Lakers overpower Ramblers in playoff opener

Maple City Glen Lake 28,
Boyne City 7

BOYNE CITY — Entering the playoffs fresh off an undefeated regular season, which featured emotional wins over Elk Rapids and Traverse City St. Francis and a Northern Michigan Football League - Legends Division title, the Boyne City football team was riding high.

The Ramblers stood at 9-0 and Maple City Glen Lake came in with an impressive 6-2 campaign and were riding a five game win streak of their own.

Entering a hostile road environment and facing the home field advantage of Boyne City would not phase a Laker team that finished as Division 6 runners-up a season ago.

After a three-and-out for the Ramblers on their first series, Boyne punted away to the Lakers.

It didn't take long after that to see that something was a little off for Boyne as Glen Lake quarterback, and Grand Valley State commit, Cade Peterson took off on a keeper on the Lakers opening play and ran 51 yards up the far sideline nearly untouched to put Glen Lake up 7-0, with just under 10 minutes to go in the first quarter of play.

Boyne was unable to get any type of offense going throughout most of the first half, but a pair of Rambler fumbles in the second quarter would keep the momentum going in the Lakers favor as BC fumbled and Glen Lake picked off a pass on Boyne's next series.

Glen Lake would capitalize on the miscues, and tack on two more Nick Aspey scores, one on the ground for a 1-yard touchdown and the other on the receiving end of a Peterson 47-yard scoring strike with just under nine minutes to play in the half.

Boyne City had not given up more than 13 points in a game all season, but found themselves trailing 21-0 at the half, while also being held scoreless for the first time entering intermission.

Glen Lake took the opening drive of the third quarter and punched it in after moving the ball 63 yards for a 28-0 advantage.

Following the score, the Ramblers could have packed it up, but they fought for everything they could get, finally picking up some momentum of their own late in the quarter as senior Ethan Hewitt took a handoff and went from the Laker 24 yard line and followed blockers to the the near corner of

the endzone for the first BC score of the night. A successful Jacob Dean extra point attempt would make it 28-7 Glen Lake, but they could get no closer as the suffocating Laker defense would keep Boyne from chipping away at their lead.

On the night for the Ramblers, Ethan Hills finished 2-of-14 passing for 10 yards as he faced constant pressure, sacked four times and hurried on multiple occasions.

The Rambler ground game was able to rack up a total of 233 yards, led by Tyler Price with 66; Hewitt had 62; Dillon Sulak added 54 and Joseph Baugh tallied 21.

Mason Gardner and Hewitt each finished with one reception.

Defensively for Boyne, Gardner had nine tackles, Jacob Ager fin-

ished with eight stops, while Dylan Williams added six and Jacob Robinson had five.

For Glen Lake, Peterson was 4-for-15 passing for 125 yards and two touchdowns through the air and rushed for 117 yards and one score.

Boyne City will graduate 14 sen-

iors including: Ager, Baugh, Gardner, Hewitt, Price, Robinson, Williams, Spencer Joles, Trevor Wilcox, Eric Carson, Ryan Hautz, Connor Gabos, Jared Hausler and Max Burke.

Look for the Ramblers to bounce back next season as they will put in

the work necessary and make adjustments as the cupboard is far from bare with the returning personnel as Hills returns under center as do running backs Sulak and King, along with an undefeated JV program.

Boyne City ends season in regional semi-finals

The Boyne City soccer team went through its struggles early in the year. The Ramblers flipped a switch the second half of the season, catching fire and marching all the way to the regional semi-finals.

That ride unfortunately came to an end on Tuesday, Oct. 24 as it lost to Ludington 1-0 in a division three regional semi-final game in Clare.

"They never gave up after an uninspired start to the season," head coach Nick Baic said.

After beginning the year 1-8-3 the team regrouped to finish the year on a 6-1-2 run, to finish the year 7-12-5. This included their first district title in program history. Their district title run included a 1-0 win over Traverse City Christian, a 4-3 victory over Grayling and a 1-0 shootout win over Kingsley.

"Our defense started stopping shots and we scored enough goals to win some games at the end of the season," Baic said. "It was great to have Ross Daniels as a fellow coach this year. We have 24 on the roster and having two coaches was invaluable in being able to get the young players on the same page as the older players."

The Ramblers played to a scoreless tie with the Orioles in the regional game, but Ludington found the back of the net in the second half for the only goal, ending their season. Ludington also won the regional championship and is set to play in the state semi-finals this week.

"Ludington was big and fast across the board," Baic said. "Our possession game wasn't great but our defense was and our goalie played great. We didn't score on our chances and they did."

Senior goalie Ian Meier had four shutouts in the team's final 10 games and fellow seniors Evan Korthase (midfield) and Riley Minier (forward) were key players as well. Juniors Zac Backus, Jacob Daen and Jonah Leaman were a force for the defense and fellow juniors Corben Wilhelm and Logan Culver added strong play in the midfield.

So while the Ramblers graduate three key players in Meier, Korthase and Minier, they have a wealth of players coming back and will also get a boost from the lower ranks as well.

"We graduate three and we have a dozen good eighth graders coming up," Baic said. "We also have a strong group of freshmen. We hope to start a little faster next year to have a chance at the conference title."

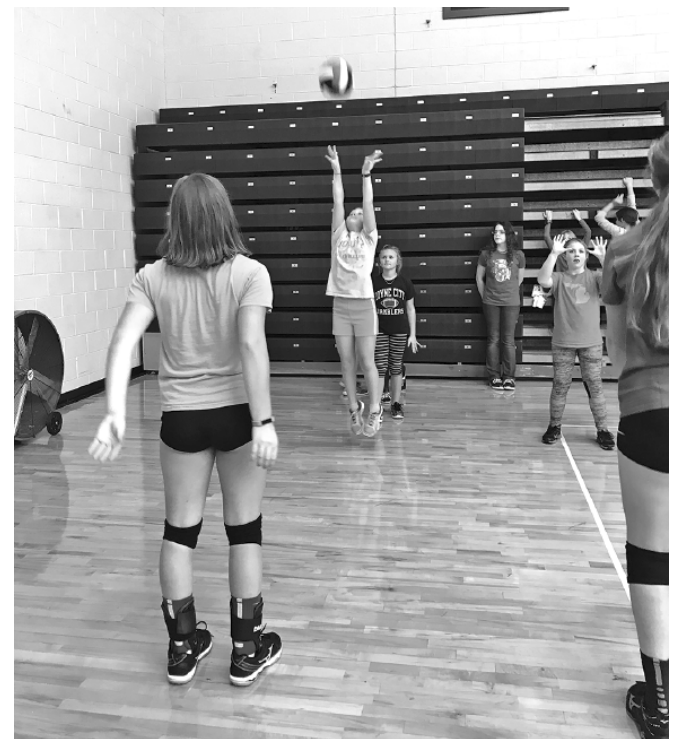

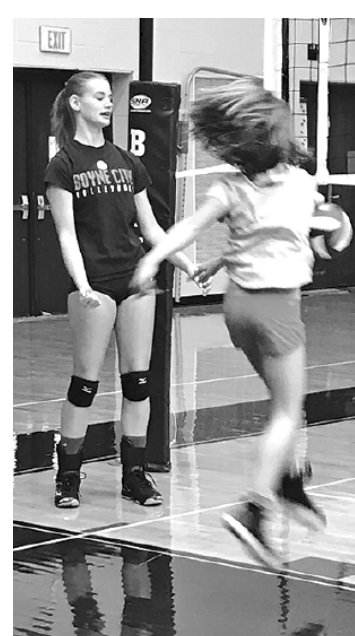

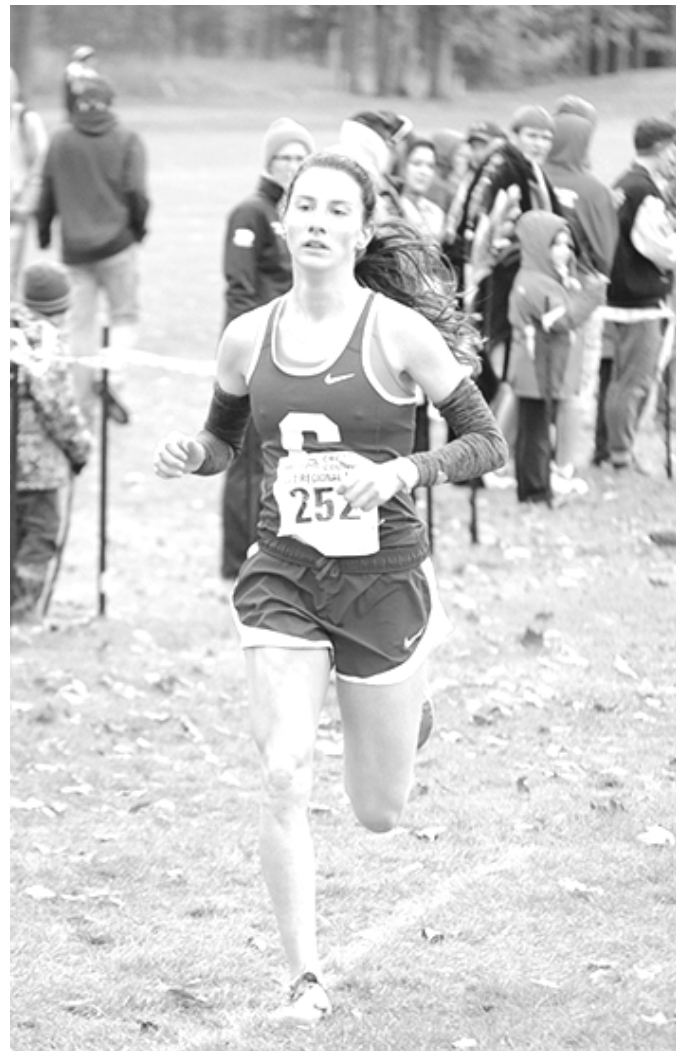

Michigan's Amazing Animals: Grouse in the House

With an autumn chill in the air it's time to start looking forward to some upland bird hunting in the Mitten State. Here are some fun and feathery facts about a popular and great tasting upland game bird, the ruffed grouse:



The Name Game: Ruffed grouse is the go-to moniker for this bird as it pertains to only this species. In some areas, however, their coined prairie chickens, partridge or pats, and even pheasant. Of course, those vernaculars apply more appropriately to other bird species.

For Latin Lovers: The ruffed grouse's scientific name is *Bonasa umbellus*. The genus *Bonasa* has two popular interpretations. A tongue-in-cheek explanation is that "bonus" refers to "good" and "assum" means "roasted." In other words, "being good while roasted!" A more plausible explanation is that *Bonasum* means a "kind of bull or buffalo" and correlates to the drumming sound a mating male makes resembling the bellowing of a bull. The species, *umbellus* most certainly refers to the umbrella like feathers displayed by courting male grouse.

Specific Statistics: Adult ruffed grouse weigh slightly more than a pound and stand about a foot tall. Males are usually larger with longer tail feathers but the sexes are often indistinguishable from each other. Grouse usually live about 7 to 8 years but individual birds may survive to age 11. **Brood Basics:** Once a fe-

male is attracted to a drumming male he puts on quite a display. He expands the ruff of feathers around his neck and struts around while arching his tail feathers in a broad "fan." After mating the female makes a ground nest and lays one egg per day for up to 14 days. All eggs are then incubated at once and all hatch together usually in about 24 days. The precocial chicks are well developed at birth and will fend for themselves a short while after hatching.

Little Drummer Boys:

During mating season male grouse channel Ringo Starr. They find a fallen log in a dense thicket and rapidly beat their wings against the air to create a vacuum. The drumming sound is unmistakable and, along with a nip in the air and blazing leaves, portends the season of autumn.

Here's Bird Mud in Your Eye! The Famous Grouse is a very popular blended Scotch whiskey made first by Matthew Gloag & Son in 1896. It's the top-selling Scotch whisky in Scotland.

Now that's something to drum about! **Roller Coaster Ruffians:** Ruffed grouse populations ebb and flow significantly. Late summer numbers may be 4 times the spring level with the production of young. Winter mortality rates, however, may reach 75% during harsh years. Within a given region grouse numbers tend to rise and fall in roughly a 10 year cycle, with the highest densities reaching about 8 times the lowest levels. **Grouse Grub:** Grouse are

omnivorous, eating both animals and plants. They'll eat just about any insect, worm, or small frog they can get their beaks on and also gorge on plant shoots and berries. The flower-like "catkins" from birch and willow trees provide critical nutrition throughout the winter. In northern climes birds that haven't fattened up well before entering winter often don't survive. **Cast and Blast:** Several areas of northern Michigan offer opportunities to, "cast and blast." That's Michi-

gan's answer to surf and turf when sportsmen fit in upland bird hunting and fly fishing on the same excursion. Give the accommodating folks at Gates Au Sable Lodge a jingle to explore this unique autumn adventure (989-348-8462). Another recommendation would be to employ Riversage Outfitters in Ewart, who are associated with Meemos Farm, at riversageoutfitters.com.

Grouse Houses: Ruffed grouse are a widely dispersed species living in 34 of the 49 continental states. Grouse thrive in young aspen forests and brush lands with ample low cover. Ideal habitat is created when aspen forests are clear-cut every 40 years, or in low growth following forest fires. Grouse are quite adaptable and can live close to human developments if the right vegetation exists. When habitat needs are met a ruffed grouse will usually spend its entire life in a 40 acre home range.

Ga Ga for Grouse: A bonus of grouse hunting is that they are absolutely scrumptious. Many recipes are available and I'd recommend the "traditional style" featured on the matching-foodandwine.com site and, of course, those shared by friend Chef Milos at cookingwithchefmilos.com.

NORWOOD TOWNSHIP Ordinance No. 1 of 2017

At their regular meeting October 16, of 2017, the Norwood Township Board passed a resolution to adopt an Ordinance to Establish Park and Public Places Rules and Regulations. In summary:

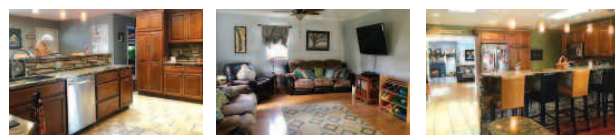

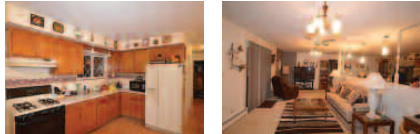
