Conference play. Charlevoix then picked up three more victories in winning another Division 3 district title and then rolled through the regional semifinal contest.

As good as the team play for each school was, there happened to be some outstanding individual play as well. With that being said, the Charlevoix County News is proud to announce this year's Girls Basketball All-Area "Dream Team."

The 2019-20 "Dream Team" once again features talent that can play all five positions, along with key floor leaders, pure scorers, hard-working rebounders and defensive specialists.

After reviewing all the necessary statistical information and each student-athlete's importance to their team and what those individuals faced each and every night on both ends of the court, the sacrifices

made for a better team result, Player of the Year honors go to East Jordan senior, Jayden Weber.

Player of the Year

JAYDEN WEBER

East Jordan, senior - #24

Weber, a four-year starter for the Red Devils, faced double and triple teams on a nightly basis and still put up outstanding numbers over her career, and was fixture as All-Lake Michigan Conference and was a two-time All-State honorable mention pick.

"I felt very blessed and accomplished," Weber said upon learning she was chosen as the POY. "I've put a lot of hard work and dedication into basketball. I have played many different roles throughout these four years. I started as a post player and scored mainly off of rebounds and expanded my game by getting the three point shot down."

During her senior season, Jayden averaged 18.5 points per game, hauled in 8.7 rebounds, 1.5 assists and one steal. She shot 48 percent from field goal range, 78 percent from the charity stripe and added a new dimension to her arsenal this season by stepping beyond the arc, shooting 34 percent from long-range. She also recorded seven double-doubles this season. In her senior season, Jayden scored 389 points and finished her Red Devil career with a total of 1,223 points.

"Jayden was a true joy to coach and the ultimate team player," coach Hines noted. "In addition to her basketball talents, Jayden carries a 3.83 GPA in the classroom and is a great role model for all younger students/athletes."

When asked about what she took from this season (both as an individual and team) she replied. "I reached over 1,000 career points which had been a huge goal of mine. I also am the #2 leading scorer for East Jordan girls basketball program."

"As a team we played very competitive all year, especially during our last game against Charlevoix in

the first round of districts. We were a younger team, but never gave up. There were multiple games where we were down at halftime, but came back and won the game."

"Great high school player, tremendous role model and great all around person," East Jordan coach Steve Hines said. "(She) became the third Red Devils player to score 1,000 points in a career and our second leading all-time scorer and four year varsity starter!"

Jayden was also asked about what she learned from coach Hines in regards to being a leader and floor general for the team, and how she overcame the adversity of always running into other teams game planning for her.

"I just knew I had to be a good leader and an even better teammate. I loved helping the underclassman with whatever they needed, and they knew they could count on me for any help. When teams would plan for me, I would just push myself more. I would try to find other ways to score, like draw fouls as much as I could and shoot more threes. Also, when I would get

double/triple teamed in the paint, my coach pushed me to find the open player at the three-point line and kick it out to them."

When asked about what the future holds, Weber said. "I plan on either attending Grand Rapids Community College for two years and then transferring to Grand Valley State University or just attending GVSU for four years. I plan on getting a bachelor's degree in nursing to become an Operating Room Nurse."

At this time, Jayden does not plan on playing basketball anywhere because she wants to focus on her academics.

Weber also wanted to thank a few others that helped her along her high school journey.

"I want to thank all of my family and friends who have been there for me throughout my basketball career. They always came to games no matter what. Without them I would have not been able to accomplish many goals and dreams of mine, such as reaching a milestone of over 1,000 career points."

I also want to thank my brothers Jordan and JJ for keeping things competitive and for contributing to my basketball drive. I look up to Jordan for the success he had as I was developing my game. I hope JJ and his team continue to have success. Lastly, I want to thank my teammates, especially the seniors. We had a young team this year, but I could always count on them. I'm going to miss playing with them more than anything."

Joining Weber on the "Dream Team" are East Jordan teammates Molly Kitson and Lauren Peterson; Boyne City's Avery Stadt, Katelyn Gabos and Brooklyn Fitzpatrick; and Charlevoix's Addie Nagel, Taylor Petrosky, Emma Lemerand and Abby Cunningham.

MOLLY KITSON

East Jordan, senior - #10

Kitson, a two-year starter for the Red Devils, averaged seven points, 4.5 rebounds and five assists from her point guard position.

