CHARLEVOIX COUNTY — Another season in the books. While this season was shortened due to a battle with the elements during the month of April, it made for a fast and furious, jam packed schedule during May. Many of our area teams experienced their first taste of outdoor play in their initial contest, but all seemed to adjust and put together outstanding campaigns and with the season ending a few weeks ago, it is now time to recognize the top players in the area, as their efforts

helped take their respective teams to the next level, as the Charlevoix County News announces the 2018 All-Area Softball "Dream Team". Boyne City earned their sixth straight district title behind the leadership of their seniors and talented roster, while East Jordan captured their first district crown in a few years. Charlevoix improved, advancing to the district championship game and will look to challenge the Lake Michigan Conference leaders next season. Ellsworth was once again atop the Northern Lakes Con-

ference, and will return 90 percent of their roster next spring, so don't look for much to change. While each area team had numerous individuals that contributed to their teams success, there were a select few that stood out from the pack. There were a select number of candidates that could be considered for Player of the Year, but that honor goes once again to Katie Hoth of Boyne City for the second straight season.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Katie Hoth #9
Once again, Hoth proved to be one of the top players in the state for the Ramblers this season, earning Division 3 All-State honors as an outfielder, while also being selected All-Conference,

All-District and All-Region. She is also a three-time All-Area selection.

Katie would once again show that her off-season work in the weightroom, the batting cage and on the track would payoff as she improved on her already impressive strength, speed and hitting.

Hoth hit for a very impressive .557 batting average in the tough Lake Michigan Conference and competitive non-league schedule with 58 hits, blasting eight home runs, 18 doubles, seven triples and knocking in 40 RBIs. Her slugging percentage was 1.050.

Her 43 stolen bases rank her among the season leaders, scored 60 runs, while walking 13 times and was hit by a pitch four times.

"My senior season didn't end quite like I had hoped, but I'm lucky to have been apart of four district wins," Hoth said. "I thought this was going to be our regional year, although it didn't work out, I'm happy with how hard everyone worked and the positive chemistry we shared."

On defense, she had only three errors all season for a fielding percentage of .942.

When called upon to enter the circle, she worked 49 1/3 innings, going 3-5 with two saves, allowing 33 hits, while striking out 54 and allowing 29 earned runs for an ERA of 4.83 per six innings.

"Recently, I joined Charlevoix Crossfit to help stay in shape outside of my regular at home workouts," she added. "Not only is it providing me with strength, but stamina as well."

Katie will be taking her talents to Lansing Community College next season, where she will play for the Stars.

"After spending most of my summers playing travel ball, I'm glad I chose to play at the next level, because I'm for sure not ready to be done yet," Katie noted. "In August, I'm going to the Dominican to play softball, representing the USA through AIST (American International Sports Teams)."

Joining Hoth on the 2018 All-Area "Dream Team" are Rambler teammates, Kelsey Hubbard and Katelyn Gabos and Madison Rosenow; Charlevoix's Hannah Solomon, Zoe Brodin and Maddie Olach; East Jordan's Chelsea Gibson, Karah Dunson, Gabbie Cutler and Abby Peterson; and Samantha Miller, Abby Nachazel and Bahley Glynn of Ellsworth.

BOYNE CITY

Kelsey Hubbard - #10

Hubbard would once again set up shop in the middle of

the infield for the Ramblers, taking her role at shortstop, recording a fielding percentage of .877.

Kelsey would bat .407 for the season, recording 39 hits on the year, including nine doubles, two triples and a homerun, while picking up 14 RBI from her leadoff spot in the lineup.

She walked 13 times, was hit by seven pitches and her slugging percentage was .524.

Once on base, she stole 19 bases and scored 49 runs.

"A special thank you to all coaches and teammates who have impacted my softball career," Kelsey said. "Without them, I would not be where I am at today. This season I had the best team I could ask for, they are the nicest, yet hardest working girls you will ever meet."

"The younger ones really stepped up this year and I cannot wait for what type of players they will and are becoming."

Hubbard also earned first-team honors in the LMC, and All-District and All-Region. Kelsey is a three-time All-Area selection and will be playing at Schoolcraft College next season.

Katelyn Gabos #15

The Rambler sophomore did nothing but improve on her already solid freshmen campaign.

Flipping positions between third base and catcher all season, the hard-hitting, hard-throwing young lady let opponents know that they either needed to hustle just a little faster down the first base line if they wanted to leg out an infield hit, or not to venture too far off if they were thinking of trying to steal a base.

Gabos would bat .422 at the plate, recording 40 hits, including 10 doubles, a triple and nine round-trippers to go with her team-high 46 RBIs.

Katelyn would score 55 runs, steal 13 bases, walk 11 times and get plunked twice. Her slugging percentage was .780.

In the field, she had a magnet like glove, finishing the season with a fielding percentage of .928 playing two of the most demanding positions on the diamond.

