BOYNE CITY -- 2016 Boyne City graduate and All-State catcher, Hannah Hoth returned home in late July, following a nearly two week visit to Italy with the American International Sports Team (AIST) U19 Softball squad that she earned her way onto following a tryout last summer.

In addition to playing some top level competition, Hannah and her new teammates had the privilege of taking in some breathtaking and historical sites throughout Italy, including the Vatican, the Sistine Chapel, St. Peter's Basilica, the Colosseum, the leaning Tower of Pisa, the coastal scenes of Cinque Terre, Milan, Como and Bellagio.

AIST was represented by two U19 teams, team Stars and team Stripes, Hoth was selected to play for the Stripes and her team ended up taking second place to a professional Italian team with an overall record of 5-2, while the Stars team placed

When she was asked to reflect on the overall experience from meeting her fellow teammates and coaches, to taking in the sights and different cultures, she had this

coaches were really cool and knew what they were doing. Even though we didn't get to practice before going over there, we gelled well as a team."

"Everything is so different over there just because it's so much older and they don't have water available like we do. The water cost more than pop and wine there. The toilets are really close to the ground and don't have toilet seats either! However, AIST had everything extremely organized and everyone had a great time! We had a translator and a tour bus 24/7 and every place we went had a tour guide ready for us."

"Aside from softball, my favorite part was the train ride in Cinque Terre. It was a beautiful beach and had cliff diving available.

During her time overseas, Hannah recorded five hits in the tournament, including a pair of triples, while also walking twice, as the team played at ball fields with fences that were over 70 meters (229 feet).

"The competition was tough! They had great pitchers," Hannah said. "The teams were older than us for the most part because they were pro teams. As a team we did well. We took second overall. As an individual I did alright. I batted third or fourth in the lineup and caught most of the time."

She was then asked what she was able to take away from the experience overseas and would she do it again.

"I would do it again in a heartbeat! It was a great experience and anyone who has a chance to do it should! I made great friendships that will last a lifetime. I will take time in my future to go visit

them across the country." Hannah also wanted to say thanks to those who help made this possible, "I would like to say a sincere thank you to everyone who helped by donating toward my trip!" She said. "And a huge thank you to my parents for making this possible! I am extremely grateful to have gotten this opportunity.'



Charlevoix Bait and Tackle Shop a Loving Endeavor

A plaque perched atop a vintage fly fishing creel reads, "Never let yesterday use up today!" That's certainly the, "make the very best of today'



vibe you'll get when visiting Tall Tales Tackle Shop in Charlevoix. The bait and tackle shop is the

only one in Charlevoix and was the brainchild of Charlevoix Middle/High School teacher Courtney Kretovik. She coordinates a community-based program teaching life skills and core academics to special needs students hoping to land a job in the community.

She said, "The goal of our program is to teach our students how to be productive members of the community after graduation. We want to teach them how to be independent and make good use of their time, be it a job, recreation, or volunteerism. The program helps them to be more employable and the bait shop is great training for

Kretovik explained that a program requirement is that they find a niche that is unfilled in the area. She said, "Charlevoix is a small place with not a lot of opportunities for our students to find jobs. It has the lake and lots of fishing but no bait and tackle shop. This really hits a need in the community and helps our students learn customer

service and other skills."

The program, including the bait shop, is run by volunteers and fourteen special needs high school students. In addition to the bait shop students learn how to cook for large groups, serve coffee to customers, work in the arts studio, and repurpose outdoor materials. It's exceedingly apparent that the students take great pride in their

The endeavor wouldn't have succeeded without significant sponsorships. Kretovik turned to the donorschoose.org website and within three hours the program was fully funded for their \$2,500.00 startup goal! Major contributors included Google and Disney. She has written additional grants and has been funded by the Tip of the Mitt Quality Deer Management Association and donations from community members.

Kretovik said, "We have made enough money to be self-sustaining and continue to purchase items for the store."

When I perused the gear I was impressed at how competitively priced everything was.

The converted classroom has been transformed into a bait and tackle shop that is as efficient as it is aesthetic. Lures, reels, rods, and other items for sale line the walls in a nicely decorated space including lots of vintage angling gear. The students have enhanced the shop's appeal by creating nature-themed art that graces the shop.

On my first visit I met an extraordinary young lady, Sierra Shorty, who's one of the lead employees

Mark Kroll of Charlevoix attended the Grand Opening this past fall and was called to action.

He said, "As soon as I visited the program it was just screaming my name to get involved. Fridays during the school year are the best days of my week!"

Kroll volunteers every week and, among other things, is working with a group of students to completely refurbish a 22-foot sailboat that will eventually be sold to help fund the program.

