Rayders earn Homecoming victory Solid Defense keys big conference win over Kalkaska 20-12

Charlevoix 20, Kalkaska 12

CHARLEVOIX -- A steady start, a fantastic finish

The Charlevoix Rayder football team picked up a huge homecoming victory over the visiting Kalkaska Blazers, 20-12 on October 2, in front of a standing room only crowd at Kipke Field, and in the process stayed unbeaten in conference play, despite playing without two of their leaders in the form of Justin Adkins and Jared McLean.

With the Rayders holding a 20-6 advantage early in the Blazers, refusing to go away quietly, picked up a TD to pull within a score, and when they got the ball back with about two minutes to go, they looked as if they were going to have an opportunity to tie the game as Kalkaska connected on a big pass play, only to have the receiver caught from behind by the always hustling Brad Klinger near the 20-yards line.

"I was really impressed with what we did tonight," Rayder coach Ron Bindi said. "The kids pulled together and had a couple of goal line stands as well as Brad (Klinger) catching them on that last big pass play, we never quit on the play and that was big."

The Blazers went to work from inside the red zone, but were unable to get the ball into the endzone against the tough Charlevoix defense.

Kalkaska looked to get on the board early, but were unable to score as the Rayders clamped down on D and held the Blazers out of the end zone on multiple occasions in the first half. The Rayders however, mixing it up, moving the ball both through the air and on the ground, were able to punch it in via a 1-yard touchdown run by junior Malcolm Williams and after a successful point after attempt by Hunter Cox, Charlevoix led 7-0, a lead they would carry into the half. Following intermission, the Rayder defense turned it up a notch, creating three turnovers, two fumble recoveries and an interception. **Quarterback Forrest Noirot** called his own number and found his way into the end zone from 1yard out to make it 13-0 Charlevoix. Kalkaska would finally score, and after a failed conversion attempt, the score would be 13-6. Early in the fourth, with the Blazers driving, Rayder Oliver DeYoung would pick off a pass at the Chx 8-yard line, giving the ball back to the Charlevoix offense. On the next play, Rayder Ben Boss would take a handoff and follow an opening created by the offensive line and it was off to the races as Boss blazed a 92-yard trail to paydirt, putting Charlevoix up 20-6. Offensively for the Rayders, Noirot took to the air and was very efficient, completing 10-of-15 passes for 158 yards, connecting six times with Austin Putman for 112 yards, while also finding Klinger four times for 46 yards. The Rayder ground game totaled 142 yards, as Boss led the way with 119 yards on 15 carries

and a score. Williams and Noirot had the other two touchdown runs for Charlevoix. On defense, Jordan Adkins and Williams led the Rayders with constant pressure as they recorded 13 and 12 tackles respectfully.

Josh Hinkley added seven stops, while Klinger and Cam Alden each added six.

With the win, Charlevoix improves to 4-2 overall on the season, 2-0 in the Northern Michigan Football League II. The Rayder travel to East Jordan for another conference showdown with the rival Red Devils on October 9.

BOYNE FALLS -- The Boyne City Cross Country team continues to pick up hardware for their trophy case as both the boys and girls teams took home runner-up trophies following the varsity race at the Boyne Falls Logger Invitational on October 3.

The Rambler girls were edged by Inland Lakes by one point, while the Rambler boys finished two points behind Ellsworth.

"It was a great day for running," Boyne City coach Andy Place said. "Our runners finished the day with six personal record times and five season best times on a course that traditionally runs slow."

In the girl's race, Boyne had four girls finish in the top 20, led by Emily Sterling's second place finish and a new personal record time of 21:32.

Annie Stokes finished eighth in a personal best time of 22:22; Veronica Sosa was 10th in a season best 22:51; Annika Bergquist was 16th in 23:47; Madison Bates was 21st in 24:06; Eleri Giem was 26th in 24:33; Alysse Whittet finished 37th in a season best time of 25:38: Molly Day was 46th in 26:29: Brianna Burnell was 56th in her season best time of 28:01; Liv Looze crossed the line in 62th place in 28:55; and Hailey Fogo was 63rd in her personal record time of 28:56.


