Boyne City able to withstand tough Rayder effort

Boyne City 36, Charlevoix 34

BOYNE CITY — On an evening where rivals clashed, the annual "Battle

of the Fans" contest kicked off and baskets were hard to come by, the Boyne City Ramblers recognized the accomplishments of the 1976-77 boys basketball team that reached the state semifinals that year, by honoring a number of team members that were in attendance and

unveiling a new banner commemorating that run during halftime.

The Ramblers and Rayders took the floor in a highly anticipated rivalry matchup, that no matter what season it is, records don't mean a thing as each team brings everything they have and battles it out until the final buzzer.

On this night, it would be a defensive charge and offensive struggle for each squad, as neither team was able to put the ball in the hoop on a consistent basis, with Boyne able to pull out a hard-fought 36-34 Lake Michigan Conference victory on January 12.

"Great rivalry game, that's what high school basketball is all about," BC coach Nick Redman said. "Credit Charlevoix for how hard they played, they out rebounded us in the first half."

The Rayder defense forced the Ramblers to struggle offensively the entire night, as Boyne shot just 50 percent from the floor and six percent (1-of-16) from long range, and didn't get many second shots.

Following a slow first half of ball, the Rayders took a 21-16 lead into the break, but coming out of the intermission, the Ramblers stepped it up on their defensive end, forcing the Rayders to turn the ball over as Boyne was able to battle back, behind eight points in the quarter from junior guard Dillon Sulak, taking a 28-25 lead by the end of the quarter.

Charlevoix however, refused to go away as senior,
Danny Nesburg connected
on a key opportunities during the fourth quarter, keeping the Rayders within
striking distance and had a chance to tie the game late,
but a missed long-range shot
was just off the mark and the
Ramblers were able to convert a couple of free throw
opportunities to close out the
victory.

"Proud of how we responded in the second half and found a way to win on a night when we struggled offensively," coach Redman added.

Sulak would finish with a game-high 11 points to lead Boyne, while Max Vondra had seven and Mason Gardner added six.

Charlevoix was paced by Nesburg's 10 points, with Josh Carlson chipping in nine and Danzelle Williams adding eight.

The Ramblers improve to 5-2 overall, 2-1 LMC, while the Rayders slip to 2-4, 0-2. Both teams are in action on Friday, January 19, when Boyne travels to East Jordan and Charlevoix hosts Elk Rapids.

"Solid defensive effort in the first half, holding Boyne City to three points," Rayder coach Liz Shaw said. "I

thought we showed better ball movement and received offensive contributions by the team throughout the game."

Boyne would find their offensive rhythm in the second half, outscoring Charlevoix by five points.

"Defensively, I thought we


played well, especially in the second half," Rambler coach Julie Redman said. "Offensively, we just have to make good shot selections and the ball needs to go in the bas-


Avery Stadt led Boyne City with seven points, while Katie Hoth added five and

ELK RAPIDS — Playing well in their second contest in as many nights, the East Jordan girls seemed to run out of gas for a brief moment in the third quarter against the host Elks on January 11 in their Lake Michigan Conference clash.

Knotted at 20-20 at the half, Elk Rapids got things rolling in the third as they outscored EJ 25-14 over the eight minutes, behind 12 points from Kendall Brown as the Elks carrieda 45-34 advantage into the final quarter.

"We kept their best player (Brown) scoreless the first half," East Jordan coach Steve Hines said. "(She) had 12 in the third and led all scorers with 19, we stumbled in the third quarter, especially on the defensive end. Elk Rapids shot well from behind the arc, hitting seven three's (in the second half), which was the difference.

Elk Rapids led 14-10 after the first quarter. "We were down 18 and closed it to 11 points at the end, so I was pleased with effort

in the last quarter.," coach Hines added.

"Kendall McNitt broke the East Jordan school record for career three pointers with her made triple in the third quarter. Congratulations to Kendall!"

"I was feeling like I was under some pressure," McNitt said. "I definitely felt a big relief after making it. I never imagined setting a record like this, I was always a post player until about my sophomore year and was a little scared to shoot it from there, but after the coaches saw that I could shoot, they started moving around and playing the perimeter

McNitt also noted that her dad played a big role in her success as a shooter. "He would work with me every day for hours shooting, and it's definitely helped."

East Jordan was led by Jayden Weber with 12 points and nine rebounds, while Abby Peterson added 10.

DNR officers offer snowmobile safety tips

With Michigan's snowmobile season in full gear, Department of Natural Resources conservation officers remind riders that safety is key to enjoying their sport.

"Snowmobiling is a great way to spend the winter months," said Lt. Tom Wanless, DNR recreational safety programs supervisor. "But when operating a snowmobile or any type of vehicle, safety comes first. This includes riding within your own abilities, operating at

safe and appropriate speeds for the terrain, always wearing a helmet and proper clothing, and never operating your machine while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.' Other safety tips include:

Always keep your snowmobile in top mechanical condition.

Wear insulated boots and protective clothing, including a helmet, gloves and eye protection.

Only ride in designated areas and trails.

Check weather conditions before riding and be aware of changing trail conditions.

Pick safe places to stop off the trail and never park or stand in the trail.

Exercise additional caution when riding on an unfamiliar trail, or when riding at night.

Never ride alone; use the 'buddy system.''

Keep headlights and taillights on at all times and keep them clear of snow, ice or other debris.

Be alert to avoid fences

and low-strung wires. Use caution when ap-

proaching a trail intersection, come to a complete stop when required, and look both ways for traffic before proceeding.

Stay clear of trail groomers, if possible. Never follow groomers, and give them the right of way.

Avoid crossing frozen bodies of water, when possible. If you must cross, never do so while riding in single file.

Wear a life jacket if operating on frozen bodies of

Don't trespass. If you don't know whose property you are on, you probably don't belong there.

Snowmobile safety education training and online safety courses are recommended for all snowmobile operators and are required for those who are 12 to 16 vears old.

Snowmobilers also should learn the rules and regulations for snowmobiling in Michigan, as well as the universal snowmobile trail signage developed by the DNR to help ensure safety on the A valid snowmobile regis-

tration from the Michigan Secretary of State, or another state or province, is required for all snowmobiles. Snowmobilers also must purchase a trail permit, which is valid for one year (Oct. 1 to Sept. 30), when operating on public trails. Learn more about snow-




