The Charlevoix Circle of Arts will be featuring the work of longtime Charlevoix resident Susan Bolt in an upcoming exhibition "The Seasons of Sue Bolt" opening on August 25

from 5-7 pm. Susan Bolt is a 1955 graduate of the Cleveland Institute of Art with a double major in painting and sculpture. She has been creating her signature style of art for over 50 years.

Early in her career, she also studied at the Center for Creative Studies and Pewabic Pottery in Detroit, Michigan. After graduating from art school, she moved to Detroit with her husband Russell where she worked freelance for Hallmark cards and the J.L. Hudson's display department.

Sue was an illustrator for the Detroit Free Press Sunday Magazine where she re-

ceived many awards. For over 21 years Sue was active in the Detroit art scene teaching at Wayne State University and Oak Park High School. She has conducted many workshops in ceramics and paintings for the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association, the Flint Institute of Art Museum, Michigan State University, Grand Rapids Public Schools, and the Detroit Institute of Arts. Her ceramics, paintings and prints are exhibited in many galleries, and museums and are in many public and private collections.

Bolt Studio has been an operational working studio since 1974. Sue and her husband Russell, purchased 15 acres and a 100-year-old Farmers Grange Hall in Charlevoix, Michigan with the idea of creating a working studio. The family moved to Charlevoix and started to refresh the old Grange Hall into the working studio they have today. The Studio has completed many varied and diverse projects in its 34 years of operation. Some highlights are the custom, large ce-

ous organizations. "What I feel will be enlightening to many when they visit the exhibition is the vast amount of work that Sue created during her earlier career while living in the Detroit area. On display will be a collection of her illustration work for the Detroit Free Press and

earlier salt fired ceramics," explains Gail DeMeyere, executive director at the Circle of Arts.

She adds, "Sue is recognized in northern Michigan for her whimsical ceramic work and moving angel paintings. What we endeavor to do in our exhibitions is to explore aspects of an artist's journey to show how earlier work travels forward to influence the work they do today. There are movements that link a career together even though a medium, environment or influences may change."



U.S. MILITARY VETERAN OF THE MONT



The "Veteran of the Month" for August 2017 is Ralph Earl Kitson, Jr. Born August 2nd, 1927 in Boyne City, Michigan and attended East Jordan Michigan Public Schools. After completing the 11th grade he left school and joined the Merchant Marine Service for a short time before he was found to be to young and his service

was terminated. On November 28th, 1945 Kitson was inducted into the Army Air Corp in Detroit, Michigan and after having served two months and 14 days at Sheppard Field Texas in the 3706th Army Air Force Bomber Unit, he received a discharge for reenlistment on February 11th, 1946. On February 12th, 1946 Kitson reenlisted and received training as a radio repairman. On April 9th, 1946 Kitson departed the USA arriving on the island of Okinawa on April 27th, 1946 and on November 6th, 1947 he qualified with the 30 caliber M1 carbine rifle and 45 caliber pistol. On December 23rd, 1947 Kitson was promoted to Staff Sergeant. On March 18th, 1948 Kitson departed Okinawa arriving in the USA on April 1st, 1948 having served 1 year, 11 months and 22 days of foreign service. On January 13, 1949, at Offutt Air Force Base, Fort Creek, Nebraska, Kitson received an Honorable Discharge and was awarded the Japan Occupational Victory Metal. Returning home to East Jordan, Kitson went to work in Boyne City at the Tannery and for a short period of time he was a



City. Kitson married Carol M. Lawson and when the marriage ended he married Luezeta "Zettie" Smith on March 16th, 1963. Kitson Worked at the Michigan Milk Producers Creamery in East Jordan delivering milk products to area stores all over Northern Lower Michigan. He than

worked for the City of East Jordan starting on June 6th, 1966 for the Department of Public Works and as the City Superintendent for three years and also was the City Assessor for several years until retirement on July 28th, 1989. Later he drove a school bus for the East Jordan Public Schools from 1990 to 2001. Kitson was a member of the Rebec-Hosler-Sweet Post#227 of the American Legion in East Jordan, Kitson was an outdoorsman and enjoyed fishing, hunting, making bird houses, bowling and was a sports fan. On August 23rd, 2013 Ralph Earl Kitson Jr. answered the final call and is being honored by his extended

As Ingham County Prosecutor, she implemented stronger ethics standards, established a new Domestic Violence Unit, and sped up the rehabilitation of nonviolent first time offend-

Gretchen currently lives in East Lansing with her husband Marc, daughters Sherry and Sydney, and stepsons Alex, Mason and Win-

"We learned so many new skills and strategies to become community leaders and agents of change," said Gavin Kerley, a student at Petoskey High School. "My favorite part

of the conference was knowing I could apply the things we learned back in Northern Michigan."



harvested right from the Farmfest gardens.







With Fall sports practices getting into full swing, when is it too hot to play sports? It depends on Heat Index

When deciding when it is too hot to play sports, it depends on the heat index.

Using the heat index to modify or cancel sports practices, always be alert of the following:

Hot, dry weather can be extremely dangerous. Because perspiration evaporates very quickly in such conditions, your child won't feel sweaty, and neither you nor your child may recognize how much water he or she has lost.

As humidity increases, the effectiveness of perspiration (sweating) in cooling the body

When humidity is high, perspiration drips off the skin so that the cooling benefit of evaporation is lost even at cooler temperatures, resulting in a buildup of body heat.

Some groups have issued guidelines for modifying or canceling practice based on the heat index (air temperature and the humidity). One of the strictest is the one issued in 2009 by the Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association:

Heat Index under 95°

All sports:

Provide ample amounts of water. This means water should always be available and athletes should take in as much water as they desire.

Optional water breaks every 30 minutes for 10 minutes duration.

Ice-down towels for cooling

Watch/monitor athletes carefully for necessary

Heat Index 95° to 99° All sports:

Provide ample amounts of water. This means water should always be available and athletes should take in as much water as they desire.

Mandatory water breaks every 30 minutes for 10 minutes duration.

Ice-down towels for cooling

Watch/monitor athletes carefully for necessary action

Contact sports:

Helmets and other possible equipment removed if not involved in contact

Reduce time of outside activity. Consider postponing practice to later in the day

Re-check temperature and humidity every 30 minutes to monitor for increased Heat Index

Heat index 100° to 104° All sports:

Provide ample amounts of water. This means water should always be available and athletes should take in as much water as they desire.

Mandatory water breaks every 30 minutes for 10 minutes duration.

Ice-down towels for cooling

Watch/monitor athletes carefully for necessary

Alter uniform by removing items if possible Reduce time of outside activity as well as indoor activity if air conditioning unavailable Postpone practice to later in day if possible

Contact sports and activities with additional equipment:

Helmets and other possible equipment removed if not involved in contact or necessary for safety. If necessary for safety, suspend activity

Re-check temperature and humidity every 30 minutes to monitor for increased Heat Index

Heat index above 104 All sports:

Stop all outside activity in practice and/or play, and stop all inside activity if air conditioning is unavailable