On the boys side, BC had three runners finish in the top 20, with all of them running their personal record times.

MAPLE CITY -- Coming off their first regular season loss since 2013, the Boyne City Ramblers had to overcome a slow start against the host Lakers, and ran away with the contest 48-21 in Northern Michigan Football League I play on October 2.

Glen Lake got things going first, capitalizing on a short field and punching it in for a 7-0 Lake lead in the first quarter.

The Ramblers would respond by scoring seven of next nine touchdowns, with four coming in the first half for a 28-14 lead at intermission, before adding their final three scores in the second half to seal the victory.

"We got off to a slow start, probably due to the short week," Boyne coach David Hills said. "I was really pleases with how the kids responded to the adversity early."

Sophomore quarterback, Mason Gardner was a smooth 4-of-5 passing for 113 yards and a touchdown, connecting on that score with Luke Sage, who hauled in three receptions for 94 yards.

Defensively for Boyne, Sage tallied nine stops to lead the Ramblers, while Carter Wilmot added seven, with Kruzel and Zak Bearss added six each and Smith chipping in with four.

Boyne City, 5-1 overall, 2-1 NMFL-I, plays their final regular season home game on October 9, as they host Benzie Central. The contest will also be the Ramblers homecoming and annual pink game, A Crucial Catch

Outdoors Prospects for small-game hunting season

DNR biologists say hunters should find conditions similar to last year

Small game hunting season began with the opening of the early Canada goose season and teal seasons on Sept. 1 and continues until rabbit and hare season ends March 31. Department of Natural Resources wildlife biologists across the state say hunters should find conditions similar to last year. Hunters are reminded that due to changes in licensing, all licensed hunters may pursue small game.

Rabbits

Season: Cottontail rabbits and varying (or snowshoe) hare can be hunted from Sept. 15-March 31 statewide. The daily bag limit is five in combination with a possession limit of 10.

Outlook: Roughly 56,000 hunters reported pursuing rabbits in 2011 (the most recently completed harvest survey) and about 12,000 hunted hares. Cottontail populations are good throughout their range over much of the state. Concentrate on thick cover, such as briar patches and brush piles, often near agricultural fields. Snowshoe hare populations are down from historic levels. Look for early-successional forests (such as aspen stands) and low-lying conifer swamps with blow-downs and brush piles in the northern two-thirds of the state.

Squirrels

Season: Sept. 15-March 1. The daily bag limit is five per day with 10 in possession.

Outlook: Both fox and gray squirrel populations are at moderate to high levels across much of the state. Areas that had good mast production last year are a good bet, as are wood lots adjoining corn fields. Post deer-season hunting, in Jan. and Feb., is increasingly popular. About 72,000 hunters pursue squirrels.

Ruffed Grouse

Season: Sept. 15-Nov. 14 and

Michigan).

Outlook: Grouse populations are cyclical, typically rising and falling over a 10-year period, and indications are that we are near a bottom, though spring drumming counts during the last two years were up. Hunters are expected to see more birds this year than in 2014. Young to moderate-aged aspen stands – about 6 to 15 years of age – with a thick understory of witch hazel or dogwood are prime grouse habitat. Food sources are important, but wild fruit and berry production should be very good this year due to good spring rains. Grouse are most numerous in the Upper Peninsula and northern Lower Peninsula, but hunters may find local populations in areas with good habitat in southern Michigan as well. Grouse and woodcock hunters are asked to assist the DNR in monitoring populations by reporting their results. Cooperator forms can be found on the DNR web site at www.michigan.gov/hunting (select Upland Game Birds and then Ruffed Grouse). Michigan boasts about 77,000 grouse hunters.

Woodcock

Season: Sept. 19-Nov. 2 statewide. The daily bag limit is three with a possession limit of six.

Outlook: Woodcock populations have been in long-term decline, though there is evidence that decline has slowed in recent years. Hunters can expect about the same results they had last year. Found in all parts of Michican be found in good numbers in southern Michigan later in the season as the birds head south. Some 32,000 hunters say they pursue woodcock in Michigan, the top woodcock-hunting state in the union. All woodcock hunters must obtain a free woodcock stamp in addition to a valid base license; the endorsement stamp is available at all license agents or online at www.mdnrelicense.com.

