Girls District Basketball Tournament

Rayders claim third straight Division 3 district title behind Petrosky's career night

CHARLEVOIX 52, EAST JORDAN 30

MANCELONA — Sometimes the stage is too big, sometimes it's not.

And there are those other times that it just doesn't matter as long as you go out and play.

The latter is just what Charlevoix freshman Taylor Petrosky did Friday night, March 8 during the Division 3 district final in Mancelona, as the Rayders defeated East Jordan 52-30 to claim the teams third straight title.

With the Red Devils defense focused on stopping All-Stater Elise Stuck, Petrosky stepped up and delivered when the team needed her, collecting a game-high 22 points, nailing five triples in the process.

Most of Petrosky's damage was done early in the third quarter as she netted eight of the Rayders first 10 points of the second half, turning a seven point Charlevoix half-time lead into a 17 point cushion.

The contest was nip and tuck for the first half as the Red Devils and Rayders were both unable to get any sort of run together as the two struggled to find an offensive rhythm against the tough defense of their opponent.

East Jordan was able to limit Stuck to just three points in the first 16 minutes of play, as they went to a box-and-one on the Rayder star,

daring others to beat them and Petrosky was up for the challenge.

Despite 18 points from Red Devil junior, Jayden Weber, EJ was unable to get into any

offensive flow as Molly Kitson was the second leading scorer with just four points.

"It's been a struggle for us all year long to consistently get more than one person in

double figures," EJ coach Steve Hines said. "When you don't have a lot of confidence in your shot and you miss a couple, that confidence in your shot drops a little bit and we fell behind, and you can't fall behind against a good team because it's so hard to comeback."

With the loss, the Red Devils finish the season with a 10-12 record. "It was a great season as far as I'm concerned," Hines added. "Certainly you like to win as many games as possible and finish higher than we finished in the conference, but these young ladies were awesome to work with."

EJ will graduate Gabby Snyder, Angie Rowbotham, Madeline Malpass, Tia Spence and Lilly Black.

Charlevoix (20-2) moves onto the regionals against Elk Rapids, where they will face another member of the Lake Michigan Conference after the Elks (17-5) defeated TC St. Francis.

Emma Lemerand added eight points for the Rayders, while Stuck, Addie Nagel and Emma Buday each chipped in with six.

Rayders advance past Elks in regional semis

CHARLEVOIX 48, ELK RAPIDS 47

MANCELONA — The Charlevoix girls basketball team is moving on.

The Rayders defeated Elk Rapids for the third time this season, this time in the Division 3 regional semifinals by a one point margin, 48-47 on Monday, March 11 in Mancelona.

Charlevoix trailed the Elks with just over two minutes to play when Elise Stuck scored on a

layup to put the Rayders back in front 46-45.

Following an unsuccessful trip down the floor by the Elks, the Rayders drew a foul and the junior would grab a rebound off the front end miss of a one-and-one free throw and was fouled, sending her to the line for an opportunity to push the Charlevoix advantage to three with under 13 seconds to play.

Stuck converted both attempts for a 48-45 lead. Elk Rapids managed to get off a contested triple, but did not connect as the follow up field goal from inside the arch was good as the horn sounded, sending the Rayders into a celebration.

The contest was back and forth as Charlevoix built a 12-5 first quarter lead, with Stuck hitting

a triple at the horn. In the second quarter, it looked as if the Rayders were going to run away with the game, taking a 10 point lead, only to see the Elks shoot their way back into the contest, cutting the lead to 25-21 as the teams went to intermission.

Stuck led the Rayders with a game-high 23 points, while Taylor Petrosky had 11 points and Abby Cunningham and Addie Nagel each chipped in with five.

The Elks got 11 points each from Olivia Travis and Drew Antcliff, with Kendall Brown and Juni Parrish each scoring seven and Rebecca Marolf adding six.

PETOSKEY — Getting off to a slow start is never a good sign for any team.

The Boyne City boys basketball team did just that against Escanaba on March 5, falling behind 11-4 after the opening quarter and were down 33-17 at the half.

“We got off to slow start,” Boyne City coach Nick Redman said. “Guys were play-

ing timid avoiding their size and length.”

But after some halftime adjustments, the Eskimos had more Ramblers than they wanted as Boyne came out firing in the third, outscoring Escanaba 18-9 in the frame to 45-35, headed into the final eight minutes of play.

Boyne turned up the heat again in the fourth, cutting the Eskimo lead to five with just over two minutes to play,

but could get no closer.

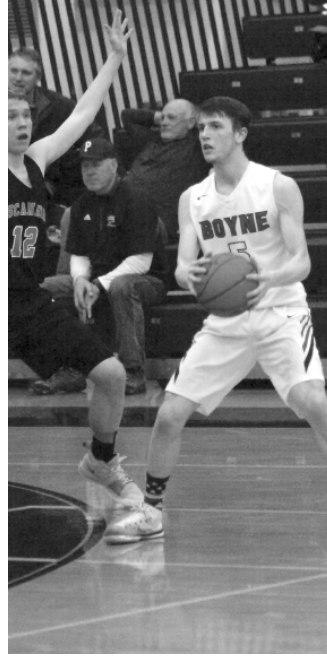
“Couldn’t be more proud of them the way they fought and gave it everything they had in the second half,” Redman added. They gave themselves chance to win it. We just couldn’t make that extra play down the stretch to win the game.”

Pete Calcaterra finished with 19 points to lead the Ramblers, while Max Vondra added 18 and Trevor King chipped in with nine.

“Happy for these seniors (King, Dillon Sulak, Dayten McPherson) and this team for the way they kept working and improving all year and finished strong playing good basketball,” the coach noted. “They kept our tradition alive and are all champions. Sports are about learning life lessons and we did a lot of that this year.”

Another trait that stood out for Coach Suttle is his ability to communicate and connect with the student-athletes he coaches. He has been a mentor to many youths in the Boyne City community. Coach Suttle currently works locally as a carpenter.

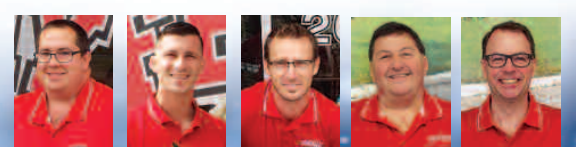
