Have You Been Wondering What YOU Can DO to Help the People of Ukraine?

As of March 21, the UN estimates that there are around 3.5 million refugees that have fled Ukraine with an estimated 6.48 million people being internally displaced. The need is so great, it is easy to feel helpless. However, there IS something that we can do!

On Sunday, April 3, at 10:30 AM, we are planning a very special service to celebrate and support Ukraine. The service will feature authentic Ukrainian music played by none other than our dear Ukrainian friend Iuliia Fetysenko, one of Northern Michigan's finest violinists. A Native Ukrainian, Iuliia started to play the violin at age 5. During her school years, she performed solo pieces and concertos with several Ukrainian symphonic and chamber orchestras and took part in different Ukrainian competitions.

Gifts made to UCC Ukraine Relief Fund will provide shelter, food, and other care to war refugees and internally displaced people. It also will help refugees and asylum seekers from African, the Middle East, and other countries who had sought refuge in Ukraine and now are twice displaced, as well as other citizens of more than 125 countries living in Ukraine. In addition to Iuliia's performance, all our prayers that morning will focus on Ukraine, and we hope to take a special offering that morning that will go to the United Church of Christ's Emergency Relief Fund for Ukraine, which provides humanitarian support for the Ukrainian refugees at the border as they flee their war-torn homeland. A family of six in Boyne City appreciates all the help from the community after their house caught on fire. In the evening of March 15, 2022, the historic 214 State Street "Boyne City Hospital" of 1902 had a very severe, disastrous fire. This has displaced the Lewis family - Devon, Jody, and

their four children. Devon is the most hard-working, dedicated worker and father. He has tirelessly worked to give the best life

he can to his family, and he and Jody are in very much need of clothing for them and their children in the Boyne school district.

The kids did not appear even to have the time to get their coats as they were taken out of bed immediately around 10 PM. Each one of them will need coats and boots to return to school as soon as possible.

They have lost everything and have only the clothes on their backs. Devon was hit last week from a car that couldn't stop in the intersection to 31 HWY while he was driving to work, and a wood chipper truck hit his work trailer and truck. They have had an unbelievably difficult time, and despite his best efforts to keep his head up and go to work every day, they have lost everything as a family besides the clothes on their backs and their lives. If anybody I have ever known deserves an outpour of community help when in need, it is this family.

along with living supplies. Neighbors thanked the Boyne City Fire Department for a speedy response to a fire that destroyed a historic home at 214 State Street Tuesday night. Everyone in the house was safe, and no neighboring homes were damaged. Anne Jeffery Payne sent posted some pictures on Facebook with this note: "I captured these images of the fire departments doing an amazing job and thought they would like to view them.



They are true heroes!" The mother, Jody Kapanke, says that the family nearly lost everything, even their family pet, and says they're struggling to get their life back to normal. "It's scary to go through something like that, and then for it to be so intense, and how the fire went so fast, and all my kids were in there sleeping... it's hard," said Kapanke. Despite everything, Kapanke says she's amazed by the strength shown from her children, partner, and the community.

Wilma Bolhuis, 105 (MARCH 9, 1917 - MARCH 23, 2022)



Wilma Bolhuis of Ellsworth died March 23, 2022 at Meadow Brook Medical Care Facility in Bellaire. She was born on the Groenink farm in Banks Township on March 9, 1917, the first of Martin and Winifred (Burggraaff) Groenink's six children.

Wilma attended Bentley Hill School, K-8, worked for her Uncle Hubert and Aunt Rose Bearss while attending 9th grade in Benzonia, was orchard boss at Fairman Orchards, and worked for her board and room in Ellsworth while completing high school. After a rollicking senior skip day, she graduated as salutatorian in 1934.

