With another exciting football season in the books, there has been plenty of time to reflect on the outstanding plays made by each team and the high level of competitiveness and no quit effort that each squad brought to the gridiron each and every week.

It is the time of year where the select few athletes from each team stand out and receive the recognition that they have battled for and earned throughout the offseason and playing season, as the Charlevoix County News names the 2017 All-Area Football “Dream Team”.

It should come as no surprise that after another successful season by the Boyne City football team, that the All-Area team has quite the number of Ramblers representing their school, led by the 2017 Defensive Player of the Year, Jacob Ager and Offensive Player of the Year, Dillon Sulak.

Defensive Player of the Year

Jacob Ager, Boyne City

A three year member and two-year captain of the Boyne varsity program, Ager was a standout athlete on both sides of the ball, especially defensively where he often times set the tone of the game within the first few snaps of the contest.

Ager was recently named to the Division 5-6 All-State first team, solidifying his out-

standing season.

The hard-hitting 200 plus pound linebacker, led the Rambler's with 112 tackles, including 15 for a loss and four sacks, picked off two passes, including one for a touchdown, deflected two passes, forced one fumble, recovered three and returned one for a score.

And those are just the start of what Jacob brought to the field each and every Friday night. Opponents would often change their game plan to run away from him, and when they did challenge him, they would find that he could and would put a halt to that idea rather quickly, by wrapping up a running back or quarterback in the backfield, or chase down a receiver that thought they had open field ahead of them.

If you were walking to your seat or engaged in conversation at anytime throughout a Rambler contest and heard a good clean hard hit, you would turn your attention to the field and it was #2 getting up off the turf after halting another offensive play.

Ager also contributed on the offensive side of the ball as well, blocking for his teammates to spring them open for a long gain or pass protecting to give his quarterback another second or two to find the open receiver.

He wasn't limited to just blocking either as he caught four passes for 46 yards, including a touchdown.

The quick accelerating, hard running Sulak picked up steam throughout the season, rattling off multiple 100 yard rushing games for the Ramblers.

The Boyne junior waited his time at the season start and when given the opportunity, took full advantage of it, as he compiled 953 yards on 103 attempts for an average of 9.25 yards per carry, while finding the endzone on five occasions.

Dillon also caught three passes for 35 yards, including a touchdown, which happened to be against Traverse City St. Francis, when a field goal snap went low and holder and fellow “Dream Team” member, Ethan Hewitt pulled it in

and the pair connected on a jump ball to the back of the endzone, putting Boyne on top and sending the Rambler crowd into a frenzy.

Dillon also saw some time at linebacker for BC, making 17 tackles, including one for a loss.

Ager and Sulak are joined on the 2017 All-Area Football “Dream Team” by fellow Rambler's, Jacob Robinson, Connor Gabos, Spencer Joles, Ethan Hills, Eric Carson, Ethan Hewitt, Mason Gardner, Ryan Hautz and Dylon Williams. East Jordan is represented by Hayden Ferguson, Nick Norton, Keegan McDuffie, Chris Reid, Trent Graham

and Spencer Reid and Charlevoix players, Ray Cunningham, Alan Ritter, Cole Wright, Michael Pearsall, Robby Morgridge, Colin Davis and Kyle Balch.

Defensive Team

Eric Carson, Boyne City

The Rambler senior and two-year starting defensive back, led the team with eight interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, was recently selected as a first team Division 5-6 All-State.

Carson recorded 40 stops on the season, including 21 solo, forced one fumble and deflected five passes.

Ethan Hewitt, Boyne City

Another Rambler senior; this do-it-all player, did just that for Boyne this season.

On the defensive side of the ball, the two-year starter, Hewitt made 42 tackles, picked off two passes and made two pass deflections from his strong safety position.

Ethan also had duties as the kick and punt returner as well as the kicking team holder.

Hewitt returned 10 punts for 148 yards and nine kickoffs for 255 yards.

He also rushed for 415 yards on 39 carries, including four touchdowns, but also hauled in 11 passes for 114 yards and two scores.

The highlight game of the season for Hewitt had to be against TC St. Francis, where the senior threw a pair of timely touchdowns, his only two pass attempts of the season, one to begin the game and the game winner.

Ryan Hautz, Boyne City

A two-year starter for the Ramblers, Hautz could often times be seen and heard making tackles from his linebacker position.

