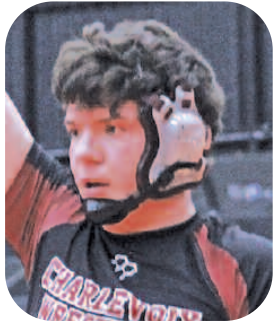

BOYNE CITY — The Boyne City girls picked up their first Lake Michigan Conference win of the season, defeating Grayling 46-35 on January 26.

"I thought the girls played hard and never gave up," Rambler coach Julie Red-

man said.

Individual results were as follows:

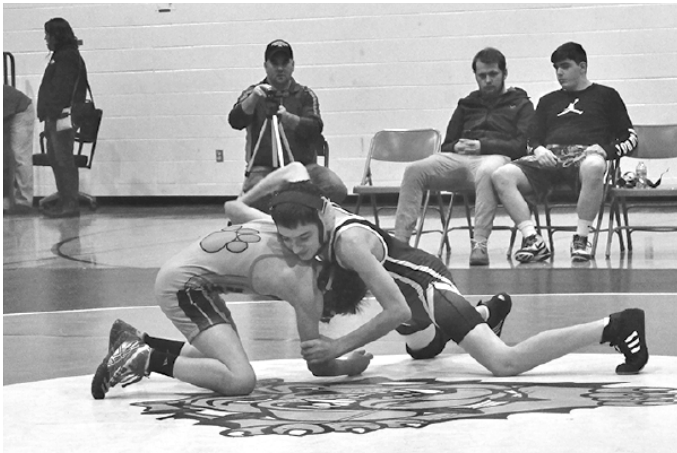
Jeremy Chernauckas (145 lbs) and Max Hinkle (215 lbs), both finished 2-0, while

Levi Carson (171 lbs) and Riley Jensen (171 lbs), finished 0-1 and Ryan Henry (189 lbs) was 0-2.



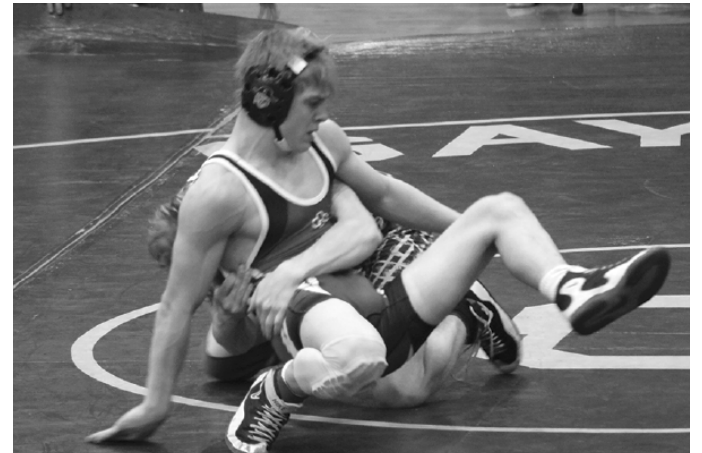

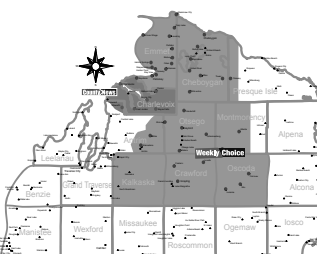