Wilma worked for her tuition, room and board and graduated from Western State Teachers' College in Kalamazoo in 1936. For ten ears she taught at Pleasant Hill and Mitchell Country Schools, Central Lake and Ellsworth Public Schools, and later did substitute teaching in Ellsworth and at Ebenezer Christian School. Wilma taught during the Great Depression but said, "We didn't realize there was a Depression. Everybody was in the same boat." As a country school teacher, Wilma skillfully built the fire (easy on the wood pile), played the piano for singing, did recess duty and janitor work, fulfilled state requirements and filed timely reports with the County Superintendent. Wilma wrote "Country School Days" for Banks Township Historical Society, detailing life and learning in the country school system. She wrote, "The little ones learned from the older ones, and the older ones' learning was reinforced by helping the younger ones. Students and teachers became a community... learned cooperation and built self esteem through a variety of skills... But rural schools were isolated. There was no telephone. In the winter the roads were not plowed. You were left to your own resources. If a child got sick, you cleaned it up.' Wilma became engaged to Fred Bolhuis shortly after he was drafted into the Army in 1942. When Fred returned, they were married in Chicago on November 8, 1945. In 1946, they bought their farm on Pleasant Hill Road. They were blessed with three children. Besides substitute

teaching, Wilma washed the milking machines, tended a large garden and did canning and freezing. She enjoyed baking bread and date-filled cookies.

In 1989, Wilma and Fred retired from farming and moved into Ellsworth. She enjoyed grandparenting, gardening, going for rides, taking long walks, picking cherries, making applesauce, playing Rumikub, and watching birds, squirrels, rabbits and deer. She enjoyed high school class reunions and Pleasant Hill School reunions where she was honored by the students whose lives and community she had helped to shape.

Wilma was a member of the Ellsworth Christian Reformed Church where she taught Sunday School and led the Coffee Break Bible Study. She was an honored member of the Antrim County Farm Bureau Women, volunteered at Meadow Brook Medical Care Facility, served on the Zoning Commission and worked as an election official.

Surviving are her children Ardith (Jack) Tornga, Celia (John) Hastings, and Roger (Sarah) Bolhuis; grandchildren Paul Hastings, Scott Tornga and Ed Boh; greatgrandchildren Grant Hastings, Jake Hastings, Mick Hastings and Eddie Boh, nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband Fred on October 19, 2020, by her parents and her siblings Annalane (Bernie) Maurer, John (Alberta) Groenink, Milton (Kitty) Groenink, Marvin Groenink, and infant brother Robert Lee Groenink.

Visitation will be held on Friday, April 1, 2022 from 6 to 8 p.m. at Ellsworth Christian Reformed Church. A service of thanksgiving for God's grace in Wilma's life will be held at the Church on Saturday, April 2 at 1:00 p.m. with the Rev. There was no other place she would rather be than watching them compete; their biggest fan and greatest support, she was so proud of them all. She lived for her children and grandchildren and dedicated her life to the love she built with her husband on the family farm. She will be dearly missed! The East Jordan Fire Department also arrived to help contain the fire from spreading to nearby homes.



NORTHERN MICHIGAN OUTDOORS **Positively Possums**

One of the most maligned and misunderstood mammals in Michigan are possums. Yet, in reality, they are very beneficial animals. Here are some terrific tidbits about these harmless, somewhat hairless, and hardy helpers:

You say Possum, I say Opossum: In true linguistically illogical form both possum and opossum correctly refer to the Virginia opossum found in Michigan and large swaths of North America. In common use, possum is the usual term; in technical or scientific contexts opossum is preferred. Opossum can be pronounced with its first syllable either voiced or silent. To confuse the situation further, there is a critter who is properly called a possum. It's a small arboreal marsupial that inhabits Australia and New Guinea. For consistency, in this piece I'll refer to these marvelous marsupials as, 'possums.' The Name Game: The scientific name of the possum is Didelphis virginiana. The genus Didelphis is derived from Ancient Greek and translates to di, meaning "two", and delphus, meaning "womb." (Their unusual reproductive anatomy will be explained more later.) The species name harkens from the area in which it was first scientifically identified in 1792. Accordingly, the animals are often called Virginia possums and in some regions they're coined North American possums. The common name, opossum, comes from native Algonquin tribe's vernacular and loosely translates to, "small, white animal." Tail of the Tape: Possums are cat-sized mammals with grey fur and a white face. They average 21-36 inches long and tip the scales at 8-15 pounds. Possums also sport a long, pointy snout, round black eyes, a plump pink nose, hairless ears, and a substantial leathery tail spanning over 1/3 of its total body length. Short Span: Possums have an extremely ephemeral life expectancy of only 1-2 years in the wild. Specimens have lived up to four years in captivity. Toothy Tendencies: Possums have more teeth than any other North American mammal. In fact, they possess a very full jaw supporting 50 teeth! Because of their large,

numerous canines you get the impression that's the only tooth type they have. In reality, they feature several incisors and molars.

