Boyne City - Boyne City resident Elizabeth Looze had her day in court Thursday, February 17 in front of Judge Angela J Lasher. Looze pled guilty to malicious destruction of property less than \$200, a second charge of larceny was dropped.

She was sentenced on March 24, 2022 to: fines-fees of \$725.00, 8 months probation, 80 hours of community service, writing a "paper" on proper Flag etiquette to the court & a written apology to the Boyne Area Veterans Memorial committee for her actions. Both of which going to the court for its approval and forwarded if/when approval is reached. And an 8 month delayed sentencing.

Looze found herself facing criminal charges for the first time, after, in a moment

of passion, she removed the Bennington Flag from the Boyne City Veterans Memorial. "I was not there to take the flag. It was an emotional frustrated action. I took it because no one was listening to me. I thought, a private citizen put this up, I'm a private citizen," said Looze. Once she realized the potential implications of

what she had done she left the memorial leaving the POW flag which had flown under the Bennington, on the ground. Shortly later she folded the Bennington flag, packaged it and mailed it to City Hall.

Prior to that emotional day Looze had approached the city administration, had a meeting with the memo-

rial committee and even spoke at a city commission meeting about her interpretation of the Bennington flying in place of the typical stars and stripes. "For me, this was an act of protest against a symbol that they raised in place of the American flag," she said. Looze was prepared with a great deal of research on the origins of the Bennington flag including having made contact with the national flag

foundation in Pittsburg PA. The flag was not present at the Battle of Bennington but created in celebration of the battle probably in 1876. She is a patriot at heart and because she believed the flag was being flown as a right wing protest against the present government, took offense. "I did not remove an American flag, I re-






News Grants for Environment, Land Use, and Recreation Awarded

The Community Foundation, through its first grant cycle of 2022, responded to requests from nonprofit partners in the areas of environment, land use, and recreation. Thanks to donors who look to the Community Foundation to make a difference close to home, a total of \$142,725 in grants have been awarded to nonprofits who will work on protecting the Lake Charlevoix shoreline and watershed, introducing composting to school age kids, addressing invasive species, improving recreation opportunities and more.

Two organizations will work on protecting or restoring the Lake Charlevoix Watershed. The Conservation Resource Alliance is embarking on the construction phase of their three-year plan to

upgrade river crossings on the Jordan River and Deer Creek. They will be replacing three crossings that currently have culverts with single span timber bridges that allow both the river and wildlife to flow more naturally. Lake Charlevoix Association will be teaming up with Tip of the Mitt Watershed Council and Land Information Access Association to work with communities surrounding Lake Charlevoix on visioning for the future and reviewing zoning that will protect the Lake Charlevoix shoreline.

Other organizations will help to address and manage invasive species. The Charlevoix Antrim Kalkaska Emmet (CAKE) Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area (CISMA) will re-

lease Galerucella beetles to feed upon the invasive purple loosestrife at the mouth of the Jordan River in East Jordan and at a site on Six Mile Lake. Walloon Lake Association and Conservancy will install a solar-powered boat washing station at the Sumner Road boat launch on Walloon Lake, to help people wash their boats to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species in the area.

The East Jordan Public Schools, Äô Shoe Club will move forward with its ,ÄúSeed to Salad,Äù project to increase the growing season and improve the school garden. In addition to renovating a greenhouse and adding a hoop house to the garden, the schools will also now implement a composting program at all levels, teaching kids that all food has value, and helping the garden to grow. At Raven Hill Discovery Center, kids of all ages will learn more about solar energy, with the new Solar SMART exhibit that will be installed this summer with grant funds. On Beaver Island, Tara.Äôs Meadow will continue working on energy sustainability initiatives, too.

Recreation will also get a boost in Charlevoix County, with Little Traverse Conservancy,Äôs new equipment that will help to keep trails maintained, Charlevoix Township, Äôs new screening that will go up around the tennis and pickleball courts, and Wilson Township, Äôs new basketball hoop and half court, to be installed this summer.

For a complete list of grants, visit c3f.org. A portion of the grant funds were produced by a fund that is being invested in a socially responsible way. By investing these dollars in environment. social, and governance investments (ESG), the fund will continue to grow, while also supporting and being supported by income from socially responsible companies.

A charitable organization dedicated to improving and enriching life in the area, the Charlevoix County Community Foundation accepts gifts from individuals, families. businesses and civic groups and manages them as permanent endowments. While a portion of the funds are utilized to support grantmaking, the principal of the

endowment continues to grow, providing ongoing charitable capital to benefit Charlevoix County, Äôs residents, Äînow and in the future.

