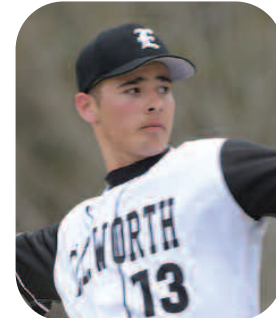

Bartig was 3-for-3 at the plate with a double, Justin Barnett added an RBI single and AJ Bartlett and Sawyer Thomas each singled.

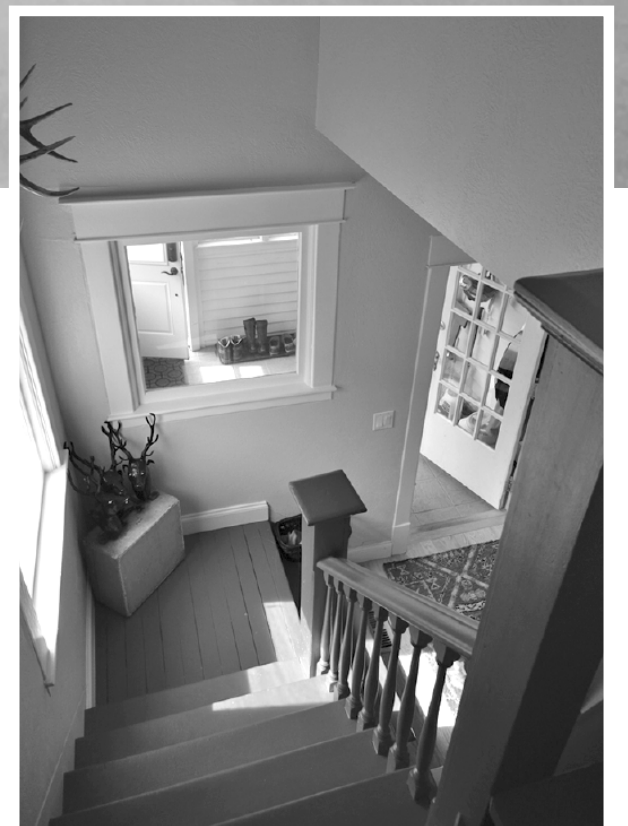
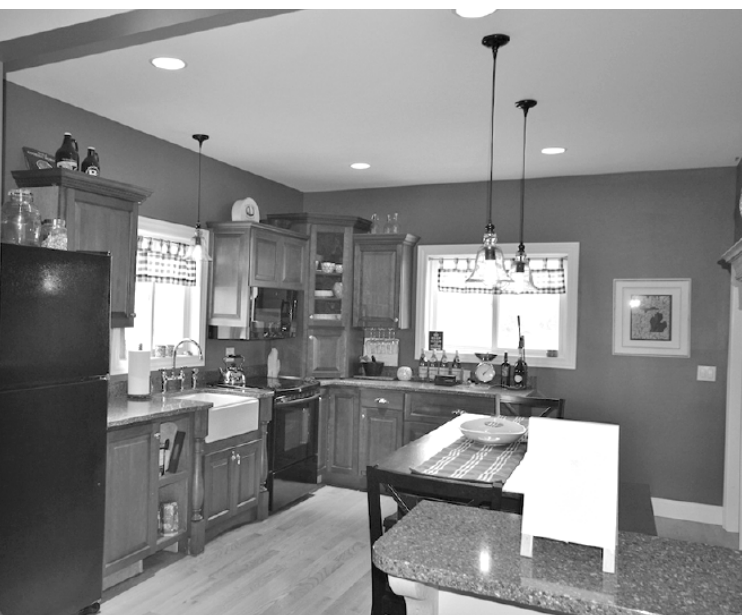

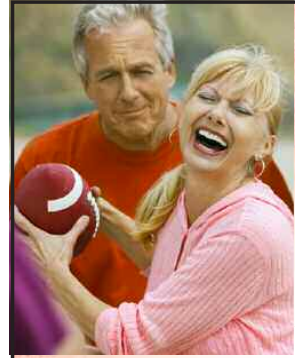
