were more fundamentally sound than last week. Hopefully we can continue to progress."

Charlevoix, 3-2 overall, 1-0 NMFL II, will play host to conference unbeaten Kalkaska on Friday, October 2, at 7 p.m.

The contest is also the Rayders homecoming.

Gladiators out duel Ramblers

Smith's big night not enough for Boyne

T.C. St. Francis 32, Boyne City 13

TRAVERSE CITY -- A fast start does not guarantee a thing.

The Boyne City football team got off to a good start in the much anticipated matchup against the Division 7, No. 1 ranked Gladiators on September 25.

The Ramblers took the opening drive 73 yards on 12 plays, capped by a one-yard score by Malik Smith, the first of two touchdowns of the night for the senior at the 6:29 mark of the first quarter. A successful Tanner Kruzul extra point attempt would put Boyne up 7-0.

The score would remain that way until 2:27 of the second quarter, when the Gladiators would pull even on a Gabe Callery 11-yard run to the right side, capping an 11 play, 75-yard drive by St. Francis that chewed up nearly five and a half minutes of clock.

St. Francis would begin the second half with the ball and on the first play from scrimmage, Gladiator Jacob Klingel Smith would take the ball over the left end and rumble his way to the BC 6-yard line, where he was stopped by Rambler Logan Sulak, setting up another Callery touchdown run on the next play less than one minute into the third quarter for a 14-7 TCSF lead.

The Ramblers were unable to get any offensive momentum going in the third as the Gladiators were able to extend their lead, courtesy of a 28-yard Brady Buel field goal with about four and a half minutes remaining in the quarter.

Boyne however, would not go away and struck early in the fourth, as Smith took a handoff

on third and two from the BC 36 and ran through and over any would be St. Francis defenders on his way to a 64-yard score, cutting into the Glad lead and trailing 17-13 with 10:34.

That would be as close as the Ramblers would get as they were unable to capitalize on a fourth and short and then fumbling on their next possession that resulted in a defensive TD for the Glads, putting the game out of reach with just over two minutes to go in the contest at 32-13.

On the night for Boyne, Smith would total 229 yards rushing on 30 carries and two scores, while Kruzul added 48 yards on nine attempts and Luke Sage rushed four times for 35 yards.

Gardner finished 6-of-17 passing for 73 yards, and Tarin Bell caught four passes for 29 yards.

Defensively, Kruzul finished with six and a half tackles, while Sage and Colton Sieradski each added five and a half, with Smith

and Carter Wilmot chipping in with four and a half and three and a half, respectively.

Boyne City slips to 4-1 overall on the season, 1-1 in the NMFL I.

The Ramblers will once again be on the road, when they travel to Maple City Glen Lake on October 2 for a 7 p.m. contest.

Red Devils over powered in second half against Panthers

Frankfort 34, East Jordan 6

EAST JORDAN -- The East Jordan football team were able to put points on the board, just before halftime, cutting the Frankfort lead to 14-6, and carrying a big shift of momentum with them as they headed into the break.

But that's all they would get, as the Panthers put together a strong second half, where they reeled off 20 unanswered points against EJ in coming out on top, 34-6 on September 25.

In the early going, it looked as if the Red Devils would take control of the game, forcing a Frankfort fumble on the Panthers first drive on the EJ 29 yard line.

East Jordan then put together a 14 play, near 70 yard drive that would put them inside the one yard line, where on fourth and inches, Frankfort would stuff the Red Devils for a loss of one, taking over on downs near the two yard line with 43.7 seconds left in the opening quarter.

"We ran our offense pretty well in the first half," EJ coach Allan Peterson. "The second half was a different story, we still worked hard, just ran out of gas."

"Colin Shepard played a great game as well as Don Cutler, we fought for every yard," the coach added. "We have seen good improvement every week, and I'm sure this week will be the same."

The Panthers ensuing possession would then see them march down the field in 11 plays for a 98 yard drive, capped by a 17-yard run for a touchdown from Kole

Hollenbeck just inside nine minutes of the second quarter.