Sharp-tailed Grouse

Season: Oct. 10-31 in the eastern Upper Peninsula, east of M-129 and east of I-75 north of M-48. The limit is two daily, with four in possession; six per season.

Outlook: Sharptails use grasslands and associated shrubby habitat; think pheasant habitat.

Often found in small flocks and sometimes difficult to approach, sharptails often require relatively long-range shooting compared to ruffed grouse. Sharptail hunters are required to have a (free) sharp-tailed grouse endorsement on their hunting licenses. In 2013, 350 hunters chased sharptails.

Pheasants

Season: Oct. 10-31 in the Upper Peninsula in Menominee County and portions of Iron, Marquette, Dickinson and Delta counties, Oct. 20-Nov. 14 in the Lower Peninsula; and Dec. 1-Jan. 1 in selected areas of Zone 3 (southern Michigan). The limit is two cocks daily, with four in possession.

Outlook: Pheasant populations have been in decline for a num-

private lands that have been managed for pheasants, especially those that are enrolled in farm set-aside programs, though some public land is being intensely managed for pheasants. Generally speaking, hunters who enjoyed success last year should find similar hunting conditions in the same areas. The best counties for pheasant hunting occur in south-central to mid-Michigan and into the Thumb, though locally abundant populations can be found almost anywhere. Look for warm-season grasses, especially on idled farm fields. Lateseason hunters can have success in cattail and shrub lands adjoining picked agricultural fields. An estimated 23,000 hunters pursue pheasants in Michigan.

Quail

Season: Oct. 20-Nov. 14. Quail can be hunted only in Branch, Calhoun, Clinton, Eaton, Genesee, Gratiot, Hillsdale, Huron, Ingham, Ionia, Jackson, Kent, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Montcalm, Oakland, Saginaw, St. Clair, St. Joseph, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Tuscola, Washtenaw and Wayne counties. The bag limit is five per day/10 in possession.

Outlook: Back-to-back harsh winters and ice storms have significantly lowered quail populations. Often associated with pheasant hunting, fewer than 500 hunters reported quail hunting in 2011.

Wild Turkey

Season: Sept. 15-Nov. 14 in eight

Oceana, Newaygo, Mecosta, Isabella, Midland, Bay and Huron (except Wayne and Monroe). A total of 51,850 licenses are available - 5,150 general licenses that may be used on public or private land and 46,700 licenses for private-land only. Licenses are issued by lottery, though leftover licenses are available over the counter on a first-come, firstserved basis until management unit quotas are met. Hunters may take one bird of either sex per license. The limit is one per license.

Outlook: Fall turkey seasons are held only in areas where populations are stable to increasing, so prospects are very good. Roughly 16,000 hunters pursue wild turkeys in the fall hunt, many of them during the archery deer season.

Ducks

Seasons: Early teal (only) season Sept. 1-7. Youth: Sept. 12-13. Regular season: Sept. 26-Nov. 22 and Nov. 28-29 in the North Zone (Upper Peninsula); Oct. 3-Nov. 29 and Dec. 12-13 in the Middle Zone; and Oct.10–Dec. 6 and Dec. 26-27 in the South Zone.

The bag limit for ducks is six per day with no more than four mallards (no more than two hens), three wood ducks, three scaup (bluebills), two redheads, two pintails, two canvasbacks and one black duck. Five additional mergansers (no more than two may be hooded mergansers) may be taken. Possession limit is two days' daily bag limit.

Outlook: Continent-wide, duck

numbers are high, well above the long-term average, with mallard numbers the highest on record. Michigan mallard numbers are similar to last year. Wetland conditions are very good. Hunting should be very good for early season puddle ducks (wood ducks and teal). Diving ducks, which usually begin arriving in good numbers around mid-October, should be plentiful on the Great Lakes, too; notice the extra canvasback allowed this year. About 42,000 hunters pursue ducks in Michigan.

Canada Geese

Seasons: The early season is Sept 1-15 except in the Upper Peninsula and Saginaw, Huron and Tuscola counties, where the season is Sept. 1-10. The daily bag limit is five.

