Emmet-Charlevoix County Fair opens Tuesday August 22

For 112 years, the Emmet-Charlevoix County Fair has been an annual summer tradition that has been thrilling residents and visitors to the area. The 2017 Emmet-Charlevoix County Fair is set to open once again this coming Tuesday, August 22 and continue through the following Sunday, August 27. The midway will soon be bustling with carnival set-up activity, the 4-H livestock barns will be filling up, vendors and exhibitors will begin creating their spaces in the 10,000 square foot Community Building, and the 2,500 seat Grandstand area is being prepared for a week of exciting shows.

Visitors to the fair will enjoy carnival rides and games by Skerbeck Family Carnival on the midway, exciting grandstand events including a Monster Truck Shout Out, a Country Music band showdown, Horse and Tractor Pulls and more. Free family fun events during fair week will include a local artists displays, garden, arts & crafts, antique exhibits, a Dog Agility Show... even a Firefighter Show! The back stage will feature old fashioned spinning, knitting, beading and more on Tuesday followed by live music from "Second Time Around, and Wednesday enjoy from demonstrations by the DNR, Watershed Council, Trails Council and Emmet County Recycling and Conservation District. Be sure to heck out the Market Livestock auction taking place on Thursday, August 24, starting at 3pm.

Don't miss the Country Music Showdown on Wednesday evening starting at 6pm in the Grandstand area. Five excellent bands; Tom Zipp & The Bullpen, I Forty 4, Easy Picks, Whiskey Creek and Northern Nites will perform live. In this exciting "Battle of the Bands," these talented groups will compete for five cash prizes, and the audience will help decide who will be the \$1,500 first place winner. Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$5 for those ages 5 to

12 and under age 4 is free. Later in the week enjoy a Modified Truck & Tractor Pull on Thursday and a Monster Truck Show on Friday.

every day for the rest of the week. Fire destroys home near Charlevoix

CHARLEVOIX - No one was injured but a home was completely destroyed in a house fire in Charlevoix County last week.

Fire crews from Charlevoix Township's department responded to report of a house fire at 2748 Marion Center Road around 9:15 p.m. Thursday, August 10, to find the house fully enveloped in flames.

Fire Chief Dan Thorp said it was impossible and unsafe to fight the fire by the time crews arrived as the building was already beyond saving.

Complicating the firefighter's efforts was the fact that an adjacent pole barn, which also caught on fire, had been packed with furniture and other items,

making it nearly impossible for the firefighters to safely access the structure.

The homeowners and their dogs were able to get out of the house safely and were not injured in the fire. It took firefighters more than four hours to

extinguish the flames but hot spots festered well into the next day.

Thorp said the cause of the fire is yet to be determined and is being investigated by the Charlevoix County Sheriff's Department.

Secretary of State offices spread word on Bridge walk traffic closure

Renewing your driver license or getting new registration tags at a Michigan Secretary of State branch this month? The Mackinac Bridge Authority (MBA) hopes you'll pick up some information about the annual bridge walk closure to public traffic as well. To help alert travelers to the bridge closure the morning of Labor Day, the SOS is displaying posters and a message on its Motor Vehicle Network video monitors in all 131 branch offices statewide.

"Labor Day weekend is a great time to travel and see new parts of our great state," Secretary of State Ruth Johnson said. "We want all travelers to know that the bridge will be closed until noon on Labor Day so please adjust your travel plans accordingly."

It's just one of many ways the MBA and other state agencies are notifying the public of the upcoming closure.

"We want to make sure everyone knows about the closure in advance, rather than unexpectedly finding stopped traffic Labor Day morning," said MBA Executive Secretary Bob Sweeney. "Help from state agencies like the Michigan Secretary of State is invaluable in reaching as many people as

possible." Updates have been posted to the Mackinac Bridge Authority website (www.mackinacbridge.org), MDOT's website (www.michigan.gov/mdot), and Mi Drive, MDOT's travel information site (www.michigan.gov/drive). The Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) will send emails regarding the closure to state park campground reservation holders, and the MBA will send updates to people who have signed up for email alerts.