The next grant cycle is called Community Priorities. Applications are now being accepted. This cycle will focus on requests from eligible nonprofit partners for county-wide projects, arts and culture, and health needs, and the organizations that make this work possible. In 2022, requests for general support are being accepted in all grant cycles. Applications are due by Sunday, May 1, 2022. Leadership Is About Our Relationships

While business is complicated, and managing our time is challenging, I do believe that leadership is basic; it's common sense; it's about our earning the respect of our people and continuing to earn relationships founded on trust.

Early in my career in New York City, I attended a Dale Carnegie training program and found it very helpful. The two fellows who taught our program were amazing. I was totally taken by their quiet confidence, poise and ability to communicate.

Here I am many years later, now a leadership consultant and coach. I am an ardent believer in reading leadership books like Carnegie's enduring classic, How to Win Friends and Influence People, which was published in 1937 and still holds true!

Like most people, I love the theory that simple is good. That's exactly what How to Win Friends is, the basics of

leadership, and it makes so much sense. In fact, I fervently believe it makes even more sense today than when it was written 85 years ago. I'll mention below some of the "golden rules" that are Mr. Carnegie's principles. These were keys to success then, always have been, and just think how vital they are now in our crazy busy world when so many, unfortunately most, senior managers are nearly constantly in meetings, on their computers, conference calls, in conversation in the C-suites, and maybe now traveling again. What would I like to see?

As people return to working in their company's offices, I'd like leaders to be intentional about having conversations with their internal clients the people in their company doing the work of their company – all the people, not just with other senior executives. And I encourage leaders to check in with those working remotely, and not just by email or text. Pick up the phone. Conversations are way more important and effective than emails.

To be very successful consistently, year after year, leaders must make conversations a top priority. Quality conversations that treat each person as a teammate and show a genuine interest in them and their well-being. Conversations are the

work of a leader, and Leadership is one conversation at a time.

Think about these golden rules offered by Dale Carnegie (and these are just some examples). By embodying these, we'll cultivate enthusiastic organizational cultural and a winning team.

Don't criticize or complain Give honest, sincere appre-

ciation Be genuinely interested in other people

cause we genuinely care about our people and are not self-absorbed, those on our team will very likely look up to us and be motivated to do their very best work, going the extra mile when needed. Happy employees do better work!

We must bear in mind the importance of asking openended questions, asking people for their ideas, opinions, input, and feedback. We'll learn a lot, gain great ideas, and our people will feel appreciated. This is very much of a success factor as the best ideas are bottom up ideas!

There is also the very effective approach of leadership by questioning. For example, when someone asks what action we should take, ask that person what she recommends and why. Leadership by questioning helps our people learn and grow. And isn't that our responsibility as a boss, as a leader?



moved a piece of propaganda," she said.

Ron Crozier, Dean Kleinschroder and Skip Hall are three of a twelve member committee that are caretakers of Veteran's Park. These men are also patriots. "The memorial is a memorial, so is the Bennington flag." said Hall with tear filled eyes. "It was flown for those who fought in the war of 1776." The memorial committee was offended by comments made at the meeting with Looze. "They said it was a political movement for us to put up that flag," said an exasperated Kleinschroder. "The memorial is for all veterans, from all wars. She felt it didn't represent her brother (who died in service),' said Crozier. After hearing Looze's complaints the committee took the Bennington that had flown in the most prominate place on the poles since late April down for Memorial Day Services because they did not want to cause hard feelings but returned it shortly thereafter. "It's very clear that her intentions were to disrespect the 1770's flag," said Crozier.

The Veterans were also angered by Looze's comments at a commission meeting in early June that the flag represented white supremacy. "It's not the Bennington flag used by those groups that's the Betsy Ross flag," said Crozier. Also, the flag left on the ground was very egregious to them. "We did the same research, he (Hall) interpreted it incorrectly," said Looze. Two other veterans, non-committee members, attended the court hearing in support of the committee.

Making your Home more Energy Efficient

Proper insulation on the cent yearly efficiency. This attic and walls make it more energy-efficient. Proper insulation slows down the heat that flows out of your home in winter or summer, thus less energy is needed to cool or heat your home. Foam insulation materials, cellulose and fiberglass reduce the heat conducted on the wall system when they are properly installed.

Use energy-efficient models to replace your leaky and old windows to boost the efficiency of your windows. Consider putting up storm windows or weather stripping. You will be able to save from 7 to 24 percent of your airconditioning and heating costs when you replace old windows.

Ordinance No. 60

AN ORDINANCE PURSUANT TO ACT 3 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1895 TO REGULATE THE KEEPING OF DOMESTIC POULTRY WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BOYNE FALLS TO INSURE THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

THE VILLAGE OF BOYNE FALLS ORDAINS:

Section 1. Title.

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Village of Boyne Falls Domestic Poultry Ordinance.

this Ordinance, the Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, shall within ten (10) days decide whether to issue the license for the domestic poultry. If the applicant fails to provide all the information required by Section 4, then the application shall be deemed incomplete and may be denied on that basis. The decision of the Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, to issue the license shall be made pursuant to the standards contained in Section 6 of this Ordinance. The decision of the Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, concerning whether to issue the license shall be in writing and shall include findings of fact, based on information presented by the applicant, on each standard for approval.

