

Heckler disrupts Boyne City Commission meeting

BOYNE CITY COMMISSION MARCH 22 MEETING

Boyne City - The Boyne City Commission March 22 meeting started with an outburst during a public comment in support of the marina expansion project and Commissioners supported the application of three more grants for the marina.

Mayor Hugh Conklin had to quell the dissenting heckler in the audience. "Is that appropriate behavior for someone to have in a public meeting? No, this is just what we're coming down to," he stated after he offered to eject the heckler who chose to leave the meeting while threatening the speaker.

City Manager Michael
Cain presented an opportunity to apply for three Michigan Department of Natural
Resources Waterways grants
that would support the marina expansion upgrades.
The grants that each require

a 50% match and must be submitted by April 1, would be for landside utilities in the amount of up to \$327,319 with a total cost of \$654,638, two floating wave attenuators in the amount of up to \$419,470, with a total cost of \$838,939. and the replacement of Dock E including utilities in the amount of up to \$824,621, with a total cost of \$1,649,242. "The vision for the community for nearly 20 years has been for significant replacement of the marina. It's been

in the last year and half or so that there's been much more in the way of community conversation about doing something different than what has been planned for these last 20 years," said Cain.

Harbormaster Barb
Brooks stated in her recommendation "Whether that vision remains the same or changes, the grants being recommended today should help us maintain and improve long term marina oper-

ations." A representative from Abonmarche Engineering was present via Zoom. Mike Morphey answered questions about how securing the grants could ease the city's share of the marina project. Mayor Conklin asked Morphey twice if there was any risk in applying for the grants and both times he stated that there was not. "None of this says we have to do any of it," said Cain. "We need to put the whole package together before we do anything. We've been told over and over there's no risk to the city to apply for these grants, I guess I don't see why we wouldn't at this point," said Commissioner George Lasater. Moody objected to the rushed timeline for the grant submittals. "I have no problem waiting until next April first," he said. Conklin stated that he was disappointed that the deadline was 'last minute.' A motion to approve the recommendation was made by Neidhamer, seconded by Lasater and passed with Moody and Nemecek voting against.



After a year in the planning, North Country Community Mental Health (NCCMH) hosted an intensive two-day Behavioral Health Partnership Training for first responders in Northern Michigan. Twenty law enforcement officers and EMS responders from four counties convened at the Kirtland Gaylord M-TEC on March 15-16.

The Behavioral Health
Emergency Partnership
(BHEP) training was designed to equip first responders with the tools they need to effectively recognize, respond, and mitigate a behavioral health emergency.

According to Carole Doherty, NCCMH Director of Crisis Services, "Peace officers in Michigan and across the nation are frequently called upon to manage incidents involving people with mental illness in crisis. Specialized training on the topic of mental health helps to prepare peace officers and other responders to resolve these incidents in a safe and effective manner. Officers learn to identify signs and symptoms of mental illnesses, and how to utilize a range of stabilization and de-escalation techniques, and they learn about disposition options, community

resources, and legal issues."

"The primary goals of behavioral health emergency trainings are to reduce injuries to first responders and the person experiencing a mental health crisis, and to appropriately redirect the person in crisis from the judicial system into the services and support they need,

and reduce future contact with police," said Doherty.

Joseph Reid, Executive Director of Broken People, shared his recovery journey and the need for officers to also take care of themselves. "I go through most days feeling broken and having thoughts of suicide. Being patient and caring is one of the most important things I would ask of you. Also, as first responders, you all have very tough jobs. I really encourage you all to find ways to take care of yourself. If you don't take care of you, you can't take care of me, and I

need you!"

with mental illness, at what is often some of the worst times in their lives. We look forward to providing a second training in Northern Michigan this May." Funding for the training

Funding for the training was provided by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Mental Health Diversion Council and the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES).

