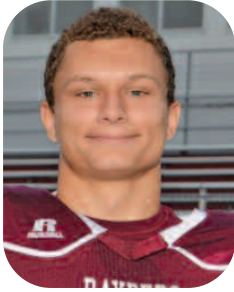

Rayders clinch playoff berth

Charlevoix 16, Onekama 9

ONEKAMA -- Seasons are set with goals in mind. Chalk up another goal met for Charlevoix as the Rayders earned a trip to the post-season with their sixth victory of the season, a 16-9 win over Onekama on October 7.

With the win, the Rayders improve to 6-1 overall, 3-1 in the Northern Michigan Football League - Leaders Division, setting up a showdown with unbeaten Frankfort (7-0, 4-0) in Charlevoix on Friday, October 14. A Rayder victory, would create a possible three-way tie atop the Leaders Division with one week to play.

"Frankfort is a fine team, they are well coached, with a big line and good runners," Rayders coach Ron Bindi said. "This will be a good test for us. We made the playoffs, and the kids know we are playing for a piece of the conference championship."

In the Charlevoix win over Onekama, the Rayders struck first in the opening quarter as Cam Alden rumbled for a long gain, (60 plus yards) and into the endzone for a 6-0 lead, and after quarterback, Brad Klinger connected with Oliver DeYoung on the conversion attempt, it was 8-0 Charlevoix. Onekama would get their only

touchdown of the night on the defensive side of the ball, picking off a Klinger pass and returning it 10 yards for a score. Charlevoix would stop the conversion attempt for an 8-6 lead.

With the half winding down, the Rayders stopped the Portagers deep in Charlevoix territory, inside the 25-yard line with 43 seconds remaining in the second quarter.

A couple of long Jared McLean runs would march the Rayders right down the field. Follow those

runs with a Klinger to Alden completion to the 1-yard line and on the next play, Klinger would run in a keeper as time expired and he would add the conversion run for a 16-6 lead at the break.

"Jared (McLean) was instrumental in that score before halftime," Bindi added. "His ability to turn those runs in was a huge plus for us going into find the half."

The second half would feature the Rayder defense as Charlevoix was once again tested by Onekama.

With the teams going back and forth, the Portagers would have a first and goal from the five yard line.

Charlevoix would hold Onekama to a field goal attempt on the drive, and the Portagers would successfully convert the three-point try, pulling within 16-9, but thats as close as they would get the rest of the contest.

Klinger finished 7-of-12 passing for 100 yards and also rushed for 64 yards and a score.

McLean finished with 118 yards on 15 carries to lead the ground attack, while Alden added 86 yards on three attempts.

Colin Smith hauled in two passes for 72 yards, while Alden had three receptions for 20 yards.

Defensively, Alden finished with 11 tackles, while McLean added nine stops, Seese-7, Davis-6, Caleb Hart-8.

"The defensive line played well once again," Bindi noted. "A great all-around team effort."

Jared McLean had a couple of long runs, setting up a Klinger keeper for a touchdown as time expired. Klinger also ran in the two-point conversion to give the Rayders a 16-6 halftime lead.

Both offenses were dormant in the second half, as the Portagers mustered just a field goal. Bindi said the three points allowed in the second half was huge for his defense.

"It was a big stop defensively because we gave them a short field to work with and to hold them to a field goal, that was really vital for us," Bindi said.

Bindi added his defense "did a lot of bending but (it) didn't break." He felt the defensive line played well, and some players who have not logged much playing time this season stepped up to the challenge.

"We were happy with the all-around efforts of everybody," Bindi said. "Once again it wasn't one person that really stood out."

The Rayders have now won two straight since suffering a 49-7 loss to Maple City Glen Lake. They shut out East Jordan 27-0 in week six before earning their playoff berth on Friday.

Bindi said his team did not practice well before Glen Lake and thought they just went through the motions. He said his team has practiced well since then, and his defensive line is working the line of scrimmage, which is a huge plus for his team.

"It's just the work ethic," Bindi said. "We're practicing like we need to play. That was the message after the game (against Onekama)."

Bindi emphasized the defensive line will have to prepare the offensive line for a matchup with Frankfort on Friday, Oct. 14. The Panthers are 7-0 and defeated Glen Lake 26-21 in week six before dismantling Mesick 53-0 on Friday.

