



# Sports **Michigan played in very first Rose Bowl**

Fielding H. Yost brought the unbeaten Wolverines west by train for the Jan. 1, 1902 game with Stanford

It was New Year's Day of 1902. Teddy Roosevelt was in the White House and the American League of baseball had joined the Major Leagues just the year before. The Amercian Civil War had ended less than 40 years earlier. There were 144 miles of paved roads in the U.S. and 8,000 cars on the roads. The speed limit for autos was 10 mph. Only 14 percent of U.S. households had a bathtub and 8 percent had telephones (no i-phones, though).

The University of Michigan played football that year and fielded one of the most dominant teams ever to play on the gridiron. The Wolverines went 10-0 during the season before being invited to participate in what would later be known as the first Rose Bowl game in Pasadena.

Michigan, the best team in the East, was to play Stanford, a dubious choice as the best team in the West, in what was billed as the "Tour nament East-West football game." The game was played in "Tournament Park" on a field 110 yards long with no end zones in front of a crowd of about 8,000 seated in temporary bleachers constructed for the occasion. (For those who have been to the Rose Bowl, the old Tournament Park site is about three miles southeast of the stadium)

Fielding H. Yost, the celebrated coach of the Wolverines, had come from Stanford the year before and had been forced out after the school administration ruled that coaches had to be graduates of Stanford. So Yost, who had led Stanford to a 7-2-1 record in 1900 and outscored opponents by a whopping 154-20 margin, was out of a job. He landed on his feet in Ann Arbor, however.

Yost's previous association with Stanford – and perhaps his desire for revenge against his former employer

– helped in the negotiations for the first-ever New Year's Day football game. The Tournament of Roses parade had been an annual tradition in Pasadena since 1890 and organizers were looking for ways to build on the popularity of the parade and bring in more tourists. The idea of an east-west football game had merit, the organizers believed, and so they contacted Yost to see if he'd be interested in bringing his boys to Pasadena to play Stanford. (The University of California had initially been approached to be the representative from the West but declined.) Tournament of **Roses Association President** James Wagner guaranteed \$3,500 to cover the travel expenses of both teams.

## **ILL-ADVISED MATCH-UP**

The first Tournament East-West game was certainly one of historical significance, eventually spurring the tradition of New Year bowl games that continues to this day, but the game itself was a complete rout. Stanford came into the contest with a less-than-stellar 3-1-2 record, including a 2-0 loss to Cal in their annual rivalry game.

Michigan, meanwhile, was unbeaten in 10 games and had not allowed a single point all season! Yost's troops were so dominating, it was hard to pick what was better, the offense or the defense.

The 1901 Wolverines were nicknamed the "Point-a-Minute" team. In an era when the forward pass was basically a myth, Michigan still averaged more than 50 points per game. The Wolverines rolled into Pasadena having outscored their 10 opponents 501-0.

The very first New Year's Day football game was played by different rules. For one thing, a touchdown counted as five points, not six. A field goal also counted as five points and a conversion after a touchdown was

one point.

A team had to advance five yards in three downs to get a first down and forward passes were forbidden. The playing field, as previously mentioned, was 110 yards long with no end zones.

The ill-advised match-up between mighty Michigan and Stanford had all the ingredients of a gridiron train wreck. And that's what happened on Jan. 1, 1902 in Pasadena. Yost's Wolverines ran roughshod over Stanford from the start, pounding out a 49-0 victory.

It was so bad, in fact, that Stanford captain Ralph Fisher requested the officials stop the game with eight minutes left in the second half. Michigan captain Hugh White agreed to the early stoppage.

## SNOW POURS IN ON

The score was only 17-0 at halftime but the visitors from Ann Arbor turned up the volume of the attack in the second half and Stanford was completely outmanned.

Michigan running back Neil Snow scored five times on runs of 5, 2, 8, 17 and 4 yards to lead the turf-pounding rushing assault. Snow's five rushing touchdowns still stands as a Rose Bowl record

after more than a century. Snow was named the Most Valuable Player of the game many years later.

Michigan's 49 points is still tied for the most points scored in the history of the storied game and Michigan's 503 yards rushing is still the most ever accumulated in the game.

There were other Michigan heroes on the day aside from Snow. Everett Sweeley kicked field goals of 20 and 21 yards, worth 10 points for the Wolverines, and Bruce Shorts made 4 of 7 extrapoint attempts. Curtis Redden scored on a 25-yard punt return and a 25-yard return of a fumble.

Michigan, which finished with an 11-0 record and a point differential of 550-0, was the unquestioned national champion of the 1901 season. Stanford, after absorbing such a fearful beating from the monsters of the East, disbanded football and played rugby instead until 1917.

The first-ever New Year's Day football game in Pasadena was so lopsided, in fact, that the Tournament of Roses organizers opted not to do it again for 15 years. In place of football, they held chariot races, ostrich races and other events designed to draw curious crowds. In 1916, the Tournament East-West game was finally held again at Tuornament Park, this time with Washington State playing Brown University.

The east-west game became a New Year's tradition after the 1916 game. It was played at Tournament Park until 1923 when the Rose Bowl stadium opened and the east-west game subsequently took on that name.

## YOST LEGACY

The rout of Stanford put an exclamation point to Michigan's dominating 1901 season and the school's first national championship. And it marked the beginning of a notable reign for the legendary Yost, who went on to coach Michigan until 1923, and then again in 1925 and 26.

The Wolverines posted a 165-29-10 record under Yost for a remarkable .833 winning percentage. They won six national championships with Yost on the sideline and 10 Big Ten championships. They went 56 straight games without a defeat between 1901 and 1905, the only blemish being a tie with Minnesota in the game that established the Little Brown Jug rivalry, the oldest trophy rivalry in football.

Michigan outscored its opponents 2,821 to 42 during those five seasons of dominance and won the national championship each year. The streak finally ended when Michigan lost to the Chicago Maroons coached by Amos Alonzo Stagg at the end of the 1905 season.

Yost, an innovator and creative thinker, invented the position of linebacker and impacted the sport of football in a number of other ways, including the creation of the first bowl game along with then-UM athletic director Charles Baird.

After his coaching career ended, Yost became the Michigan Athletic Director and served in that capacity until 1940. Michigan Stadium was built and opened during Yost's tenure along with the Yost Fieldhouse and the school's golf course. Yost was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1951.

## **ROSE BOWL AFTER-**MATH

After the 1902 pounding of Stanford, Michigan didn't return to the Rose Bowl until 1948. The Wolverines played USC that January 1 and won by a nearly identical score of 48-0. That was also the first year that the Big Ten played the Pac-10 champion, a tradition that would continue for more than 30 years. Michigan appeared 16 times in the

Rose Bowl between 1948 and 2001 and posted a 7-9 record. Only USC has more wins in the Rose Bowl (12) than the Wolverines.

The team that Michigan played most frequently in the Rose Bowl was the University of Washington. The teams met four times (1978, 1981, 1992, 1993), with each getting two wins. Michigan's overall record in the Rose Bowl is 8-12.

Michigan made three straight appearances in the Rose Bowl (1977-79) under Bo Schembechler with Rick Leach at quarterback in each of those years. Leach went on to play 10 years of Major League baseball with the Tigers, Blue Jays, Rangers and Giants.

The last time Michigan played in the Rose Bowl was Jan 1 2007 when Llovd Carr was still at the helm. The Wolverines lost to USC 32-18 that year. Michigan's last victory in the Rose Bowl was on Jan. 1, 1998, also under Carr. a 21-16 decision over Washington State.

Counting the disappointing 41-15 loss to Florida in the Peach Bowl over the weekend, Michigan's overall record in bowl games is 21-26. The Wolverines' recent record in bowl games is not very good, showing five losses in the past six games. Jim Harbaugh won his first bowl game with the Wolverines, 41-7 over Florida in the Citrus Bowl on Jan. 1, 2016, but has lost three straight since, including narrow losses to Florida State (33-32 on Dec. 30, 2016 in the Orange Bowl) and South Carolina (26-19 on Jan. 1, 2018 in the Outback Bowl) before the blowout loss to Florida in the current bowl season.

Michigan has played in the Citrus Bowl four times, posting a solid 3-1 record. The Wolverines have played in the Outback Bowl four times, but with a 1-3 mark in those games.