North Country Community Mental Health provides services to residents of Antrim, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Emmet, Kalkaska and Otsego Counties experiencing a serious mental illness, severe emotional problem, or intellectual/developmental disability, including individuals with co-occurring substance use disorder. This was his favorite hobby and he continued it into his nineties. He was a talented wood worker and made many fine furniture pieces for his home, and that of his children. He converted an old school bus into a camper and he and Carolyn took the family on summer vacations to Baja, Mexico, Washington DC and many points in between. He could fix most anything, seldom buying new parts. Instead, he'd scrounge around his shop and make do with

Verl retired from the Antrim County Road Commission after 31 years of dedicated service. A large part of his time was spent in the grader, and a road trip through Antrim County was always an opportunity for him to point out the different projects he had worked on. He took great pride in his work.



Peace on Earth

From 2017 through 2019, Northern Community Mediation (NCM) placed two peace banners in the Charlevoix and Emmet County libraries on a rotating basis during the holidays. Because of COVID, the peace banners were not distributed in 2020 and 2021.

During a recent staff meeting, the staff was discussing the horror of the situation in Ukraine. A light bulb went on in the head of Case Manager Karen Cole. Why not make use of the peace banners now? With the exception of one caveat, it took only minutes for Case Manager Laura Buckingham and Executive Director Jane Millar to make the decision to go forward with the idea. Rotating the two banners among the libraries, however, did not make sense. Therefore, it was decided that NCM would bite the bullet and pay to have four more banners made so that the message of peace could be displayed at six of the local libraries con-

Within half-an-hour, the Marketing Committee headed by Jenny Brower and Lisa Hoyt were in complete support of the idea, and within an hour the four additional banners were ordered and available for pick-up the next day. When contacted, all six library directors were pleased to be able to display the banners. And, within two days, all six banners were in the six libraries: Boyne City, Charlevoix, East Jordan, Harbor Springs, Pellston and Petoskey.

NCM asks that you take the time to go to your library, look at the peace banner and reflect upon what is happening in our world, specifically Ukraine.

This service is intended only for individuals unable to travel to an established vaccine location—the Office of **Emergency Management** schedules appointments for home visits. The Johnson & Johnson single-dose vaccination shots will be given during these visits. Please note that EMS paramedics will not show up at your residence in an ambulance but another fully equipped vehicle. Paramedics will be prepared to provide medical service immediately in the rare event of an adverse reaction to the shot. They would dispatch an ambulance only if one is needed for transporting a patient to the hospital. Persons who are homebound or otherwise unable to travel but want a vaccine are encouraged to contact **Emergency Management at** 231-541-4461 (Sheriff's Dept Office Line) to schedule an appointment.

5. Protect yourself during travel.


When to Wear a Well-Fitting Mask

Governor Whitmer Announces Michiganders to Receive Additional Assistance in March to Lower the Cost of Groceries

LANSING, Mich. - Governor Gretchen Whitmer today announced all Michigan families who are eligible for food assistance benefits will receive at least an additional \$95 monthly payment in March to help lower the cost of groceries and ensure Michiganders can keep more of their hardearned money. The additional assistance will help approximately 1.31 million Michiganders in more than 700,000 households.

"Michiganders will receive additional assistance to put food on the table in March as we continue growing our economy," said Governor Gretchen Whitmer. "This relief ensures that families can thrive and help us build on our economic momentum. We will continue collaborating with our federal partners to get things done by lowering out-of-pocket food costs and put money in people's pockets with our proposals to roll back the retirement tax, triple the Earned Income Tax Credit, and lower the cost of gas."

In April 2020, some Michigan residents began receiving additional food assistance under this program. In May 2021, all eligible households began getting extra monthly benefits. Federal approval is necessary every month.

Eligible clients will see addi-

tional food assistance benefits on their Bridge Card from March 19-28. These benefits will be loaded onto Bridge Cards as a separate payment from the assistance that is provided earlier in the month.

All households eligible for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) receive an increase of at least \$95 monthly, even if they are already receiving the maximum payment or are close to that amount. Households that received over \$95 to bring them to the maximum payment for their group size will continue to receive that larger amount.

