CHARLEVOIX — Time to enter some uncharted waters.

For the first time in Charlevoix football history, the Rayders have advanced past the opening contest of district play.

In a rematch of the season finale, (the game that earned Charlevoix a postseason bid), the Rayders welcomed Harbor Springs to Kipke Field, where the two teams would face off in a Division 7 play-

off battle on November 1. From the opening kickoff it appeared the two teams were trying to figure out the other, but once the second

quarter rolled around, it was all Charlevoix from then on until the final horn, it was pretty evident that Charlevoix would not be denied, as the Rayders steam rolled past the Rams, 32-0.

"Both teams played well, Harbor had a good season and their coaches do a great job. Our kids have been improving all season and it showed on Friday night," Charlevoix coach Don Jess

With the win, the Rayders improve to 7-3 on the season and will travel North of the bridge to face Iron Mountain, a 40-8 winner over Mancelona on Saturday, November 9, with a 12pm kick-

After a scoreless opening

quarter, the Rayders would capitalize on a pair pair of Ram turnovers, the first on a fumbled punt that would result in a 8-yard keeper by quarterback, Cole Wright, combined with a Wright to wideout Jacob Mueller conversion for an 8-0 Charlevoix

The second score of the night came on another Wright keeper, this time from 1-yard out and another two-point conversion, this time Wright would connect with Caleb Stuck for a 16-0 lead that the team would

carry into the half.

Wright's second touchdown was set up by a Jake Snyder interception.

The third quarter was a near mirror to the first, as neither team could sustain a drive and each held the other scoreless, but the Rayders would give Harbor another heavy does of their rushing game over the final 12 minutes of play as Charlevoix found paydirt twice more on runs of 1-yard (Luke Snyder) before Wright added his third score of the night, this time from 10-yards out.

The rayder rushing attack was led by Alan Ritter with 159 yards on 13 carries, including a long run of 45yards, while Wright tallied 91 yards on 19 attempts and three scores, while also completing 6-of-8 passing for 44 yards and a pair of two-point conversions.

Luke Snyder rushed 11 times for 45 yards and Jake Snyder added 38 yards on six attempts.

Mueller was the leading receiver with four catches for 24 yards.

On the defensive side of

the ball, Luke Snyder set the tone with 12 stops, while Dimitrii Bell added eight, Ritter had seven, Jake Snyder six and an interception, while Jake Clafflin made three tackles and recorded two sacks and Luke Stuck had one sack.

"These kids have worked extremely hard and have earned the right to be Charlevoix's first team to win a playoff game," coach Jess added.

In the current economy, and with mortgage interest rates as low as they are, the best long term financial decision is probably to rent a house out rather than sell it at a steep discount.