Other state agencies are posting updates on their Facebook and Twitter accounts.

Unlike in prior years, only buses used to transport walkers to the starting point for the walk and emergency services vehicles will be allowed on the bridge during the event. All other vehicle traffic will be stopped from 6:30 a.m. to noon while event participants are on the bridge. The Authority made the decision during a special board meeting May 16, citing safety and security recommendations by the MSP and U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

Every year, between 30,000 and 60,000 people from several states and countries come to the Mackinac Bridge for the Annual Bridge Walk, which has taken place since 1958, the year after the bridge opened to traffic. The event will begin at 6:40 a.m. with the start of the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness Jog, followed by a greeting from Gov. Rick Snyder at 6:55 a.m. Walkers will begin across the bridge at 7 a.m.

North Perk opens third location in Boyne City

When it comes to a perfect coffee all that goes perfectly well with it, Brittany and John McNeil are doing their part to keep northern Michigan perking and business booming. Having found success and a warm welcome in the coffee shop they named North Perk that the couple opened in downtown Petoskey in 2013, they have since not only moved that shop into a larger space but they recently opened two more North Perk Coffee shops in East Jordan and Boyne City.

The East Jordan North Perk coffee shop opened last spring at 101 Main Street in the new Cannonball Development complex at the corner of Main and Mill Streets. And the North Perk in downtown Boyne City just opened this summer at 202 S. Lake Street. The Petoskey North Perk recently re-located from where the original shop opened on Lake Street in downtown Petoskey to a bigger space in a nearby building at 308 Howard Street.

The McNeils relocated in 2012 from Grand Haven to Petoskey, where they recently welcomed their first child, three and a half month-old daughter, Nina. Brittany said she knew right away that downtown Petoskey would be a perfect place to open a cozy coffee shop. A former high school English teacher, she said it was a childhood dream of hers to open exactly that kind of place.

"In many ways, I grew up in a coffee shop - it was one of the first places near my neighborhood I was allowed to bike to with friends unaccompanied by adults, where I snuck away to read, where I had first dates, where I watched friends perform, where I studied in high school and college, and where I graded papers or met with students as a teacher," Brittany recalled, "I felt my dream of owning my own shop from a young age, but the reality seemed both scary and difficult, so I focused on a "real career"...before finding the confi-

dence to feel like it was something within reach"

Her confidence was bolstered by her husband, John, who had experience opening a business. "Watching him create something out of nothing showed me that I could do it too," she said.

She and John moved to Petoskey and opened the North Perk. The shop's success seems to pivot on the couple's devotion to serving their customers cups of highest quality coffees, along with teas and specialty drinks. They also offer a light menu of coffee-friendly and locally sourced foods including scones and bagels, muffins, biscotti,

doughnuts, cookies, oatmeals, granola bars and vegan/gluten-free snacks.

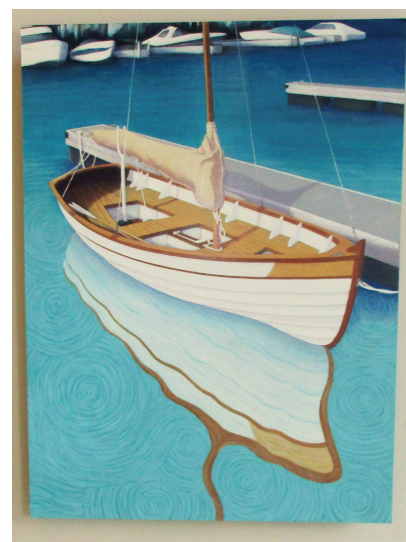
They roast their own organic, fair trade coffee with John heading up the coffee roasting operation for all three North Perk shops. Brittany meanwhile oversees the three North Perk locations as general manager.