Ryan recorded 57 tackles this season, 18 solo and 39 assisted. He made five stops for a loss and had one sack.

Dylon Williams, Boyne City

A two-year starter from the defensive end position, the larger than life Williams, who towers over pretty much anyone who stands next to him, made 48 stops on the season for Boyne.

Dylon had 12 solo tackles, 36 assists, three sacks, nine tackles for a loss and forced three fumbles.

Mason Gardner, Boyne City

Gardner roamed the defensive backfield for the second straight season as the Ramblers fire safety, making 61 tackles from his position.

Mason had 27 solo stops, 34 assists, five tackles for a loss, deflected two passes, made five interceptions and recovered a fumble.

Gardner was also a big asset to the BC offense, leading the team with 507 yards receiving on 25 reception, with five touchdowns, while also throwing a 15 yard scoring strike. He was recently recognized as a division 5-6 all-state honorable mention selection.

Hayden Ferguson, East Jordan

The hard-working Ferguson was a key contributor to the Red Devil defense. An inspirational and motivational leader for the East Jordan team.

Chris Reid, East Jordan

A key lineman on both sides of the ball for the Red Devils and two-year starter for the program.

Trent Graham, East Jordan

In his first season on the varsity, Graham would find himself in on a number of tackles for the Red Devils.

Offensively, he looks to be on track to being a focal point of the future EJ attack.

Ray Cunningham, Charlevoix

A key contributor for the Rayders, Cunningham made 61 tackles this season, including 39 solo and had two sacks.

Ray made 14 tackles for a loss and recovered a fumble.

The two-time all-area selection, also anchored the offensive line for Charlevoix.

Colin Davis, Charlevoix

Davis would finish second on the team with 49 tackles, which included 38 solo and 11 assists, while also picking off a pass and recovering a fumble.

Colin would also record five tackles for a loss.

Robby Morgridge, Charlevoix

A junior defensive back, Morgridge would have 39 stops on defense for Charlevoix, including 32 solo tackles.

Robby would also make one interception.

Offensive Team

Connor Gabos, Boyne City

A force up front for the Rambler offense, Gabos, a senior was a two-year starter at the offensive guard position.

Jacob Robinson, Boyne City

Robinson, a senior and two-year starter for Boyne, held down the fort from his tackle position, opening holes for the running game and providing protection for the passing attack.

Spencer Joles, Boyne City

The Rambler offense would not go anywhere without this senior and two-year captain snapping the ball from his center position.