Madison Rosenow, #12

This season, Rosenow took over a majority of the innings in the circle for the Ramblers, allowing the team to put one of the best defenses in Northern Michigan behind her.

Madison finished the season 14-3, working 81 innings, allowing 39 earned runs for an ERA of 3.16, giving up 88 hits, striking out 36 and walking only 18 batters.

Rosenow batted .324 on the year, having 22 hits, with three doubles and 16 RBIs. She walked nine times and scored 22 runs for Boyne.

CHARLEVOIX

Hannah Solomon #33

The speedy Solomon legged out 49 singles to lead the area with a .621 batting average, hitting four doubles and six triples, while picking up 18 RBIs. She also walked 20 times and scored 44 runs for the Rayders.

Hannah stole 61 bases, had an on-base percentage of .693 and a slugging percentage of .789.

She was a LMC first team selection and All-District and also a three-time All-Area selection.

Maddie Olach #14

Olach was a good contact hitter for Charlevoix, supplying a lot of the power to lineup.

Maddie hit .425 for the season, recording 34 hits in 80 at-bats. She had 15 RBIs and scored 18 runs, while walking 10 times and was hit by a pitch on three occasions.

Her slugging percentage was .562, and her on-base was .485.

Zoe Brodin #11

Brodin finished the season with 42 hits, including seven doubles, two triples and a long-ball and a team-high 30 RBIs.

She hit .447 for the year, slugging .596, with an on-base percentage of .463.

Zoe scored 29 runs, walked seven times and was hit once.

EAST JORDAN

Chelsea Gibson #3

The senior capped her final season as a Red Devil as one the top catchers in Northern Michigan. Prior to the start of the year, Gibson signed to continue her playing career at Lansing Community College.

Gibson would throw out eight of the 13 runners that attempted their fate at advancing a base this season, while making 14 assists and recording 21 putouts, with a .778 fielding percentage.

She again improved her offensive skills, batting 60 points higher from her junior year, finishing with a .393 batting average, recording 33 hits, including six doubles, six triples and a team-high six home runs and a team-high 29 RBIs.

Chelsea also scored a team-high 31 runs and stole six bases, her slugging percentage was .821 and her on-base was .552.

"I think our season was pretty successful," Gibson said. "It felt good to win districts, although we didn't make it past regionals this year, our team never gave up when we played. We played until the end and you could tell when we did."

She will be majoring in Interior Design and Decorating while at LCC.

Chelsea was a first team LMC, All-District and All-Region and is a three-time All-Area selection.

Karah Dunson #25

Back on the All-Area team after battling injuries the past two seasons, the always hustling, leave it on the field player did just that.

Karah had an outstanding season, .327, going 18-for-65 at the plate, and came up big late in the year for E.J.

She had three doubles, a triple and two home runs and nine RBIs. Dunson stole three bases and scored 21 runs.

In the field, she had 25 putouts, five assists and a fielding percentage of .882.

Karah will play ball for Alpena Community College next year.

Abby Peterson #14

A solid pitcher for East Jordan for the fourth straight season, Abby put together another strong year tossing the ball, going 11-4, working 81 1/3 innings, facing 376 batters and allowing

91 hits, recording 78 strikeouts, and finishing the season with an ERA of 2.36

Offensively, Peterson finished her career with a .405 average this season, including 10 doubles, two triples and one home run to go with 13 RBIs, while scoring 28 runs for E.J.

Her slugging percentage was .607 and her on-base percentage was .505.

Defensively, she had 36 putouts, 29 assists and a fielding percentage of .942.

"Always work hard and have a positive attitude," is something that Peterson noted.

While she does not plan to play ball at the collegiate level at this time, she does plan to join an intramural (coed) team for fun.

"Who knows, I might to join a sports team for Grand Valley!" she added.

Abby was a first team Lake Michigan Conference and All-District selection as well as a four-time All-Area selection.

Gabbie Cutler #11

Cutler had a brilliant season, batting .410, with 25 hits in 61 at-bats, including six doubles, two triples, 11 RBIs and scored 18 runs.

Her slugging percentage was .574 and her on-base was .521.

In the field, she had a fielding percentage of .857, making 32 putouts and 22 assists.

ELLSWORTH

Bahley Glynn #16

Leading the Lancers at the plate this season, Bahley, a team captain, hit .574 as a freshman.

She had three triples and 20 RBIs on her resume.

"Bahley leads by example everyday on and off the field," coach Andy Montgomery said. "She is like a cat at the catching position."

Abby Nachazel #8

A mainstay inside the circle for Ellsworth, Abby finished the season with an 18-6 record, working 90 innings, fanning 130 hitters and had an ERA of 2.14.

"Her mere presence on the mound is intimidating, her attitude and leadership skills as team captain is easy to see," coach Montgomery said. "An absolute warrior."

At the plate, Nachazel hit .559 with 11 doubles and six homers and a team-high 45 RBIs.

