Team sets sights on postseason

GRAYLING -- Following a two week stint of no games, due to Elk Rapids forfeiting their contest scheduled on October 16 due to lack of numbers, the Boyne City football team finally got the chance to get back in action and put to rest any doubt of being rusty as the Ramblers downed the Vikings 35-20 on October 23.

The Ramblers improved to 8-1 on the season (5-1 in the Northern Michigan Football League I) as they now prepare to host their first round playoff contest with 6-3 Oscoda coming to town on Friday, October 30.

Boyne and Grayling battled to a 7-6 Rambler lead after one quarter of play, only to see BC extend that margin to 21-6 at halftime. The two teams played an even second half,



scoring 14 points apiece.

The Ramblers were paced by the senior backfield of Malik Smith and Tanner Kruzel as the duo rumbled around, over and through the Grayling defense, combining for 301 yards on the ground, Smith - 196 and two scores and Kruzel 105 to go with a touchdown of his own.

Tarin Bell also added 37 yards rushing on 10 carries and a touchdown and also caught two passes from quarterback Mason Gardner for 21 yards receiving.

Derek Willis would connect with Luke Sage for a 30-yard touchdown on his only pass attempt.

On the defensive side of the ball, Kruzel recorded 10 stops, including one for a loss to lead the Ramblers, while Sage added seven tackles, Dylan Hutterrer chipped in with six and Smith had five.

The Ramblers host Oscoda at 7pm, Friday, October 30 at Earl Brotherston Field in the opening round of the MHSAA football playoffs.

Rayders come up short in season finale

Harbor Springs steals game with last second field goal

Harbor Springs 22, Charlevoix 20

HARBOR SPRINGS -- Football is a game of yards and on Friday, October 23, the Harbor Springs Rams were just a few yards better than the Charlevoix Rayders, as the Rams escaped with a 22-20 win in the closing seconds on a Mitch Hoffman field goal from 24-yards out.

The Rayders held a slim 20-19 lead with just over six minutes to play in the contest and were looking to run some clock when a first down run was negated by a holding penalty and forced Charlevoix to punt, setting up the winning drive by Harbor.

'We gave it a run, had a few chances but could never quite put them away,' Charlevoix coach Ron Bindi said. "They (Harbor Springs) kept pounding the ball and wore us down, we got pretty banged up.'

Charlevoix held the lead 7-6 after the first quarter and 14-13 at halftime.


"The kids played hard and gave it their best effort, Harbor is a good football team," coach Bindi added. "We never really had a chance all year to have a full team due to injuries and such."

Senior Austin Putman, like much of this season, was a huge force for the Rayders, hauling in all five of Forrest Noirot's completions for 103 yards, including a 22yard score.

Malcolm Williams carried 11 times, gaining 71 yards on the ground, while Ben Boss added 56 yards rushing on seven carries and a 34-yard touchdown.

Putman chipped in with 21 yards rushing, while Brad Klinger had 13 and Noirot added a 1-yard touchdown run.

The Rayders close the season at 5-4 and while this one hurts, will be ready to go next fall when the whistle blows in late August.

Nordics battle back with strong second half

Felch North Dickinson 64, East Jordan 42

EAST JORDAN -- There was something explosive in the air on October 23, as the host Red Devils and their last minute opponent, Felch North Dickinson, combined to put over 100 points on the scoreboard as both teams found the end zone, courtesy of long runs and long passes and what would seem to be, very little defense. In the end, it would be the visiting Nordics ousting East Jordan, 64-42 at Boswell Stadium.

The game was made possible by Felch North Dickinson making the five plus hour trip to play East Jordan due to the fact that the Red Devils scheduled opponent, Elk Rapids forfeited their contest a week earlier.

East Jordan wasted little time in getting on the scoreboard on senior night, as running back, Donny Cutler took a handoff and raced 50 yards down the right sideline, just two minutes and twelve seconds into the contest for an early 6-0 lead.

A defensive stand by the Red Devils would force Felch North Dickinson to punt after only three plays, setting up the next East Jordan offensive series.

Red Devil quarterback, Colin Shepard took the second play from scrimmage and connected with a pass to Ryan Graham for another 50 yard score and a 12-0 EJ lead.

The Nordics would find their offensive rhythm the next time they touched the ball, as they put together a one minute, fifty three second, five play, 57-yard drive, as Noah Berg ran it in from one yard out. A successful conversion attempt and North Dickinson was back in it 12-8.

The scoring wasn't done by far, as the two teams went on to combine for three more scores in the opening quarter, with the Red Devils leading 28-14.

The offensive outpouring continued in the second quarter as both teams found paydirt twice, with Cutler and Graham picking up the scores for EJ, and at the break, the Red Devils were up, 42-26

Hubbard Lake Yields Goliath Smallmouth

Former state record stood for 109-years!

