

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

School buses are the safest mode of transportation for getting children back and forth to school. Riding in a school bus is safer than walking, riding a bicycle, or being driven to school in private vehicles.

Today's school buses are built with safety in mind. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, children are protected in large school buses by compartmentalization, a passive occupant pro tection system. This provides a protective envelope consisting of strong, closely-spaced seats that have energy-absorbing padded seat backs that help to distribute and reduce crash forces. Compartmentalization is most effective when occupants are fully seated within the bus seat. Seating should be provided that will allow each occupant to sit on a school bus seat without any part of his or her body extending into the aisle. The majority of bus-related deaths and injuries involve pedestrians - mostly children - who are struck by a bus or injured when they are exiting the bus to cross traffic. Those who pass stopped school buses may be charged with civil infractions carrying a fine between \$100 and \$500. Violators may also be required to perform up to 100 hours of community service at a school. School Bus Zone & Danger Zone Anyone who can touch the bus with an outstretched arm is TOO CLOSE to the bus! Danger Zones and More DO YOU KNOW ... there are areas to stay clear of when getting on and off the bus? Because school buses are so large, there are blind spots around the bus where it can be hard to see small children as they are preparing to board or after exiting a bus. Parents can help bus drivers keep children safe





"Chronicles of a Psalmist" that takes a reader for a walk through his life. Encounters he had along the way inspired some of the writings. As his mom, reading the book I began to understand that my desires for him to be a more "conventional citizen" contributed to his feelings of being a "misfit." I finally understood that being who he is made it possible for him to relate to people in a way that we more "conventional" folks could never do. With all his heart, he reached out to the afflicted, the grieving, the homeless, the abandoned. He did not judge, he loved. If you knew him for only an hour, you heard him say "Jesus loves you and wants to help you." I confess that occasionally embarrassed me; now it humbles me.

MEMORIAL CONTIBU-TIONS: Alec wrote a song called "Seeds of Faith" shortly before he died, describing his vision of the church he wanted to build. A church with open doors, encouraging hurting people to "come on in" to sit with Jesus.

I listen now to one prophetic stanza. "If you've lost a loved one, a close family or friend, well, come on in and let the healing begin" This spoke to my heart when I sat with him as he died. Any memorial contributions will be used to help us to publish this song. Alec was a blessing to many in his life, and this song we hope, will keep that blessing flowing.

Front Danger Zone: It is never safe to walk close to the front of the bus. Children should walk five giant steps ahead of the bus before crossing in front of it.

Side Danger Zone: Children should always stay three giant steps away from the side of the bus. Rear Danger Zone: Never walk behind the school bus.

Rear Danger Zone: Walk (don't run) three giant steps away from the

bus when exiting the bus. When the bus approaches, step back from the curb at least three giant steps.


I had an informative conversation with Gerard Doan, Chief of Charlevoix Police Department, who is quick to acknowledge his appreciation for the other police departments and their dedication throughout Charlevoix County.

As background, Chief Doan grew up here, initially attended St. Mary School through the 6th grade (and served as an altar boy), then on to our public schools (played football, basketball and track) and then to Lake Superior State University. At LSSU, he was in the cadet program, which helped coordinate parking and events, and that led to a career in law enforcement. Well, actually a significant number of his family are themselves in law enforcement, e.g., Michigan State Troopers, and also during his summers as a student, he worked as a parking meter attendant and a life guard.

Chief began his career following college with the County Sheriff, but after seven months a position opened with our police department. That appealed to him as he dearly loves our area, it's beauty, resources and people, and this is his Magic Kingdom (sound familiar.....so many of us feel likewise).

Having served with our police force for about 20 years, in 2006 the then Chief retired and Doan became our new Chief. In addition to Chief

Doan, there are six others in the department, all

certified officers, as well as a much valued secretary. Each his team member is well trained, highly skilled, work well together, care deeply about our community and our residents and visitors. There is significant training provided by our county, e.g., fire arms skills, legal updates, and emergency medical services. In addition, Chief Doan is always alert to training that he feels would be helpful and he also encourages team members to let him know if there is specific skill training that they would like and he will likely give his approval. He appreciates that their growth and success heighten their devotion

to our public safety and desire to continue as a Charlevoix police officer.

Our police officers provide 24-hour coverage to respond to emergencies, and offer road patrol year-round as well as foot patrol in the downtown area during summer months. Jurisdiction is encompassed by the city limits, which includes the airport, three beaches. city marina, city operated golf course, industrial park, downtown Charlevoix, and residential areas. They handle a variety of calls ranging from property damage accidents, domestic violence, and disorderly persons, to local ordinance and nuisance complaints. Chief Doan greatly

values teaching, educating, and mentoring (referred to TEAM), which focuses primarily on a proactive effort to make schools and communities safer, and on promoting responsible citizenship and positive character traits among students in grades K-12.

