RAYDERS HOLD ON AGAINST RED DEVILS



CHARLEVOIX 14, EAST JORDAN 7

EAST JORDAN — Like it's often times said, throw the records out when rival meet.

On September 20, the Charlevoix Rayders traveled to East Jordan to take on the Red Devils, with the Rayders sporting a 2-1 record and the Red Devils came in looking for their first win.

The East Jordan football team trailed 14-7 in the fourth quarter and put together a couple of drives, but could not get the play when needed.

"It was a great high school football game between two rival schools," EJ coach Greg Kitson said. "We were well prepared and I think we did some things that Charlevoix didn't expect. Don (Jess) does a great job with those kids and they kept fighting when we took the lead. Give them credit, they made one more play they we did."

"We knew (Alan) Ritter was fast and we had to keep him in check. Cole Wright probably made the play that made

the difference in this game on their first score," coach Kitson added. "Overall a great game. I am disappointed we didn't get the win again, we are much improved and the wins are going to start coming for these kids real soon, we just need to focus on what we do and work to get better every day."

The East Jordan football team held a 7-6 halftime lead, following a scoreless first quarter the Rayders took a lead in the second on the Wright TD, but failed the conversion attempt.

The Red Devils responded just before half time on a 31-yard scoring pass from Dawson Olstrom to Jackson Raymond. A Judd Wise extra point was good, giving EJ a 7-6 lead headed into the break.

Both teams failed to score in the third quarter until Charlevoix scores early in the fourth, this time converting the conversion for a 14-7 advantage.

"We were pleased with how our kids responded after

being down 7-6 at that half," Charlevoix coach Don Jess said. "East Jordan played us tough, as expected."

Offensively for EJ, Cooper Stevenson was the leading rusher with 84 yards followed by Levi Pepin with 79. Jackson Raymond was the leading receiver with 47 yards and a score. Judd Wise had three catches for 34 yards.

Defensively, Stevenson had 16 tackles and a fumble recovery. Wyatt Thompson added 11 tackles and a forced fumble. Wise and Ethan Antaya both had stops and Raymond recorded another interception.

For the Rayders, Wright finished 10-of-17 passing for 81 yards and rushed 20 times for 109, including a 36-yard score; Ritter carried it 13 times for 91 and his 24-yard second half scamper and Jake Snyder added 51 yards on eight attempts.

Jacob Mueller had five catches for 30 yards and a 2-point conversion.

On the defense, Dimitrii Bell recorded 10 tackles and a sack, Luke Stuck added eight tackles and a pair of sacks.

EAST JORDAN 3, GAYLORD ST. MARY 0

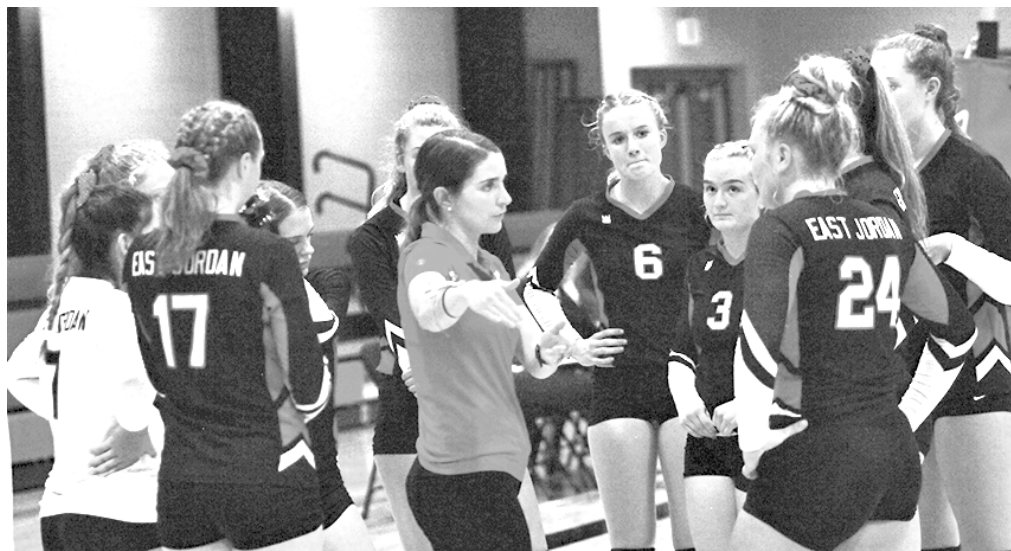

Haley Gibson had 20 digs, six aces; Kylie Skrocki had 20 digs, three aces, two kills; Tegan Swanson had 11 digs and served 100 percent from the line; Ellie Skrocki had two assists, 12 digs; and Lauren Peterson was 100 percent from the serving line with one ace and added two kills.