Thanks to Kretovik, Kroll, special needs parapros Chris Way, Andrea Whitley, and Chad Foster and other volunteers the program is flourishing and is truly a labor of love. They are always looking for volunteers. On Fridays during the school year they need helpers to facilitate any of the many exploratory activities with the

GOLF TIP

Setting up for Success!

A collogue of mine coined the phrase "Set up for Success" when we were doing junior golf clinics. It doesn't matter what type of shot we are talking about, you always want to "set up for success". For the purpose of this discussion let's talk about full shots. Here's what I want you to do:

Stand as tall as you can

Take hold of the club, have your hands in front of you chest high

Let your arms down so they hang comfortably Bend slightly from the waist. NOTE: The club

should be above the ground Bend your knees so the club will touch the ground

The awesome thing about setting up this way is you will always be in the same starting position, which leads to being more consistent. There are two other benefits from setting set up this way. One, if the ball is below your feet all you have to do is bend your knees more. Conversely, if the ball is above your feet, you will bend your knees less, if at all. So, implement this technique and you should have more consistency and you will be set up for success!

DNR looks to expand hunting opportunities on private lands

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources encourages landowners interested in making the most of their property and supporting local hunting traditions to consider enrolling their lands in the DNR's Hunting Access Program, which provides private-land hunting opportunities for hunters in southern Michigan, parts of the northern Lower Peninsula and the eastern Upper Peninsula.

The DNR is looking to expand hunting opportunities on private lands in the northern Lower Peninsula in the following counties: Alcona, Alpena, Antrim, Arenac, Benzie, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Iosco, Leelanau, Manistee, Mason, Montmorency, Ogemaw, Oscoda, Otsego, Presque Isle and Wexford.

"You can help promote wildlife population management, support the local economy, reduce wildlife conflicts, improve your land, and get paid to do it," said DNR Hunting Access Program coordinator Monique

Landowners with at least 40 acres are eligible to enroll.

"Providing access to hunting lands that are close to home is critical for supporting Michigan's strong hunting heritage," said Ferris. "Our commitment to providing access has more than tripled the number of farms enrolled in HAP the past three years. We now have over 170 farms and nearly 20,000 acres available for public hunting."

In the northeastern Lower Peninsula, Ferris said the DNR is hoping for increased Hunting Access Program property enrollments as landowners see the benefit HAP provides, particularly in areas where deer population management is needed, such as those areas affected

by bovine tuberculosis.

The DNR received a \$951,400 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Voluntary Public Access and Habitat Incentive Program last year to expand HAP into the northern Lower Peninsula to increase private-land hunting opportunities.

The Voluntary Public Access and Habitat Incentive Program encourages property owners to voluntarily allow outdoor enthusiasts greater access to their privately owned land for hunting

According to a 2013 study by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, outdoor recreation supports 6.1 million direct jobs across the country and \$646 billion in spending each

"The Hunting Access Program is good for the economy," said Ferris. "Hunters taking trips to HAP lands contribute \$1.7 million annually to Michigan's economy. The majority

of the HAP hunter trips are within 25 miles of the hunter's home, making HAP lands extremely accessi-

Michigan's Hunting Access Program was created in 1977 to increase public hunting opportunities in southern Michigan, where 97 percent of the land base is privately owned. Landowners enrolled in HAP receive an annual payment, up to \$25 an acre, for allowing hunters to access their lands. One of the oldest dedicated private-lands, publicaccess programs in the nation, HAP provides access to quality hunting lands close to urban properties and in agricultural areas. Using funds from the new hunting license package and the new federal grant, the DNR plans to continue expanding the program over the next three vears and now offers habitat improvement funds for landowners.

Landowners have the ability to

choose which types of hunting are allowed on their lands. Hunting options include:

Youth and apprentice hunting

Small game only. Deer only.

Turkey only. Elk only.

All hunting.

Landowners may choose more than one option, such as deer and turkey hunting only. Maximum payments will be given for the all hunting or youth and apprentice hunting

In order to control the number of hunters using HAP lands at any one time, hunters are required to register to hunt each time they visit the property. The landowner can select either a mandatory registration at their home or a hunter self-registration box, which the DNR will provide and install. The maximum number of hunters allowed on the property is determined by the total acreage, as well as the habitat type. Leases are on a two- to three-year period, with annual payments made each spring.

To ensure landowner and hunter satisfaction, HAP offers landowner liability protection. Public Act 451 of 1994 addresses the concerns some landowners have over sharing access to their land. In addition, HAP lands are patrolled by conservation officers, with an increased focus on patrolling during the busy fall hunting season.

Visit mi.gov/hap to learn more about the program and to see a current list of private lands available for hunting in Michigan. The HAP web page includes details about enrolled properties, including types of hunting allowed and aerial photos of the properties.



It happens... Septic Failure