Below are the maximum allowable benefits for SNAP customers based on their respective household size:

- One Person: \$250
- Two Persons: \$459
- Three Persons: \$658
- Four Persons: \$835 Five Persons: \$992
- Six Persons: \$1,190
- Seven Persons: \$1,316 Eight Persons: \$1,504

The federal government is providing additional funding to states for food assistance under House Resolution 6201, the Families First

Coronavirus Response Act. Eligible families do not need to

re-apply to receive the additional benefits. People who receive food assistance can check their benefits balance on their Michigan Bridge Card by going online to www.michigan.gov/MIBridges or calling a consumer service representative toll-free at 888-678-8914. They can ask questions about the additional benefits

Governor Gretchen Whitmer outlined her priorities to save Michigan drivers, seniors, and working families money. The More for MI Money Plan builds on proposals announced by the governor during her 2022 State of the State address to eliminate the retirement tax on seniors and triple the tax credit for working families and temporarily pausing the state sales tax on gas.

Retirement Tax Repeal: Governor Whitmer is proposing a repeal of the retirement tax, which

would save half a million households an average of \$1,000 a year. By the end of 2024, Governor Whitmer's proposal would again exempt public pensions and restore deductions for private retirement income, including private-sector pensions, withdrawals from individual retirement accounts (IRAs). and the portion of a 401k account that is subject to an employer match. Dear Dave,

My husband and I are getting a divorce, and everything will be final in less than a month. I haven't worked outside the home

in a few years, but according to the terms of the divorce I'll receive \$75,000 in cash on the day the divorce is finalized. I also have about \$5,000 in debt on a credit card I am responsible for paying. Other than that, I have no debt. Can you give me some advice for moving forward in my life?

Starla

Dear Starla,

I'm truly sorry to hear you're going through this. If you're not already connected to a good church, I hope you'll consider finding one. Having caring people of faith around you in times like this can help a lot.

The credit card debt is a small part of your financial picture right now. Still, my advice is to go ahead and pay it off as soon as you receive the settlement money. That way, you'll be completely debt-free and still have \$70,000 in the bank.

There's a little bit of a catch, though. You'll need to live for a while like that money isn't there. Use just enough to get yourself settled somewhere else, if that's a consideration, and then start looking for a job so you can eat and pay the utilities. There are tons of places hiring right now, and the money's decent, so it shouldn't be too hard to start generating a regular income soon.

If you'll do this, that big chunk of cash will still be sitting there a year from now when the pain of the divorce has lessened a bit. At

that point, you'll be stronger and more emotionally and mentally ready to think about the future and make real plans.

And if you haven't already, cut up that credit card and close the account. The last thing you need right now is an avenue to more debt. God bless you, Starla.



Rep. Borton: Despite big talk, governor vetoes tax cut for working families, seniors

State Rep. Ken Borton, R-Gaylord, today issued the following statement after Gov. Gretchen Whitmer vetoed a bipartisan plan to cut taxes for working families, seniors and small businesses:

"Northorn Michigan resi

"Northern Michigan residents deserve tax relief.
That's why I proudly voted to help workers keep more of their wages and seniors keep more of their retirement benefits. In fact, both Republicans and Democrats in the Legislature voted to cut taxes for families across our state, but the governor rejected our bipartisan plan.

"This veto stands in direct contrast to the sentiments Gov. Whitmer expressed only a few short weeks ago in her State of the State address, when she expressed support for tax relief for working families and retirees. The governor may talk a big game about bipartisanship and tax cuts, but her actions speak louder than her words."

Senate Bill 768, which earned bipartisan support in the Legislature, would have provided an estimated \$2.5 billion in tax relief. The plan would have reduced the individual income tax rate from 4.25% to 3.9%; allowed families to claim a child tax credit of up to \$500 per dependent under 19; enabled seniors to exempt an additional \$20,000 of retirement income for individuals or \$40,000 for joint filers; and lowered the age for the senior income exemption from 67 to 62.

Rep. Borton, colleagues introduce sunshine government reforms

New proposal builds on previous plans to increase transparency, ethics

In the middle of Sunshine Week, state Rep. Ken Borton and fellow House legislators today introduced legislation to make government more accessible, transparent, and accountable to the people of Michigan.