As Chief Doan has extensive experience, he has great working relationships with police in the surrounding police departments in our county and they come together when helpful for an emergency, as do the State Police, EMS, Fire Department, FBI and Coast Guard. Anyone who can help to get the job done successfully is called upon, including at times our local citizens for their knowledge, observations and ideas.

We are fortunate for Chief Doan's dedication to his team as we remain fully staffed and committed to keeping Charlevoix a safe community.



American's AMAZING ANIMALS: American Black Bears

By Patrick Bevier One of Michigan's most massive mammals are those unbelievably brawny, beautiful, and berry-loving black bears. Hold on firmly for a few fun facts about these abundant, animated, and awe-inspiring animals:

Name Game: The scientific name of the American black bear is Ursus americanus. Ursus is Latin and translates literally as, "bear," while americanus tips a cap to the region in which they are widely distributed. First described by Russian zoologist, Peter Pallas, in 1780 American black bears are the smallest and most widely distributed bears found in North America. The other three Ursus species, worldwide, are the brown bears (including grizzly and Kodiak bears), polar bears, and Asian black bears. Sixteen subspecies of the American black bear are traditionally recognized including the Florida black bear and the Louisiana black bear, both listed as threatened species in their respective regions.

Distribution Data: Believe it or not black bears have been reported in every Michigan County. However, the vast majority – close to 90% - of all Michigan black bears reside above the Mighty Mac in the UP. Most of the other 10% hang out in the northern Lower Peninsula. The Michigan DNR reckons that we have about 12,000 black bears in our state. By comparison, the state that boasts the most black bears is California with an estimated 40,000 individual Ursus americanus in residence.

Smallest Species: American black bears are the smallest bears of the three found in the Western Hemisphere (brown bears and polar bears being the other two). But their mass is nothing to take lightly as fullgrown black bears in Michigan average 200 and some sport mammoth paws which can measure up to 10-inches in length!

Stable Situation: The IUCN lists the American black bear as a Least Concern Species due to its wide range and population numbers that are twice that of all other bear species combined. Along with the brown bears, they are one of only two bear species not considered to be globally threatened. That doesn't mean they're totally, "out of the woods" as habitat destruction and poisons continue to take a toll on some black bear populations.

Oswald's is OK: If you're travelling in the UP, and want to support a great cause while getting close to black bears, visit Oswald's Bear Ranch in Newberry (oswaldsbearranch.com: 906-293-3147). Owner Dean Oswald summarized what they do, "We only take in and save orphaned or injured black bears and raise them here at the ranch. We have 42 bears currently – of which we bottle fed 39 of them - from all over the US. We've had cubs from Wyoming, Ohio, and New York, for example. They were all rescued cubs whose mothers were killed by cars, poachers, logging, or neglectful owners. We provide bears with great natural habitats on 180acres of land that can be viewed by visitors from raised platforms." Kudos to him and his team as they rescued-including bottle feeding-five orphaned cubs this year alone! They've been saving black bears since 1984 and have earned 5-star ratings from several conservation societies. Oswald's give back, too, by having free school tours and free admission for active military, among other altruistic gestures.

Brunettes, and Blondes, too: Despite the name, American black bears have genetic variations in fur

Mexico, and West Virginia. Their cousins, the grizzly bears, have that distinction in Montana and California drinking or passing waste. Their bodies have the remarkable ability to reabsorb and turn urine into critical proteins through a dubbed "sows." And you don't have to be a Wrigley Field baseball fan to know the young are called, scribes. I'm hoping that all who read this are aware to never approach a bear too closely, especially during the spring and summer when an adult bear is likely to be a mother with cubs. The vast majority of black bear attacks - which average only one fatality per year in the US - are during times when a mother bear was simply defending her young from foolish hikers, campers, photographers, sight-seers and the like. Interestingly, a three year study of black bear attacks in the US found that over half of them were initiated by an off-leash dog whose owners were then injured trying to protect the dog.

Bringing Up Baby: In Michigan, black bears mate in the summer from late May through early August. Females leave scent trails around their territory signaling males of their receptiveness. The pair may stay together for a little over a week but then go their separate ways. In one of the most unusual embryological processes, known as delayed fertilization, female black bear eggs float freely around in their uterus before implanting in the uterine wall, usually in November. The cubs are born in January or February while the female is in torpor. They have been known to have up to 6 cubs, but two little ones are most common. Newborns are quite helpless and start off blind, toothless, and blueeyed, and weigh only a pound.

