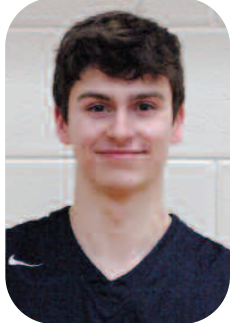

## Ramblers claim third straight district title

**Boyne City 52, Harbor Springs 38**

CHARLEVOIX — Three-peat!

Not an easy feat to accomplish, no matter the sport or the competition. But the Boyne City boys basketball team claimed their third straight Class C district championship and fifth in the last eight years, having been to the finals in seven of those seasons, defeating Harbor Springs 52-38 on March 10.

For the first 16 minutes of play, the Rams seemed to get to the rim whenever they wanted, driving left and right, beating the late rotation of the Boyne City defenders.

"We didn't start off well

defensively," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "Credit Harbor for that, they were very aggressive."

But after the intermission, it looked like a different Rambler team, attacking the basket on offense and locking down on everything Harbor tried throughout the second half.

"We had a great conversation at halftime about how we needed to step up and play with some pride on defense. We didn't want to go out not playing hard," coach Redman added. "Proud of how we responded and came out with outstanding enthusiasm in the second half to win the game."

Credit the effort of the reserves, coach Redman noted

especially that of freshman Max Vondra and sophomore Trevor King. The pair would spark the team with their hustle for loose balls, rebounding as well as handling the ball in key situations.

After halftime, with Boyne trailing 24-22, junior Eric Carson would tie the game with an uncontested layup just 20 seconds into the third quarter, and the Ramblers would take the lead for good at the 7:07 mark of the third on a Kane McPherson free throw for a 25-24 advantage.

While the Rams were still able to get to the rim in the third, they would often have their offerings at the hoop sent back as Boyne started their own block party, with McPherson and Carson rejecting back to back Harbor shots and the team racking up another three over the final quarter and a half.

The Ramblers would slowly start to pull away with patient offensive attack, freeing up close range shots and knocking down 12 of 17 tosses from the charity stripe over that time period.

"I thought we came out a little nervous, almost like we had cold feet," Rambler senior Kane McPherson said. "At the half, we got together and discussed that we needed to play to win, and not play to not lose."

After going up 10 points as the quarter was running down, the Rams would not go away, pulling to within six points, 39-33 headed into the final eight minutes of regulation.

The teams would trade baskets over the next three minutes, with Harbor pulling to within 41-36 with 5:14 to play, but that's as close as the Rams would get, with Boyne closing out the contest with an 11-2 run and earning the district title.

"Great team effort! Great experience and memories to last a lifetime," coach Redman noted. "To make it to seven district championship games in eight years and win five, including three in row shows how much hard work everyone has put in and having great support from our parents, school and community. I would like to thank all our Coaches, especially Chuck Day, Tim Hardy and Randy Calcaterra for helping build a program we can all be proud of."

Boyne was led by McPherson with a game-high 17 points, scoring 11 in the first half, including a triple as the second quarter was about to expire, giving the Ramblers some momentum headed into the break.

"Last year was difficult for me, not seeing the floor as much as I'd hoped, but it was still fun to win it," McPherson added. "This year my goal was to come out and do everything I could to help my team get the win."

Also for BC, Mason Gardner and Jacob Ager finished with 11 and 10 points, respectively and Eric Carson

### Boyne put it together against Red Devils

**Boyne City 60, East Jordan 33**

CHARLEVOIX — The Boyne City basketball team has certainly have picked the right time of year to get hot.

Their opponents, however have not been so lucky as Lake Michigan Conference rival East Jordan found out first hand in the district semifinal as Boyne jumped out early and kept the pressure on, as the Ramblers defeated the Red Devils 60-33 on March 8.

After the opening tip, East Jordan worked the ball around and got a triple from senior Colin Shepard, but the Ramblers would respond with an answer by Eric Carson.

John Roehrig would find a streaking Payton Loviska for an easy two and a 5-3 E.J. advantage, but Boyne would respond with back to back hoops by Ethan Hewitt (three pointer) and Kane McPherson for an 8-5 Rambler lead, one that they would not re-

linquish.

Boyne City would go on a 12-3 run to end the first quarter, taking a 20-8 cushion into the second.

The Red Devils would come out in the second quarter with some full court pressure, but the Ramblers would work it around patiently, getting quality looks and converting at a high percentage for a 36-18 lead at the half.

"We came out and played loose tonight," Boyne coach Nick Redman said. "We wanted to play with some energy and the kids did just that."

Mason Gardner would finish with 16 points (14 in the first half) to lead the Ramblers, while Carson chipped in with 11, including three triples and McPherson added 10.