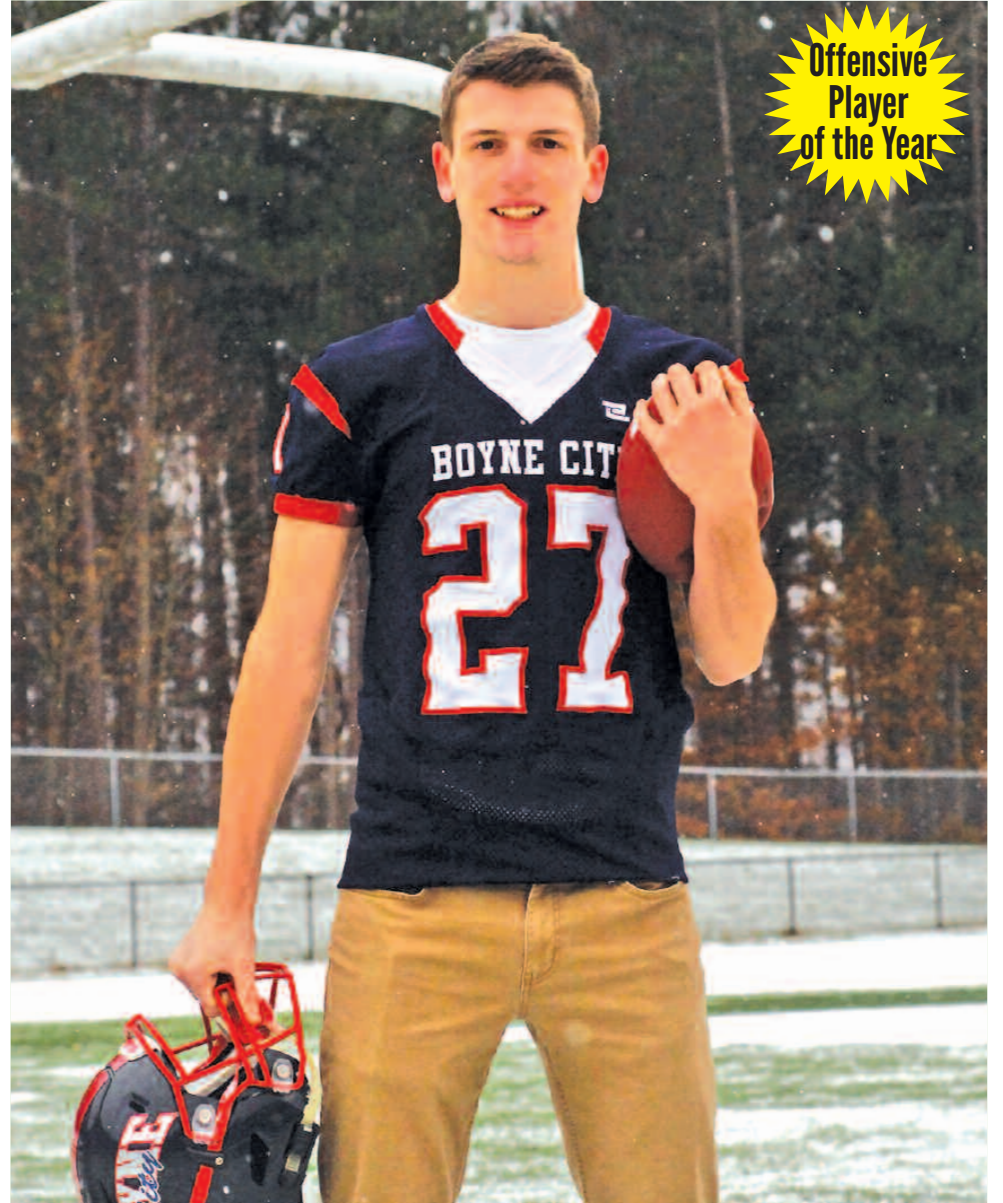

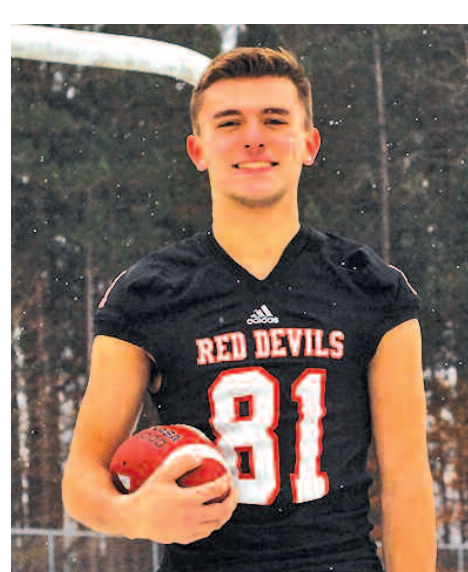

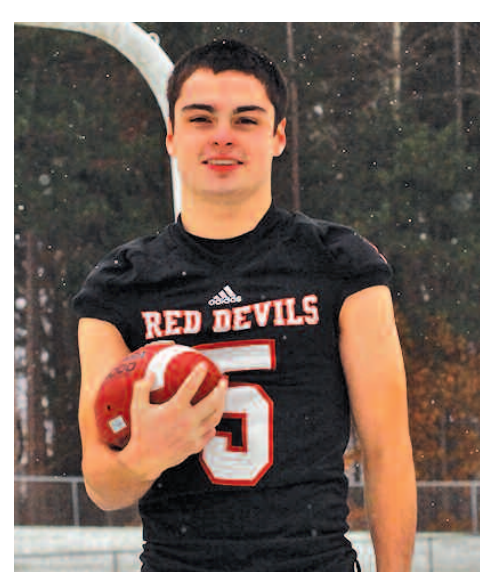

Michigan's Amazing Animals : Wild About Whitetails

Michigan's official state mammal gets a massive amount of attention this time of year. Here are some fun facts about those wonderful and wily white-tailed deer:

The Name Game: The scientific name of white-tailed deer is *Odocoileus virginianus*. *Odocoileus* derives from the roots "odonto" and "coileus" meaning "hollow-tooth" that likely describes the deep valleys in a deer's molars. *Virginianus* pertains to the region of the U.S. where they were first described.