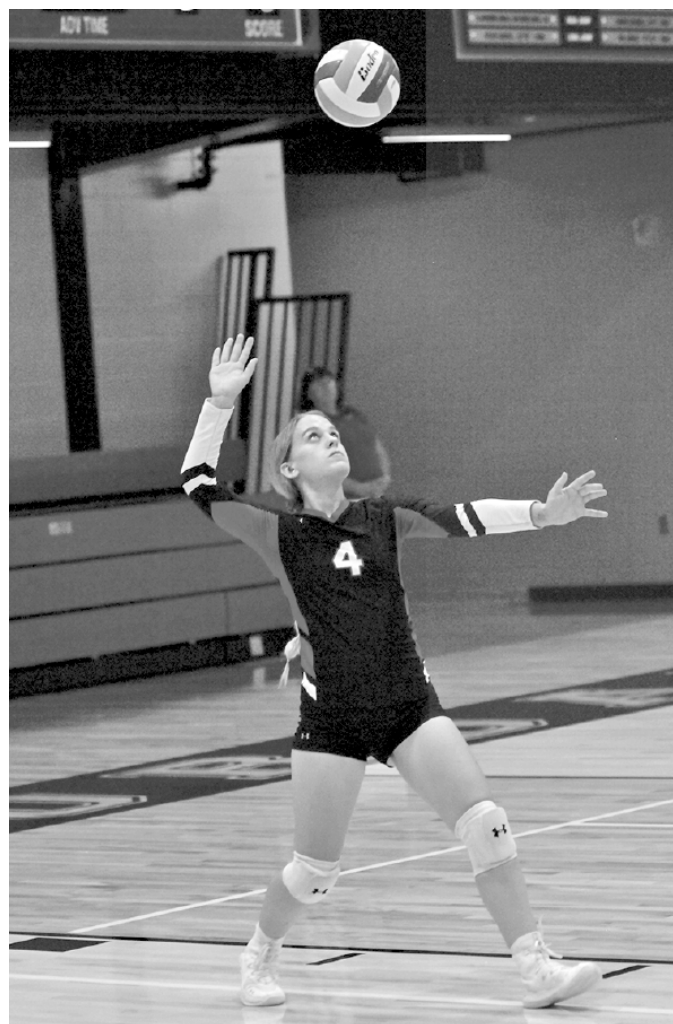
East Jordan volleyball team battled hard in each contest, but could only come away with one victory in the four set match against Kalkaska on September 17.

CHARLEVOIX — On Saturday, September 21, the Rayders hosted their annual Charlevoix Invitational Volleyball tournament, welcoming eight other teams.

It was a tough weekend for the host Rayders, as they had to adjust to a new line-up just hours prior to playing.

"On Friday, our setter (junior) Zoe Brodin went down with a twisted ankle and quickly trying to adjust and adapt to a new line up with only an hour of practice," coach Audra Randall said. "The girls had a lot of extended rallies and solid serve receive not able to win the sets."

In the opening round of pool play, Charlevoix faced off with St. Ignace, falling to the Saints 18-25, 17-27. Their next contest was against Brimley, where the Rayders split 22-26, 25-16.

In the second round of pool play, the Rayders faced off with Rudyard and Cheboygan, falling to each, 15-25 and 22-25 to the Bulldogs before dropping straight sets to the Chiefs 21-25, 16-25.

"I was still proud of the girls, many stayed positive and worked very hard to get a win," Randall noted. "Many times we were staying right in the game and then 3 or 4 point run by the opponent which was a combination of their solid plays and our errors. Filling in for the injured junior were Grace Lentz and Claire Scholten, as the pair split the setter duties. "(They) had good attitudes, as they adjust and we get some practice time on our belt we will regain our confidence and move forward in a positive path."

