CHARLEVOIX COUNTY -- The Charlevoix County area has been treated to some pretty good basketball over the last couple of seasons and this one was no different.

Area fans had the chance to cheer their own squads, as well as those of other area schools. following the end of their own team's tournament run.

This season saw the East Jordan boys basketball team do something that no other team from EJ has done in quite a while, the Red Devils ended a 30 year drought by capturing the Lake Michigan Conference title and in the process, set a school record for wins in a season with 20.

Boyne Falls clinched their fifth straight Northern Lakes championship, a feat that is tough to do, no matter where you play.

Boyne City earned their second straight district championship, in the toughest district around by defeating Charlevoix, St. Ignace and East Jordan.

While all of that was fun for each team and fan base to be a part of, each team had standout athletes that have set a higher standard for how the game was and will be player going forward. With that being said, the Charlevoix County News is proud to announce the 2015-16 All-Area Boys Basketball

"Dream Team".

The 2015-16 honor of Player of the Year goes to Boyne Fall's senior, Marcus Matelski. Matelski is a multiple time All-Area selection as well as POY during the 2013-14 season.

Joining Matelski on this season's team, in school alphabetical order; Tanner Kruzel, Colton Sieradski and Derek Willis of Boyne City; Andrew Campbell and Shea Ross of Boyne Falls; Austin Putman, Walker Drost and Kevin Pearl of Charlevoix; Jordan Weber, Colin Petrie, Collin Bajko and Thomas Brandell of East Jordan; and Zeb Collins and Tyler Drenth of Ellsworth.

Player of the Year

(#32) Marcus Matelski, Boyne Falls, senior.

Marcus was a varsity starter ever since he set foot on the court as an eighth grader for the Loggers.

Over the course of his stellar career, Matelski would rack up numbers on a nightly basis, and he did so over the last three seasons facing multiple defenders (sometimes all five opponents) each game.

His accomplishments would

not go unnoticed as he was an Associated Press, four-time All-State honoree, earning honorable mention as a freshman, and first team status his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. This year as a unanimous selection. He was also All-Northern Lakes Conference first team.

He would finish his career with 2,422 points, which ranks ninth all-time in the state of Michigan, while this year, he also set the single season steals record with 146, giving him a total of 340 during his career, fifth best all-time.

The Loggers went 97-13 over Matelski's five seasons on the team, including 77-11 during his four-year high school career, capturing five conference titles and two Class D district championships in the process.

"Coach Smith has always done a good job of getting us prepared, especially for the big games," Marcus said. "The vounger guvs

stayed focused and locked in as the season went on."

Marcus would average 27 points per game as a freshman, 26.5 as a sophomore and 29.3 as a junior. He would elevate his game to another level this year, averaging 35 ppg, while grabbing 11.3 rebounds, 7.3 steals and four assists. He shot 62 percent from the floor. 41 percent from beyond the arch and 82 percent from the charity stripe.

He also managed to record five triple-doubles this season, and over the course of a two week period, set and reset the school record for points in a game with 52.

When the humble Matelski was asked to reflect on his career at Boyne Falls, he responded; "It went by fast! As I get the chance to look back on it, it's pretty cool to know that I've done those things, it may be my name on the

banner or trophy, but it's more than just me, it's my family, my teammates, every team i've played on from AAU through this season."

"Coach (Tim) Smith has been a great influence on my basketball career, we talk on a regular basis, as well as coach Dale Jacob (Logger assistant). They are a huge reason a lot of this has happened."

The Logger point guard/shooting guard was a key contributor the last few seasons, helping orchestrate the Boyne Falls offense.



15 points per game, topping the 20 point mark seven times including a high of

Campbell did his job as the setup man, dishing out nearly eight assists per game, including three games of over 10. He was a NLC first team selection.

(#33) Shea Ross, senior

One of the unsung heros for any team, battling on the boards each and every possession, as well as setting multiple screens each offensive series to free up teammates.

Ross however, stepped into a bigger offensive role this season, averaging over eight points per contest and turning himself into a deep threat.

He showed his ability to keep defenses honest by knocking down five triples against a tough East Jordan team late in the season. Shea was a NLC selection.

Boyne City (#12) Tanner Kruzel, senior.

The Rambler big man, finished the season averaging nearly 12 points per game. Tanner went on a tear over the season's final eight games, racking up 12 or more points in seven of them, including a high of 22 points.

His biggest contributions would come during tournament play where he averaged 14 ppg and 9.25 rebounds per game, while his energy electrified the crowd and was able to tire

out opposing post players.

Kruzel finished the season averaging over six rebounds and two assists per game. He was also a first team All-Lake Michigan Conference selection.

(#23) Colton Sieradski, senior.

The quick and crafty point guard for the Ramblers this season, came into his own early on in the campaign, leading the Boyne City charge with his timely shooting and ability to get a steal whenever the team needed it.

Sieradski averaged 11 points per game, 3.5 boards, 2.5 assists, 4.5 steals and shot 81 percent from the free throw line.