Rambunctious Roamer: Whitetails frequent every county of Michigan. On a broader scale, in the Americas white-tailed deer are the most widely distributed wild ungulates, a group that includes elk, moose, cattle, and even hippopotamuses! Michigan's abundant deer herd once shared our northern Lower Peninsula with moose and even woodland caribou.

Big Ears and Black Tails: Whitetails closest kin are the subspecies known as black-tailed deer and mule deer. These mammals are plentiful west of the Rocky Mountains. Mule deer get their name from their greatly exaggerated ear size. Can you say "hee haw" to that?!

Peak Pressure: The state record for number of hunters participating in a firearms season peaked in 1998 when 785,000 blaze orange and camo-clad sportspeople pursued deer. A record 582,000 whitetails were also harvested that year.

Daniel and Davey Data: Trophy bucks are often measured using the Boone and Crockett Club's scoring system. B & C determinations are made using multiple measures including the number of points (tines), antler spread length in several areas, and length and circumference of all tines on both sides of the buck's rack.

Massive Mount: In 2010 the largest Michigan deer on record was discovered dead in Clinton Township. The buck had an amazing Boone and Crockett score of 257 - 2/8 non-typical. It eclipsed the previous record buck shot with a firearm in 1976 by Paul Mickey that scored 238-2/8 B & C points.

Mitch's Mystery Deer: One of the most talked about-and most controversial-Michigan deer was Mitch Rompola's potential world record buck from Grand Traverse County in 1998. Supposedly several scorers and a game warden claimed it was the real deal but Rompola refused to have it scored by Boone and Crockett representatives and declined a \$20,000 dollar offer to have the rack X-rayed.

Best Bet for Bucks: Based on Commemorative Bucks of Michigan (CBM) records the top five

Michigan counties for big bucks are, in order, Jackson, Washtenaw, Iron, Livingston, and Hillsdale.

A Heady Decision: After deer populations had dropped to a paltry 45,000 statewide Game Commissioner William R. Oates recommended in 1914 that only antlered deer be taken via hunting. The strategy worked as the estimated population density of whitetails increased to over a million by 1937.

Quality Quota: Information for managing healthy deer herds containing larger bucks can be found on the Quality Deer Management Association's (QDMA) webpage at www.qdma.com. Michigan wildlife biologists are reporting that the management strategy of Antler Point Restriction (APR) is having a positive effect as hunter satisfaction has increased and they

are seeing greater numbers of bucks in older age classes.

Michigan's Mammal: Kid Power: Thanks to the political savvy of fourth grade students and their teachers from Zeeland, MI the white-tailed deer was named Michigan's official state mammal. In 1997 the students went through a successful petition and lobbying process to make that happen. Gracing 11 lists whitetails are the most common state mammal in the U.S. including holding that honor in our neighbors Ohio, Illinois, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin.

The Tale of the Teeth: White-tail deer can be aged by examining the characteristics of their teeth. In particular the amount of wear, number of cusps, and ratio of dentine to enamel on the premolars and molars is used. Most bucks in Michigan don't live longer than 6

½ years but captive deer have reached the grand old age of 12. Great diagrams of age estimates based on tooth wear are available at www.dcccl.org.

Antler Alterations: Based on food quality and timing of spring green-up whitetails usually begin growing antlers in April. It's the fastest growth of bone material in nature sometimes reaching in excess of 200 inches in additional tissue. Initially, the antlers are nourished by blood rich "velvet" until early to mid-September at which time the bucks scrape off the fuzzy covering. These big boys now have a fully developed set of battle weapons at their disposal. The timing of velvet shedding varies, however: Case in point, our unseasonably warm autumn resulted in a number of bucks taken on opening day gun season to be still in velvet! Antlers are shed in the winter and the cycle starts again the next spring. If you go shed antler hunting you may have to compete with porcupines who love to nibble on the boney nuggets!

Skinny Studs: My Bachelors thesis at Lake State involved measuring various parameters - age, neck diameter, antler tines, body weight - in correlation with subcutaneous body fat quantity in rutting whitetails. It was the first scientific study of its kind and found an inverse relationship between the factors. It corroborated the logical hypothesis that the biggest bucks, being more active during the rut, had the lowest body fat quantities.

