CHARLEVOIX — A season of ups and downs is finally in the books for the Charlevoix football team.

On Friday, October 20, the

Rayders put an exclamation point on their subpar season, outlasting visiting Mancelona 44-32, ending the year on a high note.

Charlevoix, riding the his of the homecoming festivities, jumped out to an early 24-8 lead after two quarters of play Tre Hart got things going for the Rayders, crossing the goal line on a two-yard run, teammate Robby Morgridge tacked on the second score of the night, this coming on a 14-yard scamper, as both scores came in the first quarter of play.

Sophomore quarterback, Cole Wright then connected on two of his four passing scores during the second quarter, on passes of six and 14 yards respectively.

Following the halftime festivities, the Rayders and Ironmen both kept the scoreboard operator busy as the two teams combined for 44 points in the third quarter.

Wright finished the day with 116 yards on 7-of-8 passing and the four scores, while Hart picked up 70 yards on 13 carries and a score, Morgridge

added 63 yards on 13 carries and a touchdown as well. Alan Ritter also chewed up 33 yards on three attempts.

Andrew Baten, Thomas Rudolph and Michael Pearsall each added a touchdown reception as did Hart.

Defensively for Charlevoix, Ray Cunningham finished with 14 tackles, while Garrett Seese added 13. Kyle Balch and Baten chipped in with six stops apiece.

HIGH SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

Q & A WITH
KATIE HOTH

BOYNE CITY — In a new feature that will look into the what drives select Northern Michigan athletes, I had the opportunity to sit down with Boyne City senior Katie Hoth, an All-State softball player as well as a multiple time selection for All-Area and All-Conference basketball, softball and volleyball, to find out what drives her passion for sports and what she looks forward to in the future. Katie is the daughter of Robert and Michele Hoth.

Hoth spent much of this past summer playing travel softball around Michigan and neighboring states, and when she wasn't on the diamond, you could often find her working out in the weight room, pushing herself to be in the best shape possible or getting in some cardio by running on the shore of Young State Park in Boyne City.

Q: What are your main motivations for doing athletics? (Why do you do athletics?)

KH: I love how I feel when playing sports and staying active. I was born into an athletic family that encouraged me from a young age to try all sports and get a feel for the game. No matter what's going on around me I get to have at least two hours a day where none of that matters and I can forget about my school work and other responsibilities I have. Before a big game the adrenaline rush kicks in and it's exciting to be so hype and ready to perform. Not to mention staying fit as a whole. It's a lot easier to maintain a regular amount of exercise when you're practicing ten plus hours a week.

Q: What do you most enjoy about athletics?

KH: I love the atmosphere around me during season. Whatever sport I'm playing I know I'm going to practice with fun people that are there essentially with similar goals as myself. On game days it's ever better. With fans surrounding you, peers cheering, and of course the satisfaction of knowing you did well.

Q: What have been your major highlights/achievements in athletics?

KH: As of this past spring I was awarded first-team All-State, as well as Player of the Year through the Charlevoix County News for softball. However, in July within two weeks of finding out I will be playing for the AIST USA Softball team in the Dominican Republic. I also made my verbal commitment to play softball for Lansing Community College starting Fall 2018.

Q: What are your long range goals in athletics?

A: This is a hard question. I typically don't spend a ton of time thinking into the future as far as athletics go. After my two years are up at LCC it's possible I could transfer to a university and continue playing so I see that as a goal.

Q: What are some of your medium/short term goals? (Within the next year or so)

KH: I want to walk away this final year knowing I did everything I could to be the best that I can be. I'm shooting for another chance as an all-state softball player, but also looking to improve my overall basketball skills as well.

Q: What do you feel are your main strengths in athletics?

KH: My strength and my speed are my best attributes to my athletic ability.

Q: What areas do you feel that you need improvement in?

KH: I need to improve my jumping. My vertical is way too low.

Q: Do you currently do any training for athletics? If yes, provide details. (Examples and how often)

KH: Outside of regular practice/games, I spend time in the weight room and occasionally somewhere I can do speed training, (typically the beach). I lift at least five times a week, and at most eight times. I personally like to focus on legs because that's where most of your power comes from in any activity, but I'm aware that core/upper body is important as well. When the weather is nice I do "sand-sprints" to help with speed and agility. This workout consists of running, jumping (vertical, side-to-side, forward/backwards), and a slight body-weight leg workout.