Range Rovers: Possums originated in tropical regions and are the only marsupials found north of Mexico. Their flexible diets, urban adaptability, and reproductive habits make them successful colonizers and survivors in diverse locations and conditions. They now inhabit all areas of the US except for the Great Plains and Rocky Mountain regions. There are over 100 separate species of possums worldwide.

Saviors Statements: There are several licensed rehabbers in our state who take possums. Two in SE Michigan that I interviewed were Jenni Nuss and Lee Kurche. These ladies are extremely dedicated and knowledgeable about saving possums. Frequently they even need to run a tiny feeding tube into the stomachs of helpless joeys that have been rescued! Nuss, also known as the Possum Queen, has been doing this selfless job for over 35 years and when asked why she does it she said, "It's a passion and a calling. I enjoy caring for and releasing these helpful animals!" Diverse Diet: Possums are opportunistic omnivores who eat essentially anything they can find. Therefore, they rid areas of pest species including destructive rodents, insects, grubs, and ticks. Expert possum rehabber, Nuss, said, "without them our forest floors would be a mess with carcasses, harmful insects, and many more undesirable items." Tasty Ticks: Adding to their beneficial credentials the National Wildlife Federation reports that each possum can consume up to 5,000 potentially harmful ticks per season! Playing Possum: Possums, when confronted with a threat, exhibit a behavior known as "playing possum" or "playing dead." If a predator approaches they will first hiss and bare their teeth. But if they are surprised by a predator, possums may literally faint and become unconscious. It's a stress-induced response and the possum has no control over it. They mimic the appearance and smell of a sick or dead animal. The lips are drawn back, teeth are

bared, saliva foams around the mouth, and a foulsmelling fluid is secreted from the anal glands. Most of the time this crazy combination

Functional, Funky Feet: Other than primates, possums possess the only opposable thumbs in the class Mammalia. They are found on

Winter Wanderers: Possums are solitary and nocturnal animals. In winter they may den for a few days to escape the cold, but need to feed periodically and don't hibernate. Sometimes they'll change their nocturnal habits and feed during daylight hours to take advantage of warmer temperatures.

Prehensile Power: Possums are one of only a handful of animals with prehensile tails. They sometimes employ this appendance to carry items or to grip the sides of trees to provide stability for climbing. Baby possums can even use their tails to hang from branches upside down, although they are only strong enough to hold them for a short while.

Roadkill Rescues: Because baby possums can live for up to two days after mom has been hit by a car, it's important to check road killed individuals to see if any joeys are in the pouch. Later in life, babies will sometimes fall off of the mom's back and, depending on the situation, may be left behind. If you find a possum joey in either situation. please call a local rehabber. You can find a list of licensed rehabilitators at www2.dnr.state.mi/us. Memory Minded: Possums have incredible memories-at least when it comes to food. Researchers found that they are better at remembering which path led to a delicious dish than cats, dogs, or pigs. Possums can also recall the smell of toxic substances up to a year after first experiencing them. Snakes Alive: Possums are immune to the venom of most snakes, including copperheads, cottonmouths, and rattlesnakes. They produce a protein that binds to the toxins and neutralizes them. Studies are in the works to synthesize the proteins for use as an anti-venom. Parting Plea: While possums may not win a Most Beautiful Animal pageant, please do not harm or kill them. As mentioned previously, they are harmless and highly helpful animals. Those are some of the bizarre, yet beneficial, beatitudes about those unique and ubiquitous possums. With good fortune you will encounter one in the woods and waters of the Wolverine State!

wards off any wannabe diner.