House Bills 5921-5929 would bolster transparency for campaign and lobbying expenses, heighten ethical standards for public officials, and expedite government records requests. Borton, R-Gaylord, is the lead sponsor on HB 5927, which would prevent lobbyist-sponsored vacations for state lawmakers. He cosponsored the other bills in the package.

"Public servants should be held to the highest ethical standards," Borton said. "Avoiding conflicts of interest that cloud the judgment is a must. Preventing legislators from taking complimentary vacations on a lobbyist's dime will provide a wall of separation against potential conflicts."

The plan comes in addition to two bipartisan packages of legislation that Borton supported in the House last year, which are currently before the Senate. One would allow citizens to request records from the Legislature and the governor's office, which are both currently excluded from the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). The other would increase ethics requirements for public officials, including by mandating disclosure of financial interests by legislators and top executive branch officials. "An open government is an accountable government," Borton said. "Citizens are the core of our system of government, and transparency makes true accountability possible. This Sunshine Week, we should continue to open up our government to the people we serve. The Senate should finally approve our House ini-

tiatives to expand transparency laws and tighten

ethical guidelines."
Borton's bill would prohibit lobbyists from paying for a legislator's travel or lodging expenses. Legislators would also not be permitted to solicit travel or lodging for themselves or immediate family members.

immediate family members. Other highlights of the overall plan include:

Stronger transparency for lobbying and campaign spending: On top of existing disclosure requirements for expenses incurred while lobbying legislators, the plan would require lobbyists to report expenditures related to lobbying partisan staff in the Legislature, who work closely with lawmakers. A new, easily searchable online database would detail lobbying expenses for food, beverage, travel, and lodging. The plan would also establish stricter guidelines for campaign finance reports, requiring officials and candidates to provide greater detail about campaign expenditures.

• Stricter ethical standards for officials and candidates: In addition to Borton's bill preventing lobbyist-sponsored vacations, the plan would prohibit officials and candidates from paying their immediate family members from campaign accounts.

· Swifter disclosure of public records: The plan would streamline bureaucratic processes that frequently slow down requests for public records under FOIA. Public bodies would be required to clearly post the name and contact information of their FOIA coordinator, accept electronic payments for documents requested under FOIA, and acknowledge that a record exists even if it is exempt from FOIA. If a FOIA request is denied, the plan would require a public body to bring up all reasons for denial at the time of the denial. It would also clarify that a public body cannot shield documents from FOIA by handing them over to legal counsel.

Sunshine Week is recognized in March each year to highlight the importance of open, honest government. This year, the occasion is observed March 13-19.


line for the main event.





NORWOOD TOWNSHIP Amendment of the Short- term Rental Licensing Ordinance

Ordinance No. 2 of 2022

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE NORWOOD TOWNSHIP SHORT-TERM RENTAL LICENSING ORDINANCE

NORWOOD TOWNSHIP HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amendment of Section 3.

Section 3 of the Norwood Township Short-term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add the following definitions in their appropriate alphabetical locations, which new definitions shall read in their entirety as follows:

"Cap" means the limit on the number of short-term rental licenses that may be issued by the Township each year, as established by resolution of the Township Board beginning on or before the first Township Board meeting in April 2023, and on or before the first Township Board meeting in April in subsequent years.

Recreational Unit: Means a tent or vehicular-type structure, primarily designed as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use, which either has its own motive power or is mounted on or drawn by another vehicle which is self-powered. A tent means a collapsible shelter of canvas or other fabric stretched and sustained by poles and used for camping outdoors. Recreational unit includes the following:

- 1. A travel trailer, which is a vehicular portable structure, mounted on wheels, of such a size or weight as not to require special highway movement permits when drawn by a vehicle, primarily designed and constructed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use.
- 2. A camping trailer, which is a vehicular portable structure mounted on wheels and constructed with collapsible partial sidewalls of fabric, plastic, or other pliable material which fold for towing by another vehicle and unfold at the campsite to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use.
- 3. A motor home, which is a vehicular structure built on a self-propelled motor vehicle chassis, primarily designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use.
- 4. A truck camper, which is a portable structure designed to be loaded onto, or affixed to, the bed or chassis of a truck, constructed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use. Truck campers are of 2 basic types:
- 5. A single sectional mobile home used only to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use. Recreational unit does not include a mobile home used as a permanent dwelling, residence, or living quarters.

