MANCELONA -- Another week, another victory for the Charlevoix Rayders.

Fresh off their big win over rival Boyne City last week, the upstart Rayders kept things rolling, disposing of the host Ironmen, 37-22 on September 9 in a Northern Michigan Football League - Leaders Division contest.

The win, puts the Rayders at 3-0 overall, 1-0 conference for the first time in over 10 years.

After an 8-8 first quarter, Charlevoix opened up the offense a bit in the second quarter, outscoring Mancelona 21-6 during that time for a 29-14 halftime lead.

The Rayders then added another score in the third quarter for a 37-

Cam Alden and Malcom Williams also had touchdown catches, with Williams adding 71 yards on the ground and a TD.

On defense,Oliver DeYoung had 11 stops, while Alden, Caleb Hart

and Garrett Seese all finished with 10 tackles each and Colin Davis and Klinger had nine and eight tackles, respectfully. Klinger also had an interception.

"Brad (Klinger) and Colin (Smith) really played well for us, and give Mancelona credit, we couldn't stop them, they just kept coming at us.," coach Bindi added.

Charlevoix was to host Suttons Bay on Friday, September 16, but the Norsemen cancelled their football season a week ago due to lack of healthy players, so the Rayders improve to 4-0 with the forfeit victory and will have a week off before they visit Glen Lake for a match-up with the Lakers on September 23.

Stiff defense, explosive offense carry Ramblers

BOYNE CITY -- After coming up short in their first two home games of the season, the Ramblers got solid play on both sides of the ball in their convincing 40-14 Northern Michigan Football League - Legends division victory over Cheboygan on September 9 at Earl Brotherston Field.


The contest did not begin like Boyne City had hoped, as the Chiefs took their first play from scrimmage 46 yards to the house as running back Asher Bury took a handoff on a counter for a 7-0 Cheboygan lead just nine seconds in.

After that, it was the pretty much all Ramblers as the team responded with a short drive of their own, capped off on a Mason Gardner to Tarin Bell 20-yard scoring strike on 4th down with 9:28 left in the quarter, a successful extra point by Bence Budi would pull the teams even 7-7.

Following a three and out by the Chiefs, Boyne marched down the field and Joseph Baugh would add to the Rambler lead with a two-yard plunge, his first of three scores on the night with 5:01 left in the quarter, an unsuccessful extra point put BC up 13-7.

The Rambler defense would then stop Cheboygan on 4th and 2, giving Boyne the ball back at their own 44

with 1:37 to go in the first and the offense took over once again, marching down the field, highlighted by a Bell run on a pitch that saw him scoot along the far sideline for a 21-yard touchdown run with 9.6 left in the quarter.

The second quarter would see the BC defense strike as Baugh picked up a Chief fumble and rumbled 47 vards for the defensive score and a 26-7 lead as the point after attempt by Budi was good. The Ramblers

would take that lead into the half.

"This week, we decided we were going to focus on ourselves and we practiced like we're supposed to, and do things the way we're supposed to do them and the kids responded well to that and the play (tonight) shows," Rambler coach David Hills said. "When you get back to doing things fast and with the proper technique and play with good leverage, generally it will turn out better for you, real happy with

the kids this week."

Boyne would add two more rushing touchdowns in the second half as Baugh scored from three yards out in the third quarter and Gardner weaved his way into the end zone, getting key blocks along the way for a 34-yard keeper down the near sideline with 8:17 to go in the contest and a 40-7 Rambler lead.

Cheboygan would score with just under four minutes to play for the final points of the night.

The Rambler offense was led by Baugh who rushed for 202 yards on 25 carries and three touchdowns, while Bell added 56 yards on six attempts and a score and also hauling in three passes for 55 yards and another TD.

"We knew going in, Cheboygan was a big physical football team and we were able to spread the field out and made them cover the entire field tonight, which opened up our run game and that's something going forward we're going to have to be able to do," coach Hills added.

Five other BC players picked up rushing yards as the team tallied 311 on the ground and 423 yards in total offense.

Gardner finished the night 7-of-12 passing for 112 yards and a score, while also rushing for 34 yards and a touchdown.

"After the first two games, we took some steps (forward) tonight, and I thought our passing game was good," Rambler junior quarterback, Mason Gardner said. "Our running game was good too, Joseph (Baugh) is a hard runner and if he makes a mistake, he's over it pretty much before he gets back to the huddle and ready for the next play."

Junior receiver, Eric Carson had three receptions for 47 yards and Ethan Hewitt had one for 10 yards.

On the defensive side, Jacob Ager finished with 15 tackle, while Ryan Hautz had nine, Dylan Hutterer and Dylon Williams each finished with six stops and Gardner added an interception.

The Ramblers (1-2, 1-0) travel to 0-3 Kingsley at 7pm on September 16 for another NMFL - Legends conference contest.

Real Estate Corner Hidden Costs of Homeownership

You've traded in renting for owning. So now what?

You may be surprised to find out that there is more money involved in owning a house than just taking out a home loan and making your monthly payments.

What you weren't responsible for as a renter becomes all yours as a homeowner. Property taxes, utilities, home maintenance and repairs, insurance and even decorating in any way you choose

are all on you now, for better or worse. And if you live in an association or in other types of communities where special property taxes are assessed, you'll have to contend with that, too.

Let's break it down.

Closing costs can add on thousands of dollars when your loan is settled. Those fees are often negotiated and vary state-by-state. As a buyer you may be responsible for a portion of them or the seller may assume all of them. The expense may be written into

municipalities, counties and school districts. The United States average for property taxes is 1.38 percent of the home's value with the highest rates in New Jersey, Connecticut, New Hampshire, New York and Rhode Island and the lowest in Louisiana, Alabama, West Virginia, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Additionally, there are variances within counties, parishes, boroughs and the like. If you live in a condo or a com-

munity that assesses its residents a special tax, such as a condo development, you will have fees on top of your property taxes.

Find out what your annual obligations are and budget accordingly. Otherwise, you'll have a shock when those taxes and fees become due.

Private Mortgage Insurance If your down payment was less than 20 percent of the purchase price, you will be required to buy Private Mortgage Insurance PMI enables you to huy a house with a smaller down payment. The insurance protects the lender against you defaulting on the loan. Once you have sufficient equity in the house, the

PMI coverage can be canceled.

Homeowners Insurance You can't get a loan without taking out homeowner's insurance but that doesn't cover everything, especially if you live in an area where natural disasters occur. You should consider supplemental policies for floods, tornados, hurricanes and earthquakes. And if you have a lot of valuable items, such as jewelry, antiques, art or a lot of expensive equipment like computers or cameras, you'll need to buy a rider if you want them covered.