Abby Paramo led Charlevoix on the day with 55 digs, 53-of-60 on serve receive, 18 kills and two blocks, earning a spot on the All-Tournament team.

Also for the Rayders, Avery Zipp had 15 kills, 45 digs, 3 aces 27-of-31 on serve receive; Grace Lentz added 30 assists, four kills, seven aces and 14 digs; Taylor Petrosky had 34 digs, 44-of-57 on serve receive and 100 percent on serving, going 25-of-25 with two aces.

Abby Cunningham had 14 kills, three blocks and 14-of-16 on serving; Olivia Vollmer was 4-of-6 on serve receive and added two blocks; Kirsten Wagner had eight kills and three blocks; and Claire Scholten finished with 24 assists 14 digs, and was 22-of-23 on serving.

"We have definitely been on the upswing but with Brodin out we will buckle down and get going in the right direction," coach Ran-

dall added.

had seven kills, eight digs and was 10-for-11 on serve receive.

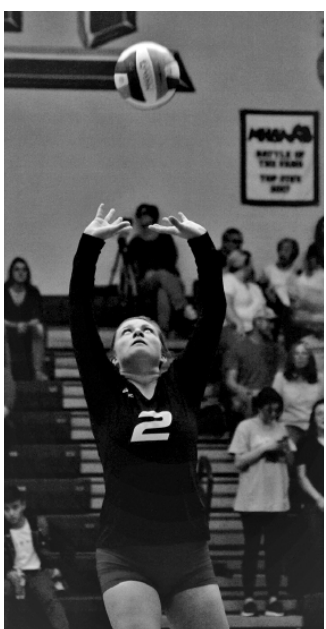

With the win, the Ramblers improve to 2-2 on the season, as they took a 42-0 lead late into the contest, when the Vikings found a way into the endzone on a long run.

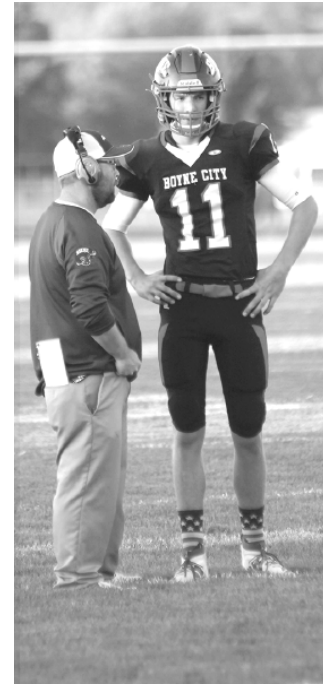
Calcaterra completed 3-of-7 passes (all to Hoth) for 110 yards, and rushed for 23 yards.

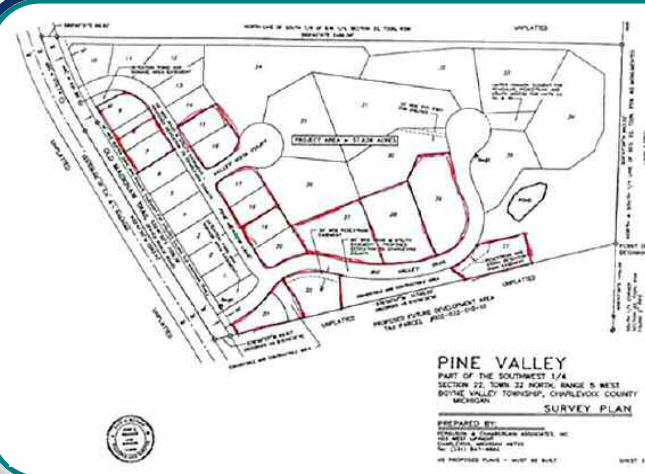

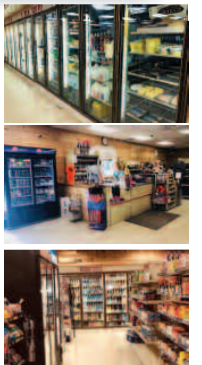

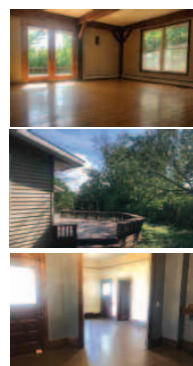