The McNeils were on point when it came to giving their coffee shops a homey, welcoming feel, with the décor at all three locations hitting that mark. The look is eclectic but cozy, with regular tables and chairs overlooking vignettes of overstuffed

couches or chairs around coffee tables. There are shelves lined with books and board games, newspapers to peruse and free Wi-fi. And the walls are adorned by original artwork by local artists.

It's the kind of place where 16-year-old North Perk barista Anika Manthei, a junior this year at Concord Academy Boyne, said she's glad to have in Boyne City because it's filled a need there, especially for those in her age group.

"We didn't really have a place like this to hang out before," she said, "Everything about it is great. The coffee is great. The

staff is great. The owners are great. And it's a great environment."

Manthei's co-worker, 19-year-old barista Sarah Belcher of Boyne City, wholeheartedly agrees.

"People will tell me I'm super obnoxious because I talk about how much I love my job all the time," Belcher laughed, "But I really do. It's a great place not only to work, but it's relaxed and friendly place just to be. It's a super awesome job."

Brittany said she's not surprised to hear her employees to give North Perk such accolades, with two new stores opening just this year and one having outgrown its original spot, it's clear that customers seem to agree.

"We feel lucky to have found our place here and are excited to share our cozy coffee spaces with three communities in northern Michigan that we really enjoy spending time in," Brittany said, "The support we have felt through all of our changes is really special."

Canadian Identity thief sentenced to prison

CHARLEVOIX - A 65-year-old Canadian woman will spend between 38 months and 15 years in prison after being convicted of identity theft in Charlevoix County.



Charlevoix 33rd Circuit Court Judge Roy C. Hayes III last week sentenced Jewel Elizabeth Browe, 65, to prison after she was convicted of stealing and using a former friend's identity for the second time.

Browe was convicted on two counts of the same crime against the same victim in Charlevoix County back in 2013, according to a media release issued by Charlevoix County Prosecuting Attorney Allen Telgenhof.

She was sentenced to 20 months in prison for that conviction but instead completed the Department of Corrections Special Incarceration (SAI) "bootcamp" program and was

released early, Telgenhof explained. After she served her sentence, he said Browe was deported to Canada but returned to the United States in what appears to be a perpetual pattern of hers, having been deported numerous times prior.

This most recent conviction resulted after Browe was stopped by police in Bangor, Michigan for a traffic violation. Knowing she'd been deported many times, Browe did not give police her own identification but instead produced a driver's license belonging to the same Charlevoix County resident whose identity she had stolen several years ago, Telgenhof said.

Browe later failed to appear in court on a traffic citation issued on the stolen identity, resulting in the Charlevoix County victim's driver's license being suspended. Browe also used the identity to order cable TV service in Bangor, Michigan that eventually resulted in collection action against the victim, Telgenhof said.

He said the victim was a former friend of Browe's who in 2012 had taken Browe into her home. Browe subsequently stole personal items with the victim's identifying information which she used to pass herself off as the victim, which was the root of Browe's conviction in 2013.

"Both cases came about through the hard work of Charlevoix County Detective Mike Wheat," Telgenhof noted. "Hopefully, this defendant will realize that she needs to stop

victimizing people. At least she will not be able to do that over the next three years while she is in prison."

Telgenhof added Browe has an extensive criminal history-including mostly felony offenses- dating back to 1975.

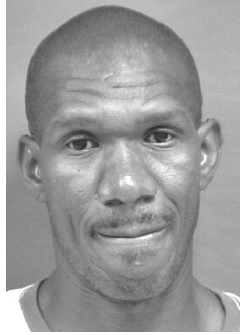
Charlevoix man faces multiple charges for child molestation

CHARLEVOIX - A Charlevoix

man remains lodged in the Charlevoix County jail and could be facing time in prison after being charged with allegedly molesting an 11-year-old girl on three separate occasions earlier this summer.