Q: Have you ever had a personal athletics coach before? If yes, provide details.

KH: I have a hitting coach out of Gaylord, Coach Greg Jones. He is absolutely wonderful. I recommend him to anyone and everyone looking to become a better athlete, leader, softball/baseball player, pitcher, hitter... the list goes on. He is so inspirational and could motivate Eeyore if he tried. I've learned so much from him and I truly give him credit for my bat. I've been working with Coach Jones for five years now and he's improved my mental game just as much as my physical ability.

Q: What do you like about training?

KH: I love how I feel when I'm done. There's a quote I've seen before that always sticks with me; "I really regret that workout" - said no one ever." Sometimes the workout is a pain but I know I will never regret it. When I'm done I feel not only like I'm getting better, but I also gain confidence as a person as well as an athlete.

Q: What do you dislike about training?

KH: I don't really ever not like training... sometimes if I can't do something right I get flustered and that's honestly the worst part. Other than that I'm pretty positive about getting better.

Q: Of all the sports, recreation and fitness activities you do, does one take a higher priority than all of the others? If so, which one?

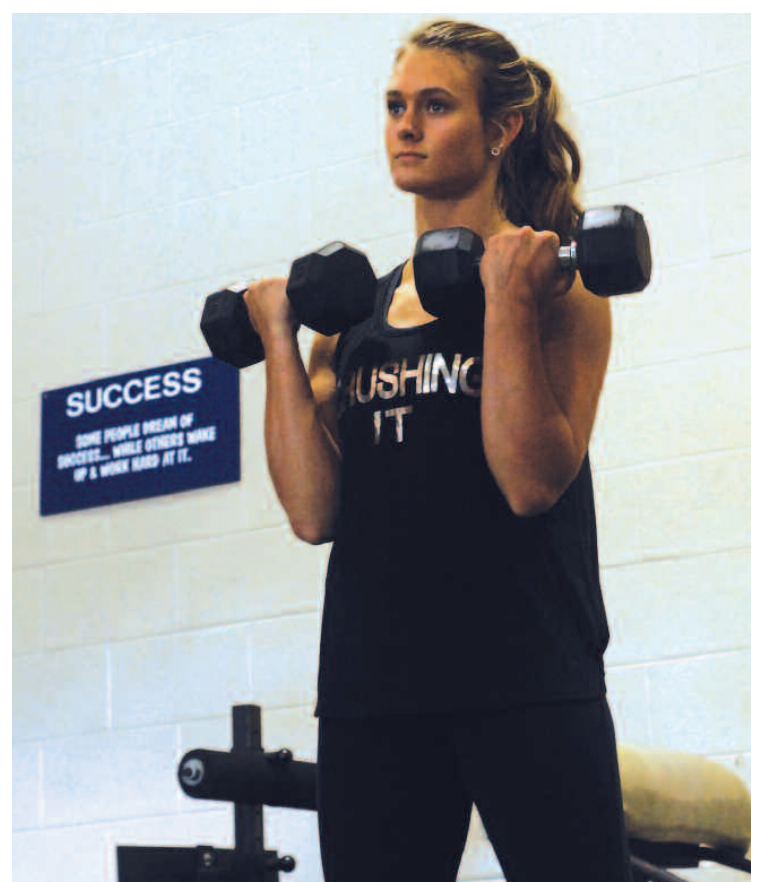
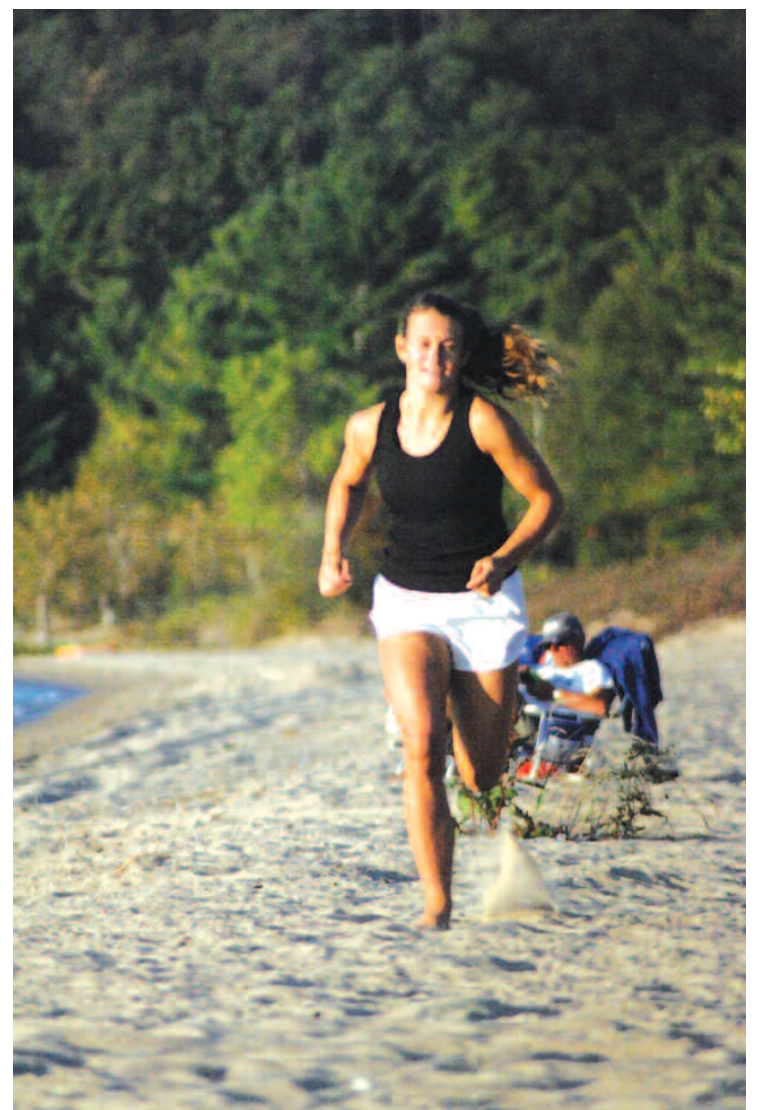
KH: Absolutely. I prefer softball to any other sport/activity. Hitting helps get anger out, defense makes you feel good when you make a great play. All of it combined is so much fun.