The regular goose seasons are Sept. 11-Dec. 11 in the North Zone; Sept. 19-Dec. 19 in the Middle Zone; and Sept. 19-27, Oct. 10-Dec. 6, and Dec. 26-27 in the South Zone, except in designated goose management units (GMUs). The daily bag limit is two. In the Saginaw County and Tuscola/Huron GMUs, the season is Sept. 19-27, Oct. 10-Dec 6, and Dec. 26-Jan. 19 with a daily bag limit of two. In the Allegan County GMU, the season is Oct. 31-Jan. 30 with a bag limit of two. In the Muskegon Wastewater GMU, the season is Oct. 17-Nov. 14 and Dec. 1-22. The bag limit is two.

The late goose season, in the South Zone, excluding the GMUs, is Jan. 23–Feb. 14 with a daily bag limit of five.

Outlook: Resident Canada goose populations, which account for more than 70 percent of the state's total harvest, are above population goals, so hunters should find plenty of geese. Migratory goose numbers are down somewhat. Except for a few days in Dec. and Jan., waterfowl hunters may pursue geese somewhere in the state from Sept. 1 to Feb 14.

Less weight and more power is the combination for performance success and engineers of the 2016 Camaro have the numbers to prove it. With weight savings of up to 390 pounds (177 kg), the allnew Camaro delivers performance numbers that reset the benchmark for the segment.

Chevrolet testing shows the allnew, 455-hp (336 kW) Camaro SS coupe - the most powerful Camaro SS ever - sprints from 0-60 mph in 4.0 seconds and covers the quarter-mile in 12.3 seconds, when equipped with the all-new eight-speed paddle-shift automatic transmission.

The other Gen Six Camaro coupe models are commensurately quick, with the 275-hp (205) 2.0L Turbo delivering 5.4-second 0-60 performance and a 14.0-second quarter-mile, with the sixspeed manual. With the available, 335-hp (250 kW) 3.6L V-6 and eightspeed automatic, the Camaro zips to 60 mph in 5.1 seconds and down the quarter-mile in only 13.5 seconds.

"The performance of the Camaro 2.0L Turbo will challenge many of the iconic muscle cars from the 1960s, while the Camaro SS's performance - including 0.97

g cornering – makes it one of the most capable 2+2 coupes on the market," said Al Oppenheiser, Camaro chief engineer. "The performance numbers only tell half of the story, because the lighter curb weight also makes the new Camaro feel more responsive and agile behind the wheel. It brakes more powerfully, dives into corners quicker, accelerates faster and is more fun to drive than ever."

With standard 18-inch wheels and Goodyear Eagle Sport all-season tires, the 2.0L Turbo delivers 0.85 g in cornering grip and 60-0mph braking in 129 feet. With the RS package, which includes 20inch wheels and Goodyear Eagle F1 Asymmetric all-season runflat tires, the 3.6L V-6 delivers 0.89 g in cornering and 60-0 mph braking in 124 feet. The Camaro SS features Eagle F1 Asymmetric 3 run-flat summer-only tires, enabling 0.97 g in cornering and 60-0 braking in 117 feet.

Much of the Camaro's performance can be attributed to the development team's focus on reducing vehicle mass and improving structural stiffness. They invested 9 million hours of computational time looking for opportunities to make the chassis lighter and stiffer. That computeraided engineering led to a modular architecture strategy that tailored the chassis to each model.

"Every Camaro model offers exceptional chassis strength and rigidity, but the modular design made the architecture more adaptable and mass-efficient, because we didn't have to compensate for the unique demands of, say, the SS convertible when building a 2.0L Turbo coupe," said Oppenheiser. "The result was an elegant engineering solution: 12 chassis components that could be combined to meet the structural requirements of each specific model, without adding unnecessary mass to other models."

Consequently, the base curb weight for the 2016 Camaro is 368 pounds (167 kg) lighter than the previous model. The 1SS model is 223 pounds (101 kg) lighter, while offering 29 more horsepower, for a 14-percent improvement in its power-to-weight ratio.

The 2016 Camaro goes on sale this fall.
