Legislation including funding to boost northern Michigan and UP tourism heads to governor

LANSING, Mich. — Sen. Ed McBroom joined Sen. Wayne Schmidt and Rep. Sara Cambensy in supporting a funding measure that includes resources to support northern Michigan and Upper Peninsula tourism.

'The western U.P. has been dealt many blows economically for years, the most recent of which was the untimely and unnecessary closure of Ojibway Prison," said McBroom, R-Waucedah Township. "The state has made many promises of economic investment and today, thanks to the great U.P. legislative team and partners

across the U.P. and downstate, we are seeing a tremendous investment in a transformational project for our area."

Senate Bill 565, which contains funding for muchneeded road and water infrastructure repairs, also included funds for local park projects across the state. SB 565 includes \$20 million for the restoration and development of the Copper Peak ski jump facility in Gogebic County. The world-class facility will attract international ski competitions and provide sports-related tourism to the region. The ski jump is expected to generate \$50 million for the region in visitor revenue over its first four years of competitive events.

"Northern Michigan and Upper Peninsula legislators worked together and across the aisle to include funding to transform Copper Peak into a world-class destination for ski jumping competitions and training for Olympic-level athletes from the U.S. and around the world," said Schmidt, R-Traverse City. "We already have an international commitment to host ski competitions once upgrades are complete."

State Rep. Sara Cambensy,

who represents a portion of the Upper Peninsula in the state House of Representatives, agreed with both senators and called this a critical investment for the area and Michigan as a whole.

"This monumental funding to rebuild the historic Copper Peak ski flying jump is truly a once in a lifetime opportunity for the entire state of Michigan. The economic growth that will come from this unprecedented investment is unlike anything U.P. legislators have been able to capture since building the Mackinac Bridge," said Cambensy, D-Marquette. "Bob

Jacquart had a dream to bring international ski flying back to the United States and his hometown of Ironwood, and his consistent ask to the U.P. delegation of legislators has finally paid off. What a gift this appropriation is for every Michigander, but especially our Yoopers who share our ski jumping and flying

Schuss Mountain Snow Challenge

The 12th annual Schuss Mountain Snow Challenge at Shanty Creek Resort's Schuss Village, drew thousands of spectators who watched over 160 racers from as far as California, Iowa and Missouri, race side-by-side up the resort's ski hills. Within a short time, the event, which began in 2009, has grown to be one of the largest off-roading competitions.

Race director Jason Grzesikowski said there are seven classes in which racers can compete, including DOT A and B, Sportsman, Any Tire, Mega Truck, Super Mod and Power Adder. Spectators gather at the base of the hills to watch racers give it their all to get to the top.

Long time participant and racer Scott Nelson, of Kalkaska, said being a professional mechanic has helped him to build his own trucks and jeeps.

"I'm not in it for the money," he said. "I've learned to keep it a hobby and just have fun. Trophies are nice, and I have acquired a room full."

While most racers are able to make it to the top,

some struggle and have to back down the hill. Strict safety precautions and rules, including the use of helmets, multi-point harnesses and straps, help keep racers safe.

The mild temperatures

made for less than stellar snow conditions at this year's race. Grzesikowski said although Mother Nature didn't cooperate, the successful snow challenge prevailed.

Schuss Mountain Snow

Challenge is a two day event that is held in early April each year. A portion of the proceeds benefit Disabled American Veterans.

"The second booster vaccine is meant to provide further protection in those with underlying health conditions," Dr. Meyerson said. "Each individual should base their decision to get the second booster shot on their medical conditions, whether

they've recently had COVID (which provides some protection), and the makeup of others in their household who may be immunocompromised. These are all considerations to take into account," he said. Four months after receipt

of a first booster dose, the following options are available to individuals who choose to receive a second dose: · A second booster dose of

the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine may be administered to individuals 50 years of age and older. · A second booster dose of

the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine may be adminis-

tered to moderately or severely immunocompromised individuals 12 years of age and older. • A second booster dose of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine may be administered to moderately or severely immunocompromised individuals 18 years of age and older.

"Vaccination continues to be our best protection strategy against severe COVID illness and death," Dr. Meyerson said, adding it is important to be up to date on your vaccination series, whether it is first or second doses or the booster shots.

Bellaire and East Jordan Family Health Center to Distribute At-Home COVID-19 Test Kits.

Testing for COVID-19 has proven critically important to help reduce the spread of the virus in our communities. East Jordan Family Health Center will be receiving over 5,000 at-home COVID-19 test kits for distribution through their Drive Thru Pick Up Days in Antrim and Charlevoix County. This testing supply program is part of the Biden Administration's "Path Out of the Pandemic" COVID-19 Action Plan, making available "free COVID-19 testing supplies, FDA-authorized for emergency use, for

distribution at no cost to their patients and through their communities," states HRSA.

The Bellaire and East Jordan Family Health Centers have received the Quidel QuickVue At-Home OTC Covid-19 Tests. These tests are rapid antigen tests that an individual can self-administer at home with results available within 10 minutes. These tests can be used if a person is symptomatic, asymptomatic, or within 6 days of symptom onset. The tests can be self-administered

and are recommended for use by individuals 14 years of age and older. For children 2-13 years of age, this COVID-19 test must be performed by an

The Bellaire and East Jordan Family Health Centers will be holding drive thru pick up days for free At-Home Covid Tests and N95 Masks. Bellaire's site will offer tests on Tuesdays from 4-6 pm and East Jordan will offer tests on Thursdays from 4-6 pm. The At-Home Test Kits will be available while supplies last and are limited to two kits

per person per week. The goal of these tests is to provide access to testing in our communities and are not intended to fulfill employers requirements regarding testing.


