CHARLEVOIX COUNTY — As warmer weather and spring sports slowly roll around here in Northern Michigan, it is time to reflect on another fine season of local play on the hardwood.

This past season was met with a few challenges, where area teams experienced a lot of ups and downs, but one thing that was pretty consistent was the high caliber of play each and every night on the court.

Ellsworth had the most successful regular season of area squads, where they captured another Northern Lakes Conference title, going 13-0 in league play and finishing the year with a 16-5 overall record.

Boyne City and Charlevoix each claimed district titles in their respective divisions, for the Ramblers, it would be their fifth straight crown, while the Rayders added their first piece of hard-

ware in a decade. East Jordan continues to improve, pushing all opponents every game as the Red Devils picked up huge Lake Michigan Conference victories this season, beating Charlevoix twice and Boyne once.

With the season coming to an end a few short weeks ago, the Charlevoix County News has selected the top players from the area and is proud to announce the 2018-19 All-Area Boys Basketball "Dream Team".

This seasons squad is led by East Jordan's Jackson Raymond, who captured Player of the Year honors. The talented all-around player took on new roles for the Red Devils and helped create matchup problems, making EJ a team to watch close next season.

Earning selections alongside Raymond in school alphabetical order: Pete Calcaterra, Trevor King and Max Vondra, Boyne City; Jacob Mueller, Evan Solomon and Ben Lentz, Charlevoix; AJ Bartett and Cooper Stevenson, East Jordan; and Kevin Dickinson, Atlas Marlatt and Ethan Tornga, Ellsworth.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

(#5) Jackson Raymond, East Jordan, junior

Due to a preseason injury this past season, Raymond was thrust into playing the point guard for the East Jordan.
And after watching the sea-



son he had, we'd say that Jackson did a little more than just satisfy the Red Devils.

Raymond had an unbelievable season, averaging 12.4 ppg, 7.5 rpg, 3.3 apg, 1.6 blocks and 1.3 steals per game. He also shot 44.8

percent from the floor. Jackson had four double-doubles


this year, topped 20 points in a game ning assists in a pair of victories three times, including 23 in a win against Boyne City. He had five games of five or more assists, including delivering the game win-



was our second best rebounder and averaged nearly 31 minutes/game."

"This kid works as hard as anyone in Northern Michigan and grows as a player each time he steps on the floor and pushes those around him to get better every day."

(#34) Cooper Stevenson, East Jordan, junior

Another strong season for the Red Devil junior, Stevenson finished the campaign averaging 12.5 ppg, shooting 45 percent from the field and 77.1 from the charity stripe.

He also hauled in 8.1 rebounds per game, and just under one steal and one block per outing.

"This year teams did really focused on stopping Cooper and he played through that oftentimes drawing multiple defenders which opened up his teammates. While sometimes the stats don't show the big picture of knowing when the game was on the line Cooper would get the boxout and rebound defensively and while teams would focus on stopping him would come set a solid screen to get teammates open," coach Dzwik noted. "He did a great job of recognizing when to take over games and when to make his teammates better."

(#3) AJ Bartlett, East Jordan, junior

According to coach Dzwik, Barlett was a kid who was never afraid to take the big shot.

AJ had eight games of 10 plus points and kept the Red Devils in

a lot of games by knocking down some big three pointers.

Bartlett averaged 8.8 points, 3.0 rebounds and one steal per game for E.I

"AJ has a really big basketball IQ and is a gym rat," Dzwik said. "He was a vocal leader of the team always pushing kids to play a little harder and make themselves a little better."

(#24) Jacob Mueller, Charlevoix, sophomore

As noted earlier, the 6-6 Mueller helped Charlevoix compete each and every night during the tough Lake Michigan Conference season. Often times the focus of opposing defenses, Jacob stepped up his game, taking what opponents gave him, or looking to open teammates when there were no good looks.

Mueller would finish the season with a 14.2 point per game average, while also grabbing 7.2 rebounds each night.