He also stepped up his game in the post-season, going over 10 points in three of the Ramblers four games.

(#3) Derek Willis,

senior.

Willis finished his senior season very strong, stepping up over the final three weeks on the year.

Derek put together a strong tournament run for Boyne, averaging 10 points per game during the postseason, including a high of 19 points against Charlevoix in the opener.

In addition to his solid offensive outbursts, he brought exceptional tough defense, helping shutdown opponent's top perimeter threats with his 6'4" length.

Charlevoix (#40) Austin Putman,

senior.

One of the Rayder senior captains, he finished the season averaging a doubledouble, coming in at 17 points and 10 rebounds per game, earning him an honorable mention all-state in Class C.

Austin was also a first team All-Lake Michigan Conference player.

Putman was a physical presence for any team he faced this season, using the hard work he had put in during the offseason to his advantage by controlling zzthe boards and getting to the basket whenever he wanted to do so. His doubledouble total for the season was 10 games and he recorded 15 or more rebounds in a game three times, topping out at 18, which he did twice.

(#22) Walker Drost, senior.

Another Rayder captain, Drost was the floor general for Charlevoix once again this season.

Walker averaged 13 points and four assists per game this year while also guarding the opponent's best ball handler.

He was a first team All-Lake Michigan conference selection.

(#32) Kevin Pearl, junior.

Another Charlevoix captain that helped lead the Rayder charge this past season

Pearl has been a featured scorer in the past for each Rayder team he has been a part of. He took a step back this season, sacrificing his own scoring to defend the opponent's top scoring

Kevin is one of the best defenders in the LMC and long range threat, still managed to drop seven points per game for Charlevoix. He was an honorable mention selection in the LMC this season.

East Jordan (#32) Jordan Weber, senior.

If you've had the opportunity to see Jordan play over the past four years, you know that once he crosses half-court, opponents had better guard him, as his ability to hit shots from 35 feet and out are similar to most players shooting from the six foot

Weber is a two-time Class C All-State first team selection and first team All-LMC and four time All-Area selection.

Jordan has set numerous records for the Red Devils over the course of his fouryear stint on the varsity. He is the school's all-time leader in points (1,579); 614 points in a season; threepointers made (278) and ranks fourth all time in Michigan state history; 91 triples in a season; and 45 points in a game.

"I've been a part of some historical things," Jordan said. "We've won a district, a regional, which was the

first time in over 50 years, this season we won a conference title for the first time in 30 years and set the record for most wins in a season with 20."

This season, Weber averaged 19 points and seven rebounds per game, while shooting 76 percent from the free throw line, while knocking down 73 shots from beyond the arc.

When asked about playing with his teammates (Colin Petrie, Collin Bajko, Thomas Brandell, etc) and many more, all of which have been together since fourth grade, he responded; "They make it more than a game, we have bonded for more than eight years, and in just a few months we will all be going our separate ways.

"One of the best players I've ever had, and statistically speaking, the best player I've ever coached," coach and father, Darrin Weber said. "He is an amazing kid and I love him and I'm so proud of all that he has accomplished."

(#24) Colin Petrie, senior.

Petrie was a three year starter for the Red Devils and finished this season with 287 points, good enough for a 12.5 ppg average, shooting a team his 48 percent from the field.

Colin took over the point guard role for EJ at the midway point this year and finished with a team high 107 assists, while only committing 54 turnovers.

He also made 48 steals to lead the team and finished third in rebounds with 140.

"One of the best kids I've ever coached," coach Weber noted.

Petrie was a first team All-LMC selection and is a two time All-Area team member.

(#33) Collin Bajko, senior.

Bajko was a first team All-LMC selection and is a repeat All-Area team member as well.

Collin led the Red Devils in rebounds this season with 156 and finished third on the team in scoring with 212, an average of nearly 10 per game.

(#22) Thomas Brandell, senior.

Without a doubt, the most improved player in the area this season.

Brandell was a key contributor in the Red Devils success this season, his fourth on the varsity







and third as a starter. He finished second on the team in rebounding with 146, an average of 6.3 per game, while scoring 166 points (7.2 ppg).

"Thomas is a quiet kid but one of the hardest workers I've ever had," Coach Weber said. "A lot of what he did went unnoticed on the offensive end as he was responsible for getting guys open in our offense. Constantly setting ball screens, crashing the boards, he was another very coachable kid."

Ellsworth (#40) Zeb Collins, senior.

Collins brought his 6'7"

presence to the court each and every night, altering the game plan and constantly changing the shooting selection of many of the Lancer opponents.

Zeb finished the season averaging 11.1 points per game, while hauling in 10.5 rebounds per outing.

(#32) Tyler Drenth,

senior.

Another big obstacle for Ellsworth opponents, the 6'4" Drenth was also a factor in altering shots and controlling the boards for the Lancers.

Tyler finished the season netting 10 points and grabbing 8.1 rebounds per game for Ellsworth.

Coach of the Year

This season, coach of the year honors go to Darrin Weber of East Jordan. When asked to reflect over his time as coach for the Red Devils, Coach Weber responded;

"11 years ago when I got here, the bar wasn't set very high. East Jordan was a win on the schedule. We always had individual players who bought into playing year around but never a group like this years seniors."

Over time and through the development of our youth program and kids believing that basketball needed to be played year around and that there is a certain way to play the game, we started getting better and closing the gap."

"The last 3 seasons we've gone 56-13 and won the school's first District Championship since 1995 and first regional since 1953. We tied the school record for wins three seasons ago as well at 19, last season we had to deal with a lot of adversity and still managed 17 wins losing to a great Boyne City team in the district final by three."

"This year, during our first morning practice, I sat the team in front of one of our banners on the far side of the gym and had them look and see how long it had been since we won a league championship. 30 years

ago East Jordan won the league when we were in the Ski Valley and never an LMC championship. We started out on a roll, then got beat on a half court shot, and having to deal with yet more adversity half way through the season, these amazing kids were able to regroup and refocus and close out the season playing very well beating Boyne City and celebrating our conference championship. We then closed with two great teams the last week of the season beating both Boyne Falls and St. Ignace."

Coach Weber then noted that the Red Devils picked up their 20th win of the season, (a new school record) with a win over Harbor Springs in the district semifinal.

"Unfortunately we didn't finish the season the way we would've liked losing in the District final. We had a great mix of kids this

season, with a veteran senior group and a great mix of junior players. They set the bar very high for the future of East Jordan boys basketball. Over the past three seasons they've given this community a lot to cheer about and our little Red Devils something they will never forget."

Au Sable Fish Farm Controversial

The Au Sable River, a stream

used by thousands of anglers, canoeists, and other outdoorspeople, is currently the epicenter of a big-time controversy. The war being waged is between those who would like to preserve the Au Sable and those that propose to use it for aquaculture to provide locally produced food and a handful

On the environmental side, the most invested combatant is the influential Anglers of the Au Sable organization (AAS). Several Trout Unlimited Chapters, and the Sierra Club, also stand shoulder to shoulder with the AAS. In the opposing camp, is Henrietta Hills Fish Hatchery owner Dan Vogler, the Michigan Aquaculture Association, and some Michigan regulators.

In May, 2015 the Michigan DEQ approved a permit for the installation of a flow-through fish farm on

the East Branch of the Au Sable in Grayling. The facility - called the Grayling Fish Hatchery and now owned by Vogler - opened in 1914 and is currently operating as a tourist attraction where people can see large trout in raceways and children can catch fish for a fee.

Over a year's worth of testimony regarding the proposal has occurred at hearings and other meetings. This has included pas-

sionate discourses by environmentalists worried the Au Sable might lose its Blue Ribbon status if potential degradation of the river due to the hatchery were to occur. They are also concerned that the hatchery would impact the over \$3 million in annual touristgenerated income associated with the use of the pristine river.

The permit would allow an annual increase in

fish production at the Grayling Hatchery from 20,000 lbs. to about 300,000 lbs. Of primary concern is the contamination of the river that would accompany the 8.5 million gallons of water discharged into the Au Sable each day. This would include an estimated 100,000 lbs. of concentrated fish feces per year and, with such contamination, the distinct possibility of the propagation of the

microorganism that causes the deadly whirling disease in river fishes. In addition, it's feared that the increased phosphorous would negatively impact water quality necessary for the proliferation of important plankton and insect populations critical for trout food.

It's also feared that genetically dissimilar trout would escape the hatchery and enter the wild trout population. The Au Sable harbors large numbers of all three of Michigan's riverine trout-the brown, rainbow, and brook.

If the project is approved MDNR biologists are strongly suggesting that the same sort of filtering-system currently used on their Platte River Fish Hatchery be employed at the Au Sable site. There are no such requirements in the current documents for the Grayling Fish Hatchery. Of additional concern is that the permit actually states that, for the facility to function, a "lowering of water quality is necessary to support the identified important social and economic development of the area." The permit requires weekly monitoring of levels of phosphorus and other nutrient-laden chemi-

Anglers of the Au Sable president. Tom Baird, said. "The D.E.Q. permit is totally insufficient to protect the river. Without the necessary safeguards for waste removal and independent

water quality monitoring it essentially is a permit to pollute the Au Sable!" Sen. Rick Jones, R-Grand Ledge agrees, and has compared the plan to dumping sewage from a city into the Au Sable.

Proponents of the project claim it will provide fresh fish for local groceries and produce 4 jobs for local workers. The permit has been modified to what Vogler states is the most stringent requirements the DEQ has instituted on an aquaculture facility in Michigan. He was quoted in a recent MLive article as saying, "It's a very, very high standard. We believe very firmly that our operation can be done sustainably and responsibly with no harm to the river." Vogler has also stated that he believes the concerns are unjustified and that he is being painted as a villain.

The trial was heard in February by an administrative law judge in Lansing and, because of the voluminous testimony and complexity of the case, the ruling has been delayed. If the judgment is not in favor of the environmental groups they plan to file further suits at higher levels of the judiciary.
