Northern Michigan winters are a challenge for everyone but especially our aging adults. Slippery sidewalks and driveways in addition to the cold weather can cause a wide range of injuries and illnesses. Here are some tips to get you through the next few months.

Falls are a daily challenge for some of our aging adults and in the winter time these fall chances increase dramatically. Avoid slipping on the ice by making sure you wear shoes with good traction and non-skid soles if you have to go out. Be sure to replace a worn cane tip and walker pads too. Remember to take your snowy shoes off as soon as you go inside because as the snow melts it can leave water that becomes a slippery condition inside.

As cold temperatures can lead to frostbite and hypothermia dress warmly and in layers. Be sure to cover exposed skin with hats, gloves and scarves. You can even use your scarf to cover your mouth and protect your lungs from extreme cold.

Wintertime depression is also a concern as we all tend to go out less often, especially our aging adults. This can breed feelings of loneliness and isolation. Though family members can check on their aging family members, aging adults can also arrange a check in system with neighbors and friends where each person looks in on one another daily either in person or by phone.

If you have to go out and are considering driving, understand that your car needs to be as ready as you are. Be sure to get your care serviced before wintertime hits making sure the oil, tires, battery and wipers are in good shape for the winter

roads. Also, make sure you have antifreeze in your washer fluid and check the weather report beforehand to avoid driving in the worst winter conditions. Our aging adults may not drive as regularly as when they were younger and their reflexes may not be as quick as they once were so be sure to let someone know where you are going and when you will be back if you need to go out and avoid driving when possible by taking public transportation.

As a reminder, you don't have to go out to get meals from the Senior Centers. We have Disaster Meals that can be delivered once a week during this Pandemic to you and they include a hot meal and 6 frozens. If you do come for Curbside, get 2 hot meals so that you don't have to go out as often. These like our other meals are available for a \$3.00 donation for all Charlevoix **County Aging Adults 60** years old and older.

The COA is also partnering with Transit to help you order your groceries and get them delivered to your door set. Call Charlevoix County Transit for more information on this great new service. Transit will also pick up your prescriptions for you too!

# Snow Removal Program 2020-2021

The Charlevoix County Commission on Aging will once again be offering some limited support for snow removal for aging adult residents of Charlevoix County. The Commission will reimburse the provider who renders service to senior citizens (those 60 and older) up to the voucher total assigned to the household in TOTAL for any Snow Removal services: Snow Shoveling, Snow Blowing or Snow Plowing. Seniors choose their own providers. Providers must omplete a W9 before payment of services, if we have one already on file, you will not need to do this again. The intent of the program is to reimburse services that keep seniors independent and in their own homes. Those seniors who are age 60 or older will be required to complete an eligibility packet including the Snow Removal Self Declaration Form for the 2020/2021 season, provide proof of all income along with a copy of one of the following proofs of residency: A current MI photo ID with your Charlevoix County address on it; A copy of your paid property taxes for Charlevoix County or a copy of the current rental agreement. A completed packet will be the sole way of determining eligibility at this time. These packets will be handed out during curbside meal pickup times or you can contact the COA office to pick one up.

Once the senior has completed the packet and returned it to the COA office and eligibility has been determined the senior will receive a letter informing them that they are enrolled in the program along with the designated vouchers. If the eligible senior leaves their resident for a month or longer, they will not be eligible for the program until they return to the residence. Eligibility will be determined annually from the date of application.

The Commission will reimburse the contracted snow remover. Invoices will be reimbursed according to the date the work was performed and must be with in the Program Time frame of 11/1/20 – 3/31/21.

**Residency Requirements that need to be provided:** If you are a home owner: A current Michigan photo ID with your Charlevoix County address on it A copy of your paid property taxes for Charlevoix County The property owned must be your homestead or primary address

If you are a renter: A current Michigan photo ID with your Charlevoix County address on it A copy of your rental agreement will be required – Verbal Agreements do not qualify. Renters who are temporary or vacationing are not eligible

**Income Verification requirements that need to be provided:** All persons requesting to enroll must provide any of the following that apply to their particular situation.

A copy of your last year's Federal 1040 or 1040A income tax return (front page only) A copy of your annual Social Security Statement and any other source of income (If you are not required to file a tax return)

## MMAP Program Update - Open Enrollment begins October 15, 2020 through **December 7, 2020**

Kevin Clements is once again providing this service to Charlevoix County Seniors but it will be done differently this year. For an appointment please call 237-0103.

In light of the current health crisis caused by COVID 19, MMAP, Inc. has reviewed its policy and practices for providing in-person counseling to Medicare beneficiaries, their family members and caregivers. Because the people MMAP serves and many of our MMAP team members are most at risk for adverse outcomes if they contract COVID 19, MMAP, Inc. is suspending the use of in-person interactions with beneficiaries, their family members and caregivers, for the purpose of providing one-on-one counseling.

This policy was written in collaboration with the Aging and Adult Services Agency (AASA) and is in accord with the Administration for Community Living's (ACL) Volunteer Risk and Program Management guidelines for SHIP and SMP grantees.

Effective immediately all MMAP one-on-one counseling with beneficiaries, or their representatives, is to be provided by telephone, email, postal mail, or a web-based platform such as, ZOOM, MS Teams, Skype, etc.

# **Other Reminders:**

- Please bring exact change to the centers when paying for meals as we are not making change due to the spread of COVID-19 risk.
- Make sure you are getting your weekly information and activity packets with your meals - ask for one if you are not getting them for some reason as they contain current
  - information on things our aging adults need to know!
- PLEASE review and sign your NAPIS forms and get them back to the Site Coordinators for the 2020-21 year. These are a funding source for us and they make it possible to
- continue our meals! Ask your Site Coordinator for yours today if you have not completed

it yet.

iff's Department that will provide free, periodic wellness checks for aging residents of Beaver Island, aged sixty (60) and older due to the

limited resources on the island.