Section 2. Definitions. As used in this Ordinance, "Domestic poultry" means domesticated chicken hens, ducks, geese, and turkey hens. Domestic poultry, however, shall not include chicken roosters or turkey cocks (a male turkey).

"Dwelling" means a single unit building, or portion thereof, providing complete independent living facilities for one (1) family for residential purposes, including permanent provisions for living, sleeping, heating, cooking, and sanitation.

"Family" means an individual, or two (2) or more persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption, together with not more than three (3) persons not so related, occupying a dwelling and living as a single nonprofit housekeeping unit with single culinary facilities, as distinguished from a group occupying a boarding house, lodging house, hotel, club, fraternity, or similar dwelling for group use.

"Owner" means a person holding any legal, equitable, option, or contract interest in land.

"Parcel" means an area of land, two or more contiguous areas of land, or two or more contiguous platted lots that are under single ownership and used or designated by the owner for treatment as one development site.

"Principal residence" means the main or primary dwelling in which the owner habitually sleeps, keeps his or her personal effects, and has a regular place of lodging.

"Totally enclosed structure" means a building with a roof, floor, and walls, or a building with closable doors around its perimeter, or a building otherwise capable of being sealed on all sides.

Section 3. License Required.

No person shall keep or confine domestic poultry within the Village without first obtaining a license from the Village pursuant to the requirements of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Application and Fee Requirements.

A person seeking a license under this Ordinance shall submit a complete application to the Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, and pay the required fee, which shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Village Council. The application shall include proof of ownership of, or proof of a leasehold interest in, the property on which the domestic poultry will be kept or confined and all information reasonably necessary for the Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, to determine whether the standards for approval provided in Section 6 of this Ordinance have been met. If the applicant is a tenant, then the application shall include a written statement from the owner of the property approving the submission of the application.

Section 5. Issuance of License; Conditions; Annual Renewal.

After receiving the information required in Section 4 of Α.

B. The Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, may impose reasonable conditions on a license issued under this Ordinance which are reasonably necessary to ensure continuing compliance with the standards for approval provided in Section 6 of this Ordinance.

Any license issued pursuant to this Ordinance shall C. be valid for a period of one (1) year and shall be renewable annually upon inspection of the property by the Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, to assure continued compliance with this the standards of approval in Section 6 of this Ordinance and the payment of the licence renewal fee, which shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Village Council.

Section 6. Standards for Approval.

The Village Clerk, or other official designated by the Village Council, shall approve, or approve with conditions, an application for a domestic poultry license only upon a finding that the application complies with all of the following standards:

A No more than a total of four (4) domestic poultry will be kept or confined per parcel.

B The parcel on which the domestic poultry will be kept or confined is the principal residence of the owner of that parcel.

C The parcel on which the domestic poultry will be kept or confined has no more than one (1) dwelling located on that parcel. Domestic poultry shall not be kept or confined on a parcel on which two-family or multi-family dwellings are located.

D The domestic poultry will be kept or confined in a totally enclosed structure located in the rear yard of the parcel, with an optional covered fenced enclosure. In addition, the structure will be constructed and maintained to prevent the structure becoming a breeding ground, food source or habitation place for rats, mice, or other rodents.

E The feed and other items associated with the domestic poultry will be kept in a totally enclosed structure which shall be constructed and maintained to prevent the structure becoming a breeding ground, food source or habitation place for rats, mice, or other rodents.

F The structure in which the domestic poultry will be kept or confined, any optional covered fence enclosure, cel outdoors.

Section 7. Nuisance.

A violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, a nuisance per se and is hereby further declared to be offensive to the public health, safety and welfare.

Section 8. Violations.

Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction as defined in Public Act 12 of 1994, amending Public Act 236 of 1961, being Sections 600.101-600.9939 of Michigan Complied Laws, and shall be subject to a fine of Five Hundred and 00/100 (\$500.00) Dollars. Each day this Ordinance is violated shall be considered a separate violation.

Section 9. Enforcement Officials.

The Charlevoix County Sheriff officers for the Village of Boyne Falls are hereby designated as the authorized officials to issue municipal civil infractions directing alleged violators of this Ordinance to appear in court.

Section 10. Civil Action.

In addition to enforcing this Ordinance through the use of a municipal civil infraction proceeding, the Village may initiate proceedings in the Circuit Court to abate or eliminate the nuisance per se or any other violation of this Ordinance.

Section 11. Repeal.

The Village of Boyne Falls Ordinance No. 60 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 12. Severability.

If any section, provision or clause of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be invalid, such invalidity shall not effect any remaining portion or application of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application.

Section 13. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after its enactment.