Charlevoix County Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Kerry Zahner said 37-year-old Anthony Atkinson of Charlevoix has been charged with



three counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct and three counts of second degree criminal sexual conduct in connection with a report made by an 11-year-old girl that he assaulted her in June and July of this year.

Atkinson has pleaded not guilty to those charges.

According to a court affidavit, the 11-year-old victim told her mother that Atkinson allegedly made inappropriate physical contact with her on three separate occasions between June 29 and July 21, 2017. The girl was then taken to McLaren Northern Michigan Hospital to be examined.

Officer William Church III of the Charlevoix County Sheriff's Department later questioned Atkinson about the alleged assaults on July 29, however, Atkinson denied the charges against him, according to court documents.

Atkinson is facing three counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct and three counts of second degree criminal sexual conduct.

Zahner confirmed that Atkinson is still at the Charlevoix County Jail as of August 15. She said his bond has been set at \$750,000 attached with conditions, among them having no victim contact, surrendering of his passport and ordered to remain in Charlevoix County.

A preliminary examination for Atkinson has been scheduled for Tuesday, August, 22.

Deadline for SBA drought disaster loans approaches

The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations that Sept. 11 is the filing deadline for federal economic injury disaster loans in Michigan as a result of the drought May 25, 2016 through Oct. 25, 2016. This disaster declaration includes the following counties: Alcona, Alger, Alpena, Antrim, Arenac, Bay, Benzie, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Chippewa, Clare, Clinton, Crawford, Eaton, Emmet, Genesee, Gladwin, Grand

Traverse, Gratiot, Ingham, Ionia, Iosco, Isabella, Jackson, Kalkaska, Leelanau, Lenawee, Livingston, Luce, Mackinac, Macomb, Manistee, Mecosta, Midland, Missaukee, Monroe, Montcalm, Montmorency, Oakland, Ogemaw, Osceola, Oscoda, Otsego, Presque Isle, Roscommon, Saginaw, Schoolcraft, Shiawassee, Washtenaw, Wayne and Wexford in Michigan. Under this declaration, the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program is available to eligible farm-related and nonfarm-related entities that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. With the

exception of aquaculture enterprises, SBA cannot provide disaster loans to agricultural producers, farmers, or ranchers. Nurseries are eligible to apply for economic injury disaster loans for losses caused by drought conditions. The loans are for working capital and can be up to \$2 million with interest rates of 4 percent for eligible small businesses and 2.625 percent for nonprofit organizations, and terms up to 30 years. Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure website at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

Disaster loan information and application forms may also be obtained by calling the SBA's Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955 (800-877-8339 for the deaf and hard-of-hearing) or by sending an email to disastercustomerservice@sba.gov. HEALTH CARE HERE & THERE

To the Editor,

You can't make this stuff up, as they say. The USA is the only developed country in this world without universal health care coverage. Even many countries considered rather backward have it, countries such as Rwanda.

Most of the developed countries have a dual possibility of public and private insurance coverage largely dependent upon income. The US in actuality has a great deal of universal health coverage, just not proclaimed as such. Medicare inception by Lyndon Johnson in the 1970s also paired with MEDICAID for the needy, a program now undergoing much stress via the political process. It wasn't until the reign of Ronald Reagan that hospitals couldn't turn emergency cases away at the desk anymore - they once did - but the dictum didn't allow for federal funding to offset the cost.

This has been and continues to be an ongoing battle, largely a battle between Republicans and Democrats although not all Republicans as evidenced of late with the McCain +2 vote of 2017 overriding the Senate bloc that sought overturning of the Obamacare Affordable Care Act (ACA). There are other options, i.e. free clinics, graduated fee accounting

