# Charlevoix takes down Ramblers in LMC play

### CHARLEVOIX 53, BOYNE CITY 46

CHARLEVOIX — It's been quite some time since the Rayder boys basketball team was able to come away with a

victory over Boyne City.

That would change on January 4, as the Rayders snapped a 7-game skid against their longtime rivals with a 53-46 Lake Michigan Conference victory.

Charlevoix (4-2 overall, 1-1 LMC) recovered from a slow start, down 11-5 after one

quarter of play, but it would be a 7-0 run late in the second that would allow the Rayders to pull ahead 22-21 at the half.

"We got off to great start then had four straight bad possessions to end second quarter which changed momentum in game. Instead of being up 6-8 we went down one at half. That was big turning point in game," Rambler coach Nick Redman said.

The Rayders continued their momentum in the third quarter, as they outscored the Ramblers by six to take a 38-31 lead headed into the final eight minutes of play.

Charlevoix would eventually extend their lead to 12

points, but could not quite shake the Ramblers over the final minutes of the game as Boyne pulled to within three points 44-41 with just over three minutes to play, but that is as close as they would get.

Rayder freshman Evan Solomon would put the game on ice down the stretch as he calmly connected on 7-of-8 tosses from the free throw line.

Solomon would finish with 13 points, but it would be a 21 point, 14 rebound effort by sophomore Jacob Mueller that would help Charlevoix pull out the win.

Ben Lentz added 10 points, while Alan Ritter chipped in with seven.

"Proud of how kids kept fighting to give us a chance," coach Redman added. "Second chance points off turnovers and offensive rebounds were the difference, hard fought rivalry game. We need to keep improving our mental toughness to make good decisions, finish at rim and make free throws. Credit Charlevoix, they made plays when they needed it."

Boyne City got 14 points from Dillon Sulak, Max Vondra had eight points and eight boards, Pete Calcaterra and Aiden Brehm added six points apiece and John Paul Moody finished with five points and five rebounds.

CHARLEVOIX — It's rivalry season. When the Rayders and Ramblers get together, you can always count on a hard-fought, leave it on the floor effort from both squads. On January 4, that is exactly what you got as the two neighbors clashed for their first meeting of the season and the Rayders used a strong second half to pull away from the Ramblers and come away with a 57-34 Lake Michigan Conference victory.

Charlevoix improved to 2-2 on the year, 2-0 LMC as they got a double-double performance from Elise Stuck, as she managed 24 points and 15 rebounds, while Abby Cunningham added 10 points and six boards and Addie Nagel chipped in with eight points and Lily Curtis added six.

The contest proved to be a battle from the opening tip, as Charlevoix took an 18-8 first quarter lead and maintained that throughout the second to carry a 29-19 advantage into the half.

Charlevoix started to pull away in the third quarter despite a seven point stretch by Molly Day of the Ramblers.

Boyer also got six points each from Josee Behling and Reagan May as the Ramblers fell to 4-2 overall, 1-1 in league play.

Charlevoix travels to Kalkaska on January 11, while Boyne plays host to Traverse City St. Francis. Both games start at 5:30pm.

EAST JORDAN — For the first time this season, the East Jordan girls basketball team did not leave the court with a win.

The Red Devils would fall to the Elks 47-34 on January 4 in their first action of the new year.

“We came out somewhat tentative and we seemed to be out of sync on both ends of the floor,” EJ coach Steve Hines said. “Our intensity wasn’t where it has been

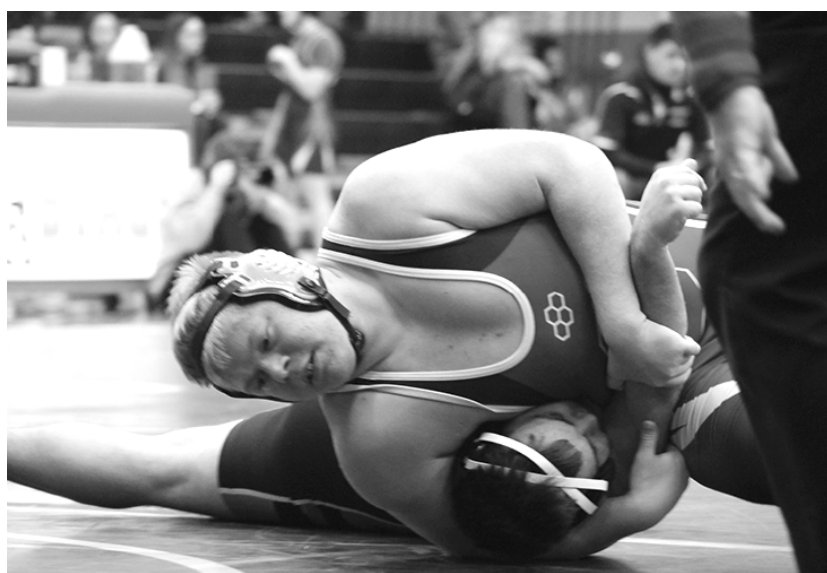

The Lancers continued to carry that momentum into the second half as they pulled ahead 36-28 headed into the fourth quarter.

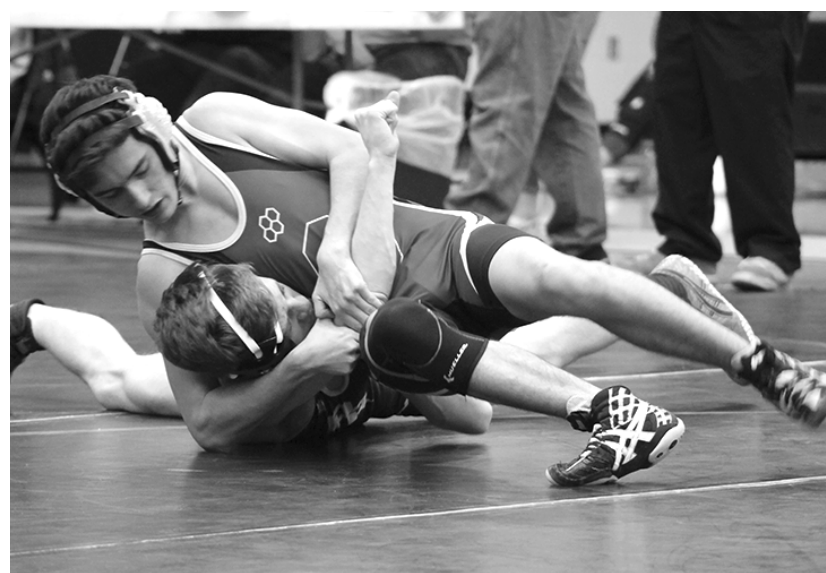

## SOUTH ARM TOWNSHIP Ordinance No. 2 of 2018

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2.02 OF THE SOUTH ARM TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE TO ADD A DEFINITION OF ROADSIDE STAND

#### THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH ARM ORDAINS:

#### Section 1. Amendment of Section 2.02.

Section 2.02 of the South Arm Township Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to add a definition of Roadside Stand in its appropriate alphabetical location, which new definition shall read in its entirety as follows:

**ROADSIDE STAND:** An accessory and temporary farm structure operated for the purpose of selling agricultural products grown or produced on the premises on which the roadside stand is located or on other properties under the same ownership or management.

#### Section 2. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective eight (8) days after being published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township.