Section 2. Amendment of Section 3.

The definition of "Short-term rental" within Section 3 of the Norwood Township Short-term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

"Short-term Rental" means a dwelling unit, or portions thereof, that is available for use or is used for accommodations or lodging of guests, paying a fee or other compensation, for a period of less than 30 days at a time. A recreational unit may not be used as a short-term rental.

Section 3. Amendment to add new Sections.

The Norwood Township Short-term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add new Sections 4a and 4b, which new sections shall read in their entirety as follows:

Section 4a. Limitation on Number of Short-term Rentals.

The cap on the number of short-term rentals allowed within Norwood Township shall be no more than as established by the Township Board annually – currently fifteen (15).

Section 4b. Time for Filing Application.

Due to the limited number of short-term rentals permitted under this Ordinance, when a short-term rental license(s) becomes available and the Township desires to accept applications for the short-term rental license(s), the Zoning Administrator shall publish a notice in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township specifying a 45-day period during which the Township will accept applications for a short-term rental license(s) under this Ordinance.

Section 4. Amendment of Section 5(d).

Section 5(d) of the Norwood Township Short-term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

(d) Complete application. The Zoning Administrator shall within ten (10) business days after an application is filed review the application and information submitted to

determine if all required information was supplied and if the required fee has been paid (i.e., whether the application is administratively complete). The Zoning Administrator shall note the date and time each application is determined to be administratively complete. Each application that is administratively complete shall be valid for one (1) year from the date the Zoning Administrator determines it is administratively complete. If the Zoning Administrator determines that all required information was not supplied, he or she shall send written notification to the applicant specifying the deficiencies. If the deficiencies are not corrected within fourteen (14) days of the notice from the Zoning Administrator, then the application shall be deemed administratively incomplete and shall be deemed withdrawn and/or may be denied by the Zoning Administrator on that basis.

Section 5. Amendment to add new section.

The Norwood Township Short- term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add a new Sections 5a, which new section shall read in its entirety as follows:

Section 5a. Excess of Administratively Complete Applications; Procedures; Waiting List.

- (a) If the Zoning Administrator determines that there administratively complete applications in excess of the short-term rental cap, then the Zoning Administrator shall prioritize the applications based on the following (in the order of priority):
 - (1) Whether the applicant; any officer, director, and managerial employee of the applicant; and any person who holds any direct or indirect ownership interest in the applicant has ever been delinquent in township or other municipal property taxes, state or federal income taxes, or any state or federal business taxes.
 - (2) The chronological order of when the Zoning Administrator determines that a filed application was administratively complete.
- (b) After being prioritized as provided in subsection (a) above, those applications remaining there are in excess of the short-term rental cap shall be placed on a waiting list in the same order as their priority status. If at the time an applicant on the waiting list is eligible to proceed with consideration of his, her, or its application and chooses not to proceed, then that application shall be removed from the waiting list.
- (c) The Zoning Administrator shall send a copy of his or her written decision to each excess applicant. Any excess applicant aggrieved by a decision of the Zoning Administrator under this section may appeal that decision to the Township Board as provided in Section 8a of this Ordinance.
- (d) Any applicant selected under this section shall then have his, her, or its applicant considered pursuant to the remaining requirements of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Amendment of Section 6.

