CHARLEVOIX COUNTY — All good things come to an end.

The 2019 Softball season was one to remember. Boyne City and East Jordan captured their respective district titles, while young Charlevoix, Ellsworth and Boyne Falls all showed vast improvements and we look forward to them challenging once again in their conference races and postseason play.

One thing to be noted, the weather was much more cooperative this spring than it was last season, and while there were a few rainouts, the most important thing was just being able to play ball over almost a two month span as opposed to a short four weeks.

With the season coming to a close a few short weeks ago, it is now time to recognize the top players in the area, as

the Charlevoix County News announces the 2019 All-Area Softball "Dream Team".

While each area team had numerous individuals that contributed to their teams success, there were a select few that stood out from the pack.

There were a number of quality candidates that would be considered for Player of the Year, but that honor goes to Charlevoix senior, Hannah Solomon.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

HANNAH SOLOMON

In her fourth season on the Rayder varsity, Solomon continued to be one of the toughest outs in Northern Michigan, using her blazing

speed to run out an infield hit, or if she found a gap in the outfield, she would more times than not, be rolling into third base standing up.

Hannah finished the season with a .644 batting average, scoring 59 runs, swiping 75 bases and knocking in 26

RBIs from her leadoff position.

When not tearing up the basepath, Solomon was roaming the outfield, chasing down would be hits or setting up camp at shortstop, and using her laser like arm to throw out baserunners.

"A model player who will dearly be missed in our lineup but her legacy and work ethic will live on in this program," Charlevoix coach Tom Zipp noted. "She has set the bar high and has given an amazing example for our next generation of Rayder softball players. Constant positivity on and off the field. She is a natural and a true leader! I expect good things from her in the future."

In addition to her Player of the Year status, Solomon was also recognized as All-Lake Michigan Conference, All-district, All-region and Honorable Mention All-State in

Joining Hannah on the 2019 All-Area "Dream Team" are Rayder teammates, Zoe Brodin, Grace Lentz and Madelyn Sandison; Boyne City is represented by Katelyn Gabos, Magee Behling and Sophia Morias; East Jordan's Madeline Malpass, Ellie Skrocki and Katelyn Crawford; Boyne Falls Sidney Bess and Jordan Gellis; and Ellsworth's Mckenzie Esenberg and Jasmine Adams.

CHARLEVOIX

ZOE BRODIN

Brodin, continued to come into her own during her sophomore campaign, with her leadership and ability to deliver timely hits when the Rayders needed it most.

Zoe, manned the hot corner for the Charlevoix, vacuuming up pretty much anything she could get a glove on.

Offensive, the power hitter knocked in 65 runs this season and finishing with a .533 batting average and scored 44 runs.

"When you need a hit. Zoe delivers," coach Zipp said.

MADELYN SANDISON

Another sophomore for Charlevoix, Madelyn made quite a name for herself this season, going 17-4 in the circle with a 1.97 ERA and recording 193 strikeouts.

"She has emerged to be one of the area's top pitchers as a sophomore," coach Zipp noted. "(She) leads by example and works very hard every day to be her best.

GRACE LENTZ

As a freshman, Lentz stepped right into the Rayder lineup as the everyday second baseman, helping hold down the right side of the infield.

At the plate, Grace hit .479 with eight triples, knocked in 32 RBIs and scored 36 runs.

Coach Zipp noted that Grace has a bright future ahead of her.

BOYNE CITY

KATELYN GABOS

The Rambler junior moved from catcher/third base to shortstop this season and didn't miss a beat, finishing the season with a .925 field-

ing percentage.

At the dish, Katelyn pounded out 45 hits, including nine home runs for a .413 average. Her slugging percentage was .725, added 29 RBIs and scored 35 runs, while also stealing nine bases.

MAGGEE BEHLING

Behling, a sophomore, took over at third base this season, recording a .928 fielding percentage at the hot corner.

Maggee batted a team-high .464 at the plate, with a slugging percentage of .718. She also hit one home run from the leadoff spot, while adding 20 RBIs, scoring 56 runs and stole 21 bases.

SOPHIA MORIAS

The Boyne senior catcher had another solid season for the Ramblers, she fielded the #2 position with a .949 percentage.

Offensively, Morias hit .376 with 28 RBIs, scored 32 runs and blasted two homers. Sophia had a slugging percentage of .554 and stole six bases.

BOYNE FALLS

SYDNEY BESS

Bess, the lone Logger senior on the team had another outstanding season for Boyne Falls. She helped mentor the young pitchers along this season from behind the plate.