Peculiar "Plumbing": Adding to the litany of unusual characteristics, possums also possess verv unique genitalia. For example, females have two vaginal canals and two uteri! Accordingly, and like many other marsupials, males possess a bifid (or two headed) penis.

Pouch Potatoes: When baby possums, that are called joeys, are born they are the size of a bumblebee! Unlike most mammals the joeys do not have the ability to suckle, instead each elongated teat actually extends into the baby's stomach. The release of milk is like a drawstring. Possum litters may consist of 25 young, but a female has only 13 nipples. If the baby possum doesn't fasten to a functioning nipple, it dies. The lucky survivors stay attached for 50 to 70 days. After this, they stay in the den or ride around on their mother's back. After approximately 120 days the young depart to live the life of a solitary possum, a transition that 60 percent do not survive. Combating this high mortality rate is their ability to have two litters per breeding season.

Rarely Rabid: Although folks sometimes equate their rat-like appearance and formidable canines with other rabies carrying creatures. possums very rarely carry the debilitating disease. Their comparatively low body temperature does not harbor rabies-causing viruses. Possums are also not ferocious biters and even the ones we visited who had been rescued did not bite when being picked up.

Mommy Myth: A particularly wacky myth about possums is the once-common view that they give birth out of their nostrils! It's because the mothers lick their pouch and surrounding areas before giving birth, sometimes making a sneezing sound when they do. Observers apparently then peered into the pouch, saw newly born young possums and hypothesized they were delivered from the nose!

Happy Habitats: Possums prefer deciduous woodlands with nearby sources of water but are extremely adaptable and succeed in a variety of habitats. They don't build their own dens preferring to take shelter in abandoned animal burrows, hollow logs. brush piles, and other abodes.

Cold Feet: Having originated in tropical climates possum's are better adapted to the warmer climes of the U.S. Many were introduced by humans to northern states and the west coast. Unlike some other mid-sized mammals think raccoons, red foxes, and coyotes - opossums don't have furry, protective tails. In fact, their tails, ears, and feet are hairless, making them particularly susceptible to frostbite and even hypothermia. Many Michigan possums bear the physical evidence of surviving harsh winters on their ears, tails, and feet. Their tails often appear stumpy or as if something had bitten them off, but these are signs that they were lost due to frostbite

FISHING New fishing license season begins April 1

For anglers eager to hit the water, a reminder that Michigan's new license season – the 2022 fishing license season – starts Friday, April 1. Licenses for the 2022 season are valid through March 31, 2023, and can be purchased at

Michigan.gov/DNRLicenses. Anyone buying a fishing license online will have the opportunity to sign up for auto-renewal through the DNR eLicense system.


Last month, the DNR announced upcoming regulation changes adopted by the Michigan Natural Resources Commission. One notable change is the expansion of underwater spearfishing opportunities that will now include the chance to harvest additional species.

Starting April 1, underwater spearfishing for walleye, northern pike and lake trout has been added for Lake Michigan (waters south of the southernmost pier at Grand Haven) and Lake Huron (waters south of the southernmost pier of the Thunder Bay River, extending south to the mouth of the St. Clair River [Fort Gratiot Light]).

This opportunity requires a new underwater spearfishing license along with monthly effort and harvest reporting requirements. The underwater spearfishing license is complimentary, unless a DNR Sportcard is needed, and will be available only online at Michigan.gov/DNRLicenses. See page 16 of the 2022 fishing guide (available on the DNR guides and digests page) for more on this spearfishing opportunity.

Everyone planning to fish is encouraged to periodically review the digital version of the fishing guide for regulation updates throughout the 2022 fishing season. For tips on getting started, choosing locations, targeting different species and other "how to" information, visit Michigan.gov/Fishing.





The monthly cash value benefit for fruits and vegetables will remain at the following increased amounts through September 2022:

THE CITY OF EAST JORDAN ORDAINS:

The Zoning Code for the City of East Jordan is hereby amended as follows:

Original: Chapter 46 Zoning, Article III District Regulations, Division 4, R-2 Duplex-Family Residential District here by removed in its entirety

DIVISION 4. R-2 DUPLEX-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

Sec. 46-294. Purpose.