Kitson led East Jordan in minutes played, assists and steals.

"Molly is a 4.0 student, co-captain and a team leader with a great work ethic," coach Hines said.

LAUREN PETERSON

East Jordan, senior - #12

Peterson started every game for the Red Devils this season as a forward, anchoring the middle of the East Jordan defense.

"Lauren provided great leadership for our younger players," coach Hines said.

Peterson finished the season with a four point per game average, while grabbing six boards per contest (second to Weber) and 1.5 steals (second to Kitson).

AVERY STADT

Boyne City, senior - #10

One of the toughest defenders in the area. Stadt, a four-year varsity member, would lock down opponents' top ball handler and render them neutral for that night's contest, taking them out of the game both mentally and physically.

Stadt led the Ramblers with 37 steals, (2.3 per game), while also grabbing 39 boards (3.5 rpg) and scoring 84 points for a 5.3 per game average and dishing out 1.8 assists per game.

Avery also shot 30 percent from the field, and 40 percent from three point range.

KATELYN GABOS

Boyne City, senior - #15

Another four-year letter winner for Boyne, the first half would seem to be hers as Gabos would often be the "hot-hand" for the Ramblers,

knocking down her patented 15 foot jumper from all over the court. She had a season-high of 19 against Harbor Springs.

Katelyn averaged 7.5 ppg, 3.6 rebounds and 1.6 steals per game.

Gabos shot 36 percent from the floor and 42 percent from beyond the arc.

BROOKLYN FITZPATRICK

Boyne City, senior - #2

Fitzpatrick was the leading scorer on the team for the second straight season, averaging 8.9 points per game, scoring a season-high of 20 against Charlevoix early in the season.

Brooklyn would also haul in 8.9 rebounds per game and made 1.7 steals each night and shot 41 percent from the field.

ADDIE NAGEL

Charlevoix, senior - #13

Nagel, without a doubt was the best ball handler in Northern Michigan, her handles allowed her to not only maneuver her way around the court, but with her vision, she would put teammates in positions to score or make the extra pass for an easier look at the hoop.

Despite running the show, Addie could score when she needed to as she dropped in 13 points per game and dished out three assists, while shooting 52 percent from the field, 30 percent from the three-point line and 70 percent at the free throw line.

She also was a tough matchup for opponents on the other end of the court, harassing teams both in the full and half court situations, leading to three steals per game and also grabbing four rebounds each night.

She was an All-LMC selection and All-State honorable mention and will take her basketball skills to the next level and play at Lawrence Tech University in the fall.

TAYLOR PETROSKY,

Charlevoix, sophomore - #24

Petrosky, who was a standout as a freshman, avoided a setback and went on to score 13 ppg, as she was constantly a threat from anywhere on the court, but especially outside the three point arc.

Taylor shot 45% from the field, 33% from 3-point range and 73% from the charity stripe.

Taylor also looked to involve her teammates, handing out two assists each night, while hauling in five rebounds and making two steals per game.

"She has combined her outside shooting with attacks to the basket and offensive rebounding," coach Marc Sroufe said. "She is working on strength and agility which improved her ability to defend and improve her game in all areas."

Petrosky was All-Lake Michigan Conference and All-State honorable mention.

ABBY CUNNINGHAM

Charlevoix, senior - #32

One of the most dependable and improved players in the area, Abby has played in every game during her four-year varsity career.

"She has been a fixture in the post since the first game of her senior year," coach Sroufe noted. "With the absence of Elise Stuck this year Abby was asked to become a stronger post presence, which she did."

Cunningham recorded a stat line of six points per game and five boards each night.

EMMA LEMERAND

Charlevoix, senior - #5

Oftentimes, Lemerand would be tasked with guarding the opposing team's best scorer.

"Emma is a very athletic player who thrives on playing defense," coach Sroufe said. "She led the team in steals and breakaway layups."

Lemerand finished the season with a six point per game average, while adding two rebounds, two assists and three steals per game.

Emma will play basketball at Hope College in the fall.

Coach of the Year

Charlevoix

Taking over a successful program is never an easy task, but if you look at what Rayder coach Marc Sroufe did this season, you may think a little different, as Charlevoix went 15-5 during the regular season and after capturing another district title, were poised to claim the Division 3 regional crown when the season was put on hold.