Samantha Miller #23

Miller led the Lancers in doubles this season with 13, while batting .500 and adding 26 RBIs.

Credited by coach Montgomery with having the ability to play all nine positions and not hurt the team in any way. He also noted that she is the best base runner that he has ever coached.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Meg Kitson, East Jordan

The longtime Red Devils coach gets the nod for Coach of the Year honors this season, taking her team to new heights this year and reaching the 20 win mark, finishing third in the Lake Michigan Conference and winning the Division 4 district title and reaching the 400 coaching win plateau in the process.

"My team was a really fun team to coach," Kitson said. "They played their roles well and shared playing time (which is necessary with 16 on the team). I will miss my seniors...all eight of them. They were fun kids to have a good leaders in our school."

"My team motto became 'Red Devils never give up!'" and they truly embraced this attitude and effort," she noted. "I'm proud that we finished third in the LMC and winning the district was awesome."

Kitson was quick to mention the coaching staff of Rachael Tison and Chris Kolp and noted their tremendous help.

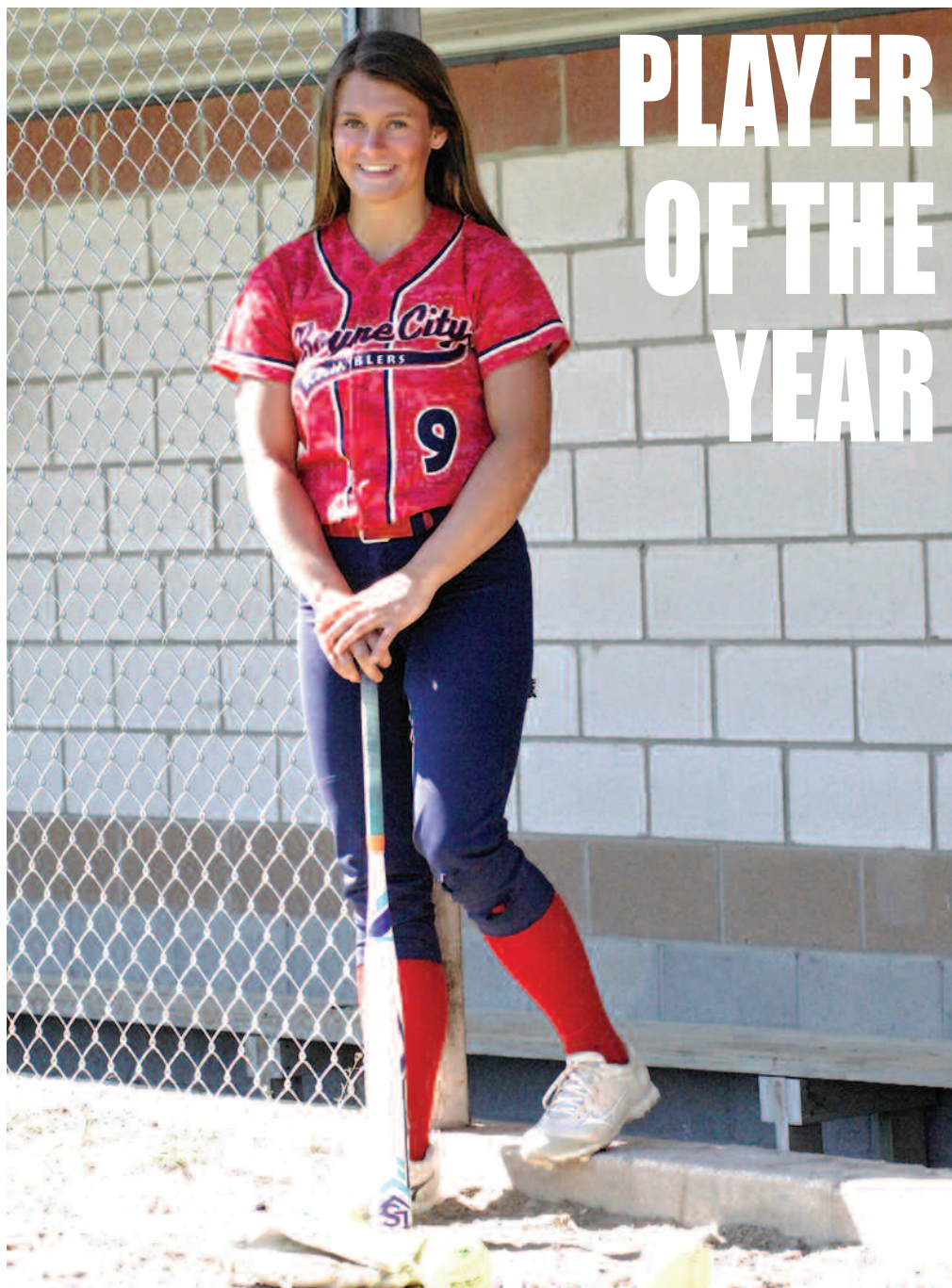