Bear Bites: Black bears are omnivorous and opportunistic feeders, and treat the forests of our state like a Golden Corral buffet! Eating mostly at night they are seasonal feeders with wetland plants predominating in spring, berries of all kinds in the summer, hard mast from trees in the fall, and meat throughout the active season. The majority of animal matter consumed by bears includes colonial insects and larvae, and medium-sized animals like mice, squirrels, woodchucks, fish, and reptiles. When available, bears also feed on carrion. Additionally, they enjoy human-related foods including agricultural crops, orchards, apiaries, bird feed, and garbage. In preparation for winter torpor, bears gorge heavily in the fall and can gain as much as two pounds per day during that period! Native Nemeses: Native Americans generally consider the American black bear reverently as a creation of the benevolent Great Spirit. In contrast, they view the grizzly bear as its antithesis, a creature associated with the malevolent Evil Spirit. Mascot Mania: Bears are a very popular pick as a mascot name. Examples from pro sports are the NFL's Chicago Bears, MLB's Chicago Cubs, the NHL's Boston Bruins, and the NBA's Memphis Grizzlies. Notable college nods include the University of California Golden Bears, the Baylor University Bears, and the University of Maine Black Bears (their mascot character is named Bananas T. Bear!). Constellation Connections: Bears play key roles in our fascination with celestial bodies by being central to the well-known constellations Ursa Major (known to some as "The Bear", but also called, "The Big Dipper") and Ursa Minor (aka "The Little Dipper"). Interestingly, "The Bear" constellation was mentioned in both the Old Testament and in Homer's Iliad! Those are some bite-sized, but not unbearable, blurbs about black bears. With any luck you'll encounter one, but from a distance, in the wonderful woods of the Wolverine State!

300 pounds for females and males, respectively. The largest black bear recorded in the Mitten State was a mind-blowing 650 pounds for an animal from the northern Lower Peninsula. Other max dimensions for these bountiful behemoths are over five feet in length, 4 1/2-feet high when on all fours, and seven-feet tall when standing upright!

Brawny Bruins: Additionally, a black bear's head alone can stretch the tape up to 13- inches long and color including brown, cinnamon, or even blonde, on occasion. The vast majority, however, are dark brown / black in hue. The black fur is an advantage for heat retention during the colder, active months and while they're denned-up when Old Man Winter comes a calling in the Great Lakes State.

State Symbols: American black bears are the official mammals of four states: Alabama, Louisiana, New (on whose flag a golden grizzly predominates).

Hardly Hibernation: Although the term is widely used, physiologically bears are not true hibernators. That's because their body temperatures only dip by a few degrees whereas hibernating animal's internal temperature, heart rate, and breathing drop to very low levels. Bears instead fall into a deep sleep known as torpor. During torpor bears can slumber for more than 100 days without eating, urea recycling process! Female bears also wake up to give birth during torpor and then fall back to sleep as their little ones nurse and nod off themselves. In Michigan, bears typically enter their den by December and emerge in late March or April after a long winter's nap.

Sleeping Bear Story: One of our most prized geological formations, the Sleeping Bear Dunes, gets its name from a Chippewa legend. Beautifully captured in Ann Arbor-based Sleeping Bear Press's children's book, The Legend of Sleeping Bear, the native story tells of a mother bear and her two cubs that, fleeing a fire on the Wisconsin shoreline, swam across Lake Michigan. The cubs didn't quite make it and are immortalized as the North and South Manitou Islands. Mother bear, who longed for her cubs, lay down to forever watch for them. She was covered with sand by the Great Spirit Manitou, forming the famous dunes on the lakeshore.

Awesome Adaptations: Black bears are well suited for their lives in the forest. They are superb climbers, have an acute sense of smell that's 100 times better than humans, have large claws for digging, climbing, and defense, good eyesight, and possess powerful jaws and canine teeth.

Long Lifespans: Black bears live on average from 18-23 years in the wild. Some top that and the record lifespan was a female (Bear Number 56) in northern Minnesota who died in 2013 at the amazing age of 39 ½!

Honey Lover's History: The popular fictional character, Winnie the Pooh, was named after a black bear from the London Zoo in the early 20th century known as, "Winnipeg."

Nifty Names: Male black bears are called, "boars" while the females are "cubs." Bears are solitary animals other than during mating season or when a mother is caring for her young. However, much to Sherlock's delight, when in a group bears are referred to as a, "sleuth."

(Not So) Terrible Teddy: The origin of the most popular stuffed animal ever, the Teddy Bear, occurred in 1902. A Brooklyn candy shop owner and stuffed animal maker saw a political cartoon depicting then president Theodore Roosevelt refusing to shoot a black bear that had been tied up. This inspired the shop owner to create a stuffed toy, initially named, "Teddy's Bear" and, with the president's permission, mass produced the wildly popular bears in his factory called the Ideal Toy Company.

Surprising Speed: Much like the best NFL defensive linemen, black bears are extraordinarily fast for their size. They can attain a sizzling speed of up to 35 mph and can sustain near max velocity for long distances. Yes, the claim that they could outrun a race horse, or any dog, is completely true. They could even leave world-record sprinter, Usain Bolt, in the dust in the 100-meter dash! So. you're never going to outrun one, and forget about climbing a tree, too. According to the US National Park Service, the best thing to do if you come face-to-face with a bear (once you've checked your undershorts) is to slowly and calmly speak to the bear, wave your hands above your head so they know your "different" from typical prey items and back away slowly. If the bear does attack, however, they say, "Fight back with anything you can grab and everything that you have!"