Q: How important is athletics in your life right now?

KH: As of now, athletics are my life. Every day consists of practice, workout, or training. Ultimately all of that hard work was going towards a softball scholarship. That has been a goal since I've been little and I dedicated many days, months, and years to that.

Q: How important is it for you to excel in athletics?

KH: Excelling is extremely important to me. I'm a competitive person that wants

to win all the time. In order to win, the team must come together and everyone has to contribute.

Q: How would you rate your desire and determination to succeed in athletics?

KH: On a scale of 1-10 I'd rate my desire an 11. I chuckle as I say that because it's not fun for me unless I'm succeeding and in order to succeed you have to be determined.

Q: Finally, what would be a successful season of athletics for you?

KH: Success to me is when I reach my goals. I always set standards for myself, but also I have an idea in my head as to what I think the team should be doing. If I can accomplish the things I'm working towards, that is success.

Q: How important are academics to you?

KH: Academics are very important. At the end of the day athletics aren't going to find me a career, my brain is.

Q: What are your "current" plans for after high school?

KH: I love the medical field I'm just not sure what branch I want to study. I'm leaning towards pediatrics as of now; I love kids, but there are so many options out there that I don't even know exist yet.

I would like to thank Katie Hoth for taking the time to participate in this Q & A, and wish her nothing but the best of luck in whatever athletic event or classroom activity she takes part in. There is no doubt this young lady will do wonderful things for a very long time, both on and off the playing field in the foreseeable future.

Ramblers take down Glads in title contest

Late touchdown lifts Boyne to victory

Boyne City 19, Traverse City St. Francis 12

BOYNE CITY — When two teams are evenly matched, sometimes it comes down to a few yards, a couple of plays, a single snap.

While it was pretty evident that each of those occurrences took place on Friday, October 20 at Earl Brotherton Field in Boyne City, it would be the low snap that turned into a scramble, toss the ball to the back of the endzone, outstanding reception, touchdown that turned out to be the highlight of the game, filled with emotional highs and lows for each respective sideline and fan base.

Trailing 13-12 with 24 seconds left in the game, Boyne City set up for the game winning field goal attempt from the St. Francis 4-yard line as Rambler kicker, Jacob Dean, also a player on Boyne City's soccer team that arrived just moments prior after the Ramblers won their first ever district soccer championship over Kingsley earlier that evening, looked to boot the through the uprights, but it would turn out to be Ethan Hewitt's handle of the low snap, quick decision to pull it in and create just enough space from the TCSF defense to locate teammate Dillon Sulak's waving hand streaking across the field as Hewitt lofted a short pass towards the back of the endzone and Sulak going up high between two Gladiator defenders, taking a hit and coming down with the ball, sending the Ramblers, their sideline and fan base into a frenzy.

"It was a low snap, so I pinned it, turned left, yelled fire, which cues our tight end and halfback to release, made eye contact early with Dillon (Sulak) and stretched it out until I could and lofted it up to him and he made a crazy, outstanding catch," Hewitt said.

Dean would kick the extra point, giving Boyne a 19-12 advantage.

With the win, the Ram-

blers complete the regular season with a perfect 9-0 record, including 7-0 in the Northern Michigan Football League - Legends Division, capturing the title in the process.

"We had a lot of resolve all the way through, and we kept telling the guys, we're gonna get our shot, and we got it down in there, and

things happened that sometimes you don't draw it up that way, but sometimes good things happen when you're trying real hard." Boyne City coach Dave Hills said. "It's a big game and it means a lot to your program when you can beat somebody like Traverse City, it's not an easy thing to do, it's a difficult thing to do, I think it shows a lot where our program is at, their really good and we're really good and right there with them. It says a lot about the kids, they believe in our system and the guys that are coaching and they follow the process and work at it."

The final drive by the Ramblers was made possible after linebacker, Jacob Ager forced and recovered a St. Francis fumble with 2:30 to play in the contest. Prior to the Hewitt touchdown pass, the highlight of the drive came facing a 3rd-and-9 from the TC 40, when Ethan Hills connected with a streaking Mason Gardner over the middle for a 35-yard gain,

putting Boyne on the doorstep with 1:40 remaining.

TCSF received the opening kickoff, and were looking to attack the Rambler defense with a steady diet of run plays, but on their sixth play of the opening drive, they elected to go to the air, and then St. Francis quarter-

back, Dylan McCardel fired his first pass right into the outstretched right hand of Ager, who returned the interception to the Gladiator 42 yard line.

The Ramblers wasted little time in getting things rolling as Hills pitched left to a pulling Hewitt, and the senior running back threw a 42-

yard strike to a wide open Gardner for a touchdown, giving BC a 6-0 lead with 8:44 left in the opening quarter.

"We normally run that play to the right (with me being right handed) but when coach called my number and Ethan (Hills) gave me a good pitch, the corner bit and it left a wide open Mason (Gardner) for me to throw to."

The two teams would then exchange drives, before the Glads looked to move the ball again, but another McCardel pass was picked off by defensive back, Eric Carson and it was off to the races for the senior, as he returned the ball 61 yards for another Rambler touchdown and a 12-0 advantage.

"We kind of held them in check, and I knew if we could get some points early and put some pressure on them, that might result in some good things for us," coach Hills added. "Our defense has played good all year. It is a good defense, and I'm glad our offense doesn't have to go against that defense all the time."

The score would remain the same until just under seven minutes to play in the third, when TCSF was finally able to get into the endzone and cut into the BC lead 12-7.

Following a Rambler fumble, St. Francis would take the lead on the first play of the fourth quarter, going up 13-12 as the conversion attempt was unsuccessful.

The Rambler defense held strong throughout the contest, limiting Traverse City to only 182 yards of total offense, including 170 on the ground.

Ager would lead the Ramblers with 12 tackles, including one for a loss and an interception, while Gardner and Dylon Williams finished with 10 stops each. Ryan Hautz added nine tackles, while Max Burke and Spencer Joles contributed six apiece.

On the offensive side of the ball, Hewitt finished 2-of-2 passing for 46 yards and two scores, while Hills was 4-of-12 passing for 66 yards.

Kyler Price led the rushing attack with 65 yards on 14 carries, while Joseph Baugh added 46, Trevor Wilcox 27 and Sulak 20.

Gardner caught three passes for 87 yards, while three other Ramblers hauled in one each.

Boyne City plays host to Glen Lake on Friday, October 27, in the opening round of the playoffs. There are no advance ticket sales for this event.