Offensively, Sydney was one of the Logger leaders with a .571 batting average, recording 20 hits in 35 plate appearances, legging out four triples and nine doubles along the way. She scored 24 times and added 11 RBIs.

JORDAN GELLIS

Gellis, a junior, led the Loggers with a 9-3 pitching record, logging 49 innings, allowing only 17 hits and fanning 65.

At the plate, Jordin finished with 19 hits in 33 trips to the batters box for a .576 BA. She had one triple and six doubles to go with 16 RBIs.

EAST JORDAN

MADLINE MALPASS

The Red Devil mainstay at first base for the last couple of seasons, Madeline didn't allow much to get by her this season, recording a .976 fielding percentage, while only committing three errors.

At the plate, Malpass batted .333, with an on-base percentage of .506, slugging percentage of .569, made contact .847 percent of the time and blasted three home runs.

Coach Meg Kitson, noted that Madeline led by example and played

amazing softball this year.

ELLIE SKROCKI

Skrocki hit .394 this season for EJ, with an OBP of .506.

"She is a team leader, who leads by example and is a great help to her teammates," coach Kitson said.

On defense, Ellie had a .942 fielding percentage at second base, committing only two throwing errors, and a .899 overall as she started the season at shortstop.

KATELYN CRAWFORD

Crawford hit .368 with four home runs for the Red Devils this spring. Her slugging percentage was .706, and her OBP was .513.

Defensively, Katelyn had a .943 FPCT, with only two errors in left field.

"She plays full out all the time, sacrificing her body for the play," coach Kitson said. "She has made several diving catches. She also has an astounding five assists from the outfield and 28 putouts."

ELLSWORTH

MCKENZIE ESSENBERG

Esenberg took on a different role this season, stepping up to take over pitching duties when a teammate went down with an injury.

During her time in the circle, Mckenzie went 13-5.

Esenberg hit .611 with two home runs, eight doubles and a pair of triples and had 23 RBIs.

"Mckenzie is having a breakout

year," coach Andy Montgomery said. "All of her hard work is paying off."

JASMIN ADAMS

Adams, a utility player for the Lancers, played many positions this season, moving around a lot due to injuries and coach Montgomery credited her with doing them all really well.

Offensively, Jasmin hit .444 with 19 RBIs and five doubles.

"Jasmin has a very powerful swing and has performed nicely this year," the coach added.

Honorable mention goes out to Boyne City's Brooklyn Fitzpatrick and Madison Rosenow; East Jordan's Molly Kitson and Jaden McCoy; and Charlevoix's Avery Zipp.

COACH OF THE YEAR

TOM ZIPP, CHARLEVOIX

In his first season as the Rayder skipper, coach Zipp helped lead Charlevoix to a second place finish in the Lake Michigan Conference and a Division 3 district final appearance, finishing the season with a 22-8 overall record, including 12-2 in league play.

"I couldn't have asked for a better group of kids, parents, and coaches to have on board for my first year as head coach," Zipp said. "The girls hit the gym hard in the off season. By the time the first pitch was thrown we knew who we were and believed in what we were doing and where we were going. I'm excited

for the future of our program."

With that being said the Charlevoix County News would like to congratulate those selected to the "Dream Team," and to thank the coaches that helped throughout the season by providing their stats and game information following their contests.

Baseball & Softball All State Honors

Division 3 Baseball, Boyne and Charlevoix represented

CHARLEVOIX COUNTY — In baseball, Boyne City senior hurler, Ethan Hills was selected as a first team All-State member after another dominant season on the mound for the Ramblers.

Hills, who will be attending Saginaw Valley State University in the fall, finished the season with a

10-2 record, while also recording one save.

Ethan fanned 116 of the 246 batters he faced this season, allowing only 26 hits and recorded an ERA of 1.24.

In softball, Charlevoix senior Hannah Solomon and Boyne City junior, Brooklyn Fitzpatrick were recipients of All-State honorable mention honors.

Solomon, who will lace up her shoes for the Alma Scots next season, hit an astounding .644, pounding out 65 hits, and added 26 RBI, she also scored 59 runs and used her blazing speed to steal 75 bases for the Rayders.

Fitzpatrick, the Rambler first baseman, hit .417 on the season, with a slugging percentage of .573, hit two home runs, scored 27 runs and added 17 RBIs.

Lake Michigan All-Conference softball

Charlevoix led area teams this season with four first team selections and three honorable mentions.

Senior Hannah Solomon, sophomore Madelyn Sandison, sophomore Zoe Brodin and sophomore Avery Zipp.

