Harbor would attempt a comeback in the fifth, but could only manage a single run after a few hard hit balls.

Stackus would collect three hits for the Ramblers, while Hills and Hutterer would finish with two base knocks apiece.

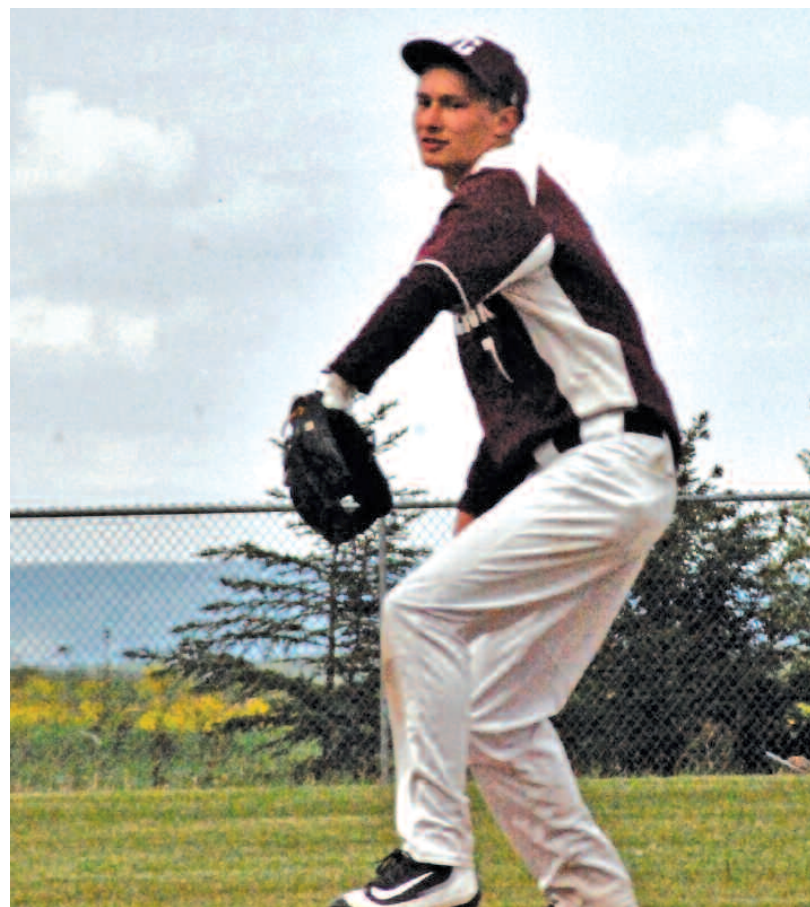
East Jordan's Justin Barnett took the hard-luck loss, tossing 5 2/3 innings, scattering six hits along the way.

CHARLEVOIX — It was the final home game of the season on May 26 for the Rayders and Charlevoix celebrated Senior Night at Kipke Field.

Charlevoix would come out focused and ready to play, scoring the games first goal nine minutes and 30 seconds into the contest as the result of a direct kick off the foot of Megan Scholten. The Rayder freshman sent a rocket over the Liberty keepers outstretched arms from 25 yards out for a 1-0 lead.

TC's Libby Krcmarik would score the equalizer and then add the go ahead goal less than two

minutes later at the 4:25 mark to send the Liberty into intermission with a 2-1 advantage.

Krcmarik would then complete the hat trick, scoring six minutes into the second half to put the Liberty up 3-1, and. Traverse City would add in their fourth and final goal with 30:09 left in the half.

The Rayders would have a combined 20 quality scoring chances in the contest (10 in each half), but were only able to connect successfully the one time.

Beth Veenstra had two saves in goal during the first half and Emily Hinkley added four saves in the second half.

Charlevoix finishes the regular season with an 11-7-1 overall and 8-4 in the Lake Michigan Conference.

"Honestly other than some unlucky defensive breakdowns I thought we played well," Rayder coach Pete Scholten said. "We passed and possessed the ball well generating 20 plus quality chances.

Traverse City was able to capitalize on the chances they had and made us pay."