Coach Sroufe was asked how he made that seamless transition and continued the success that had been established over the previous three seasons.

"This was a senior dominant team that had an understanding of what they wanted to accomplish," he said. "The coaching staff's job was to put them in a position to be successful. Add to that the players' intelligence and work ethic and it was an easy transition."

Coming into the season, knowing that University of Michigan commit, Elise Stuck would not be available following an injury sustained last summer, the coach was asked about how the staff went about rallying the team.

"When Elise hurt her knee the team had already given us their thoughts on the season," he said. "So we just talked about the opportunity each player now had to excel and help the team be successful. We knew that Elise had averaged 20 points and 11 rebounds per game. We talked about each player scoring a few more points

per game, getting one or two more rebounds a game. They knew it was doable."

Coach Sroufe was asked what he considered a "key" moment in the season, telling him that this would be a special year/team.

"I remember two (moments). The first was in the locker room after our first game of the season. We had lost to a good Manton team in their gym by three. The girls did not like to lose but they were positive because they knew they could have won that game," he said. "Sophomore Taylor Petrosky looked at her teammates and said: 'And everyone in Charlevoix thought we were going to Stink!'"

"The second was a game in St. Ignace early in February. We had lost to them badly earlier in our gym. We played a very good game, trailed by one, 24-23 at half eventually losing when we had trouble scoring in the 3rd quarter," he noted. "We did not lose again!"

Coach Sroufe also shared credit with assistant Mike Meriwether. "Mike coached with me all season, was instrumental in teaching the players how to play offense and was involved in all areas of our game planning. Coach Mike was a big part of the Lady Rayders success."

Congratulations to those student-athletes selected to the All-Area Team and a big "Thank You" to East Jordan Public Schools for the use of their gymnasium for the photoshoot and Athletic Director Phyllis Olszewski for helping make it possible.

MHSAA Cancels Remainder of 2019-20 Winter & Spring Seasons



The Michigan High School Athletic Association has canceled the remainder of the 2019-20 Winter and Spring sports seasons, in compliance with the Thursday (April 2) "state of disaster" directive by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer closing school buildings and moving education online for the remainder of the school year to help decrease the spread of the COVID-19 coronavirus. This will be the first school year to not see MHSAA Finals played in multiple sports since 1942-43, when World War II led to the elimination of Finals in most sports.

The MHSAA on March 12 suspended its girls and boys basketball, girls gymnastics, boys ice hockey and boys swimming & diving tournaments amid COVID-19 concerns. All activity in all sports was halted March 13. Spring sports to that point had begun practice, but not competition. The MHSAA's Representative Council approved during its Winter Meeting on March 27 a series of concepts for completing the Winter tournaments and an abbreviated Spring season, contingent on the lifting of a statewide quarantine. The closure of school buildings into June made those possibilities void. The MHSAA's Executive Committee, comprised of officers of the larger

Council, affirmed the decision today (April 3) to cancel the remainder of this school year. "We are heartbroken to not be able to provide these opportunities for Michigan's student-athletes, and especially seniors. We continue to hear from dozens asking us to hold out hope. But safety always must come first, and Governor Whitmer is making courageous decisions to safeguard the people of our state," MHSAA Executive Director Mark Uyl said. "We understand as much as anyone how much school sports mean to athletes and their communities. We had ideas and hopes for finishing Winter and Spring and helping bring some sort of normalcy after this long break. But this is the correct

decision, and we will play our part in bringing schools and communities together again when the time is right. "For now, we cannot state strongly enough that all students, staffs and others follow the guidelines established to slow the spread of this virus. All we all must do our part." Because the five Winter sports were not able to conclude with Finals, no champions will be awarded in those sports for 2019-20. However, championships won at earlier rounds of those tournaments (District or Regional) will continue to stand. The MHSAA will in coming weeks provide guidelines and other information pertinent to this unusual off-season as attention is turned to

preparing for Fall 2020. The MHSAA is a private, not-for-profit corporation of voluntary membership by more than 1,500 public and private senior high schools and junior high/middle schools which exists to develop common rules for athletic eligibility and competition. No government funds or tax dollars support the MHSAA, which was the first such association nationally to not accept membership dues or tournament entry fees from schools. Member schools which enforce these rules are permitted to participate in MHSAA tournaments, which attract more than 1.4 million spectators each year.