Earning honorable mention were Grace Lentz, Kate Klinger and Krista Dorst.

Boyne City earned three first

team selections, and three honorable mention.

Senior and Alma commit Sophia Morais, junior Katelyn Gabos and sophomore Magee Behling all were selected as first team recipients.

Senior Madison Rosenow and juniors Logan Radar and Brooklyn Fitzpatrick were honorable mention.

East Jordan had five players earn first team or honorable mention recognition.

Ordinance #252 An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 26 Offenses Article III: Offenses Against Public Safety Section 26-82-Fireworks

The City of East Jordan hereby ordains:

Sec. 26-82. - Fireworks.

(a) The term "firework" or "fireworks" means any composition or device, except for a starting pistol, a flare gun or a flare, designed for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, deflagration or detonation. Fireworks consist of consumer fireworks, low-impact fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, display fireworks, and special effects, as defined by the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act, Act 256 of 2011, as amended, hereinafter the "Fireworks Safety Act."

(b) The sale, discharge, storage, transportation and distribution of fireworks in the City of East Jordan shall be governed by the Fireworks Safety Act.

(c) The use of low-impact fireworks, (i.e. ground and hand-held sparkling devices) and novelties (i.e. snappers, party poppers, snakes, smoke balls) as defined in the Fireworks Safety Act are permitted year-round.

(d) Use of consumer fireworks, as defined in the Fireworks Safety Act, in the City of East Jordan is limited to the day before, the day of, or the day after a federal holiday, contingent on the following:

(1) Consumer fireworks shall not be sold to a minor under the age of 18 years.

(2) No person under the age of 18 years shall buy or purchase, any consumer fireworks, as defined herein, within the city.

(3) A person shall not ignite, discharge or use consumer fireworks on public property, school property, church property or the property of another person without that organization's or person's express permission to use those fireworks on those premises.

(4) For purpose of this section, federal holidays are:
• New Year's Day
• Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr.

- Presidents Day
- Memorial Day
- Independence Day
- Labor Day
- Columbus Day
- Veterans Day
- Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Day

(5) No fireworks shall be ignited, discharged or used between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.

(e) Upon application in writing to the City of East Jordan by any association or group of individuals for the public presentation of "display fireworks," the city administrator may grant permission for such display, subject to such conditions as the city administrator or his designee may impose to properly safeguard the public, both as to persons and property; and subject to the provision of the Fireworks Safety Act, Section 28.466.

(b) The sale, discharge, storage, transportation and distribution of fireworks in the City of East Jordan shall be governed by the Fireworks Safety Act.

(c) The use of low-impact fireworks, (i.e. ground and hand-held sparkling devices) and novelties (i.e. snappers, party poppers, snakes, smoke balls) as defined in the Fireworks Safety Act are permitted year-round.

(d) Use of consumer fireworks, as defined in the Fireworks Safety Act, in the City of East Jordan is limited to the day before, the day of, or the day after a federal holiday, contingent on the following:

(1) Consumer fireworks shall not be sold to a minor under the age of 18 years.

(2) No person under the age of 18 years shall buy or purchase, any consumer fireworks, as defined herein, within the city.

(3) A person shall not ignite, discharge or use consumer fireworks on public property, school property, church property or the property of another person without that organization's or person's express permission to use those fireworks on those premises.

(4) A person shall not ignite, discharge, or use consumer fireworks at any time other than permitted hours, as listed below:

- a. December 31: From 11 a.m. until 11:59 p.m.
- b. January 1: From midnight until 1:00 a.m.
- c. The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day: from 11 a.m. until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- d. June 29 to July 4: From 11: a.m. until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- e. July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday: from 11 a.m. until 11:45 p.m.
- f. The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day: From 11

a.m. until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.

(e) Upon application in writing to the City of East Jordan by any association or group of individuals for the public presentation of "display fireworks," the city administrator may grant permission for such display, subject to such conditions as the city administrator or his designee may impose to properly safeguard the public, both as to persons and property; and subject to the provision of the Fireworks Safety Act, Section 28.466.

(f) A violation of this section is a civil infraction punishable by a fine of \$1,000.00 for each violation. In accordance with Michigan Public Act 635 of 2018, \$500 of this fine will be remitted to the East Jordan Police Department for enforcement of this ordinance.

In addition to a civil infraction, fines and penalties stated within the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act may be imposed.

Following final disposition of a finding of responsibility for violating this section, the city may dispose of or destroy any consumer fireworks retained as evidence in that prosecution.

Publication: This Ordinance will take effect 7 days after publication.