The Veterans for the month of April 2022 are the Officers and Seamen of those **Submarines** that are "still on Patrol".





The pieces have been delivered to the Community Mental Health Association of Michigan in Lansing, where they will be professionally matted and framed by a person with disabilities who has a framing business and will then join pieces from around the state to travel around Michigan for the next two years.

The goals of the traveling art show are to help de-stigmatize mental illness, intellectual and developmental disabilities, and addictive disorders by showcasing the multidimensionality of the artists and to highlight the recovery potential of art.

"We know that many great artists like Michelangelo, Van Gogh, Edvard Munch, and Jackson Pollock not only possessed exceptional creativity but also experienced mental illness. Their famous artworks have helped change attitudes while enriching people's lives," said Christine Gebhard, NCCMH CEO. "We are pleased to support this show of Michigan artists

who have used art to help their recovery and build life skills. The overall effect is to end stigma and normalize help-seeking behaviors throughout Michigan."

In Michigan, one in four adults will experience a mental health disorder at some point in their life, yet many of them cannot access the treatment they need.

North Country Community Mental Health provides services to residents of Antrim, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Emmet, Kalkaska and Otsego Counties experiencing a serious mental illness, severe emotional problem, or intellectual/developmental disability, including individuals with co-occurring substance use disorder. City of Boyne City to hold first Short Term Rental Public Hearing on April 7th at City Hall

Anyone interested in the short-term rental issue in Boyne City is encouraged to attend the first in a series of meetings at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, April 7th, at City Hall. There will be additional meetings on this issue at 5:30 p.m. on April 21 and May 5, and further meetings will be scheduled if needed.

On January 25th, the City Commission approved Mayor Hugh Conklin,Äôs recommendation to have the full City Commission lead the effort on this issue, rather than appointing a task force. His memo on the topic said in part: ,ÄúWhile it is my recommendation the City Commission lead the effort, participation from the entire community is a must if we are to achieve a balanced ordinance with common prin-

The Mayor said it is his goal to have the City Commission craft a balanced Short-Term Rental Ordinance with common principles that respect the rights of homeowners to engage in Short Term Rentals while also respecting the rights of their neighbors and maintaining the character of Boyne City.

Canoe racing legend and Cheboygan resident Lynne Witte has success in dog sled racing

It may be true that Lynne Witte is better known for

her 40-plus years in the canoe racing scene. However, the 67-year-old Cheboygan resident has carved out quite the career in dog sled

racing as well.

"It is kind of addictive," Witte said. "In a way it is like canoe racing, you either like it or you don't like it but for me, I can't even imagine what I would be doing now if I wasn't doing it.'

Back in 2000 Witte attended the Iditarod, Alaska's annual 938 mile dog sled race that spans from Anchorage to Nome. She bought her first dog in 2002 and had things snowballed from there to her current 12 dogs.

"I slowly got my way to what I am doing now and when I retired from teaching in 2016 and since that time I have been racing, training and taking care of dogs," Witte said.

This past winter was one of her best seasons. She started the year off with a win at a race in Newberry and fared well in races at Duluth, MN and Marquette, where she was sixth and fourth respectively. She capped it off with a second place finish at a race near Copper Harbor.

"I space my races strategically so the dogs get a chance to rest," Witte said. "Of the dogs I have, two are retired so they just live with me and the other ones I have race every race, so I have to race strategically.

"When I first started (racing) it was simply to finish it," she added. This year I got fortunate and things worked out and we won the first race. It has been an amazing season and I won an award for dog care (after the Copper Harbor race). The dogs did amazing, they



all started and they all finished and we won that award so it was worth it."

She will have another dog to take care of shortly as

"I have 12 right now, but I am getting my 13th by the end of this week." Witte said. "Being retired, I have a couple choices, I could sit at home or go out and do something. I have fun, it is a good way for me to stay in shape and (I'll be doing this) a lot longer. For me this is a win-

win situation." With the spring weather slowly taking over, Witte will shift her attention back towards canoe racing. She competed in the Klondike Challenge in Oscoda on Saturday and will take part in several Michigan Canoe Racing Association events this season as she prepares to start her 42nd career AuS- able River Canoe Marathon. "It is hard (to do both), I really

have to dance a little bit," she said. "Right now, I am making the transition but the good thing is, once it gets warmer than 50 degrees it is too hot so I don't really run them. When it gets to be really heavy-duty canoe racing I don't have to take them out, but still some days really long and the nights are short but that is OK because I can make it all work."

Kaila came a long way in the last four years and upped her pace of improvement as she got closer to the Olympics. The goal is to peak in February at the games and she certainly did that in Beijing!! Kaila is excited to continue her climb to the top and to be one of the favorites going in to the 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milan-Cortina, Italy. She'll be continuing on the World Cup tour and has her sights set on reaching the podium at the World Championships next season.