The Red Devils would respond with the next time they touched the ball as Donny Cutler took the kickoff and scrambled 58-yards up the left sideline before being brought down at the Panther 27-yard line.

EJ however, was unable to capitalize with the favorable field position, as they lost yardage due to

a swarming Frankfort defense and forced to punt, the Red Devil punt would pin the Panthers deep in their own territory at the four yard line.

The Panthers, using the momentum generated by their previous defensive stand, began another long drive that would see them move the ball 96-yards in eight plays, resulting in another Holenbeck touchdown, this time

from four yards out, and following a successful conversion, Frankfort would lead 14-0 with just over four minutes to play in the half.

Frankfort would attempt an on-side kick on the ensuing possession, failing to reach the 10 yard minimum, resulting in a penalty and putting the Red Devils at the Panther 44 yard line to begin their next drive.

EJ then used their ground attack of Cutler and Ryan Graham, along with the quick feet of quarterback Colin Shepard, with the aid of a Frankfort penalty, putting the Red Devils at the 10-yard line with under a minute to go in the half.

The Red Devils would lose ground on both first and second down, before getting to the seven yard line on third down with 28.6 seconds remaining. After a stop for no gain, EJ faced a fourth and goal from the seven, Shepard lofted a pass to a streaking Cutler that would fall into his hands as he cross the goal line with 2.4 seconds left, and after an unsuccessful conversion attempt, EJ would trail 14-6 headed into the break.

The second half would be much different as the momentum the Red Devils created just before the horn was wiped away as the Panther offense and defense took their game to another level, shutting down the EJ offensive attack and taking advantage of what they could get offensively.

For the game, Shepard finished an effective, 6-of-7 passing for 56 yards and a score, while Cutler picked up 58 yards on the ground on 17 carries and also hauled in three receptions for 36 yards and was the recipient of the Shepard TD.

East Jordan slips to (2-3) will face Suttons Bay (0-5) on Friday, October 2, in a Northern Michigan Football League II contest..

From Owls to Eclipses

Whether you are a wildlife enthusiast, hiker, history lover, astronomy buff, or all of the above, The Headlands International Dark Sky Park in Mackinaw City is the place for you. And, at only a 45 or 60 minute drive from Petoskey or Gaylord, respectively, it's not too far to venture on a pitch black night.

The Headlands offers a plethora of entertaining activities and hosts at least one large event monthly.

This past weekend a substantial contingent of lunar lovers gathered in anticipation of the Harvest Moon Full Lunar Eclipse. Unfortunately, the celestial gods must have been in a gloomy mood as thick cloud cover made viewing of the event a mission impossible. Participants did, however, enjoy meeting and listening to renowned author, Paul Bogard, whose book, "The End of Night" has bolstered the dark sky advocacy movement.

Prior to the evening, Program Director, Mary Stewart Adams, described the significance of the eclipse. "This Harvest Moon Eclipse is the last in the series of four Total Lunar eclipses that really stirred up a sensation in 2014 and 2015. It's also a Super Moon, and sometimes known as a 'Blood Moon' because of the reddish appearance of the Moon when it is moving through Earth's shadow. It's also the Full Moon closest to Autumn Equinox, which means it is used to determine the sacred days of the season in many traditions."

Before Capricorns have their day and we usher in the New Year two more adventures are planned at the Headlands. A family-favorite is the 7th annual Headlands Challenge on Saturday, October 24 from 8:00-10:00pm. This activity, in association with the Halloween season, involves a slightly spooky one-mile, candlelit hike to the trails end where participants will enjoy seasonal storytelling around this year's theme of "superstitions", refreshments, and dark sky viewing. The last event of 2015 is on Saturday, November 14 from 6:00-8:00pm with the theme of cosmos-inspired art under cover of the Leonid Meteor Shower.

Looking to the future I highly recommend marking

your calendar for next April as the Headlands hosts an evening with a dual purpose-owl banding and stargazing. Working with Straits Area Audubon Society members, visitors can play a role in setting mist nets in hopes of capturing diminutive, elusive Northern Saw-whet owls. These birds rely on utter darkness for migration, hunting, and mating. The Headlands, one of only 6 certified dark sky parks in the U.S., provides the perfect habitat for these pernickety owls. Visitors have been able to get up close and personal with a fascinating bird with a catlike face, oversized head, and bright yellow eyes.