The purpose of the R-2 Duplex-Family Residential District is to provide for relatively small and less expensive type of housing, as well as a broader range of choice of housing types to people who desire to live in the city in small condominium, owner or rental units, and their normal accessory uses which are compatible, supportive or convenient to the residents living within such a district. The buildings containing the dwelling units may be in a single duplex or group building arrangements having group use facilities held in common to which all residents have equal access and share equally in the financing or operation and maintenance. These developments will only be allowed to develop if they can be connected to a public water supply system and public wastewater sanitary sewer system. The provisions of this division apply to the R-2 Duplex-Family Residential District.

(Code 2009, § 48-264; Ord. No. 142, § 6.01, 2-6-1990)

Sec. 46-295. Permitted principal uses.

Permitted principal uses are as follows:

- (1) Duplex family dwelling structures.
- (2) State-licensed residential facilities housing six or fewer persons.

(Code 2009, § 48-265; Ord. No. 142, § 6.02, 2-6-1990)

Sec. 46-296. Permitted principal special uses with conditions.

The following special uses of land, buildings and structures are permitted subject to the provisions of article V of this chapter:

(1) The following shall be permitted special uses:

accessory uses and activities specific to approved special uses, with the additional approval of the state department of environmental quality or other public agency when required.

(Code 2009, § 48-267; Ord. No. 142, § 6.04, 2-6-1990)

Sec. 46-298. Permitted accessory uses with conditions.

Permitted accessory uses with conditions are as follows:

- (1) Private swimming pools and other types of pools as a part of a duplex family housing development when a condominium or single ownership project exceeds four dwelling units, for use in common by all residents shall be in conformance with the provisions of section 46-718.
- (2) At least one common open space recreation area with facilities equal to at least 25 percent of the total area of the lot or parcel shall be set aside and developed as a part of the duplexfamily housing development, when a condominium or single ownership project exceeds four dwelling units for use in common by all residents.
- (3) Drives and off-street parking areas shall be in accordance with section 46-300(3) and (4).
- (4) Recreation, meeting and other group activity facilities located in buildings or as a part of a structure developed as a part of the duplexfamily housing project shall be made available for the common use and enjoyment by all residents.

- (8) Floor area requirements. Minimum standards for total floor area for each type of duplex family dwelling unit shall be as follows:
 - a. Efficiency: 450 square feet.
 - b. One bedroom: 600 square feet.
 - c. Two bedrooms: 750 square feet.
 - d. Three bedrooms: 900 square feet.
 - e. Each additional bedroom: 100 square feet.
- (9) Number of duplex-family dwelling units per building. No duplex-family residential structure shall contain more than two dwelling units.

(Code 2009, § 48-269; Ord. No. 142, § 6.06, 2-6-1990)

Sec. 46-300. Location and site development requirements.

Location and site development requirements are as follows:

- All duplex-family dwelling units shall be connected to the available public water supply system and wastewater sanitary sewer system on a permanent basis.
- (2) Open space shall comprise at least 25 percent of the total gross area of the project. At least one area of this open space shall be planned and built as a common open space recreation facility, shall comprise at least 25 percent of the total required minimum open space, and be operated and maintained by the developer or a nonprofit association representing the property owners and financed by means of a monthly or annual assessment for the benefit and use by the occupants of the duplexes in the project.

- a. Public buildings on at least two acres of land area.
- b. Public recreational playgrounds on at least five acres of land area.
- c. Nonprofit recreation areas on at least five acres of land area.
- d. Religious institutions as regulated by supplemental regulations, section 46-744.
- e. Educational institutions on at least ten acres of land area.
- (2) The permitted uses in subsection (1) of this section are subject to the following requirements:
 - a. The proposed site for any of the uses permitted herein shall have at least one property line abutting a major public street, and the site shall be so planned as to provide all access directly to said major street. Vehicular access to minor public residential streets shall not be permitted.
 - b. Street front, waterfront, side and rear yards shall be set back at least 50 feet and shall be landscaped in trees, shrubs and grass. All such landscaping shall be maintained in a healthy condition. There shall be no parking or structures permitted in these yards, except required entrance drives and those fences, walls, berms and vegetation used to screen the use from abutting residential lots and parcels.
 - c. Shall meet all off-street parking requirements specified for each use in article VII of this chapter and other applicable requirements of this chapter.