Tantalizing to the Tummy: Venison is a delicious, low-fat, organic food that's healthier than most other meats. Many recipes are available. If you have extra please consider giving your deer meat to Michigan Sportsmen Against Hunger (MSAH), or locally, the Manna Food Project, who provide healthy meals for the less fortunate. Find MSAH info at sportsmenagainsthunger.org.

Snowmobiling News Protective gear for winter roads

More than 189,000 registered snowmobiles traverse Michigan trails during the winter season. Just as a helmet and goggles keep snowmobilers protected, designated snowmobile crossings and new technologies protect roads from snowmobile damage in the winter.

Michigan was the first state to adopt Scandinavian thermoplastic material to protect the roads at snowmobile crossings, a story featured in the Fall 2017 edition of Crossroads, the quarterly journal of the County Road Association (CRA) of Michigan (<http://bit.ly/2fuYMyJ>).

Snowmobiles, roads and bridges can be a challenging combination. Both Alger County Road Commission (ACRC) and Charlevoix County Road Commission use the Scandinavian thermoplastic strip technology at road snowmobile crossings.

Thermoplastic is a plastic powder heated to 400 degrees Fahrenheit on site and extruded into thick layers that overlap and are placed across the road to connect snowmobile trails. When the layers begin to wear thin from use, another coat is placed over the top. The surface lasts three to five years and protects the road from the scoring of snowmobile skis.

"One of our biggest concerns in protecting the roads against snowmobile damage, is when snowmobiles run on the roads for a longer distance to get from one trail to another. We don't have the financial ability to coat whole half-mile sections of roads," said Robert Lindbeck, PE, Alger County Road Commission engineer-manager.

Funding these small, higher-cost road sections is one of the many special infrastructure challenges faced by county road agen-

cies. Yet, of course snowmobiling is one of Michigan's most important winter sports. A small portion (two percent) of the gas tax goes to the DNR Recreation Fund to fund snowmobile trails and crossings including signage, and thermoplastic or concrete crossings.

The 83 members of the County Road Association of Michigan represent the unified voice for a safe and efficient county transportation infrastructure system in Michigan, including appropriate stewardship of the public's right-of-way in rural and urban Michigan. Collectively, Michigan's county road agencies manage 75 percent of all roads in the state, including 90,000 miles of roads and 5,700 bridges. County road agencies also maintain the state's highway system in 64 counties. Michigan has the nation's fourth-largest local road system.

HEALTH SAFETY FOR HUNTERS

It's that time of year again in Michigan. Thousands of people get up at the crack of dawn during firearm deer season to hunt down that big buck. And every year, media reports include stories of hunters suffering heart attacks while in the woods. If you're not prepared, haven't had a physical and haven't exercised much in the year since the last hunt, you may be putting yourself at a risk of a heart attack.

Hunters rarely consider that their sport is actually an athletic event and that the excitement and exertion take a toll on their bodies. Hunters should start training and conditioning several weeks before they perform, but most don't and their heart and circulatory system sometimes suffers the consequences. Hunters who have not been to their doctor in the year since the last hunt should take this opportunity to get a checkup.

People should take a look at their major risk factors for heart disease regularly. Ask your doctor to check your blood pressure, cholesterol levels and make sure that strenuous exercise is recommended.

Smoking is another major risk factor for heart attack and heart disease. Other tips include avoiding a heavy breakfast before heading out into the woods and avoiding hunting alone. Bring a cell phone to reach emergency services if needed and tell friends or family your location and scheduled return.

Preparing early will not only help with physical fitness come deer season, but also with overall general health. Studies show that being physically fit lowers heart disease risk even in people who have other risk factors like high blood pressure and high blood cholesterol.

Warning signs of a heart attack are an uncomfortable pressure, fullness, squeezing, or pain in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or goes away and comes back again. Also, the pain spreads to the shoulders, neck and arms and is often accompanied by lightheadedness, sweating, nausea and shortness of breath. Stroke is also a concern while hunting and its warning signs include a sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, and a sudden dizziness and loss of coordination. Both heart attack and stroke are medical emergencies and 911 needs to be accessed immediately.

To help anyone start a physical fitness program, the American Heart Association (AHA) has programs available at www.heart.org. Founded in 1924, the AHA is dedicated to reducing disability and death from cardiovascular diseases and stroke. These diseases, America's Number 1 and 3 killers, claim more than 910,000 lives each year.

Good luck in trying to bag that buck, but let's be careful out there!
