BOYNE CITY -- Another spring night on the diamond, another dominating performance on the mound by the Boyne City pitching staff in a 16-0 and 5-2 Lake Michigan Conference sweep of Charlevoix on May 20.

Senior Ethan Hills worked a perfect game three inning mercy in the opener, striking out three.

The Ramblers brought the bats as well as the offense came to life early and often as well as Boyne scored six runs in the first inning, three in the second and put seven across in the third.

Hills led the hitting attack for the Ramblers as well, finishing with four hits and two RBIs, while Devon Hayden had two hits, including a double and a pair of RBIs, Stephen Orban added two hits and an RBI, Aaron Bess had a hit with an RBI and Bobby Hoth and Carter Binkley each finished two runs batted in.

Michael Pearsall took the pitching loss for Charlevoix, with relief help from Sam Dixon.

In Game 2, Boyne City plated two in the second inning, before the Rayders answered with two runs in the third to knot the score heading into the fourth.

The Ramblers blanked Charlevoix from that point on, while they scored two more in the fourth and added an insurance run in the bottom of the fifth.

ORDINANCE ADDRESSING FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS OF THE STATE CONSTRUCTION CODE

Ordinance No. 3 of 2019

AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE AN ENFORCING AGENCY TO DISCHARGE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF MARION TOWNSHIP, CHARLEVOIX COUNTY, MICHIGAN AND TO DESIGNATE REGULATED FLOOD HAZARD AREAS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE CONSTRUCTION CODE ACT, ACT NO. 230 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1972, AS AMENDED.

THE TOWNSHIP OF MARION, CHARLEVOIX COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

Section 1. Agency Designated.

Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, the Charlevoix County Building Official is hereby designated as the enforcing agency to discharge the responsibility of Marion Township, Charlevoix County, Michigan under Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended.

Section 2. Code Appendix Enforcement.

Pursuant to the provisions of the state construction code, in accordance with Section 8b(6) of Act 230, of the Public Acts of 1972, as amended, Appendix G of the Michigan Building Code shall be enforced by the Charlevoix County Building Official throughout the corporate limits of Marion Township, Charlevoix County, Michigan.

Section 3. Designation of Regulated Flood Prone Hazard Areas.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study (FIS) Entitled "The Flood Insurance Study for Charlevoix County, All Jurisdictions" and dated May 16, 2019 and the Flood Insurance Rate Map(s) (FIRMS) panel number(s) of 26029CIND1A, 26029CIND2A, 26029C0320C, 26029C0320C, 26029C0325C, 26029C0340C, and 26029C0525C and dated May 16, 2019 are hereby adopted by reference for the purposes of administration of the Michigan Construction Code, and are hereby declared to be a part of Section 1612.3 of the Michigan Building Code and to provide the content of the "Flood Hazards" section of Table R301.2(1) of the Michigan Residential Code.

Section 4. Repeals.

All ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective the day following its publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township.