Also for Boyne, Jacob Ager tallied eight points and Dillon Sulak and Max Vondra each added five.

"The Kids played hard and competed well. We lost to a team that is playing well and really took us out of everything we were trying to do on both ends of the floor, although we had two losses to Boyne in the regular season the kids felt confident as they were close games," East Jordan coach Nate Dzwik said. "We felt we had a good game plan going in and Boyne really stepped up and made us pay for every mistake we made and took us out of everything on both ends of the floor."

East Jordan was led by a trio of seniors, as Jackson Robbins, John Roehrig and

Colin Shepard all scored five points apiece as the Red Devils finished a 3-18 season.

"It was positive season in spite of our record, the kids always played hard and represented themselves, their school and community with great pride and earned respect from people along the way," Dzwik added. "This group did a great job of taking coaching, playing in roles they weren't accustomed to and helped lay the foundation for the future of this program."

# Rayders fantastic season ends in Regional Final

## Glen Lake 56, Charlevoix 44

CHARLEVOIX — It's safe to say that the Charlevoix girls are going to be a team to reckon with over the next few seasons.

The young Rayders gave Glen Lake all they could handle, before the Lakers pulled away late in the contest, coming away with a 56-44 Class C regional final victory on March 9.

The loss would end Charlevoix's season, one that saw the team improve from a three win squad last year to finish with an 18-7 record this season.

"We played a great back and forth game for 33 minutes," Rayder coach Liz Shaw said. "My girls played hard and left it all on the court tonight. The score is not a reflection of the tight game. I am proud of the girls efforts and the growth they have done throughout the season. We will be a force next year with only losing one senior."

The contest came down to the last couple of minutes before the veteran Lakers were finally able to create some breathing room against Charlevoix.

The Rayders were within one point, 42-41 at that time, when Glen Lake went on a 14-3 run to close out the game and come away with the regional title.

Freshman Elise Stuck would give everything she had on the night, recording a triple-double, dropping 22 points, grabbing 16 boards, blocking 14 shots and also dishing out five assists to lead Charlevoix.

Also for the Rayders, junior Rachel Nesburg had six points, five

rebounds and three steals, while freshman Abby Cunningham added five points, 12 rebounds and Olivia Jeakle chipped in with five points.

Charlevoix will only graduate one senior, Beth Veenstra.

"Beth (Veenstra) was a major contributor this season," coach Shaw added. "Her dedication and commitment to the basketball program was major in our success. She will be missed."

# Bench play sparks Ramblers in second half

**Boyne City 53, Whittemore-Prescott 33**

HOUGHTON LAKE — If you've followed Boyne City basketball at all this season, you know that the team is pretty balanced and doesn't rely on one player to carry the load, and they rotate about nine or ten players in on any given night.

On March 13, it would be the bench play of Dylan Williams that keyed a second half surge by the Ramblers, one that the regulars would continue as Boyne City defeated Whittemore-Prescott 53-33 in the Class C regional semifinal contest.

"We got off to a slow start. It seemed like we were playing not to lose instead of playing to win," Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. "We came out in second half and played with confidence, we made adjustments at halftime and put Kane (McPherson) in the middle of their zone and he did great job attacking it and creating offense, Dylan Williams was huge for us tonight! He really came to play, we do not win this game without his effort."

It all began in the third quarter, with the Ramblers trailing 18-17, when Williams was subbed into the contest

to help defend the Cardinals big man, Kyle Colson. Williams efforts made it difficult for Colson to get to the boards and with his wingspan, made easy looks at the basket much more difficult.

The big spark came on the offensive side though, where Dylan scored five of his seven points and helped bring Boyne back from their deficit to a 33-29 lead headed into the fourth quarter.

McPherson and Eric Carson would take over from there, as the backcourt duo would combine for 18 points over the final eight minutes of play, with Carson knocking down back-to-back three pointers and McPherson doing his work from the middle of the W-P defense.

"Eric (Carson) hit some big shots, Ethan Hewitt did an outstanding job defensively on their best player, holding him to seven points," coach Redman added.

McPherson would finish with 19 points to lead the Ramblers, while Carson added 14, Williams seven and Jacob Ager chipped in with six.

Boyne improves to 17-7 on the season and will face Manton for the regional title on March 15. Results were not available at press time.

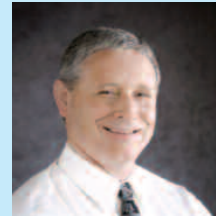

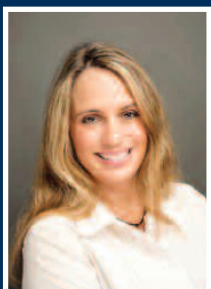