Section 6 of the Norwood Township Short-term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add new subsections (g), (h), (l), and (j) which new subsections shall read in their entirety as follows:

- (g) No delinquent taxes. The applicant shall be current in all property taxes, state and federal income taxes, and state and federal business taxes.
- (h) Minimum rental period. Any short-term rental shall be for a minimum period of no less than five (5) days.
- (i) Ownership Limitation. A person applying for a short-term rental license under this Ordinance shall not hold any form of ownership or leasehold interest in more than one (1) short-term rental within the township. In addition, a person applying for a short-term rental license under this Ordinance, including an individual and any entity included in the definition of a person, shall not hold any form of ownership interest in any other firm, corporation, association, partnership, limited liability company, or other legal entity when that other firm, corporation, association, partnership, limited liability company, or other legal entity already owns any form of ownership or leasehold interest in a short-term rental within the township.
- (j) Unauthorized advertisements. No person shall advertise a short-term rental for which a short-term rental license has not been issued under this Ordinance.

Section 7. Amendment to add new section.

The Norwood Township Short- term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add a new Sections 6a, which new section shall read in its entirety as follows:

Section 6a. Duration of License; Renewal.

A license issued under this ordinance shall remain in effect for a period of one (1) year from the date it was issued.

The license holder or local agent may request the renewal of a license upon submitting an application for such renewal to the Zoning Administrator and the payment of the renewal fee, as determined from time to time by the Township Board.

All information submitted with the prior application(s) shall be deemed submitted with the application for renewal. The license holder or local agent shall only be required to submit new information with the application for renewal when that application information has changed since the last application was filed.

A renewal license for a short-term rental shall be issued when all of the standards and regulations then in effect in Section 6 of this Ordinance are met and the Zoning Administrator has determined that there has not been a pattern of substantial violations of the standards and regulations of Section 6 of this Ordinance related to the short-term rental for which a renewed license is sought within the past one (1) year license period.

A current licensee aggrieved by a decision of the Zoning Administrator under this section may appeal that decision to the Township Board as provided in Section 8a of this Ordinance.

Section 8. Amendment of Section 8.

Section 8 of the Norwood Township Short-term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add new subsections (f) and (g), which new subsections shall read in their entirety as follows:

- (f) Existing contracts. Existing short-term rental contracts up to 60 days beyond the beginning date of any suspension/revocation may be honored by the license holder with approval by the Township Board. Those existing contracts beyond 60 days shall be canceled. The time period approved to honor existing contracts shall be added to the end of any suspension period.
- (g) Fraudulent complaints. Any person who knowingly files a fraudulent, false, or fictitious complaint about a short-term rental shall be deemed to be in violation of this Ordinance and may be subject to court enforcement proceedings and the penalties under Section 9(a) of this Ordinance.

Section 9. Amendment to add new section.

The Norwood Township Short- term Rental Licensing Ordinance is hereby amended to add a new Sections 8a, which new section shall read in its entirety as follows:

Section 8a. Appeal.

Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Zoning Administrator under Section 5a(d) or Section 6a(e) of this Ordinance may appeal that decision to the Township Board following the procedures of the Norwood Township Zoning Ordinance, as amended, for appeals to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Any such appeal shall be filed within thirty (30) days from the date of the decision from which the appeal is taken. During the appeal, the Township Board shall conduct a de novo hearing of the matter and to that end shall have all the powers of the Zoning Administrator. In rendering its decision, the Township Board shall receive and consider evidence and data relevant to the case and shall issue its decision in writing within a reasonable period of time after receiving all evidence and data in the case. The decision of the Township Board shall then be sent promptly to the applicant, to the person who filed the appeal (if different than the applicant), and to the Zoning Administrator.

Section 10. Severability.

If any section, clause, or provision of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, said declaration shall not affect the remainder of the ordinance. The Township Board hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each part, section, subsection, phrase, sentence and clause irrespective of the fact that any one or more parts, sections, subsections, phrases, sentences or clauses be declared invalid.

Section 11. Effective date.

This Ordinance shall become effective the day following its publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township.

Making your Home more Energy Efficient

Proper insulation on the attic and walls make it more energy-efficient. Proper insulation slows down the heat that flows out of your home in winter or summer, thus less energy is needed to cool or heat your home. 





- If you test **POSITIVE** with the QuickVue Át-Home COVID-19 Test you should self-isolate and seek follow-up care with your healthcare provider as additional testing may be necessary.