Regardless of the event, participants are guaranteed to enjoy Adam's masterful and mesmerizing presentations of the science, history, and folklore of the constellations and plan-

DNR confirms gray wolf in Emmet County

This is second confirmation of wolf presence in Lower Peninsula since 1910

EMMET COUNTY – The Michigan Department of Natural Resources has announced confirmation of gray wolf occurrence in Emmet County, marking the second confirmation of wolf presence in the Lower Peninsula since 1910.

Late last week, the Little Traverse Bay Band of Odawa Indians received confirmation from Trent University in Peterborough, Ontario, that scat submitted for DNA analysis by the tribe in 2014 was from a male gray wolf.

Genetic testing also confirmed that the wolf was not likely to be an escaped captive, since it closely matched genetic information taken from northeast Ontario wolves.

In March 2014, tribal biologists discovered tracks and collected scat from Emmet County. DNR Wildlife Division staff then visited the site with biologists from the tribe and agreed the tracks appeared to be from two separate wolves.

At that time, trail camera photos also were reviewed by tribal biologists and DNR staff, and an image of what appeared to be a wolf was discovered. The tribe then submitted the collected scat to Trent University for DNA analysis, which led to last week's confirmation.

"The DNR and partners continue to administer wolf track surveys in the northern Lower Peninsula, which were designed to determine if wolves have moved onto the Lower Peninsula landscape," said Kevin Swanson, DNR bear and wolf specialist in Marquette. "We have had some tracks and potential sightings, but genetic testing gives us a definitive confirmation."

Swanson said wolves dispersed from Upper Peninsula packs might travel to the northern reaches of the Lower Peninsula during cold winters that produce ice bridges between the two peninsulas.

Swanson said given the capability of the northern Lower Peninsula habitat to support wolves, the DNR is not surprised that wolves

are moving south. Swanson outlined some of the previous evidence reported.

In 2004, a gray wolf that had been previously captured and collared in the Upper Peninsula's Mackinac County was caught and accidentally killed by a coyote trapper in Presque Isle County in the Lower Peninsula. This marked the first verified wolf report from the Lower Peninsula since 1910.

In 2010, animals which appeared to be wolves were trapped and collared in Cheboygan County. Later DNA analysis confirmed that the genetic assignment of these animals was coyotes, not gray wolves.

During the winter of 2014-15, DNR staff investigated potential wolf tracks in Cheboygan and Emmet counties. Scat or hair was not present for DNA analysis so a genetic confirmation was not possible.

The DNR has not confirmed a breeding wolf population in the northern Lower Peninsula. Staff will continue to investigate reports and administer winter track surveys.

Anyone finding possible wolf tracks or collecting photographic evidence should contact a local DNR wildlife office.

If anyone should encounter a wolf, the DNR recommends standing tall, making noise and walking away slowly. When in a safe location, notify the DNR of the sighting.

In 2014, during the most recent Upper Peninsula winter wolf survey, 636 wolves were estimated to inhabit the region.

In December, a U.S. District Court judge's ruling again placed gray wolves in Michigan on the federal List of Endangered Species. The species remains protected by law and states are unable to use lethal measures from their management plans to address wolf conflicts. The one exception is threat to human life.

Focus RS launch control configures the car's chassis and powertrain systems to deliver the fastest possible acceleration – in various track conditions. The driver selects launch control from the cluster menu, engages first gear, applies full throttle and releases the clutch. The system then delivers optimum drive – in-

cluding distributing torque through the all-wheel-drive system, maintaining maximum torque using the turbo overboost function, managing traction control and setting the dampers.

To achieve maximum acceleration through the gears, a performance shift light in the instrument cluster alerts the driver when approaching the optimum upshift point of 5,900 rpm, and flashes if the engine hits the 6,800-rpm limit.
