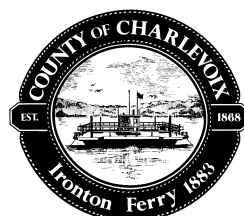

Director's CORNER

Food and Water Safety
 During Power Outages per the U.S. Food and Drug Administration

Prepare Yourself Before Power Emergencies

Make sure you have appliance thermometers in your refrigerator and freezer.

- o Check to ensure that the freezer temperature is at or below 0° F, and the refrigerator is at or below 40° F.
- o Have coolers on hand to keep refrigerated food cold if the power will be out for more than 4 hours.

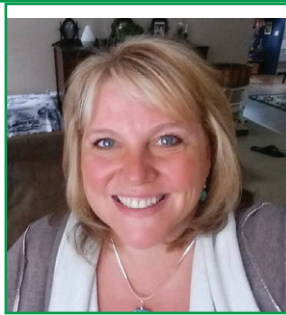
Check out local sources to know where dry ice and block ice can be purchased, in case it should be needed.

Power Outages: During and After When the Power Goes Out ...

Here are basic tips for keeping food safe:

- 1. Keep the refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible to maintain the cold temperature.
- o The refrigerator will keep food cold for about 4 hours if it is unopened.
- o A full freezer will keep the temperature for approximately 48 hours (24 hours if it is half full) if the door remains closed.

- 2. Buy dry or block ice to keep the refrigerator as cold as possible if the power is going to be out for a prolonged period of time. Fifty pounds of dry ice should keep an 18 cubic foot, fully stocked freezer cold for two days.
- 3. If you plan to eat refrigerated or frozen meat, poultry, fish, or eggs while they are still at safe temperatures, it is important that each item is thoroughly cooked to a safe minimum internal temperature to ensure that any food-borne bacteria that may be present are destroyed.



However, if at any point the food was above 40° F for 2 hours or more (or 1 hour if temperatures are above 90° F) — discard it.

Once Power is Restored ... Determine the safety of your food:

- 1. If an appliance thermometer was kept in the freezer, check the temperature when the power comes back on. If the freezer thermometer reads 40° F or below, the food is safe and may be refrozen.
- 2. If a thermometer has not been kept in the freezer, check each package of food to determine its safety. You can't rely on appearance or odor. If the food still contains ice crystals or is 40° F or below, it is safe to refreeze or cook.
- 3. If the power was out for no more than 4 hours, refrigerated food should be safe as long as the doors were kept closed. When the power comes back on, check the temperature in the refrigerator or of the food. Discard any perishable food (such as meat, poultry, seafood, milk, eggs, or leftovers) that has been at refrigerator temperatures above 40°F for 4 hours or more. Perishable foods with temperatures that are 45°F or below (measured with a food thermometer) should be safe, but should be cooked and consumed as soon as possible.

Perishable food such as meat, poultry, seafood, milk, and eggs that are not kept adequately refrigerated or frozen may cause illness if consumed, even when they are thoroughly cooked.

Charlevoix County Senior Centers Updates

We will continue to ask that those not feeling well or who are sick to please NOT come into the Senior Centers & if you do, please know you will be asked to leave to protect our Aging Adults and the Staff who serve you!

Take Out is available for those still not wanting to dine in.

We have added back our second menu option each week.

We are once again highlighting Michigan In Season Fresh Fruits and Vegetables.

We know how important the Boyne Center is to our aging adults so even with staffing issues we wanted to try to add some things we thought you would appreciate.

The Boyne Center will be closed until further notice. Boyne will have curbside lunch pick-up Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, 11:30AM-12:30PM. We will have 3 in-person Wednesday Night Dinners in Boyne on July 27, August 31, & September 28. Dinner will be served from 5-6PM on these dates and doors will be open 4-6:30PM.

Boyne Seniors interested in Travel Club will need to sign up through the COA office at 237-0103.

We will still be holding Foot Clinics on their regularly scheduled dates at the BASC.

Reminder-As of today, in Boyne only - No Wednesday curbside meals or Wednesday Night Dinners (except in-person dinner July 27, August 31, & September 28). If you would like an extra meal to use for Wednesday, frozen meals are available on Tuesdays at curbside pick-up.

The Boyne Area Senior Center, Inc. Building Board is still welcome to hold their Board meetings on July 12, August 2, and September 13 at 10:30a at the Boyne Senior Center even though the COA is only providing limited services and the Center will be posted as CLOSED.

ALL Seniors are welcome to attend activities and events at East Jordan or Charlevoix as they are fully staffed and opened as planned, including Veterans Socials and Wednesday Night Dinners.

Veteran Socials

Veteran Socials are a great opportunity to connect with other area Veterans and meet with your Charlevoix County Veteran Service Officers.

Veteran Socials are on July 5th at the Charlevoix Center and on July 19th at the East Jordan Center and a free meal can be had at these centers for all Veterans or they can take them to go.

We will reopen for Veterans Socials in Boyne from 9:30AM-11:30AM on July 26, August 23, and September 27. Veterans attending the BASC Socials may receive one free meal to-go at 11:30AM at the conclusion of the Veterans Social.