With a trip to the playoffs secure, Bindi knows his squad can compete with Frankfort in what is sure to be a solid Northern Michigan Football League Leaders Division matchup.

"We can step up and play with an undefeated football team right now," he said. "That's where our mindset is. We're in the playoffs and that's good, but we've got a big game coming up on Friday night. Nobody really gives us a chance to win but we'll see."

their own destiny in pursuit of post-season play, need to run the table the next two weeks to clinch a berth.

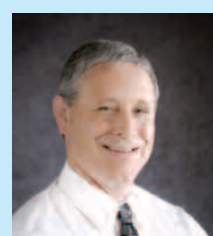
They start with Johannesburg-Lewiston on October 14 in front of their home crowd and Homecoming festivities.

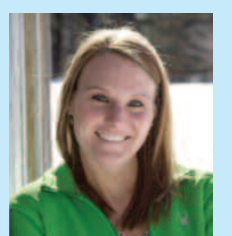

2017 Ford F-150 Raptor draws a line in the sand

Ford Motor Company, America's truck leader, today announced horsepower and torque ratings for the all-new 2017 F-150 Raptor that will continue to position the ultimate high-performance off-road pickup in a class by itself. Equipped with the all-new 3.5-liter twin-turbo high-output EcoBoost® engine, the Raptor churns out 510 lb.-ft. of torque and 450 horsepower across a wide power band.

Mated to an all-new Ford-built 10-speed transmission and exclusive transfer case – and managed by a six-mode Terrain Management System™ – the 2017 F-150 Raptor makes good on its promise to deliver an exhilarating off-road performance truck and even more bragging rights with a base MSRP less than \$50,000.

The dual-mode transfer case delivers a driving experience that supplies clutch-driven, on-demand all-wheel drive capability for everyday driving regardless of road conditions, while also providing the confidence of a mechanically-locked, durable four-wheel drive system for severe, off-road environments.

“Raptor was designed to be a no-compromise, off-road performance machine,” said Matt Tranter, Ford Performance engineering supervisor. “That is why we made the switch from the cast-iron V8 to the aluminum block, high-output GTDI V6 EcoBoost engine that our team tuned to add 39 horsepower and 76 lb.-ft. of torque for today's Raptor.”

Using the same high-strength, military-grade alu-

minum alloy body and a fully boxed high-strength steel frame as the current F-150 trucks, the 2017 Raptor is up to 500 pounds lighter than the 2014 model. Combined with a new high-output EcoBoost engine and 10-speed transmission, the 2017 Raptor delivers a 21 percent improved average torque-to-weight ratio and a 23 percent improvement in EPA-rated combined fuel economy compared with the

previous generation Raptor. EPA estimated fuel economy ratings for the 2017 F-150 Raptor are 15 mpg city, 18 mpg highway and 16 mpg combined. Actual mileage will vary.

Further building on the power-to-weight benefits, the 2017 Raptor delivers more low-RPM torque and better optimized power bands and shift points across all two-wheel drive and four-wheel drive modes thanks to the 10-

speed transmission and torque-on-demand transfer case.

Among the high-output EcoBoost performance enhancements for Raptor are more aggressive turbo compressors with increased boost calibrations, cast stainless steel manifolds and full dual exhaust, oil-cooled pistons and more aggressive engine control calibrations.

“Looking at the torque curve of the Raptor's EcoBoost engine, you see the twin turbos spool quicker for faster time to torque – it hammers quick and keeps delivering torque for a more brawny feel than its V8 predecessor,” said Al Cockerill, Raptor's powertrain development engineer.

Raptor's all-new adaptive shift algorithms monitor more than a dozen powertrain and driver control signals in real time – ensuring the right gear at the right time for an engaging driving experience, including Raptor's normal, sport, weather, mud/sand, rock/crawl and Baja modes. In addition, a high-speed, one-way clutch allows for non-sequential shifting.

Weight savings play a key role in improved shift performance. The 10-speed gearbox – the first from Ford not to employ cast-iron components – uses advanced materials and alloys that result in less weight. Additionally, an integrated torque converter/turbine clutch helps shed more than two pounds, while also reducing the packaging footprint