(#12) Evan Solomon, Charlevoix, freshman

Solomon stepped right up in his first high school season for the Rayders and it became known early on that he was ready for the high level of play that came with Charlevoix scheduling.

He would take the reigns early this season against Gaylord (a Rayder victory) as he outplayed everyone the court, scoring 23 points, knocking down six triples in the game.

Evan would finish the season with a 12.5 ppg average, while hauling in 5.5 rebounds and dishing out, 4.3 assists each night.

(#4) Ben Lentz, Charlevoix, junior

Lentz was a player that understood his role and played it well. The 6'0" junior was often times tasked with guarding the Rayder opponents best perimeter player. He also ran a lot of plays off the ball, making it difficult for teams to focus and double team other Charlevoix players.

Ben averaged 6.0 points and 3.5 rebounds per game.

(#10) Max Vondra, Boyne City, junior

One of the leaders for the young Ramblers, in his third season on the varsity, Vondra did pretty much anything and everything that coach Nick Redman and the team needed him to do.

Max would often times find himself matched up with a bigger post player on defense, and could float between playing the perimeter or the post on the offensive end. One area that Vondra has mastered is looking up-court for open teammates and getting the Rambler fastbreak off and running.

He would finish the season averaging 9.5 ppg, 6 rpg, 2.6 assists and 2.4 steals per contest.

(#11) Pete Calcaterra, Boyne City, junior

Quietly became one of the best players this past season for the Ramblers. Calcaterra stepped up his offensive game late in the season, helping the team capture another district title.

In addition to his offense, Calcaterra's defense was often called upon to shut down the top player on opposing teams.

Pete averaged 10 ppg, 3.7 rebounds, while shooting 54 percent

from the field.

(#23) Trevor King, Boyne City, senior

The Rambler senior stepped up his game this season, running the point and distributing the ball to teammates in scoring position.

King would also look to score when he had favorable matchups and did so frequently down the stretch for Boyne.

His defensive pressure would create problems for opponents, making the Ramblers a threat to run and gun.

Trevor would average around eight points per game and make just over two steals per outing.

(#13) Atlas Marlatt, Ellsworth, senior

After missing all of last season with a knee injury, Marlatt came back strong in his senior year after putting in the hours this off season.

"I think he is one of the best players in the area. Atlas is the leader of our team and is key to our success this season," coach Jarod Steenwyk said. "Atlas is a player that is constantly improving and hungry to learn more about the game. He is the guy bugging me when I am late getting the film online."

Atlas averaged 17.2 ppg, shot 80 percent from the free throw line, 2.7 steals, 3.2 assists all of which are team highs, while also averaging 4.3 rebounds.

(#25) Ethan Tornga, Ellsworth, junior

In his third season on the Lancer varsity, Tornga made his presents known inside the paint. Ethan scored at a 15.6 point per game clip, shot 58 percent from the field, hauled in 9.3 rebounds (team high), 1.8 assists and 2.3 steals.

"This season Ethan has really stepped up and filled the inside scoring roll for us," coach Steenwyk said. "This (past) off season he has worked on his shot a lot and it shows shooting 33 percent from three, in the first year of adding it to his game.

(#42) Kevin Dickinson, Ellsworth, senior

Credited by coach Steenwyk for being a great teammate.

"He is the guy that is always up for celebrating his team and teammates success," coach Steenwyk said. "Kevin has been a solid center for us this year scoring when we need him to and being relentless on the boards."

Dickinson averaged 7.9 points and 4.8 rebounds a game.

"He took a little bit of a back seat to Atlas and Ethan this season, but accepted his role and did whatever was asked of him."

COACH OF THE YEAR Matt Stuck, Charlevoix

The coach of the year honors go to Rayder leader, Matt Stuck. Stuck led the Charlevoix team to 13-10 record, a five win improvement from a year ago and in the process, helped guide the young Rayders to their first district title in 10 years.

Playing in the Lake Michigan Conference, Charlevoix was tested night in and night out, competing
