EAST JORDAN — Another close contest for the Lady Red Devils.

For the fourth straight game, the East Jordan girls basketball team just seemed to run out of time as they fell for the fourth time in as many games in Lake Michigan Conference action, falling to Kalkaska 45-39 on January 25.

The Red Devils led the Blazers 11-10 and then 21-19 at the half, before the Blazers tied the game at 32-32 at the end of the third quarter. "Another game in which

we led after the first two quarters and let it slip away in the last stanza," Red Devils coach Steve Hines said. "The last quarter was a tough one for us both offensively and defensively. We couldn't get a defensive stop when we needed it and we became a little stagnant on offense."

Jayden Weber would finish with 18 points and five rebounds to lead EJ, while Lilly Black added six.

Madeline Malpass grabbed five boards, while Ellie Skrocki, Black and Tia Spence each hauled in four. Molly Kitson dished out four assist for EJ.

"We were down late in the game and had to foul and Kalkaska made all four of their final free throws," Hines added.

Margaret Stosio led Kalkaska with 22 points, while Kayla Cavanaugh had 11. With the loss East Jordan

TCSF 47, East Jordan 45

EAST JORDAN — It looked after a fast, first quarter start by the East Jordan girls basketball team, that the Red Devils would be

rolling.

But in the end, it would be the TC St. Francis girls basketball team walking off the court with a 47-45 Lake Michigan Conference victory on January 22.

That fast start, a 16-8 lead after the first quarter, was followed by a solid second quarter that saw EJ up 24-19 at halftime. It would be a 28-21 second half advantage by the visiting Gladiators that was the difference in the contest and kept the Red Devils from their ninth victory of the season.

"We started the game really well and seemed to be in control as the first quarter came to an end. A mediocre second quarter still gave us a five point lead at halftime," Red Devils coach Steve Hines said. "Our defense wasn't the same in the second half as TCSF began to heat up and we just didn't execute well enough on the offensive end."

Jayden Weber scored 29 points for East Jordan and Molly Kitson added nine to lead the Red Devils. Weber added 10 rebounds, while Tia Spence had six and Lauren Peterson grabbed five. Kitson finished with three assists and Weber added two.

"Jayden (Weber) played a great game and keep us in it down the stretch," Hines noted. "We got the ball back with 15 seconds left and down by two. We had two good shots to end the game but both of them missed as the second one bounced on the rim twice and rolled off as the final horn sounded."

"This was a tough one to lose as we led for most of the game, we just seemed to run out of energy as the game progressed."

The Gladiators were led by Kam Schaub with 14 points, while Maddy Wierda had 11 and Lauren Tocco added 10.

"Really happy for the guys they worked their butts off to earn that win," Redman added. "Proud of team for the way they stuck together.'


Also for the Ramblers, Max Vondra finished with nine points and Trevor King chipped in with seven.



The Michigan State Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation has named Brian Piccolo, a 15-year employee with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Wildlife Division, as Outstanding Conservationist of the Year for 2018. The award was presented to Piccolo at the National Wild Turkey Federation Michigan State Chapter convention in Big Rapids

"I can't think of a better person then Brian Piccolo for the 2018 Outstanding Conservationist of the Year," said DNR Wildlife Division Chief Russ Mason. "Along with hard work and results, Brian brings passion to his job.

Piccolo has worked as a wildlife biologist in the northeast Lower Peninsula for 15 years. NWTF honored him for going beyond the call of duty to help the organization

reach its goals to conserve habitat for the wild turkey and preserve turkey hunting heritage.

the last few years to ensure that our collaborative projects, partially funded through the DNR's Wildlife Habitat Grant Program, have been successful," said NWTF

Michigan/Indiana district biologist Ryan Boyer. "Our partnerships, projects and successes wouldn't have been possible without him. He is well-

deserving of this award." Piccolo's work to lead workshop planting days, reach out to partners and willingness to meet contractors on site to answer questions was noticed and

Boyer. He worked after hours, assisted on weekends and was pivotal in helping the NWTF develop a list of projects to propose for the DNR Wildlife Habitat Grant Program. As a result, NWTF re-

appreciated, according to

ceived three Wildlife Habitat Grants that touched over 1,044 acres of habitat. The work included annual food plot and hunter walking trail plantings; hundreds of mast trees like crabapple, serviceberry and white oak planted; and acres of young forest created through completed timber sales.

"This is such an honor to have one of our employees recognized for his contributions by a major conservation partner such as the National Wild Turkey Federation," said Al Stewart, upland game bird specialist for the DNR. "This award reflects positively on the employee, and it confirms that key organizations appreciate quality employees who get work done at

the ground level like Brian Piccolo."

Art Pelon, president of the Michigan State Chapter of the NWTF, also talked about the significance of this award.

"This is an especially important tribute to bestow upon a wildlife professional because recipients are chosen for this award by NWTF members in conjunction with recommendations from their wildlife employee peers," Pelon said. "We feel privileged to be able to partner with Michigan's internationally recognized biologists and wildlife management leaders on conservation programs in this state.'

The National Wild Turkey Federation, an international organization involved in such recognitions of notable wildlife professionals in natural resources agencies, is dedicated to the conservation of wild turkeys and the preservation of hunting heritage.

NORWOOD TOWNSHIP Ordinance No.1 of 2019

At their regular meeting January 21, 2019, the Norwood Township Board passed a resolution to adopt an ordinance prohibiting Marihuana Establishments. In summary:
