

Ellsworth Community School Announces New High School Elective

ELLSWORTH, MICHI-GAN – For the upcoming 2022-2023 school year Ellsworth Community School has announced some exciting new course offerings for high school students. These new courses provide students with expanded choices for both electives and early college credit.

On the elective front, students in grades 8-12 will now have the opportunity to enroll in a Theater/Performing-Arts class as a part of their regular elective choices. This new course will be taught by ECS teacher Jessica VanderHart. Mrs. VanderHart has a wealth of theater experience having taught theater classes during the district's annual Lancer Leap project term as well as being a dance director and organizing community theater projects.

"I am extremely excited that we are able to offer theater during the school day," said Mrs. Vander-Hart. "The main objective

for our theater class will be to allow students the experience to get up in front of their peers and express themselves. This experience will encourage them to become more confident. poised, and self-aware. I can not wait to get started."

ECS Superintendent Aaron Gaffney echoed this sentiment. "Adding a performing arts class is something that we've been discussing for some time. We've seen great success with theater classes during our Lancer Leap project term and we are eager to see what types of performances Mrs. VanderHart and the students can put together given more time and resources."

The new theater class will be available to all students in grades 8-12. Students also have elective opportunities such as Computer Programming, Art, and Yearbook as well as Career and Technical Education offerings in Graphic Printing Technology, Agriculture, Building Trades, and Business Services Technology (BST). The BST class is new to Ellsworth for the coming 2022-2023 school year. "We're always looking for additional CTE classes to offer our students. We're thankful that we're able to partner with CharEm ISD to add another program to our course catalog this year," Gaffney indicated. On the dual enrollment

for college credit front ECS will also be expanding their offerings for the coming school year. "ECS has a long history of partnering with Baker College to offer our students the chance to earn college credit while in high school," said Gaffney. The school offers English Composition, Public Speaking, Psychology, and Sociology and this year will be adding College Algebra and Pre-Calculus.

"Expanding the college courses that are offered to students while still in high school will help to support their choices after graduation. ECS Juniors and Seniors will be able to graduate with at least 18 college credits through collaboration with Baker College," explained ECS Principal, Naomi Sponable.

All of these new and existing elective opportunities align with the ECS motto, Small School Relationships ... Big School Opportunities. "New classes mean increased opportunities for our students to learn and grow," said Sponable. "We're looking forward to a great 2022-2023 school year at ECS. It's a great time to be a

Crowds gather on the shores of Lake Charlevoix, along the Pine River and each of the other stops along the way (Elk Rapids, Northport, Bay Harbor, Harbor Springs and Horton Bay) where cheers and clapping for the parade of boats can delight those young and

Camp Quality, whose mission is to provide camp experiences for children with cancer, and Challenge Mountain, who provides outdoor adaptive sports for people with disabilities, along with Boyne City Main Street benefit from the

sponsorships, participant fees and auction proceeds. These organizations also participate in providing almost 100 volunteers to make the weekend happen. While numbers are not yet in for this year, last year the event raised over \$140,000 for these entities.

Bovne Thunder always begins on Friday evening with a street show of boats and cars that also provides musical entertainment on every corner. Thousands of people stroll the streets and then head to the marina to take in all the boats tied up in the marina.

"We are grateful to our city and our partner charities to work with us to host this event. We are proud to

be able to share a small slice of the beautiful topography of Northern Michigan and the crystal clear water of our lakes. People come from twenty different states and Canada to enjoy

what has been called the best poker run in the country," says Event Coordinator Ingrid Day.

In my assessments of leadership and organizational culture, I often hear "My boss does not get back to me. He must not feel I am important and what I need or think matters.'

(Personal note: in my experience, women tend to put a higher priority on their responsiveness and how their team members feel about themselves than do men).

People all too often tell me that they have to follow up before their boss responds. That lowers morale, and negatively affects our results over time. No question about that. Happy employees do better work.

When we receive an email or voice message and we cannot reply in a timely manner, we often can at least respond "I am very busy, and will get back to you first chance or in the morning." This honors our team member, let's them know we respect her/him and want to be there for her/him.

And let's develop a customized plan to manage our time online. The most effective leaders are efficient and have boundaries to maximize their productivity.

Delegate responsibilities and authority to free ourselves up to be more effective leaders. Conversations are the work of a leader. We want to have conversations, especially one-on-one conversations, throughout our day – letting our people know they are appreciated and valued, asking them for their ideas and advice, what they are learning from our customers, what they need, how can we help them, what they feel should be our priorities going forward, and other purposeful questions.

Let's make a resolution to have more conversations with our people. Make this a priority.

Timely responsiveness to questions, requests and needs definitely helps our people know that we care very much about them and that they and their work are important.




have completed this comprehensive resource to assist the community in responding to people with mental illness, reducing the number of people with mental illness in jail, and increasing their access to appropriate treatment."

SHOULD I BUY **OR SELL FIRST?**

PART 2 OF 2

Brisk selling conditions in some parts of the country require more aggressive

Brett Furman, a broker in suburban Philadelphia, says the strong market dictates that homebuyers focus on buying first, and selling later.

"The housing market in the suburban Philadelphia market is moving very quickly," said Furman. "Normally we advise our buyers to sell their home first and buy second ... However with the faster moving market, we are advising many of our buyer clients to obtain a mortgage commitment that is not contingent upon selling their existing house."

In their book, House Selling for Dummies (Hungry Minds Inc., 1999), Eric Tyson and Ray Brown "strongly recommend" that you sell first.

"Even in good real estate markets, sales frequently drag on much longer than you expect," the authors say. "Selling in a weak market usually compounds the problem. Homeowners tend to overestimate their house's resale value and underestimate the length of the selling process -- a fiscally deadly one-two punch."

The Dummies book says selling first eliminates financial risk -- no double mortgages and double payments for property taxes and insurance payments. And no worrying about how you'll come up with a down payment.

But selling first isn't the perfect solution. Some of the issues that may come up include:


Being forced out of your house before you have a new place available. Where will you live? Where will your kids go to school?

Having to move twice. Do you want to go through the hassle? Where will you store your extra furniture while you live with family and friends or rent an apartment?

Not being able to find a house you like. How long are you willing to live in temporary quarters until you find a suitable house?

Whichever way you go, it always seems to work out in the end, at least in Gregor's experience.

"I've been in the business for 30 years," he said. "We've never had anyone out on the street and the vast majority of our clients that make double moves are those building new homes that had to have their property sold first."

Thomas Reid

SENIOR, #34, EAST JORDAN

After being named the Offensive Player of The Year last season. Tommy Reid would back up his very solid performance last year on the mound, with one even better this year. Ried appeared in 13 games while pitching a total of 65.1 innings. He would rack up 120 strikeouts, while only allowing $22\,$ walks. While signing to play baseball at Grand Rapids Community College. Bess would also put together a season that would have him pick up MHSAA All-State Second Team honors. Along with All-District and All-Region honors.

Bess pitched 60.2 total innings while appearing in 14 games. He allowed 34 hits and 12 earned runs for a 1.385 earned run average. Bess would have 122 strikeouts to just 14 walks. All of which would be good enough to earn him a 7-4 overall record on the season.

Bess would also be a contributor on the offensive side as well. As he would have 84 at-bats and collect 32 hits, which is good enough for a .481 average.