based on income etc. How anyone can seek to deny health care to any who need it is incomprehensible yet there it is, the capitalistic mindset. And it must be said that health insurance companies do donate to political causes, an obvious conflict of interest. There is some oblivious disinterest inherent in the capitalistic view that allows purveyors to ignore the needs of some others. Of course the word Socialism is anathema so it is avoided. Curiously, though, the US is half-socialist already with Social Security, Unemployment, government-funded infrastructure, K-12 education, emergency services and so on. Though many complain of big government most of us partake of its largesse on a daily basis and indeed complain when it's faltering. We read and hear of the resentment of how tax dollars are collected and spent and the angst expressed at the percentage of Americans that don't pay into the system but do benefit by it. This is inevitable nevertheless due to the system itself, the continually rising cost of living, rules and regulations seemingly designed to give and take at once, caps on holdings and savings as relates to federal and state services, rather a bind of imbroglia as to one's position in midst this tumultuous economy that appears to be endless inflation and potential recession.

This country seems constantly on the brink of disastrous collapse caught only at the barest last moment repeatedly before a fall into the chasm of crash, as in Great Depression 2.0. Supposedly this almost happened in 2007-8 until rescued by Obama with his bailout and stimulus plan. The fact that Big Business and Big Banking were bailed out yet continued their practice of Big Bonuses rankled some but the effect was subsumed in the acknowledgement that a greater calamity was avoided. Meanwhile the health care alteration rankles. If Canada can do it, why not we? Some Canadians maintain that US health care is better and actually travel to purchase it when needed. That is arguable, however, since most Canadians are satisfied with the system there. It is said that waiting time is prohibitive but that's relative because waiting time in the US is markedly no different unless it's emergency care which is always available either side of the border. Mexico to the south has complete subsidized health care as does much of Central and South America. All of Europe, Scandinavia, Australia, New Zealand, same thing. Russia, same, China, check. Japan, ditto. Insurance companies in the US are long-ensconced, pharmaceuticals quite the same, rendering the expense well-inte-

grated into the fabric of American lifestyle. This is not easily changed as we see every day in news accounts. And there is a large population dedicated to preserving this tradition in automaton mode, spouting forth the rhetoric fed to them from birth, the Merle Haggard workingman blues syndrome which is said to have split the country right down the middle. Indeed some 46-7% of Americans receive some sort of government assistance, which indicates that a percentage of the middle class partakes as well as the poor and working poor. It is, according to rationale, only the instilled profit margin keeping the United States from universal health care. Naturally this never comes up in political discussions but is circumvented by tweaked logic or avoided outright. That's all it is though, greed, hedonism, indifference etc. We're slouching toward it nonetheless by bump and grind method. The US cannot much longer remain the only developed country in the world without universal health care. Perhaps it would be more expeditious to list the countries without it, might be a much shorter list, US at the top.

East Jordan Wastewater Treatment Plant groundbreaking

The City of East Jordan will be holding a groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of a new wastewater treatment plant on Tuesday, August 29, at 10am at 6100 Airport Drive in East Jordan. The public is invited to attend this exciting event. The \$5.7M project was designed by Gosling Czubak Engineering Sciences, Inc. of Traverse City. The new

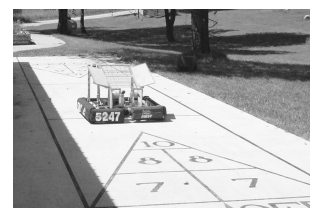
plant, capable of handling 239,000 gallons per day, will utilize screening and grit removal, oxidation ditches, and clarification before discharging treated water to sand beds. The system will operate continuously year-round with a new plant control system equipped with alarm notifications. This project will also upgrade four existing pumps

stations identified as "fair" to "poor" condition. Improvements will include replacement of aging pumps with new, and a completely new pump station at Tourist Park. Preliminary site work will begin on August 14, and the improvements are expected to be complete and operational by August 25, 2018. Construction will be com-

pleted by contractors Grand Traverse Construction, Shoreline Power, Northwest Michigan Contracting, Franklin Holwerda Company, Bay Masonry, and West Michigan Instrumentation. This project is being funded in part by a \$3.4 M grant from USDA Rural Development.