Sec. 46-297. Permitted accessory uses.

Permitted accessory uses are as follows:

- (1) Normal existing accessory uses to single-family housing and those additional normal waterfront accessory uses and activities, such as docks, decks, wharves, beaches, beach equipment and apparatus, boat houses, boat moorings, beach shelters, cabanas or small bathhouses and other existing or typical waterfront accessory uses, with the additional approval of the state department of environmental quality or other public agency when required.
- (2) Normal accessory uses to permitted and approved special uses, and those additional normal, typical and existing types of waterfront

Sec. 46-299. Dimensional requirements except as otherwise specified in this chapter.

Dimensional requirements are as follows:

- (1) Lot area. The first family dwelling unit in a duplex family residential structure shall occupy a lot or parcel comprising not less than one-half acre, except that lots of record existing prior to the adoption of the ordinance from which this section is derived shall be permitted to have one duplex located upon them, providing they can meet all of the other requirements of this chapter, and meet the requirements of section 46-300(2). Each additional dwelling unit in duplexes shall require the following additional lot or parcel area:
 - a. Efficiency: 2,000 square feet.
 - b. One bedroom: 2,500 square feet.
 - c. Two bedrooms: 3,500 square feet.
 - d. Three bedrooms: 5,000 square feet.
 - e. Four bedrooms: 6,500 square feet.
 - f. Extra bedrooms over four: 1,500 square feet.
- (2) Lot width. Minimum of 200 feet, except lots of record existing prior to the adoption of the ordinance from which this section is derived.
- (3) Lot coverage. Maximum of 30 percent.
- (4) *Number of dwelling units per gross acre.* Six dwelling units.
- (5) Yard and setback requirements.
 - a. *Front yard.* Minimum of 35 feet from the street right-of-way line unless a greater setback is specified in the master plan for streets and highways, whichever is greater.
 - b. Side yards. Minimum distance equal to the maximum height of the structures, except where a side yard abuts a street right-ofway line, the minimum shall be 35 feet unless a greater setback is specified in the master plan for streets and highways, whichever is greater.
 - c. *Rear yard.* Minimum of 50 feet.
- (6) Height limitations. Maximum of two stories or 30 feet, except that detached accessory structures shall not exceed 15 feet.
- (7) *Spacing between buildings.* Spacing between buildings shall be at least the height of the highest of the adjacent buildings.

- (3) Ingress and egress of driveways shall be provided from an impervious hard surface paved street. Drives shall be located at least 20 feet from any building and shall have at least an 18foot-wide, two-lane traveled surface for automobiles.
- (4) Off-street parking shall be provided in accordance with article VII of this chapter with parking spaces located within 200 feet of an entrance to the building for which the parking is designated. Each dwelling unit shall be provided with at least 1½ parking spaces, except duplexes shall have two spaces per dwelling unit.
- When an R-2 duplex-family residential lot or (5) parcel, except those existing prior to the adoption of the ordinance from which this section is derived which cannot meet the requirements of this section, abuts parcels other than those located in an R-2 or R-3 residential district, a 15foot-wide buffer shall be provided within the R-2 lot or parcel area. The buffer area shall be bermed and landscaped with trees, shrubs and grass. All such landscaping shall be maintained in a healthy condition. There shall be no parking or other structures permitted in buffer areas, except required entrance drives and those walls, fences, berms or plantings necessary to screen the R-2 use from abutting single-family residential and other nonresidentially used lots and parcels, except those in the R-3 district.
- (6) The outdoor storage of goods, materials, trash or garbage is not permitted, except as provided in section 46-719.