If anyone tries to tell you that angling in Michigan is declin-

ing your retort should be that, in 2015 alone, anglers set six state records! Without question, however, the most impressive feat is that of Greg Gasiciel of Rhodes, Michigan. Gasiciel was bait-casting with a green grub on Hubbard Lake a few weeks ago when something hit his bait like a rampaging great white! A ferocious fight ensued and when the fish was finally in the boat Gasiciel had broke one of the longest standing Michigan records with his 9.33-pound, 24.5inch smallmouth bass. Based on the weight, his monster bass beat the previous mark by the narrowest of margins. The former record, set in Cheboygan County's Long Lake back in 1906, was a 9.25pound, 27.25-inch fish caught by W.F. Shoemaker. Many thought this record, set 109 years ago and one of the longest-standing records for smallmouth bass in

the country, to be unbeatable. In an article in the Detroit Free Press Gasiciel explained how he and his fishing partner wondered if he had foul-hooked a carp.

"I didn't even see the fish until I had been fighting it for at least ten minutes. I had no idea what it could be."

Imagine his astonishment when the smallmouth equivalent of Godzilla exploded out of the water next to the boat!

The species and weight were verified by Kathrin Schrouder, a DNR fisheries biologist in Bay City. Gasiciel sees the merit in allowing fisheries biologists to study the brawny bronzeback.

"Once the taxidermist skins the fish, I will be giving it back to the DNR so that they can learn from it. We still don't know how old it is and what sex it is."

Based on years of population growth data, the fish would likely be at least 13 years old.

Gasiciel and his co-angler were fishing a bass tournament on Hubbard. Ironically, even with his state record fish contributing to their total weight, they didn't win the tournament.

"But, we did get \$110.00 prize for the big fish!" he said with a grin. Big fish? Man, you could say that again!

Michigan officers' tips for safe bowhunting

Michigan's bowhunting season opened October 1, and Department of Natural Resources conservation officers are sharing tips for a safe bowhunting experience.

"Bowhunting is enjoyed by thousands of hunters every year in Michigan, and we want to ensure everyone has a safe and enjoyable hunting season," said Sgt. Steve Orange, supervisor of the DNR's hunter education program. "With the season upon us, every hunter should follow some common sense safety tips before heading to or being in the woods."

The top safety tips for bowhunting include:

Before you go out, inspect equipment, including your tree stand or other raised platform. If anything is worn, frayed, cracked or peeling, replace it or get it fixed. If using a compound bow or crossbow, make sure the cables and pulleys are in good working order.

When sharpening broadheads, be careful and take your time.

Practice tree-stand safety. The DNR recommends using a fullbody safety harness to get into and out of your tree stand.

If using a raised platform, always use a haul line to raise and lower your gear.

Keep arrows in the quiver until you are ready to use them. A common injury is to stab or injure yourself or a hunting companion while carrying arrows in your hand or nocked on your bow.

When heading out to the woods, hunt with a friend or family member or make sure you tell someone reliable where you are going and what time to expect you back. This information is valuable in helping conservation officers or sheriff's deputies to find you if you are lost.

Also, think about carrying a cell phone, compass, flashlight and other small safety items in when in the woods.

Other important reminders include:

Obtain permission from landowners before hunting on their land or using their land to access public land.

Never take a shot at a deer that is beyond the maximum effective range of your equipment and your shooting ability.

If you are successful, field dress your deer and cool its meat immediately. Michigan's unpredictable weather means October days are sometimes warm, and warm temperatures and can cause the meat to spoil quickly. Some licenses available for fall turkey season

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources reminds hunters that spring is not the only time to hunt turkeys – a majority of counties are open for fall turkey hunting.

"A fall turkey hunt is a pretty unique experience," said DNR upland game bird specialist Al Stewart. "It's an entirely different feeling when you're out in the fall. The leaves are changing, and even better yet, no mosquitoes."

Sept. 15 – Nov. 14 marks the fall turkey hunting season in 59 of 83 counties. Turkey licenses still are available in Units J, HA and YY, with a large number of licenses still available in Unit YY, a multicounty, private-land-only unit in southern Michigan that includes Beaver Island.

"The fall season is used to manage turkey populations, so you can take a hen or a tom. You can even purchase one turkey license a day, until licenses are gone for that unit," said Stewart. "With two full months of hunting, the fall turkey season offers many chances for a wild Michigan Thanksgiving turkey."

Stewart added that turkey hunting is a challenging and interactive activity that can be fun for a group, or alone, while providing great local and organic protein for the table.

An ORV may be operated on the far right of the maintained portion of the roadway within the city with these exceptions:


