Academy pushes recruits Academically, physically

DIMONDALE - The Michigan Department of Natural Resources is seeking candidates for its 2018 Conservation Officer Recruit School, a 23-week training academy that is the first step in becoming a conservation officer

Recruit School #9 runs July 15-Dec. 21, 2018, at the training academy in Dimondale, near Lansing, Michigan.

"The academy demands total effort and commit-

ment," said 1st Lt. Steve Burton, training section supervisor in the DNR Law Enforcement Division. "It challenges recruits academically and physically. But those who succeed are on the path to an exciting, fulfilling career as a Michigan conservation officer. Not just anyone can wear our gray and green uniform. Only the finest men and women should apply."

The DNR is an equal opportunity employer and encourages diversity among its applicants. During the academy, recruits become state of Michigan employees and are paid biweekly. After gradua-

tion, they become probationary conservation officers and spend several more months training throughout the state before being assigned to one of Michigan's 83 counties, in which they will live. The entire training process, which includes the academy, takes one year before candidates become fullfledged conservation officers, due to the high quality and diverse nature of the training.

An applicant must: Be a U.S. citizen.

Be at least 21 years old before graduating from the academy. Become a resident of

Michigan by completing the Probationary Training Program.

Be allowed to lawfully possess a firearm in Michigan. Possess a valid Michigan

driver's license. Possess a satisfactory driving record.

Possess a clean criminal record absent of any felony convictions.

Submit to a thorough background investigation measuring the applicant's suitability for law enforcement work.

Pass the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES) physical fitness test.

Complete and attach the Job Fit Questionnaire, Location Preference Sheet, a cover letter and resume when applying.

Sports & Outdoors DNR tips for safe, enjoyable hunting season

LANSING - With the arrival of the firearm deer season this week, Michigan Department of Natural Resources conservation officers are encouraging hunters to brush up on safety tips and hunting regulations to ensure a safe, enjoyable experience.

"Firearm deer season is a special time of year in Michigan," Cpl. Dave Painter said. "It brings family and friends together in celebration of our state's great outdoor heritage. Staying safe, knowing the laws and being good stewards of our resources will help hunters have a memorable outing."

Painter reminds hunters that a mandatory deer check is in place within certain areas of the state due to the confirmation of chronic wasting disease, a fatal neurological disease found in deer, elk and moose. Hunters harvesting a deer in these CWD areas must bring it to a DNR check station within 72 hours. Visit mi.gov/deercheck for a map

and list of check stations.

Regardless of where deer are harvested in Michigan. the DNR encourages all hunters to voluntarily take them to the nearest check station to help with disease surveillance. In addition, big-game hunters who travel outside of Michigan should be aware of new regulations restricting the importation

of harvested cervids. Painter also offered the fol-

lowing general safety tips: Treat every firearm as if it

is loaded. Keep your finger away from the trigger and outside the trigger guard until you are ready to fire.

Keep the safety on until you are ready to fire.

Always point the muzzle in a safe direction.

Be certain of your target, and what's beyond it, before firing.

Know the identifying features of the game you hunt.

Make sure you have an adequate backstop. Don't shoot at a flat, hard surface or water.

Unload the firearm before

running, climbing a fence or tree, or jumping a ditch.

Wear a safety harness when hunting from an elevated platform. Use a haul line to bring the unloaded firearm up and down the raised platform. Avoid alcoholic beverages

or behavior-altering medicines or drugs before or during a hunt.

Always wear a hat, cap, vest or jacket of hunter orange, visible from all sides, during daylight hunting hours, even if hunting on private land. The law also applies to archery hunters during firearm season.

Make sure at least 50 percent of any camouflage pattern being worn is in hunter orange.

Always let someone know where you are hunting and when you plan to return. This information helps conservation officers and others locate you if you become injured or lost.

Carry a cell phone into the woods. Not only does it let you call for help if necessary, but newer phones emit a signal that can help rescuers locate vou. Also consider downloading a compass or flashlight app.

Program the DNR's Report All Poaching (RAP) line (800-292-7800) in your phone contacts so you can alert conservation officers to any natural resources violations you may witness.

"These are simple, common-sense tips that can help prevent accidents and save lives," Painter said. "The DNR encourages all hunters to review the Michigan Hunting and Trapping Digest for other essential information before taking to the field."

DNR officers honored for saving lives

Officers' immediate responses made the difference in rescues

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources has recognized two of its conservation officers for their lifesaving actions earlier this year.

Conservation Officers Jeffrey Goss and Josiah Killingbeck received the DNR's Lifesaving Award during Thursday's regular meeting of the Michigan Natural Resources Commission in Lansing.

"Both of these emergencies could have ended tragically had it not been for the actions of Conservation Officers Jeff Goss and Josiah Killingbeck," said Dean Molnar, assistant chief of the DNR Law Enforcement Division, who presented

the officers with the award. "Their extensive training, rapid responses and professional conduct made all the difference. We're proud of Jeff Goss and Josiah Killingbeck for upholding the DNR Law Enforcement Division's highest standards. Their outstanding service to their communities makes them most deserving of this recog-

nition." On May 4, Goss responded to a Calhoun County dispatch call regarding a subject who

was suffering from a drug overdose. He quickly arrived at the location because it was only 4 miles from where he was working. Once at the scene, Goss found a citizen performing chest compressions on the subject. After checking the subject, Goss observed that he had aspirated breathing and a pulse, so Goss instructed the citizen to cease the chest compressions.

Goss then administered three sternal rubs but the subject did not respond. He opened the subject's eyelids and noticed the pupils were very large. Goss continued monitoring the subject until his breathing and pulse slowed drastically, updating dispatchers of this change in condition. Soon afterward, the sub-

ject's breathing and pulse stopped, and his face was turning purple. Goss immediately started chest compressions, and after a while. the subject regained his pulse and normal coloration returned to his face.

Goss administered two sternal rubs but the subject did not respond. Goss stayed with

him and monitored his condition until medical personnel arrived. The emergency responders administered medication to the subject, and within a few minutes he was able to walk to the stretcher.

Goss has been with the DNR for 11 years, serving Calhoun County and the surrounding area. He is a native of North Branch in Lapeer County.

Killingbeck's lifesaving incident occurred June 30 when he responded to a distress call along the Pere Marquette River in Lake County. A family of four was canoeing on the river when the craft overturned, throwing all occupants into the water.

The river was unseasonably high and the water flow was swifter than usual. The father and son were swept downstream while the mother and daughter remained near the canoe and became stuck in a logjam.

The mother was unable to locate her daughter. After calling her for some time, she reached under the canoe and discovered that her daughter was underneath, partially wedged in the logjam. After

freeing her, the mother placed her daughter on top of the debris in which they were stuck.

Realizing her daughter's skin was blue and she was unresponsive, the mother immediately rendered CPR and revived her. While traveling to the scene, Killingbeck used his detailed knowledge of the local area to determine the spot where the family likely was, and advised dispatchers and a sheriff's deputy of the best response location.

The deputy was first on the scene along the river and located the mother and daughter. The father and son managed to escape the river and walked upstream to where the mother and daughter were trapped. Killingbeck arrived soon after and worked with the deputy to assess the situation.

Although a swift-water response team had been notified, Killingbeck knew that every minute was critical and he feared the mother and daughter were in immediate danger. The conservation officer crawled out onto a downed tree log that was just upstream of the mother and

daughter.

After shimmying out on the narrow log, which was in fastmoving water more than 6 feet deep, Killingbeck was able to rescue the daughter and get her back to shore with assistance from the deputy and other responders who had since arrived. Killingback then assisted the mother out of the water.

The daughter was transported to a local hospital before ultimately being sent to a children's hospital for evaluation. She was released a few days later with no reported health issues.

Killingbeck has been with the DNR for more than three years, serving Lake County and the surrounding area. He is a native of Luther in Lake County.


