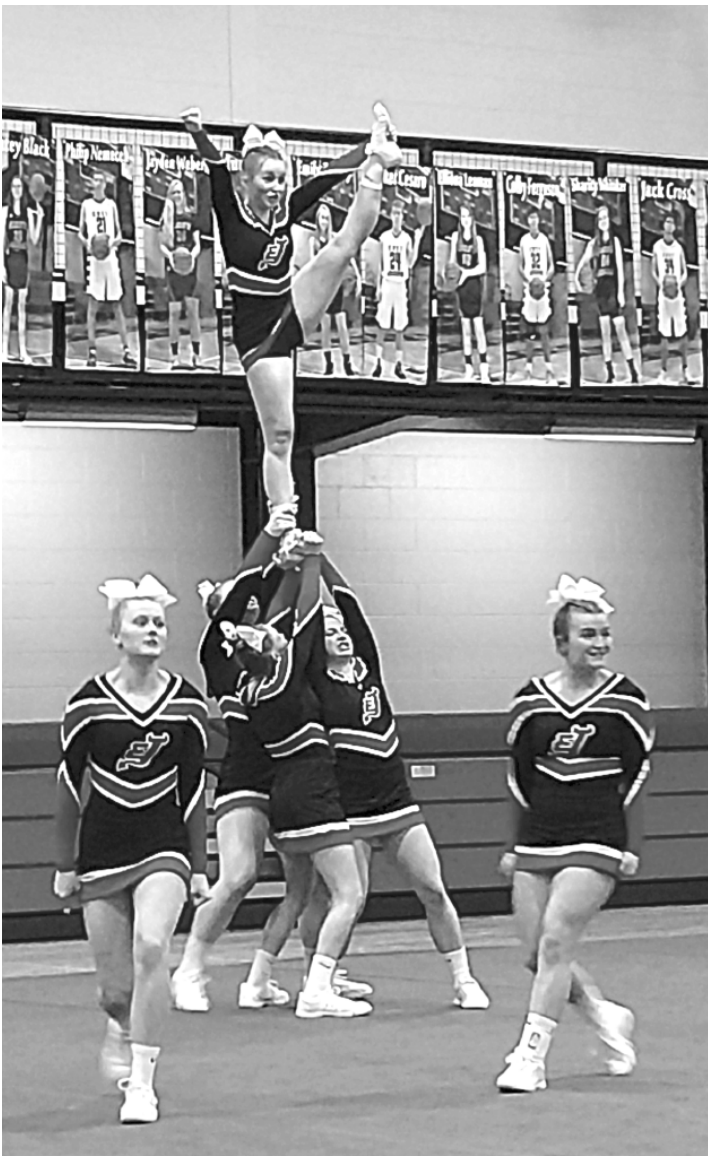
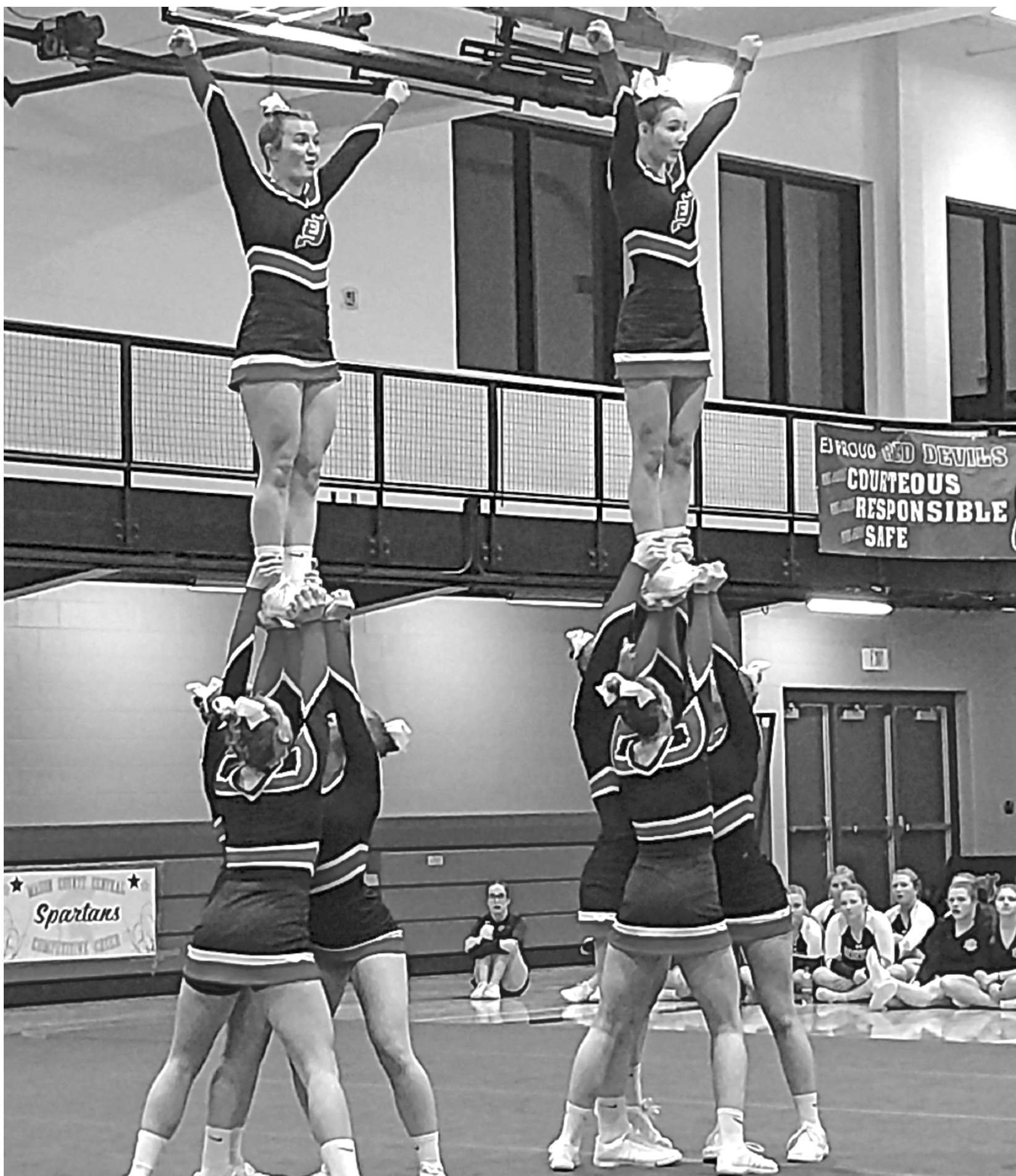
Red Devils competitive cheer team takes second in Division 4 districts