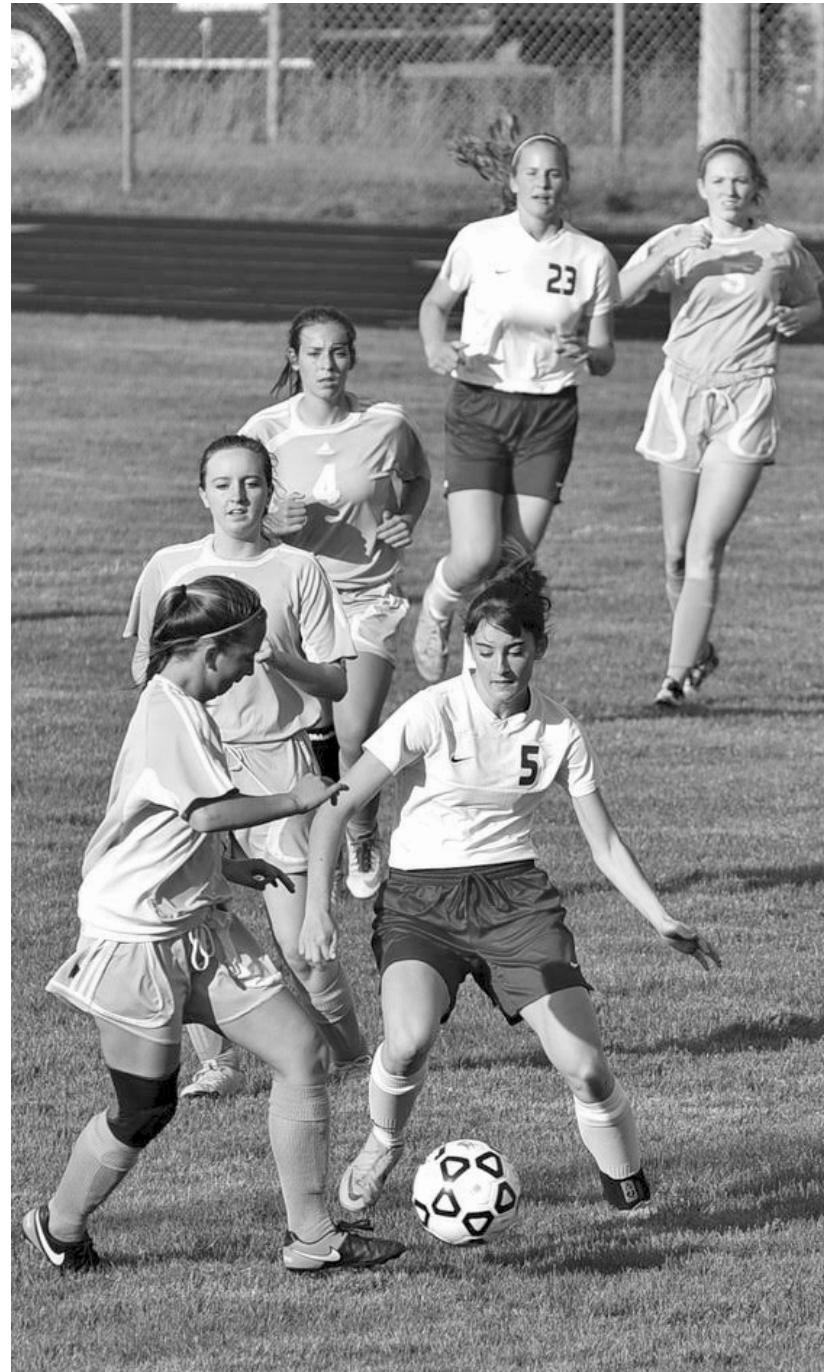
Nesburg's goal enough to down Vikings

East Jordan bounces back to earn split

East Jordan 2-12, Elk Rapids 3-7

ELK RAPIDS — The Lady Red Devils were edged in extra innings 3-2 by the Elks in game one, only to bounce back with some hot hitting in the nightcap for a 12-7 win, earning a Lake Michigan Conference split on May 25.

In the opener, EJ took an early 1-0 lead, scoring in the top of the fourth, but the Elks responded with

a run of their own in the bottom of the fifth, the score would then remain tied through regulation.

In the top of the seventh, the Red Devils took advantage of the international tiebreaker rule, as they plated their runner from second for a 2-1 lead.

Elk Rapids would respond in the bottom half of the frame with two runs for the walk off victory.

Abby Peterson took the pitching loss, going the distance, allowing eight hits, while striking out six and walking two.

Kendall McNitt doubled to lead the EJ offense, while Julia Sherman and Karlee Dunson both singled.

“We played good defense for six innings, the pressure of the tiebreaker rule got us,” EJ coach Meg Kitson said.

Game two saw the Red Devils pound out 13 hits, led by Chelsea Gibson’s three hits, which included two triples and a single to go with a pair of RBIs.

McNitt added two hits, including a double, while Marissa Kolp singled twice with an RBI; Peterson had a two-run double and Sherman added a home run and two RBIs.

Peterson picked up the win in the circle, allowing 12 hits, walked one and recorded six K’s.

EJ moves to 12-12 overall on the season, 7-7 in LMC play.

On May 30, the Ramblers worked quickly and efficiently as they routed Harbor Springs, 18-0 in a 3-inning mercy shortened pre-district contest.

Katie Hoth started for Boyne, while Madi Rosenow pitched in relief as the two combined to allow two hits, zero walks and struck out four batters.

The Ramblers scored three in the 1st inning and then erupted for a 11-run second and finally added four in the top of the 3rd.

Kelsey Hubbard finished with three hits, including a double and three RBIs to lead the Ramblers, while Rosenow added two hits and three RBI.

Also for Boyne, Hoth, Makhaylee

Fiel, Brooklyn Fitzpatrick, Katelyn Gabos, Taylor Delaney and Grace Wells added one hit each.

Nine different Ramblers would score in the contest. Boyne City advances to the district semifinal contest against Elk Rapids at noon on Saturday, while Charlevoix faces Newberry in the other half of the bracket at 10am.

Second record bigmouth catch for angler

MONROE COUNTY – The Michigan Department of Natural Resources recently confirmed a new state-record fish for bigmouth buffalo. This marks the first state-record fish caught in 2017 – and it was caught by an angler who held the previous state record for bigmouth buffalo from 2008.

The new record fish was caught by Roy Beasley of Madison Heights, Michigan, in the River Raisin (Monroe County) Saturday, May 13, at 11 a.m. Beasley was bowfishing. The fish weighed 27 pounds and measured 35.25 inches.

The record was verified by Todd Wills, a DNR fisheries research manager on Lake St. Clair.

Beasley held the previous state-record bigmouth buffalo – this one caught on the Detroit River – from August 2008. That fish weighed 24.74 pounds and measured 34.50 inches.

“More and more people are enjoying the sport of bowfishing and recognizing the thrill it can offer those who pursue it,” said Sara Thomas, the DNR’s Lake Erie Management Unit manager. “The river system in Southeast Michigan offers ample opportunity to catch rather large fish – a huge congrats to Mr. Beasley for having broken this record twice.”

The DNR reminds anglers who bowfish to properly dispose of all specimens they harvest.

State records are recognized by weight only. To qualify for a state record, fish must exceed the current listed state record weight and identification must be verified by a DNR fisheries biologist.

East Jordan State of the Community Luncheon

EAST JORDAN—East Jordan is heading in the right direction and its future is bright was the message members of the community walked away with after hearing four keynote speakers discuss the status of the city, schools, and DDA at East Jordan's State of the Community Luncheon Tuesday, November 11.

An air of optimism filled the Harvest Barn hall as 26 East Jordan High School seniors and other members of the community listened intently to Mayor Russell Peck whose speech focused on the challenges and infrastructure im-

provements that still lie ahead for the city. "All in all things are looking up, we're heading in the right direction. Together we will position our community for a resilient and sustainable future. Indeed, East Jordan's future is bright," he concluded.

Peck not only talked about all that the city has accomplished but emphasized the infrastructure improvements needed to accommodate new growth. "We are very optimistic about the future of our community and that optimism comes from the exciting new direction we have been heading," he said. He cited the city's sewer system that is already operating at 98%

capacity, sidewalks, and sea-pilings to be installed at the southwest side of the harbor next to the bridge intended to stop silt from filling the harbor (construction to begin in December) as projects that will further enable the city to grow. He mentioned the new well house (already up and running), the new open 24/7 recycling center and the \$12,000 kayak facility in the park which he stated presently "looks like an art project." "We are developing the kind of community we have envisioned for future generations. There is a positive up beat energy," he said.