Solomon delivers big fourth quarter in Rayders win over Rams

HARBOR SPRINGS -- Evan Solomon has been on quite a tear these past few weeks. Friday, February 21 would be no different. Rayders use strong second to pull away from EJ CHARLEVOIX 79, EAST JORDAN 64

CHARLEVOIX -- A 13 point advantage during the second quarter turned out to be the difference for Charlevoix, as they defeated East Jordan 79-64 in Lake Michigan Conference boys basketball play on February 18. The Red Devils came out focused and determined to

challenge the Rayders on Charlevoix's home court, capitalizing on good shot selection and limiting the Rayders to one shot on the other end, in leading 21-17 at the end of the first quarter. But Charlevoix pushed the pace in the second and got East Jordan in foul trouble during the second eight minutes of play, as the Rayders outscored the Red Devils 20-7 to take a 37-28 advantage at the half. "We got off to really quick start because we did a good job on the defensive end of limiting them to one shot," EJ coach Nate Dzwik said. "The problem is that the pace was too fast as we started to sacrifice some de-

fensive intensity to try to get run outs and that is not where we are at our best. ORDINANCE #143 W

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING CODE FOR THE CITY OF EAST JORDAN

THE CITY OF EAST JORDAN ORDAINS:

The Zoning Code for the City of East Jordan is hereby amended as follows:

Original:

Chapter 48 Zoning, District III District Regulations, Division 3 R-1 Single Family Residential District

DIVISION 3. - R-1 SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT Sec. 48-240. - Purpose.

It is the purpose of the R-1 Single-Family Residential District to provide for medium sized lot single-family residential neighborhoods free from other uses, except those which are normally accessory to and compatible with, supportive of and convenient to the various types and compositions of families living within such residential land use areas. The size of lots and parcels should be planned to be of such area and width so that they can afford to be connected to healthful and sanitary water supply and wastewater disposal systems.

(Ord. No. 142, § 5.01, 2-6-1990; Ord. No. 142G, § 8, 10-15-1996)

Sec. 48-241. - Permitted principal uses.

Permitted principal uses are as follows:

- (1) Single-family dwellings of conventional or manufactured construction having at least one cross section width of at least 24 feet, and one portion of the ground floor shall have a dimension of at least 24 by 24 feet. All single-family dwellings are required to have perimeter foundations.

All such landscaping shall be maintained in a healthy condition. There shall be no parking or structures permitted in these yards, except necessary entrance drives and those fences, walls, berms and vegetation used to screen the use from abutting residential lots and parcels.
 - c. Shall meet off-street parking requirements specified for each use in article VII of this chapter and all other applicable requirements of this chapter.

 - b. Side yards. Minimum of ten feet for each side yard, except where a side yard abuts a street right-of-way line or a waterfront shoreline, the minimum shall be the same as for the front yard.
 - c. Rear yard. Minimum of 40 feet.
- (6) Height limitations. Maximum of 30 feet for residential structures; a maximum of 15 feet

for all residential related accessory structures.

It is the purpose of the R-1 Single-Family Residential District to provide for medium sized lot residential traditional neighborhoods free from other uses, except those which are normally accessory to and compatible with, supportive of and convenient to the various types and compositions of families living within such residential land use areas. The size of lots and parcels should be planned to be of such area and width so that they can afford to be connected to healthful and sanitary water supply and wastewater disposal systems.

 - c. Shall meet off-street parking requirements specified for each use in article VII of this chapter and all other applicable requirements of this chapter.

 - b. Side yards. Minimum of five feet for a side yard, with a total of 15 feet between both side yard setbacks except where a side yard abuts a street right-of-way line or a waterfront shoreline, the minimum shall be the same as for the front yard.
 - c. Rear yard. Minimum of 25 feet. Detached accessory structures minimum of 8 feet.
- (6) Height limitations. Maximum of 30 feet for residential structures; a maximum of 15 feet for all residential related accessory structures.

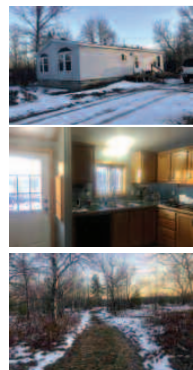
